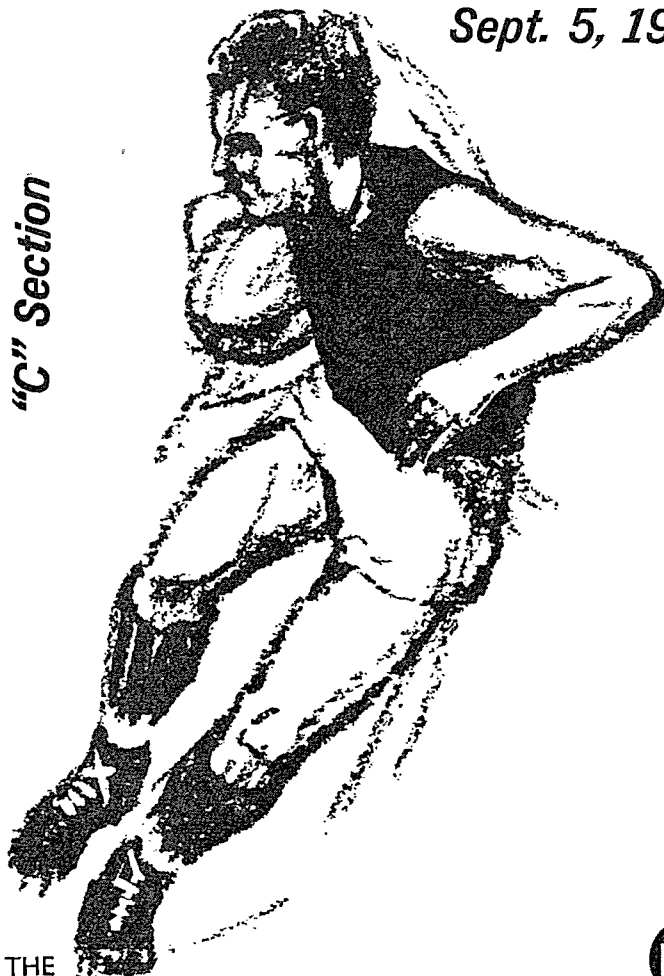

COBURG IN GRAND FINAL AGAIN

Strong Finish Too Much For Ormond

Old Scotch To Return To Top Section

After looking to be in danger of defeat early in the last quarter of the Second Semi-final last Saturday, Coburg unwound a finishing burst that left Ormond standing, and they ran out winners by 35 points.

Coburg's win puts them into the Grand Final next Saturday, when they will meet the winners of today's Final between Ormond and Caulfield Grammarians. This is Coburg's second successive appearance in a Grand Final — last year they beat Ormond for the premiership.

Old Scotch overwhelmed Geelong in the second half of the B Section Second Semi-final, and by qualifying for the Grand Final of that section, have gained promotion to the top grade in 1971.

Coburg opened well with the breeze but when Ormond settled down they held the Coburg forwards well. Coburg broke clear later in the quarter and held a 28-point lead at quarter-time.

Coburg matched Ormond in the second term and had gained a firm grip on the game when they led by 27 points at the interval. Ormond had improved towards half-time and they showed a lot more determination in the third quarter. They added 5-4 to 2-4 and were within 9 points of Coburg at the last change.

A goal in the first half-minute gave Ormond a great chance, but Coburg then raced right away and finished up piling on 7 goals for the quarter to win by a substantial margin.

Poor shooting for goal, particularly in the second quarter, badly affected Geelong's chances against Old Scotch. They led by 8 points at half-time, but should have been much further ahead as they had eight more scoring shots at this stage.

Scotch edged to the front in the third term and led by 5 points at three-quarter-time. They finished all over Geelong, adding 4-5 to 3 points and were winners by 31 points

Uni. High established a big lead in the first quarter over Old Haileybury and they kept in front all day. But for shocking inaccuracy in front of goal (they kicked 9-23) they would have won by a much bigger margin than 44 points. They won in the ruck and their big men dominated play around the ground, while Haileybury were hampered by poor forward work also.

After leading Fairfield by 20 points at half-time, Old Geelong faded right out in the second half and went down by 26 points. Old Geelong probably lost it in the second term when they kicked 3-9, and had they kicked straight in this quarter they could have had an unbeatable lead at the interval.

