

### Caulfield's Strong Finish Beats M.H.S. St. Bernard's Win in B Section

### Promotion For Old Carey, Old Trinity, Brunswick Power House Juniors

Caulfield Grammarians finished too strongly for Melbourne High in the first Semi-final last Saturday and after an even three quarters, won by 37 points. Caulfield kicked six goals in the last term.

St. Bernard's and North Old Boys staged an even first half but St. Bernard's broke away after the interval to score by 29 point's.

Old Carey, who beat Uni. High in the C Section second Semi-final have gained promotion to B Section next season. Others to play in a higher Section in 1971 are Old Trinity, Brunswick and Power House Juniors, whose wins put them in the Grand Finals in their respective sections.

Melbourne High made good use of the breeze in the first term to lead by 17 points, and Caulfield who were off the target in the second quarter, struggled to gain a lead. Then they kicked 3 quick goals to lead by 11 points, but High came back well for 2 goals and were a point in front at the inter-

The wind faded out after half-time and the game developed into a tight struggle, with the defences on top. Caulfield looked to be taking control and edged to a 7-point advantage at three-quarter-time.

Caulfield were too strong in the last quarter and went right away and although High hit back with 2 goals just before the finish, the game was

all over.

St. Bernards led North Old Boys by a goal at half-time, but added 4-6 to 2-2 in the third term to gain a handy lead. They went on with it in the last quarter and ran out comfortable winners.

Inaccuracy in front of goal was a feature of the Old Haileybury-Assumption match particularly in the first half, when Assumption led by 4 points (4-7 to 3-9). But Haileybury went to a 4-point lead at the last change and finished all over Assumption to win

by 23 points.

Uni. High were 9 points ahead of Old Carey at half-time, but Carey added 5-4 to 3-1 in the third quarter and led by a goal. They also finished better than their opponents and were winners by 15 points.

Old Geelong were much too strong for Parkside and had a firm grip on the game when they led by 26 points at the interval. They went further ahead in the second half and won easily by 40 points.

After an even first quarter, Old Trinity broke away from Fairfield and were 20 points in front at half-time. The third term was also even but Trinity ran right away in the last when they put on 7-2 to 3-2 and won

by 44 points.

La Trobe University's first quarter effort, when they kicked 9-4 to Old Camberwell's 1-1 paved the way for them to go on to a very easy win. Camberwell added 6-5 in the second quarter but La Trobe kicked 5 goals straight and were nearly 7 goals in front at the half-way mark. The second half was fairly even but La Trobe were untroubled to win by just over 7 goals.

Despite inaccurate kicking, Brunswick went to a commanding lead over Reservoir Old Boys in the second quarter and were 3 goals in front at the interval. Reservoir made little impression in the third term and Brunswick added 6-5 to 2 goals in the last quarter to score by 39 points.

In the Juniors, Ormond went to a 17-point lead over Old Scotch at half-time, and although Scotch added 5 goals in the third quarter, Ormond finished well to win by more than 6 goals.

University and Monash staged an even game except for the second quarter when University added 5-7 to 2-3 to gain a 23-point break at the interval. Monash finished a little the better but could not make up the leeway and went down by 21 points.

Army Apprentices looked to be in a strong position when they led West Brunswick by 19 points at the interval, and particularly at the final change when they were 43 points ahead. But they faded right out in the face of West Brunswick's strong finish, and West kicked 7-4 to a point in the last quarter to snatch victory by 2 points.

Power House held a 17-point advantage over Caulfield Grammar at


half-time and went on to score by points. But they had 35 scoring sho to 18 and should have won by a muchigger margin.

While most of the games in the senior sections were decided by relatively substantial margins, many of the Reserve Section games were close.

Monash were no match for Cobuston who won by 8 goals, and Old Scott were always on top of Footscray Tea and scored by 46 points. A 6-go burst in the second quarter paved the way for Power House to beat Old Melburnians by just over 6 goals.

But Assumption beat Old Carey be only 5 points in a closely fought encounter, and AMP Society beat Parlside by 9 points after being 10 points down at the interval. St. Kevin's an Old Trinity also staged an even gam with St. Kevin's slightly better kicking giving them a 4-point win.

A 5-goal burst in the second termenabled State Savings Bank to bea Old Xaverians by 2 goals, and Elstern wick, after trailing Reservoir Ole Boys by 27 points at half-time, recovered well to be beaten by only 2 goals. Had they kicked straight the might well have won it.



#### JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.


