# **SURPRISES GALORE IN LAST ROUND** Five Leaders, Eight Other "Four" Teams Beaten, But Few Changes

# University Blacks, U.H.S: Reserves, Lose Places

There were surprises galore last Saturday in the final round of home-andhome matches, with no less than five leading teams beaten.

Eight other teams in the fours also suffered defeat, but only one, University Blacks, dropped out of the final four. Uni. High Reserves won their game, but lost their place in the four when Old Melburnians, winning by a big margin, displaced them on percentage.

One of the biggest upsets of the day was the defeat of Coburg by University Blues. The Blues took charge in the second quarter and never let up on the leaders, who were beaten by 19 points.

And Ormond (second) were kept under pressure by De La Salle until well into the last quarter. 'De La" drew level but Ormond finished brilliantly to win by 38 points.

Collegians gained a big lead on Melbourne High in the first term and although High fought back well, Collegians held them off and won by 25 points. This win assured that Collegians would remain in the top section.

Old Paradians kicked 4 goals before Ivanhoe scored, in a bid to avoid relegation, but Ivanhoe came back in the second quarter and went on to score an easy win.

Monash University kept with Caulfield Grammar until shortly before half-time, but then Caulfield broke clear and had established a winning lead at the interval. They went on to score by a big margin, but Monash fought the game right out.

North Old Boys gained a place in the B Section four by downing the leaders, Geelong, by 27 points. North's greater determination carried them to victory.

University Blacks lost their place in the four when they went down by 5 points to St. Bernard's. Black's inaccuracy cost them the game as they kicked 12.18 to St. Bernard's 14.11.

Old Scotch made sure of retaining second place with a resounding win over Alphington, while Kew and Old Xaverians won the other games from Footscray Tech. and Commonwealth Bank respectively.

Three teams finished level in second place.

Leaders also fared badly in C Section where Uni. High were beaten by St. Kilda CBC, the margin being 4 goals: But St. Kilda's bid for the four was in vain, as Old Haileybury led Old Carey (second) all day and won by 38 points.

The position in this section was more even still — five teams being equal in second place, with Old Melburnians and St. Kilda CBC missing out on the four on percentage.

Old Geelong's 44-point defeat of Fairfield meant that the leaders of the four top sections were beaten. But Fairfield still held top place on percentage from Old Trinity.

Another surprise was the defeat of Parkside (third) by bottom team St. Pat's, who were winners by 17 points.

After trailing St. Kevin's by 21 points at the interval, AMP Society slammed on 9 goals in the third term but St. Kevin's came again and snatched victory by 3 points.

Just for a little variety, the leading four teams all won in E Section, Old Camberwell having the closest call. They beat Old Ivanhoe by 23 points but were never in danger. The top side, Brunswick, had 29 points to spare from Elsternwick.

AJAX shocked State Savings Bank, winning a high-scoring game by 9 points.

There was some high scoring in the Junior Sections. University kicked 24.20 against Melbourne High, Monash piled up 28.24 against Parade, and Old Scotch kicked 30.24 (204 points) against Ivanhoe. Caulfield Grammer (19.20), West Brunswick (23.10), AJAX (20.13) and Tooronga-Malvern (20.17) were high scorers in Section 2.

There was a great battle for fourth place in this Section, but although Tooronga-Malvern crept closer over the last few weeks, they finally missed out by just a fraction on percentage (0.5 per cent).

Among the Reserves, Coburg swamped University Blues in the last quarter, kicking 7.4 to 4.2 to win by a goal.

Caulfield Grammar were much too strong for Monash and won by 11 goals. Footscray Tech. beat Kew by 8 points to hold their place in the four, and the Blacks beat St. Bernard's by 11 points.

Assumption beat Power House by 8 points, and AMP beat St. Kevin's by 25 points.

#### ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals now reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-andhome matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day.

Provided that no player shall be eligible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

### JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.

Club Secretaries and Delegates are reminded that the next meeting of the Association will be held at the Amateur Sports Club, 14 McKillop Street, Melbourne on Monday September 7th, at 8 p.m. This will be the last meeting for the year.

One delegate only is permitted from each club, but make sure your club is represented.

## ADMISSION TICKETS

(c) Check with the home club of the ground being used regarding keys to dressing rooms.

(d) EACH CLUB MUST PROVIDE ONE NEW BALL, the winners to have first choice of balls after the game.

(e) EACH CLUB MUST PROVIDE a Goal Umpire's Coat (laundered).

(f) EACH CLUB should arrange to provide its own boot last and hammer.

(g) EACH CLUB MUST BE PRE-PARED to supply a Boundary and Goal Umpire if required. (Independent Boundary and Goal Umpires may be supplied at some games.) The WINNING CLUB is responsible


