SKOB and Fields meet as form sides

Round 8 of William Buck Premier Men's football kicks off with **St Bernard's** hosting **University Blues** in the RSN Carnival Match of the Round from the Snake Pit. It's the Past Players Day for the Snow Dogs and they'll be hoping to turn their fortunes around in front of their former stars after losing four games on the trot. Last week's performance against SKOB was improved as they trailed by just three points at the last break until they fell away with one goal to six in the fourth. Unfortunately for them, the task doesn't get much bigger than a University Blues side that has returned to form with a 63-point win over Old Trinity. After kicking a season-low 5.18 in Round 6, the Blues were led by Kieran Harper (4), Alex Fasolo (4) and Dan Batarilo (3) last week, with the latter firming in the club's best & fairest count.

St Kevin's OB and **Caulfield Grammarians** will meet in the clash of the form sides, with both sides having won their past four games. SKOB kicked away from the Snow Dogs in their latest clash, and it was Josh Wallis who continued his outstanding form as BOG. After losing their opening three games, the Fields have become a scoring powerhouse with an average of 115 points from their past four wins. Brett Eddy kicked four after booting six in Round 6, while Dane Crognae delivered his best game for the season.

Old Brighton will enter their Round 8 match-up with **Old Scotch** as favourites following just their second loss of the season against Old Xavs last weekend. The Tonners trailed by 13 points at three quarter time but were overrun in the fourth as Xavs piled on six goals to two. The Tonners will be without Jack Watts after he injured his hamstring in the third quarter but will be buoyed by the outstanding debut performances of Joel Crocker and Cal Wellings. After winning two in a row against St Bernard's and Uni Blues, Scotch came crashing down via a 73-point loss to Caulfield Grammarians. The Cardinals kicked a season-low three goals at Glenhuntly Oval, but had another strong performance from young ruckman, Tom Ansell.

Old Xaverians will take their strong form to Elsternwick Park this weekend as they take on **Old Melburnians**. Xavs were sensational against Old Brighton as they won their first game on the Beach Oval in over a decade with Will Hams, Ryan Schoenmakers and Dan Robinson leading from the front. After losing a tight one to Uni Blues with a score of 71, Xavs have pieced together three games of 96 points or more with a forward 50 of Grant Valles, Xavier Richards, Michael Batten and Schoenmakers. OM's snapped a two-game losing streak when they defeated Collegians by 19 points at the Trott. Jackson Paine, Nick De Steiger and Gus Borthwick continued their impressive form while Sam Dunell went forward and kicked four as he continues to have a significant impact in the games he's available.

Old Trinity's search for win numero uno continues this weekend when they host **Collegians**. In a battle of 9th vs 10th, the T's will see this as an opportunity against an undermanned Lions side that has just one win itself. The Lions will be better for the run after welcoming Sam Hibbins and Josh Prudden back last week, while the T's were once again well served by their litany of young players.

Bloods, Blackers, Beauy & Royal Blues pull away in Premier B

After some fortunate results in Round 7 that saw the Tigers and CYs slip up, **De La Salle** have now taken command of a top 4 spot, sitting two games clear of fifth and a matchup with the struggling **AJAX** to follow. Despite sitting big names in Darren Minchington, Fraser Cameron and Antony Forato, De La made short work of the winless Vultures on the back of 12 individual goal kickers, coming out on top by 90 points in what was their largest winning margin since Round 6, 2018. The Jackas' scoring issues once again caused them problems as they managed just 34 points on the afternoon in their 44-point loss to Uni Blacks, their second lowest total for the year. AJAX average just 51 points per match, ranked ahead of only Parkdale. The omission of forward Brandon Joel from their Round 7 side certainly did not help their scoring issues and will need him back if they're any chance of stealing a win from the streaking De La. Look for David Madigan and crew to control this one from the outset and avoid the Jackas grind-it-out style of play, as a free-flowing game led by Hugh Nicholson will lead De La to the four points.

