



LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

**MONASH, ORMOND CAUSE UPSETS
NORTH, DE LA SALLE BITE THE DUST
FOUR LEADING TEAMS GO DOWN**

Monash Blues and Ormond caused big upsets in last Saturday's round when they scored wins over top team North Old Boys and De La Salle (second) respectively.

North was only one of four leading teams to be defeated — the others were Old Scotch, Coburg Reserves and Old Brighton Reserves. North held their place at the head of affairs, but the other three slipped down — Old Scotch and Old Brighton Reserves to third and Coburg Reserves to second.

Altogether 16 teams in the fours were beaten, but many of them went down to others in the top brackets.

Monash won in the air and their better backing-up had North in trouble and although Monash missed many chances in the first term through inaccuracy in front of goal, they made up for it in the second when they kicked four goals against the wind, and North, scoreless in the first quarter, went in at half-time without a goal on the board and only nine behinds.

North, nearly 10 goals down at the final change, made a desperate bid to bridge the gap in the last quarter and added six goals in good time but they faded out towards the finish and were beaten by four goals.

Poor shooting contributed to De La Salle's defeat as they had five more scoring shots than Ormond and were beaten by 10 points. "De

La" were never in a winning position and could not withstand Ormond's finishing burst.

University Blues held on to fourth place when they ran away from Old Trinity in the second half, and scored by nine goals. The first half was even and the scores were level at the interval, but Trinity had no answer to the Blues' nine goals in the last quarter.

Coburg scored their first win for the season off their home ground when they proved a little too strong at the finish for Reservoir Old Boys and won by two goals.

Old Scotch went down by more than nine goals to Marcellin who are now in second place, Caulfield Grammarians taking over as the new leaders.

Great to see **Rick Sykes** and **John Houghton** in the 36 players prior to final selection of the **Carnival** side.



LES RADFORD—15 SEASONS—MORE THAN 250 GAMES

Today **St. Kevin's** meet **Commonwealth Bank** and consequently it seems an appropriate occasion to trace the career of one of the "grand old men" of **Amateur Football**, **Les Radford**, who in 15 seasons in the **V.A.F.A.** has played some 258 games with these two clubs.

Les started with the **Bank's Juniors** in 1962 and in 1963 was **Captain** and **Runner-up Best** and **Fairest**. In 10 years with the **Seniors**, Les played two years in "A" Section, five years in "B", two in "C", and one in "D".

He was **club Best** and **Fairest** in 1970, **Runner-up** in "D" Section **Best** and **Fairest** in 1973 and was nominated for interstate selection in 1968 and 1970. In total he played 218 games with the **Bankers** (184 Senior, 2 Reserves, 32 Junior).


In 1974 and 1975 Les was Captain-Coach of St. Kev's and in 1974 won the club Best and Fairest award.

These were lean years, disappointing years, marked by a shortage of players and the sort of general apathy which frequently besets a club which has stayed long and unsuccessfully in the one Section.

It is enormously to Les' credit that, having decided not to continue as Coach he elected to stay on as a player under Alan Olle. He was unanimously elected Captain and has played a large part in St. Kev's current revival playing in the ruck and on the forward line and constantly encouraging and directing the play of his young side.

Keen supporter Kath is difficult to recognise today as the mother who discouraged her schoolboy son from playing football at St. Thomas, Clifton Hill. Les is married to Margaret and is the father of three young children.

Well done, Les! On your current form a target of 300 amateur games is more than merely illusory.

Twenty-nine year-old Neil Leckie has had eight seasons with Coburg but has played only about 80 or so games with them since his first appearance with the Juniors in 1965.


He has missed quite a number through injury and other causes including a sojourn in the Army during his National Service days.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

By Kevin McKay

Former St. Kilda player, "Stevie Rae" now in his first year as an umpire with the V.F.L. made the following statement in the V.F.L. Record last week — I believe it is worth repeating —

"When you are a player and hit by an opponent or insulted, you almost always instinctively lash out, but as an umpire you just have to keep your self-control.

"As for fitness, I am now far, far fitter than any time I played football, and I've only umpired Federal and Diamond Valley Seconds and Thirds so far.

"I cannot recommend umpiring too highly to the young player who is injury prone or who isn't consistently winning a place in the team.

"The companionship between umpires is something that has to be experienced to be believed." (End of Statement.)

These comments are from a man who has played the top brand of football in Australia.

Surely with all our clubs in the Amateur Football Association there must be some "injury prone" young men wanting to stay in the sport — think about it for next season.

All umpires join with me in congratulating Peter O'Donohue on his appointment as coach of the Carnival team and also to all of the players selected to represent Victoria in Adelaide.

We wish them complete success in the Carnival.

Former Reservoir Old Boys player, Kevin Grose was seen in a new role a couple of weeks ago — as field umpire in a Schoolboys match, didn't get a very good report from the players, the boys reckon he was too technical?

