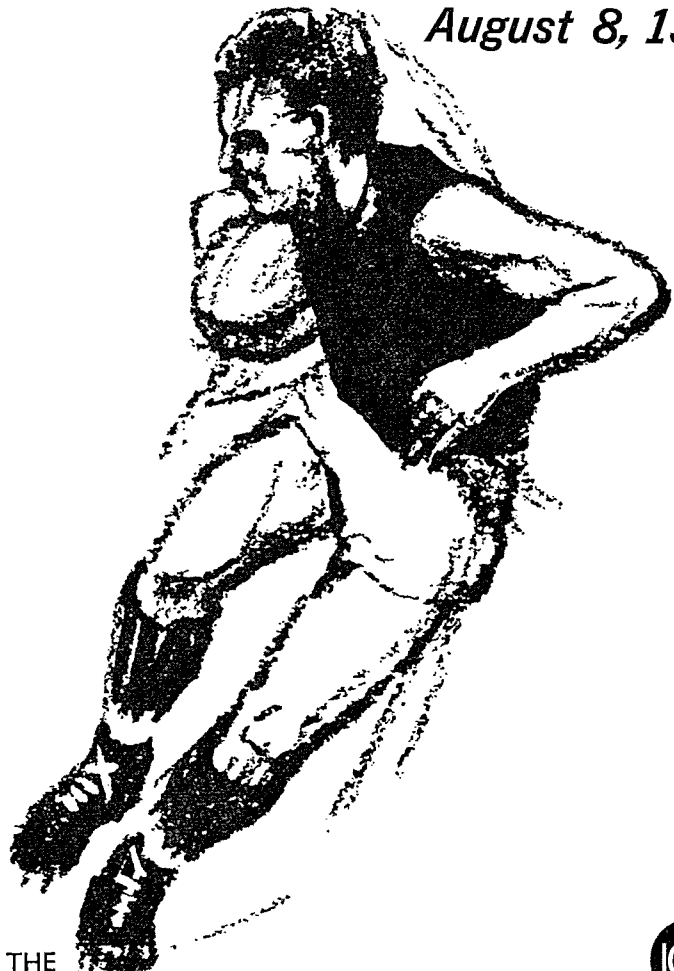

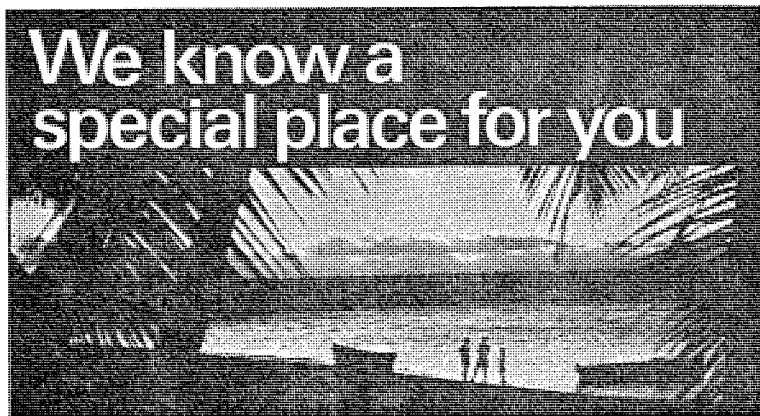

# UNIVERSITY BLUES DOWN MONASH

## Melbourne High Lose Third in Row

### Two Leaders Beaten

Monash University lost their chance of slipping into the four last Saturday when they went down to University Blues in a low-scoring game.

Ormond kicked three goals against the wind in the last quarter and beat Melbourne High by 26 points. It was High's third successive defeat but they held their place in the four as a result of Monash's defeat.

Geelong went further ahead in B Section where there are now four teams equal second — Old Scotch, St. Bernard's, University Blacks and North Old Boys.

Two leaders, Fairfield and Power House Reserves, were beaten and eleven other teams in the four suffered defeat, while another could manage only a draw.

The wind played havoc with the Monash-Blues game. Monash opened with two quick goals and led by 4 points at half-time. Blues crept up to level the scores at the final change and added 3 goals in the last quarter to take the points.

Melbourne High's defence did well to hold Ormond when they had the wind in the first and third quarters. Ormond led by 2 points at the interval and were 31 points in front at three-quarter-time.