Fairfield led by a point at three-quarter-time but finished well to add 5-2 in the last quarter while Old Geelong managed only 1-1.

Reservoir Old Boys led La Trobe University all day in a fast game with their rovers and small men and solid defence being key factors in their 27-point win. Reservoir's play-on game, with effective use of handball, proved too much for La Trobe.

Ormond Juniors scored a big win over Monash University, who won in the air in the early stages but could not break through Ormond's strong defence. Ormond took charge in the second term when they added 7 goals and were 20 points in front at the interval. Monash had most of the play early in the third quarter but Ormond came back to lead by 5 goals at the last change and went on to win by 39 points.

A 6-goal burst in the second quarter gave Caulfield Grammar a 5-goal lead over West Brunswick in the Section 2 match. West trailed by 39 points at three-quarter-time and although they finished well, Caulfield had 20 points to spare at the finish.

In the Reserves games, University Blues established a winning lead over Ormond in the first quarter when they kicked 6-1 to 4 points. They were more than 7 goals in front at half-time

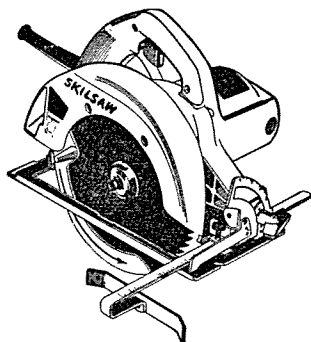
and coasted home to win by 31 points. This was Ormond's first defeat for the season.

University Blacks went to a 22-point lead over St. Bernard's at half-time and were nearly 8 goals in front at the last change. St. Bernard's added 4 goals in the last term but the Blacks won by 29 points.

Old Carey and Old Melburnians fought out a low-scoring second half with Carey winning by a goal. O.M.'s lead by 2 points at half-time and 3 points at the last change but Carey added 1-3 and kept Melburnians scoreless in the last term.

Old Trinity had the edge on AMP Society throughout and led by 14 points at three-quarter-time. Then they added 4-1 to a goal in the last quarter to win by 33 points.

After an even first half, Elsternwick forged ahead of State Savings Bank to score a 19-point win.

THE TRIBUNAL HANDS IT OUT

Up to the end of the home-and-home matches, a total of 102 players had been reported for the season.

Of this number, 92 were found guilty of charges laid against them and 88 were suspended. The total suspensions represented 435 matches or nearly 22 seasons.

Of the other four, two were given a reprimand and two received a severe reprimand.

So many players were reported on two occasions that it was necessary to convene two Tribunals to deal with the charges.

This is unfortunately a record number of reports for any one season and players and officials should take steps to ensure next season sees a vast improvement in the conduct of players on the field.

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The Rule relating to eligibility of
players in Reserve Section Finals now
reads:—

A player who has been a member of
a senior team of any club in nine or
more matches during the home-and-
home matches in any season shall not
be eligible for inclusion in the reserve
team of a club taking part in a final
match in the same season unless both
the senior and reserve teams are partic-
ipating in a final match on the
same day.

Provided that no player shall be
eligible for inclusion in a reserve
team taking part in a final match in
any season unless such player has
been a member of such reserve team
in at least TWO home-and-home
matches during the said season.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of
a senior or reserve team in more than
five matches during any season shall
be ineligible for inclusion in a junior
team taking part in a semi-final, final
or grand-final match in the SAME
SEASON UNLESS he has been a
member of the junior team for more
than five matches in the same season.