LAWS OF THE GAME HOLDING THE BALL — HOLDING THE MAN

If this rule is fully understood by coaches and players it will be realized that it is really the easiest of rules to apply.

The spirit of this law is to keep the ball in motion.

1. A player in possession of the ball, when held by an opponent firmly enough to stop him or retard his progress should be given a reasonable chance of disposing of it, either by kicking or handballing, otherwise a free kick shall be awarded to his opponent for holding the ball.

2. A player who lies on or over the ball is deemed to be in possession of it.

3. A player not in possession of the ball, when held by an opponent, shall be awarded a free kick — for holding the man.

4. If a player is in the act of kicking or handballing and he is swung off balance, and his foot or hand does not connect with the ball — play on.

5. If a player is bumped and the ball falls from his hands — play on.

6. When a player is knocked on the arm or elbow, causing him to drop the ball — play on.

7. When a player has his arms pinned to his sides, causing him to drop the ball — play on.

8. A player pulled by one arm or swung and the ball falls from his hand — play on.

9. When a player has the ball held to his body by another player — ball up.

The spirit of this law is to keep the ball in motion.

MANSON RUSSEL

Chairman of the V.A.F.A. Executive

From a champion player in the 1950's to a top administrator in the 1970's — that is the story of MANSON RUSSEL, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Victorian Amateur Football Association since 1971.

Manson started with Old Scotch in 1948 at the age of 18, and continued playing with the club until the end of the 1963 season.

He first gained a place in the Victorian team for the 1951 Carnival in Melbourne, but was injured on the Saturday prior to the commencement of the Carnival and was forced to withdraw from the side.

So he made his Victorian debut against South Australia at Adelaide, in 1952, when he won the award for Best Player in the Victorian side.


Manson went to Adelaide the following year as a member of the Victorian Carnival team, and in 1954 he again had to withdraw from the State side on account of injury. He missed selection in 1955 but rejoined the Victorian team for the Hobart Carnival in 1956.

Carnivals seemed to be his specialty for his next (and last) appearance in a Victorian sweater was at the 1959 Perth Carnival, when he was almost 30 years of age.

(I well remember Manson played no small part in lifting Victoria out of a tough spot to beat Tasmania in that Carnival, when the Tassie boys looked to have the game won at three-quarter-time. That was the beginning of Tasmania's burst of glory in Interstate Amateur Football, which lasted for a number of years, but which, unfortunately, appears to have again subsided — Ed.)

If it had not been for that ill-timed injury in 1951, Manson would have been the first Victorian player to have represented the State in four Carnival series.

But there was some consolation

for missing that Carnival — Manson won the A Section Best and Fairest award that year.

He also won Old Scotch Best and Fairest award in 1951 and again in 1954, and was voted the Best Team Player on four occasions—1953, 1955, 1956 and 1957.

In his 16 seasons with the club as a player, he chalked up 251 games, was Leading Goal-kicker six times and kicked approximately 700 goals — a truly fine effort.

His playing position? — Well, with his 5' 7" weighing a whole 10.10, what could he be but a rover?

After being Vice-Captain in 1951, Manson was Captain of Old Scotch from 1952 to 1954 and again in 1957. He was Captain and Coach in 1958, 1959, 1960 and 1963, his last playing season.

He is a Life Member of Old Scotch Football and Cricket clubs and Vice-President of both clubs.

So much for his playing career — what of the administrative side?

He was Old Scotch Delegate to the V.A.F.A. from 1949 to 1971 and was elected to the Umpire Committee in 1965. He remained a member of this Committee until 1973.

In 1963 he was appointed to the Selection Committee and has been Chairman since 1967.

Manson was elected a member of the Executive Committee in 1965, and was appointed Chairman in 1971, the same year in which he was elected a Vice-President of the V.A.F.A.

He is also a member of the Sports Council of Victoria.

So Manson Russel has given nearly 30 years service to the V.A.F.A., like Johnny Walker is "still going strong", and there's no reason to believe that he won't continue to do so for many years to come.

BLUES VETERAN

FINALLY MADE THE BIG "V"

After playing with University Blues since 1968, Tim Standish finally made the Victorian side last season.

Tim, one of the Blues' veterans with nearly 150 games to his credit, at 26 years of age showed that experience can be an important facet in our game.

Standing 6' 4½" and tipping the scales at 14 stone, it is logical that Tim should be a ruckman.

That was the position he filled in the match against Tasmania in 1975 when he was one of the best players.

The previous year he was runner-up in the Blues' Best and Fairest voting to Barry Church, but won the award last season.

On the administrative side of football, Tim was a Vice-President of Melbourne University Football Club in 1974 and 1975 but relinquished the position at the start of this season.

Tim, who is a civil engineer, was in the Victorian squad this year but was unable to make him-

self available for the trip and had to withdraw.