It was by no means an impossible task for High but they failed to finish on.

Old Paradians gave Coburg quite some trouble for three quarters and led by 4 goals at three-quarter-time but Coburg kicked 7-8 to one point in the last term and won by 25 points.

A 7-goal burst in the second quarter carried Ivanhoe to a 2-goal lead over Collegians at half-time, but Collegians recovered in the second half and their defence held Ivanhoe out in the last quarter to win by a single point.

This win lifted Collegians off the bottom of the list to eighth and pushed Ivanhoe down into the relegation zone. But the two teams to go down will probably not be finally decided until the last home-and-home round next week.

Caulfield Grammar looked to have De La Salle's measure when they led by 4 goals at half-time but "De La" hit back after the interval and Caulfield scored by only 17 points.

University Blacks gave Geelong some anxious moments, leading by 20 points at the interval but Geelong emerged clear winners by that same margin. North Old Boys beat Old Xaverians by only 9 points and St. Bernard's accounted for Kew by 20 points.

Old Scotch were much too strong for Footscray Tech. and moved up to second place while Commonwealth Bank, with 12 goals in the second term, made themselves safe from relegation with a big win over Al-phington.

St. Kilda CBC kept in the running for the four with a sound win over Assumption (second), the margin being 38 points. Old Melburnians sneaked home by 5 points from Old Hailey-bury who are now only fourth on percentage from O.M.'s and St. Kilda.

Uni. High overwhelmed Hampton Rovers and Old Carey scored a big win over Power House, while Tooronga-Malvern beat National Bank by 8 points.

Old Geelong dented AMP Society's final four hopes when they won by 22 points, and St. Kevin's, with a big win over Glenhuntly, are still in the running being only a game outside the four.

Leaders, Fairfield, went down by 10 points to West Brunswick, and now hold top place only on percentage from Old Trinity. Parkside (second) can blame poor shooting for goal for being able to manage only a draw with Old Brighton.

Old Trinity beat St. Pat's by 2 goals in a high-scoring game — 19-12 to 17-12. Brunswick crushed State Savings Bank by more than 9 goals to push Bank out of the four, their place being taken by Old Camberwell who scored by 21 points from ANZ Bank.

Dookie and Longerenong surprised Old Mentonians and won a low-scoring encounter by 17 points, and in another low-scorer, Reservoir Old Boys beat La Trobe University by 9 points.

In the Juniors, Ormond crushed Old Scotch to the tune of 19 goals and University beat Ivanhoe by nearly as much. Melbourne High finished well to score comfortably over Old Paradians. Army Apprentices suffered their first defeat on the field when they went under to Old Brighton by 9 points.

Elsternwick were the unlucky side — they kicked 20-14 (134 points) and

were beaten by a point, as West Brunswick kicked 19-21 (135).

Notable results among the Reserves were the Blues' 11-point win over Monash, Old Scotch's comfortable win (4 goals) over Footscray Tech., and Power House's 17-point defeat by Old Carey. Reservoir Old Boys beat La Trobe by 13 points and Brunswick beat State Savings Bank by 16 points.

The Monash backline stood up well under great pressure last Saturday, Tim Collie, Stuart Galbraith and John Kelly turned Blues out well all day, using intelligent football in co-operating with the half back line of Phil Knight, John North and Rod Lane. Well done fellas! Keep it up!

It is good to see Jeff Brown back in action for Ivanhoe after many weeks out with an ankle injury. Brownie is a man of few words, but on the football field his actions speak for themselves.

**COLLEGIANS:** Harry Troit Oval, Albert Park, at rear of MacRobertson Girl's High School. (St. Kilda Road tram (except Toorak) to Bowen Crescent.)

**DE LA SALLE OLD COLLEGIANS:** Glen Iris Oval, off High Street, near Glen Iris Station. (Train to Glen Iris or Glen Iris tram in Swanston Street to terminus.) **RESERVES:** Rightt Oval, off Glenferrie Road, Kooyang, opposite Kooyong Tennis Courts. (Train or Glenferrie Road tram to Kooyong Station.)

**IVANHOE:** Ivanhoe Recreation Reserve, Lower Heidelberg Road. (Train to Ivanhoe, walk

south along Marshall Street to Lower Heidelberg Road.)

