LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

ST. BERNARD'S CRUSH DE LA SALLE NORTH SCRAPE HOME FROM BLACKS ORMOND'S THIRD LOSS IN A ROW

It was a day of upsets in last week's round, with four leading teams beaten, and no less than 17 teams in the fours suffering defeat. For one of the leaders, Hampton Rovers Juniors, it was the first loss for the season.

St. Bernard's overwhelmed De La Salle and displaced them from second on percentage, and Ormond lost their third game in a row. University Blacks, narrowly beaten by North Old Boys, kept themselves in the running for the

De La Salle were never in the game against St. Bernard's, who outplayed their opponents to establish a winning lead in the first half.

"De La" were held to one goal be-fore half-time, when they trailed by 50 points, and although they improved after the interval they were unable to make any impression on their big leeway and were beaten by 59 points.

North's poor shooting for goal nearly cost them their first defeat. They were 19 points behind the Blacks at the last change but finished well to win by three points.

Marcellin's accuracy was a big factor in their comfortable win over Ormond who were well in it for three quarters. But their "off-target" forward work in the second half told against them.

Caulfield Grammarians dropped out of the running for the finals, when University Blues kicked 3 quick goals to beat them by 7 points in a very even game, and Coburg had a big win over Old Trinity.

The struggle in B Section did little to sort itself out, except that defeats to Old Melburnians and Monash Blues considerably weakened their chances of playing in the finals.

Melburnians went down by 29 points to Reservoir and Monash were

badly beaten at Geelong. Ivanhoe beat Old Paradians by 6 points in a fiercely contested game, with Parade's poor kicking (8-19) being a big factor in their defeat.

Old Xaverians beat Old Carev by only a point and Alphington, despite their score of 18-16, went down by 16 points to Power House. (Alphing-ton lost their first match for the season when House beat them in the first round.) State Bank caused an upset, beating St. Kevin's by more than 7 goals.

North Brunswick were too strong for Old Mentonians, Commonwealth Bank crashed against Bulleen-Templestowe, who won by 17 goals, St. Bede's beat Footscray Tech. and University Reds had their first win.

Three challengers for fourth place in the Juniors, North Old Boys, Old Scotch and Monash University, were all beaten, the surprise being Scotch's 33-point defeat by Ormond. In Section 2, De La Salle broke Hampton's run, winning by nearly 6 goals.

In the Reserves, De La Salle had their first loss since the opening round, going down by 16 points to St. Bernard's, and another leader, Heatherton, was pipped by a point by Beverley Hills.

The match of the seasond - Those two dedicated rivals, North Old Boys and St. Bernard's, with little love for each other, again look like fighting out the A Section Grand Final — Today will be the Dress Rehearsal.

Joe Doolan, Ray King, Peter Aughton and Mick Drennan are all excelling for the Saints while the consistency of Mark Hannebery, Mick Welch, Geoff Dillon and Gil Ould impresses North Coach, George Moloney and with skipper Shane Maguire back at his top, North look most formidable.




