

ORMOND FAIL TO STOP COBURG'S RUN GREAT FINISH BY COLLEGIANS Old Scotch Down To North Old Boys

Ormond failed to stop Coburg's unbeaten run when they met in the main match of the last round a fortnight ago, and Coburg ran out winners by 16 points.

Collegians put in a great last quarter effort against Monash University to turn what looked like certain defeat into a 22-point win. They added 10-2 to

for Coburg's inaccuracy in front of goal, the leaders drew away in the second term and had established a 25-point lead at the interval.

Coburg went further ahead in the third quarter and appeared to have a firm grip on the game when they were 40 points in front at three-time, but Ormond rallied in the last quarter and really made a game of it, finally going down by 16 points.

Monash had the edge on Collegians in the first half and after leading by a goal at half-time, cleared right away in the third term to hold a 38-point advantage at the last change. Collegians swamped them in the last quarter and won by a comfortable

Old Paradians Grammar in the first half, but rattled on 7-7 to 3 goals in the third quarter, and went down in a fighting finish by

Melbourne High were always in front of De La Salle and their extremely accurate kicking played a big part in their 27-point win. They finished with 16-2, and kicked 11 goals straight after the first quarter.

University Blues built up a winning lead over Ivanhoe in the first half, and carried on to win by more than 8 goals.

North Old Boys led Old Scotch by 43 points at three-quarter-time (14 points at the interval), and although Scotch held North scoreless in the

last term, the leeway was too great.
Geelong and Commonwealth Bank were locked in a close tussle all day with Geelong emerging victors by a point, after trailing for most of the game.

Alphington held University Blacks for three quarters but the Students broke away in the last to add 8 goals and win easily.

Kew trailed Old Xaverians for ree quarters but finished too three strongly to win by 15 points, and St. Bernard's proved too strong throughout for Footscray Tech.

Uni. High crashed against Old Carey who led by 2 goals at half-time but went right away in the last quarter to score by 38 points. It was Un High's first defeat for the season. It was Uni.

St. Kilda CBOC also finished too strongly for their opponents, Old Melburnians, who went down by 47 points after trailing by only 10 points

to spare.

West Brunswick snatched a 3-point win against Caulfield Grammar, who were 13 points in front at half-time, and Power House just scraped home by 2 points from Tooronga-Malvern.

Notable amongst the Reserves were Ormond's easy win from Coburg, Parade's 6-point victory over Caulfield Grammar whose kicking let them down, and Monash's close struggle with Collegians, who ran them to 9 points. Xavier pipped Kew by a point, St. Bernard's beat Footscray Tech. by 11 points, Uni. High crushed Old Carey by 33 points, Old Geelong beat Old Trinity by 8, Parkside beat St. Kevin's by 11, and Elsternwick beat State Savings Bank by the barest possible margin (one point).

AJAX beat La Trobe University by

15 points and Reservoir Old Boys finished 25 points in front of Old Xaverians.



UMPIRE'S CORNER

DEFINITIONS OF THE LAWS

A. Holding the Ball. - A player shall be deemed to be holding the ball if he retains possession of it while being firmly held by an opponent.

B. Holding the Man. — A player shall not be deemed to be held within the meaning of these laws unless he is held firmly enough to stop or retard his progress.

C. Handball is clearly holding the ball with one hand and striking it with the clenched fist of the other hand.

D. Charging is violently meeting and pushing a player, in a manner not authorised by these laws, when he is not in possession of the ball or when he is in the air.

Law 15. — How player may be checked-

A. A player with the ball may be fairly met by an opponent by the use of the hip, shoulder, chest, arms or open hands.

B. A player may be pushed in the chest or side or shepherded in accordance with these laws, by an opponent, provided the ball is not more


my other colleagues Pussy Cat and Gympie, I suppose you are still debating that close finish. —The Bleeder.