As stated above, the **University Blacks** got back on the winners list as they downed AJAX by 44 points to keep pace with ladder leaders Haileybury. Missing key pieces Matt Dea and Alastair Robbins, the Blackers were unaffected as they piled on 28 scoring shots to nine en route to their fourth 40+ point win on the year. Goal kicking accuracy has been a slight issue developing over the last month for Uni, going 42.61 over the last four matches, a problem they'll tidy up come seasons end. Travelling to Uni Oval this weekend will be **Old Carey**, who currently sit in ninth spot and with three straight losses in tow, it's fair to say 2021 hasn't gone to plan so far for Simon Pasinati. Running into the buzzsaw that is Beaumaris, the Panthers were big outsiders with the loss of key-big Harrison Bean during the week, a loss that could be felt from the outset as they were held goalless in the opening term for the first time since round seventeen 2019. If Bean can't return this weekend for Carey, look for Uni Blacks to take control early and push the Panthers to their fourth loss in a row.

Winners of six straight and by an average margin of 45 points during that span, **Old Haileyburians** are absolutely scorching right now. The ladder leaders took home a comprehensive 60-point victory over the CYs on the weekend, their third win by over ten goals so far this year. As it has been all season for the Bloods, their ability to convert inside-50 remains an elite trait for this side, averaging a league best 97 points per match led by Durras Seccull, Samuel Loewe, Corey Connelly and Noah Gawn. As Haileybury travel down the Nepean Hwy to Gerry Green Reserve, **Parkdale Vultures** will attempt to re-enact David & Goliath and knock off this unstoppable locomotive. Averaging 31 points per match and conceding 117, the growing pains for Parkdale are well and truly apparent as they continue to gallantly compete.

After coming up short in their Round 7 clash with Haileybury and a win by De La, **Williamstown CYMS** now find themselves in sixth spot and two full games off the pace of the top 4. The loss of Brad Tucker prior to their Round 7 clash put the CYs on the backfoot from the outset, and despite holding firm heading into the main break, they were blitzed by a 13-goal to 3 effort in the second half, going down by an even 10 goals. Going through the year LWLWLW so far, it'll be up to **Fitzroy** to break the trend and give the CYS their first set of back-to-back losses since 2018. Under the lights of Brunswick Street Oval, the Roys' ended their four-game losing streak with an incredible game-winning goal after the siren by Donovan Toohey, kicking truly from 45m out and celebrating accordingly with the Roys' faithful flooding the park. An incredible moment that could be a major turning point for their second half of the year. This clash should be a beauty, with both sides sitting around average in scoring and defence, this'll be a clash won in the midfield, with the likes of Tom Johnstone and Dylan Jones going against the hero Toohey and Ted Clayton.

Our final clash for Round 8 will see **Beaumaris** return to Banksia Reserve for a clash with the reeling **St Bedes/Mentone Tigers** who had their heart-broken by the virtuosity of Toohey and Fitzroy. The Sharks brilliance so far this year can be predominately chalked up to their backbone who, led by Lewis Diggins, week-in and week-out continue to put opposing forward structures in the grinder, conceding just 46 points a clash. On top of this, Chris Grigoriadis and company at the other end of the ground trail only Haileybury for most points per match at 84. This is a well-oiled machine that can beat almost anyone when they are on. The Tigers led pretty much the entire evening after Q1 in their round seven clash and if it wasn't some late-game heroics from the home side, they would have been staring at three on the trot and in line for a top 4 spot with a win this weekend. I'm eager to see how Bedes respond after last weeks finish, we all know the classiness of Michael Barnes, Zac Calvez and James Mangoni will shine through, but they will need a performance from all 22 if they wish to knock off Beauy at Shark Park.

Premier C recovers from five blockbusters

In what was the first of five massive games in Premier C this week, **Mazenod** defeated **Hampton** by 26 points at Central Reserve. The first quarter was all about accurate kicking, as most spectators will agree, Hampton was the better team in the first quarter but they were only able to convert three of their nine scoring shots. While the Nodders kicked six straight to hold a two-goal lead after one. With the wind now, Mazenod piled on four more and held the Rovers to only two points and by half time the match looked over. Hampton kicked six goals to four in the second half, but they could not make up the difference losing as strong favourites for the second straight week. Dillon Melnjak was prolific for the Rovers, and in-form winger Chris Perkins was once again in the best. Star mid-forward Christian Carnovale also kicked three (six in the last two weeks). For Mazenod, Samuel Michael was best on as he put on yet another dominant display in the middle. Mazenod has now won three on the trot, and it is no surprise with Tom Warby and Simon Hall leading a strong defence which held Nathan Smith (20 goals) and Max Coughlin (17 goals) goalless for the day. The Nodders will perhaps face an even bigger test when they travel to face Ormond this week and a win there could skyrocket them into contender status. The Rovers have dropped the last two after such a positive start to the year and they will face Marcellin at home this week.

