HIGH SCORING IN OPENING ROUND Good Start to Season 1970

High scoring was a feature of the opening round of the 1970 season last Saturday, and there is every indication that the new season will be another most successful one.

No less than 39 teams kicked century scores and four teams who topped the 100 points were beaten. One team, West Brunswick Reserves, kicked 37-12 (234 points) — remarkably good kicking so early in the season, while Elsternwick Reserves also did well to kick 30-15 (195 points).

Four of last year's premiers were beaten — Ivanhoe, Commonwealth Bank, Fairfield and Hampton overs Reserves - Ivanhoe going down to De La Salle who were runners-up to them in B Section in 1969.

De La Salle established a winning lead in the first quarter when they kicked 10-3 to Ivanhoe's 2-2 and were in a strong position at half-time. The last term provided a feast of scoring when Ivanhoe kicked 9-4 to seven straight goals by De La Salle, who won by 53 points.

Last year's A Section premiers Coburg, had many anxious moments against Caulfield Grammar and it was only in the last 10 minutes that Coburg gained control and won by 16

Collegians looked safe against University Blues when they led by 23 points at the interval, but the Blues fought back strongly and Collegians scrambled home by 5 points with the last kick of the match.

Two goals against the wind early in the first quarter paved the way for Melbourne High to down Old Paradians in the game at Elsternwick Park, High led by 16 points at the halfway mark and finished well to score by 5 goals.

Ormond always looked to have the measure of Monash University and ran out winners by 37 points.

A strong first half gave University Blacks a firm grip of the game against Commonwealth Bank who were 6

goals down at this stage but came

back to be beaten by 27 points. St. Bernard's finished a little too strongly for North Old Boys after an even first half and won by 20 points and Old Scotch were too powerful for Old Xaverians who went down by nearly 8 goals.

Geelong overwhelmed Footscray Tech and Kew had 47 points to spare over Alphington after leading by only 8 points at half-time. Kew added 10-4 to 3-1 in the last term.

Assumption recovered well after a poor first half against Old Melburnians and went down by only 6 points. Old Haileybury and Hampton Rovers were level at half-time but Haileybury went on to win by 20 points.

Much the same happened in the Uni. High-Power House match when House trailed by only 5 points at the interval but were beaten by 20.

National Bank led Old Carey by 4 points at the interval but faded in the second half to be beaten by 22 points, but St. Kilda C.B.C. won easily from Tooronga-Malvern.

AMP Society and Fairfield were locked in a ding-dong struggle with AMP emerging victors by 4 points, and Parkside beat St. Kevin's by 2 goals.

West Brunswick led St. Pat's by only a point at the interval but went right away to win by more than 8 goals, while Old Trinity and Old Brighton scored comfortably over Old Geelong and Glenhuntly respectively.

Brunswick beat Reservoir Old Boys by 5 points in a thrilling finish, but other winners in E Section had plenty

to spare.

Junior Section matches were decided by big margins — the most notable result perhaps the impressive debut by new team Elsternwick, who beat Hampton Scouts by nearly 8 goals.

Among the Reserves Old Scotch beat Old Xaverians by a goal, Old Haileybury beat Hampton Rovers by 11 points, Fairfield scored by 3 points from AMP Society and AJAX beat Old Camberwell by 2 points.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

A most interesting and enlightening night from both a Coaches' and Umpires' view point was held on April 6th at Elsternwick. Representation however of only 29 of our 56 Clubs was a disappointing feature of the evening.

The meeting opened with a short address, and was then capably handled by the Chairman of the Umpire Committee Mr. Brian Le Brocq.

During the ensuing two hour question time many questions were put by the Coaches, and we feel as a result of these, many of their problems, which we will never eliminate entirely, will certainly occur on a vastly reduced scale.

The meeting then closed with an address from the Secretary of the V.A.F.A. Mr. Jack Fullerton, who also answered some queries relating to the administrative aspect of our competition.

One clarification is required however and is as follows:—

- (1) When a player goes behind the goal or behind line to take his kick, he may bring the ball into play either by kicking or handball, but only in the direction over his mark.
- (2) When a player goes over the boundary line to take his kick, he may also in this instance bring the ball into play either by kicking or handball, but not necessarily over his mark. Remember however, that once he plays on other than over his mark the Umpire will immediately call "play on" and he may then be tackled.


