

# PARADE SURPRISE ORMOND MELB. HIGH LOOK SAFE IN FOUR But Many Sections Still Wide Open Two Players Reach 100 Goals

Old Paradians caused an upset last Saturday when they outplaved Ormond and ran out winners by 10 points.

Melbourne High broke a run of four successive defeats with a big win

over Ivanhoe to virtually clinch their place in the four.

Coburg's star full-forward Rod McFarlane kicked three goals against Monash University to bring his tally to 100 for the season, kicked in 15 games.

He had kicked 97 prior to last week. State Savings Bank player, Paul Cavanagh, who needed only one goal for his century last Saturday also just managed to get there. He kicked only one — in the last quarter.

Although the A Section four is settled, barring a miracle, this is not the

case in many of the other Sections. The position is wide open in B and C

Sections particularly.

Monash's hopes of taking part in the finals have almost disappeared following their defeat by Coburg. Monash had more of the play than the leaders but failed to capitalise on many of their scoring opportunities through hurried kicking up forward.

Coburg had three fewer scoring shots but won by 27 points.

Old Paradians were too strong in the ruck for Ormond and gained a big lead in the first half being 34 points in front at half-time, and although Ormond rallied after the interval. Parade held on to win well.

They now have a good chance of

avoiding relegation.

De La Salle looked to have the edge on Collegians when they led by 15 points at half-time, and 11 points at the last change, but Collegians finished strongly to snatch a 2-point win.

A poor first half by University Blues, in which they kicked only 1-7 and trailed Caulfield Grammar by 38 points spoilt any chance the Blues had of winning and they went down by 19 points.

Melbourne High started against Ivanhoe and were 28 points ahead at half-time. Ivanhoe hit the front in the third term but High swamped them in the last when they added 8-6 to nothing, and won by 51 points.

St. Bernard's broke Geelong's winning run when they finished 2 goals in front, St. Bernard's opened well with the wind, but Geelong were only 3 points down at half-time.

Hampton Rovers surprised Old Melburnians in the first half and held a narrow lead, but OM's went right away in the second half to score by more than 7 goals.

Uni. High and Assumption were engaged in a low-scoring game, which

UMS won by 21 points.

Shocking inaccuracy in front of goals almost cost Old Geelong the match against Old Brighton, OGG's kicked 7-23 to 9-10 and scraped home by a point.

St. Kevin's trailed Old Trinity by 9 points, at the interval but finished on to win by 2 points.

Fairfield were too strong for Parkside, whose poor kicking (1-9 at half-time) contributed to their 10 point defeat.

Old Camberwell made themselves safe for the four when they scored a 4-goal win over State Savings Bank. A 5 goal burst in the third term clinched the game.

Elsternwick kept with Reservoir Old Boys in the first-half but Reservoir went away after the interval to

win by six goals.

In the Juniors, University beat Old Scotch by 32 points after being only a goal in front at half-time. Invanhoe were much too strong for Melbourne High and scored a big win.

In Section 2 National Bank had their second win for the season when they beat Parkside by 3 goals.

Most notable results in the Reserves were University Blues' easy win over Caulfield Grammar, and Coburg's 4-goal victory over Monash. Footscray Tech's accurate kicking (11-3) gave them a 1-point win over the Blacks. Assumption beat Uni. High by 20 points, Power House beat St. Kilda CBC by 9, Old Trinity easily beat St. Kevin's, Parkside went down to Fairfield by 3 points and Elsternwick beat Reservoir by 4 points. It was Reservoir's first defeat.

In B Section, four teams are level in second place, two games behind the leaders, Geelong — Old Scotch, University Blacks, St. Bernard's and North Old Boys.

The Blacks are at home to St. Bernard's today and North visit Geelong.

Assumption, Old Haileybury, St. Kilda CBC and Old Melburnians are equal third in C Section with only 7.7% separating them. Old Haileybury meet Old Carey (second) today and St. Kilda CBC play leaders Uni. High.

In D Section, St. Kevin's have just a faint chance of making the four, West Brunswick and Tooronga-Malvern are equal fourth in Junior Section 2. Fourth place is in the balance in four of the five Reserve Sec-

tions.

Failure to handle the blustery conditions and lack of team play saw the end of **De La Salle Reserves**' hopes for a win. Those who battled hard all day were **Danny Kean**, Paul Kingston, Mick Burke and old timer Faul.

Ian Johnston, Old Carey's dashing half back flanker was in good form last Saturday. He marked safely and relieved many attacks with great dash, making him Old Carey's best of a very

even side.



Lists must be in NUMERICAL ORDER, NOT ALPHABETICAL, and must be in the correct sequence -No., NAME, INITIALS, AGE, HEIGHT,

WEIGHT.

## SEMI-FINAL AND FINAL MATCHES

In ALL SECTIONS other than A Section, A Reserve Section, B Section and B Reserve Section, both Semi-Finals will be played on August 22nd, Final on August 29th and Grand Final on September 5th

In A Section, A Reserve Section, B Section and B Reserve Section, the First Semi-Final will be played on August 22nd, Second Semi-final on August 29th, Final on September 5th and Grand Final on September 12th.

In each case the First Semi-Final is played between the THIRD FOURTH teams and the Second Semi-Final between the FIRST and SEC-

OND teams. The Final is between the WINNERS of the FIRST Semi-Final and the LOSERS of the SECOND Semi-Final. The Grand Final is between the WINNERS of the SECOND SEMI-FINAL and the WINNERS of the FINAL.

## ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals now reads:-

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-andhome matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day.

Provided that no player shall be eligible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.


## JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.

## CAR PARKING