**MELBOURNE HIGH SCHOOL OLD BOYS:** Melbourne High School Oval, Forrest Hill, South Yarra. (Train or Toorak Tram in Swanston Street to South Yarra Station. Cars enter from Chapel St. or Claremont St. — not Alexandra Ave.)

**MONASH UNIVERSITY:** Monash University Oval. (Train to Huntingdale, bus along North Road and Wellington Road to ground.)

**OLD PARADIANS:** Yarra Park, opposite Olympic Park. (Batman Avenue tram from Princes Bridge.)

**ORMOND:** Ormond Park. (Train to Ormond and walk North along Newham Grove.)

**UNIVERSITY BLUES:** University Oval. (Moreland or East Coburg tram in Swanston Street or Brunswick, Coburg or North Coburg tram in Elizabeth Street.) **RESERVES:** South-east corner of Princes Park, opposite Ormond College, Parkville. (Brunswick, Coburg or North Coburg tram in Elizabeth Street to College Crescent.)

## AGE, HEIGHT, WEIGHT

Clubs likely to be taking part in Semi-Finals and Finals are requested to furnish the Age, Height and Weight of players from whom the teams for these matches will be chosen, as soon as possible.

The information is required NOT LATER THAN WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 12th, but earlier lodgment will be appreciated.

Clubs with Senior and Reserve teams both in the Finals are requested to furnish separate lists, showing in the Reserve team list only those eligible to play with the Reserves, and omitting from the Senior list those players who have no chance of being selected in the senior team. It is understood that there may be a few players on both lists in these cases, however.

Lists must be in NUMERICAL ORDER, NOT ALPHABETICAL, and must be in the correct sequence — No., NAME, INITIALS, AGE, HEIGHT, WEIGHT.

### EXAMPLE:—

1. Smith, A. W. 19 6-1, 13-12, and so on.

Forward the information to The Amateur Footballer, Box 1564P, G.P.O. Melbourne, 3001.

## SEMI-FINAL AND FINAL MATCHES

In ALL SECTIONS other than A Section, A Reserve Section, B Section and B Reserve Section, both Semi-Finals will be played on August 22nd, Final on August 29th and Grand Final on September 5th.

In A Section, A Reserve Section, B Section and B Reserve Section, the First Semi-Final will be played on August 22nd, Second Semi-final on August 29th, Final on September 5th and Grand Final on September 12th.

In each case the First Semi-Final is played between the THIRD and FOURTH teams and the Second Semi-

Final between the FIRST and SECOND teams. The Final is between the WINNERS of the FIRST Semi-Final and the LOSERS of the SECOND Semi-Final. The Grand Final is between the WINNERS of the SECOND SEMI-FINAL and the WINNERS of the FINAL.

## ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals now reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day.

Provided that no player shall be eligible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

## PENNANTS, CAPTAINS

Clubs in the running for this year's premiership are requested to notify the Secretary of the V.A.F.A., of the colour requirements of the premiership pennant should they be successful in winning the premiership, for example — blue background, red border, white lettering. This information is required NOT LATER than Monday, August 17th.

The name, address and telephone number of your Captain should be included with the information regarding the Pennant, which must be submitted on Club letterhead.

# Important Notes — continued

## ARRANGEMENTS FOR FINALS

Clubs taking part in the final series must arrange between themselves the following:—

(a) Which club will wear black knicks, and which white.

(b) Which club will supply goal flags, time bell, numbers for scoring board etc.

Check with the home club of the ground being used whether these items are available.

(c) Check with the home club of the ground being used regarding keys to dressing rooms.

(d) EACH CLUB MUST PROVIDE ONE NEW BALL, the winners to have first choice of balls after the game.

(e) EACH CLUB MUST PROVIDE a Goal Umpire's Coat (laundered).

(f) EACH CLUB should arrange to provide its own boot last and hammer.

(g) EACH CLUB MUST BE PREPARED to supply a Boundary and Goal Umpire if required. (Independent Boundary and Goal Umpires may be supplied at some games.)

The WINNING CLUB is responsible for telephoning final scores to the HERALD Office and the PRESS CORRESPONDENT (with goalkickers and six best players being included in the call to the Press Correspondent — ALL SECTIONS).

## JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.