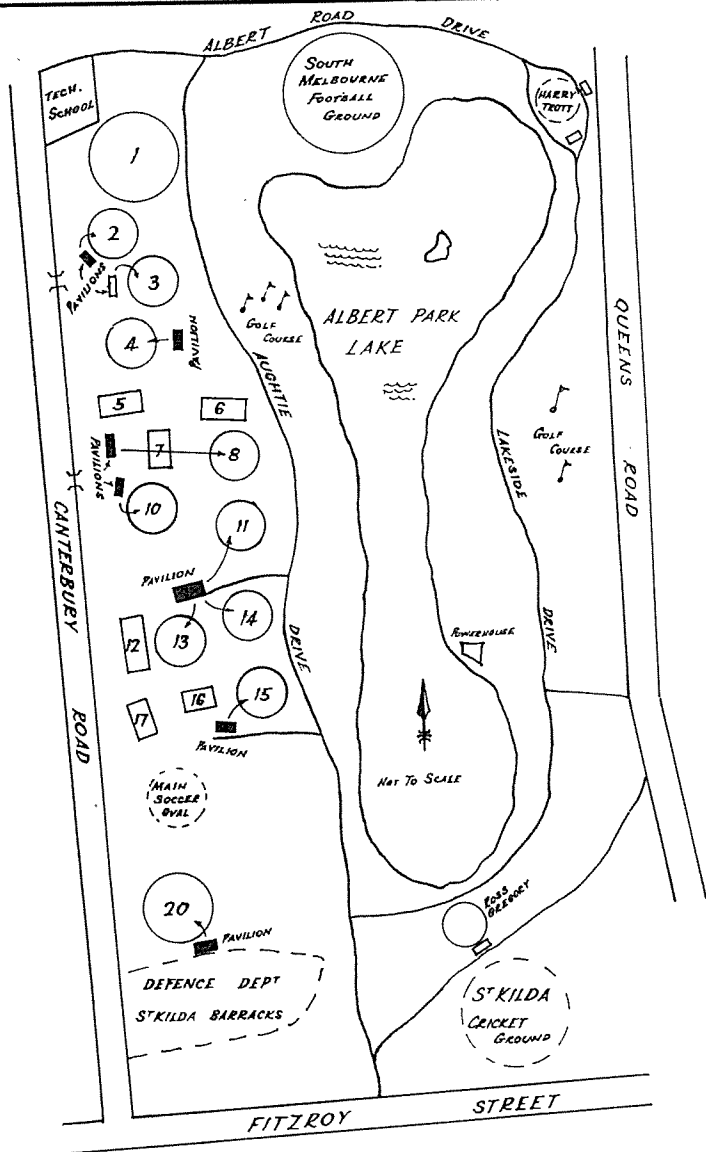

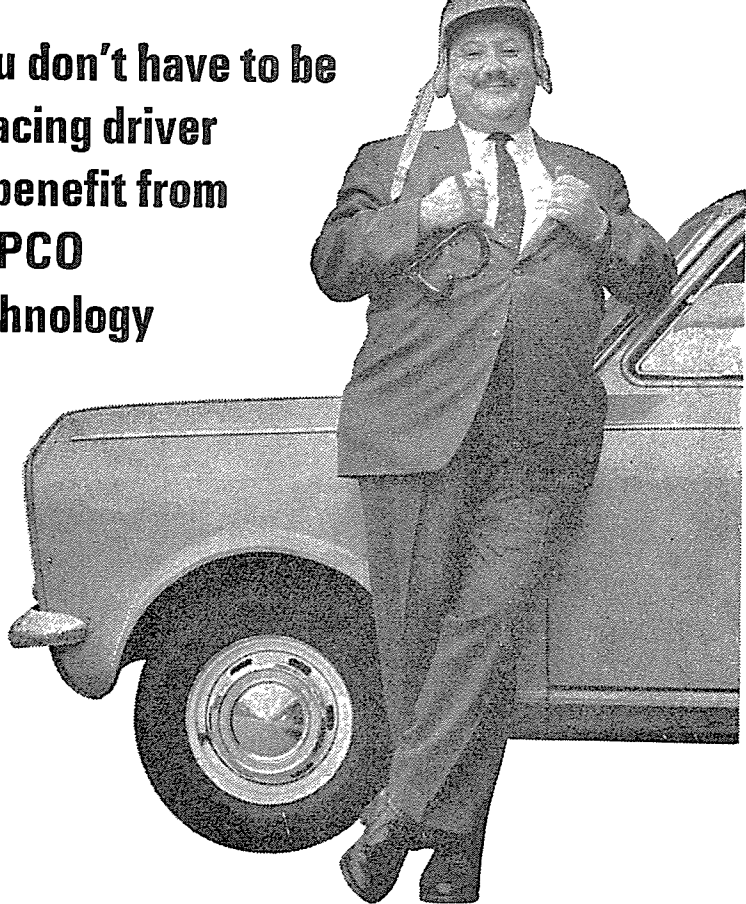