Old Geelong put last week behind them putting together a strong win against **Marcellin** at Como Park. Strong play around the ground from the Eagles allowed them to get off to a red hot start, leading by 16 at half time behind a dominant midfield display from Anypas, Tyquin and Perry. However, despite a great effort, the Oggars elite rose in the third kicking six goals to one and taking a nine-point lead into the final break which they would be able to defend. Jack Sheridan held Marcellin's two-pronged ruck attack at bay in a best on gourd performance, while the usual suspects, Scott Dixon and John Simson were instrumental in Old Geelong's comeback. Lacking firepower up forward, the Oggars were stoked to see the return of Christian Hatzis who kicked four. Old Geelong will face Old Mentone away this week while the 2-5 Marcellin, who incredibly sit 8th despite not losing a game by more than 21 points all year, will travel to face Hampton who will do all they can to avoid dropping three in a row.

In our match of the round, first versus second, **Monash** kept their unbeaten season going defeating **Ormond** by 11 points at Frearson Oval. The match was touted as a battle of the two best defences and boy oh boy did it live up to the ticket. The first was heavily contested, but Max Kennedy and Tom Buckley were able to get the edge in the middle resulting in Ormond leading by a goal after one. As Monash pushed in the second, Ormond's defence held strong and had the underdogs up by 14 points at half time. The start of the third was just as contested as the first, but in-form mids Daniel Easson and Beau Harris started to get on top in the middle and eventually, the Monders' defence started to let a few through as the Blues kicked four goals to one to take a three-point lead. An early Blake Picone goal put the Monders up, but it was Monash

kicking the final two of the game to run away winners. Matthew Suckling put on a display for the ages off half back, while Jeremy Simon continues to put his hand up as the best centre-half-back in the comp holding Mitch King to just one goal. MacGregor Cameron refuses to take a day off, as he was once again best on ground taking contested grabs and putting the ball on a platter for the Monash mids. The Blues will travel to UHS-VU who have been showing some real form of late. Ormond is clearly lacking some firepower up forward with Tolongs and Cathcart out for extended periods, and it will not get any easier when they host a red-hot Mazenod looking to make it four on the trot.

Old Ivanhoe put together a massive win beating **Old Mentonians** by 30 points at Keysborough Playing Field. Old Mentone was coming off an incredible win against the Rovers, but it took them until the second quarter to get going as they trailed by six a half time. The third was owned by the Hoers midfield as the Panthers struggled to find a way to stop big Alex Mirkov in the ruck. After three, the Hoers held a six-goal lead and were able to hold on in a contested last quarter to take out an impressive win. Despite Mirkov's dominance, Josh Gorman and Darcy 'Doc' Brown were able to put together strong games for the Panthers kicking five between them out of the midfield. Despite this, Old Mentone could not stop the play of Ben Oliver or Daniel Stanford who kicked four on the day. Old Ivanhoe will host Preston as they look to enter the top four. Old Mentone will host Old Geelong.

There would have been a big night back at Brens Oval after **UHS-VU** won their first game in the Premier sections for 44 years as they beat **Preston** by seven points. With a strong wind, the Bullants, behind the play of Gerard Sutton, kicked four goals to one but the Vultures answered in the second holding an eight-point lead at half time. From there it was contested footy. A battle of who wanted it more. In the end, UHS-VU got their revenge for the 2019 D1 Grand Final walking away victors. Big Fraser Allen took over in the ruck, kicking two on route to a best on ground display while star mid Esubalew Ramsay had a day out. Preston will be disappointed, having been in so many matches this year, but they will have another opportunity when they face Old Ivanhoe this week. UHS-VU are now only a game away from climbing out of relegation but they will have the tough task of hosting the unbeaten Monash Blues.




