

COBURG UNBEATEN AT HALF-WAY MARK IVANHOE'S SHOCK DEFEAT OF M.H.S. SETBACK TO COLLEGIANS' HOPES

With half of the home-and-home matches completed, Coburg remain at the head of the list, undefeated. Five other teams have yet to suffer defeat in other sections — UHS Old Boys, and four Reserve teams, Ormond, Univer-Army Apprentices School in Junior Section 2 have not been beaten but were forced to forfeit last week's match, together with today's and next week's.

Ivanhoe surprised Melbourne High by leading practically all day and runivannue surprised menodime righ by leading practically an day and run-ning on to win by 23 points. It was High's second successive defeat and they

Collegians' hopes, boosted as a result of two wins in a row, suffered a

setback when they went down narrowly to De La Salle.

Coburg proved far too strong for Monash University and were never in danger of defeat. They led by more than 9 goals at three-quarter time and went further ahead in a sensational last term when 16 goals were scored - 10 by Coburg and 6 by Monash. Ormond overwhelmed a very disappointing Old Paradians who showed very little worthwhile form and

Ormond won by 18 goals. De La Salle's pace and teamwork

gave them the advantage over Col-legians, who trailed by 39 points at the last change, and although Collegians rattled home in fine style to kick 8-2 in the final term they could not quite bridge the gap and were

A burst of 11 goals in the second quarter paved the way for Old Xaverians to score a big win over Alphington, Commonwealth Bank gave little trouble to Old Scotch and North Old Boys easily beat Kew.

over Assumption, who managed only one goal in the first half, when they were more than 10 goals behind. They showed better form in the second half but U.H.S. won by 73 points.

Old Carey faded out in the second half and went down by a goal to Tooronga-Malvern who had won only one game previously.

Old Geelong ran right away from Old Brighton after the interval to win by more than 9 goals, while Glenhuntly with a burst of 7 goals in the last term beat St. Kevin's by 40 points. It was only the second win for Glenhuntly and it pushed St. Kevin's down from second to fourth.

Fairfield scored a crushing 55-point win over the leaders, Parkside, after a fairly even first half and Parkside lost top place to Old Trinity as a result of this defeat.



A player who has played with a club in the V.A.F.A. this season, and has subsequently played with another club, must stand down for two matches before being eligible to play for his V.A.F.A. club again.

In a case such as this, the date on which he last played with the other club must be shown on his permit application.

Running over opponent's mark (Rule

In the event of an opponent going over the mark when a player is kickfor goal from a mark or a free kick and a goal has been scored the field umpire shall give the "all clear" and the goal shall be counted.

If a goal has not been scored, the player shall be given the option of another kick.

When an opponent goes over any player's mark, the field umpire shall stop the play, direct time-on to be added and allow the player another kick (except as provided in Rule 10 above) unless such action would penalise the side offended against.

- Little things ALL should know 1. The lines in front of goal posts are the kick-off line NOT the goal square.
- 2. Time added is time-on NOT time-off.
- 3. All clear is the signal given to the goal umpire by the field umpire — indicating that the goal umpire is at liberty to decide whether a goal or behind should be recorded.
- 4. Goal umpires are the sole judges of scores.
- 5. The ball must be **completely over** the scoring or boundary line before a goal or behind can be scored, or to be out of bounds.
