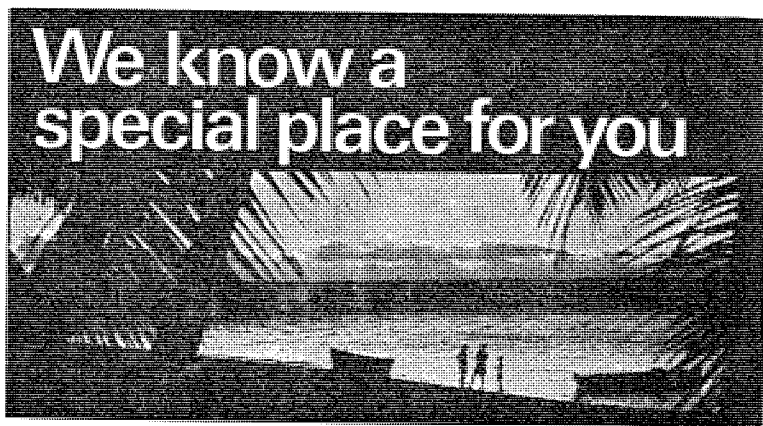

ORMOND'S SECOND HALF BEATS CAUL. GRAM. Coburg Shaky Until Last Term Close Call For Several Leaders — One Beaten

After trailing Caulfield Grammarians in the first half Ormond showed great improvement after the interval and ran out winners by 14 points.

Coburg were not over-impressive for three quarters against Collegians but turned in a strong last quarter when they kicked 9-2 to 1-2 and won by a big margin.

Several leading teams had close calls, and one of them, Old Trinity, suffered defeat.

Ormond's poor kicking got them into trouble and they were 25 points behind Caulfield at half-time but they added 5-9 to a goal in the third term, and went further ahead in the last quarter.

Collegians were within 8 points of Coburg early in the last quarter but then Coburg cut loose and doubled their three-quarter-time score to finish with the remarkably accurate score of 18.4.

De La Salle and Old Paradians battled out a low scoring even game. They were level at quarter time and and De La led by 5 points at the interval, but broke away in the third term to lead by 19 points. Parade struggled valiantly to wipe off their leeway in the last quarter but went down by a point.

Melbourne High's inaccurate kicking robbed them of the chance to score a big win over University Blues, who put in a poor first half. High led by 17 points at half-time and three-quarter-time and just managed to hold the Blues off to win by 3 points.

Monash University opened well at Ivanhoe and led the home side by 10 points at half-time but Ivanhoe gradually wore them down and won in a close finish by 8 points.

Alphington gave Geelong a fright when they led for more than three quarters of the game. Geelong were 26 points down at the last change, but rattled home in a great finish to

add 8-1 in the final term and win by 17 points.

Old Scotch were also in trouble against Kew until the third quarter when they came away and scored by 15 points.

University Blacks and Old Xaverians were engaged in a torrid struggle with the Blacks emerging winners by 7 points.

Uni. High kicked only 2 points against Tooronga-Malvern in the first half, and were 5 goals behind, but they added 5 goals in the third quarter and struggled home by 3 points.

Old Haileybury put up a poor showing against St. Kilda CBC, who were always well in command and won by nearly 10 goals.

National Bank surprised Assumption and led throughout to score by 17 points.

Old Trinity crashed against AMP Society who opened up a winning lead in the first quarter. Trinity could not recover from the 6-goal deficit and were beaten by 20 points.

Old Brighton trailed St. Kevin's in the first half but finished too strongly for their opponents and won by 20 points. This defeat cost St. Kevin's their place in the four. Old Geelong moving into fourth position.

Old Camberwell went away from Elsternwick in the last quarter and won by 3 goals, displacing Elsternwick from the four.

Reservoir Old Boys gave their percentage a boost when they kicked a big score (28-36) against Old Essendon who failed to score.

The four top teams in Junior Section 1 recorded wins. Old Scotch's shocking kicking (1-14 at half-time) gave them some anxious moments against St. Bernard's but they eventually won quite comfortably.

There was some big scoring in Section 2 — Caulfield Grammar kicked the huge score of 42-24 (276 points) against AJAX and Elsternwick kicked 30-16 (196 points) to National Bank's 12-10.

Among the Reserves Coburg finished well to beat Collegians by 13 points and Ivanhoe did the same to beat Monash by 4 goals. North Old Boys beat Footscray Tech by 7 points. Power House easily beat Old Melburnians. Old Trinity beat AMP Society by 31 points. Old Xaverians beat Brunswick by only 9 points. AJAX beat ANZ Bank by a goal and Old Camberwell surprised Elsternwick with a 6-point win.

ADMISSION TICKETS

Admission tickets issued to clubs for matches at Elsternwick Park are for the use of players and officials only. Any player who cannot produce a ticket will be required to pay for admittance.

PERMITS CLOSE SOON

Applications for permits for season 1970 will close with the Records Secretary of the V.A.F.A. Mr. Bruce De Lacy, 67 Charman Road, Mentone. 3194 on July 1st.

The only application considered after that date will be that of a player affiliated with a club in the amateur body of South Australia, Western Australia or Tasmania, who is transferred to Victoria in his employment, or a National Serviceman who returns to Victoria.

A player who has played with a club in the V.A.F.A. this season, and has subsequently played with another club, must stand down for two matches before being eligible to play for his V.A.F.A. club again.

In a case such as this, the date on which he last played with the other club must be shown on his permit application.

Re-registration of a player whose permit is still in force, that is, a player who has not played with any other club since he last played with the club with which he is seeking re-registration may be made at any time up to the last home and home match.

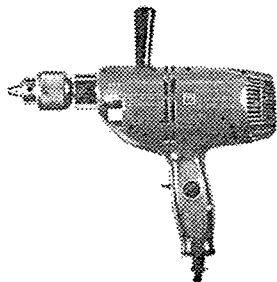
