

CAULFIELD SNATCH NARROW WIN ORMOND DOWN BY 4 POINTS Geelong Fail After Early Lead

Caulfield Grammarians staged a sensational finish to beat Ormond by four points in the Final last week and will meet Coburg in the Grand Final today.

Ormond looked to be in a safe position when they led by 23 points halfway through the last quarter but they could not withstand Caulfield's determined finishing burst.

Geelong raced to a 44-point lead over St. Bernard's in the first quarter but faded right out of the picture in the second half and were beaten by three

goals.

Uni. High, Old Trinity and Brunswick won the premierships in the lower sections with Universty and Power House taking the honours in the Junior Sections. All except University Juniors gain promotion to a higher section next season, along with Old Carey, Fairfield, Reservoir Old Boys and Caulfield Grammar Juniors.

Caulfield were right off the target in the first quarter and kicked only one goal from six shots with Ormond (4-4) going to a 17-point lead.

After an early goal by Caulfield in the second quarter, Ormond added two to go further ahead. At this stage Caulfield were playing ragged football and deserved to be 5 goals behind. But suddenly their play improved and 3 quick goals brought them to within 17 points at half-time.

They were fighting hard to wipe off their deficit but were still missing many chances in front of goal. Their efforts enabled them to reduce their leeway to 7 points but then Ormond broke away again in a see-saw game and ran to a lead of 4 goals at three-

quarter-time.

Two quick goals brought Caulfield back into the game but Ormond steadied and kicked two in reply and were 23 points in front. Caulfield came back with three quick goals and were only 4 points down and another goal less than two minutes before the finish gave them the game. Geelong staged a magnificent first

quarter in which they kicked 7-9 to

St. Bernard's 1-1, and looked set for promotion to the top section when they held St. Bernard's in the second to lead by 19 points at half-time.

But St. Bernard's held them well in the third term when Geelong with the wind managed only 3 points while St. Bernard's kicked 3-5 and led by a point at the last change. The game was in the balance for much of the last quarter but St. Bernard's went away towards the finish to win by 3 goals. They kicked two of these in the last couple of minutes.

Uni. High also put in a powerful last quarter when they added 8 goals to score a run-away win over Old Uni. High were in trouble early in the game and were scoreless in the first quarter but they hit back in the second term and were only 9 points down at the interval.

Their big men started to take control in the third quarter and their forwards were functioning more effectively. They were 4 points behind at the final change but the last term was all U.H.S. and they swamped Old Carev to win by 41 points.

Old Trinity's strong defence held Fairfield to one goal in the first half and Trinity were in a sound position when they led by more than 7 goals at half-time. Fairfield came back to add 3 goals in the third quarter but Trinity went away to win by 55 points.

Brunswick led Reservoir Old Boys all day and won by 21 points, the high marking of both sides being a feature of the game. The Reservoir rovers were on top but Brunswick won across the centre and their rucks took charge in the second half. The game was very even with Brunswick leading by 10 points at half-time. Their more accurate attack could have been a big factor in their win.

Despite shocking inaccuracy in front of goals, University scored a 3-goal win over Ormond in the Junior

Section 1 Grand Final.

They had had two more scoring shots at half-time but trailed by 13 points. They slammed on 5-9 to 1-3 in the third term and led by 17 points at three-quarter-time. Ormond battled on in the last quarter but could make no impression and University took the honours in a hard, fast game.

Power House beat Caulfield Grammar by 14 points in a thrilling finish in the Section 2 match, after leading by nearly 10 goals early in the last quarter.

The first half was very even with House 13 points in front at quarter-time and 5 points to the good at the interval. House dashed away to a big

lead in the third quarter when they added 10-4 to Caulfield's 3-1 and were 50 points in front at the last change.

But Caulfield kicked 9-3 in the last quarter in a gallant bid for victory but just failed. Fancy kicking 20-10 in a Grand Final and being beaten!

In the Reserves, Ormond beat Coburg in an exciting finish to an even game. Scores were level at half-time and Ormond led by 4 points at three-quarter-time. But they added 3 goals straight in the last quarter to run out winners by 7 points.

St. Bernard's beat Old Scotch by 5 goals (8-8 to 3-8) in an uninspiring game, and Old Carey scored a runaway win over Assumption. Carey started well and went further ahead as the game went on and they won by just over 13 goals.

After trailing Old Trinity by 15 points at half-time, St. Kevin's came back strongly in the second half to score by 3 goals, holding Trinity at bay in the last term. Reservoir Old Boys kicked 3-7 in the first quarter against Elsternwick but added only 4 points for the rest of the game. Elsternwick were 5 points down at the interval but went right away in the second half to win by 44 points.

RESERVES — PLEASE NOTE

Team Managers and Timekeepers of Reserve Section teams should note particularly the following points:—

- 3. Half-time interval MUST NOT EXCEED 15 MINUTES—that is from the end of the second quarter to the start of the third. ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR

RESERVE SECTION FINALS

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals now reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day.

Provided that no player shall be eligible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.


RESERVE SECTION MATCHES CONSIST OF FOUR 20-MINUTE QUARTERS, WITH TIME-ON ADDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH INSTRUCTIONS PRINTED ON THE BACK OF SCORE CARDS.

In ALL matches the quarter-time interval shall be only of sufficient duration to allow the teams to change ends; the half-time interval (that is from the end of the second quarter to the commencement of the third quarter) must not exceed 15 minutes, and the three-quarter-time interval not exceed 5 minutes.

DUTIES OF RUNNERS

The duty of an Official Runner is to carry messages from the coach to players and NOT to engage in altercations with players.

The runner, in carrying such messages, must take the shortest possible route to the player concerned, and leave the field immediately after delivering the message.
