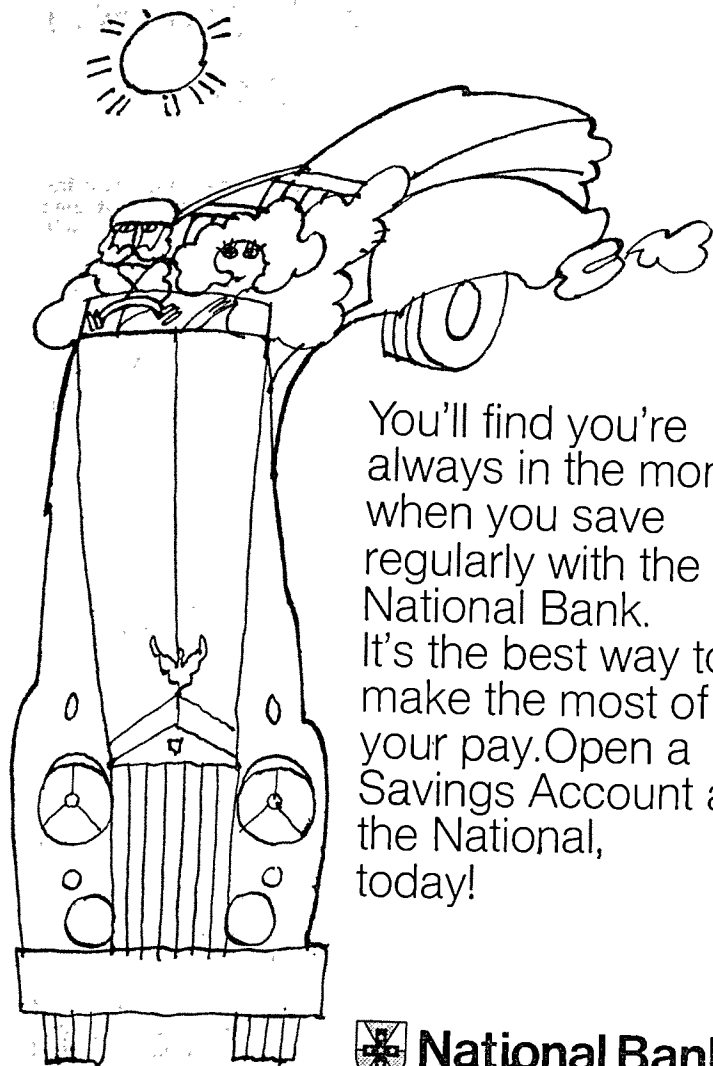

CLOSE CALL FOR COBURG

Highs Big Win Over Collegians

University Blues gave last year's premiers Coburg a fright last Saturday running them to eight points. Coburg were on top for three quarters but died in the last term when the Blues added 6-8 to 1-1. Half the University side kicked straighter they might have won.

Melbourne High's better team work was a big factor in their eight goal win over Collegians which carried High into top place on the ladder on percentage. Poor shooting for goal robbed Melbourne of a real percentage booster.

After trailing by nearly nine goals at three-quarter time Old Xaverians put in a great last term to finish only nine points behind Commonwealth Bank. Xavier kicked 9-5 for the quarter (six goals in the last 15 minutes) to Bank's three goals.

Once again conditions favoured high scoring, 32 teams topping the century and again four losers cored 100 points or more.

Certainly the weather helped the high scoring but the new "out of bounds" rule—which must cut out a lot of negative football—is probably another significant factor.

Blues trailed Coburg by more than five goals at half time and were nearly eight goals down at the last change. Coburg's play-on style gave them a chance to establish the big lead but the Blues were all over them in the last quarter.

Melbourne High started slowly against Collegians but when they got going the result was never in doubt, they led by nearly five goals at the interval and despite inaccurate kicking in the second half went further ahead to win decisively.

Parade's poor shooting in the first half kept De La Salle in the game, but De La found Parade's defence too much of a problem and went down by 39 points.

Caulfield Grammarians recovered from a 32-point leeway at three-quarter time to hit the front against Ormond in the last quarter, but Ormond steadied and drew away to win by three goals but it took Ormond 18 more scoring shots to do it.

Monash University went to an early lead over Ivanhoe who trailed by 33 points at the interval, but although Ivanhoe showed much improved form in the second half, Monash's better forward work enabled them to win by 4 goals.

A ten goal burst in the second quarter paved the way for North Old Boys to beat Footscray for 16 points in a high scoring game. University Blacks and St. Bernard's were locked in a close struggle with the Blacks scraping home by four points.

Geelong ran away from Alphington in the second half to win by more than 12 goals and Old Scotch were not troubled to beat Kew easily.

Old Carey proved much too good for Hampton Rovers and won by over ten goals. Old Melburnians finished too strongly for National Bank and won a high scoring encounter by 15 points. Uni. High beat Tooronga-Malvern by 17 points. St. Kilda CBC had 16 points to spare from Old Hailey-

bury and Assumption went away from Power House in the second half to score by 34 points.

Fairfield were much too strong for Glenhuntly and ran out winners by eight goals and Old Trinity beat AMP Society by 15 points in a neck-and-neck struggle. Trinity led by three points at quarter time, scores were level at the interval and AMP were 7 points in front at the last change.

An eight goal burst in the third quarter lifted Parkside to a five point win over West Brunswick. St. Kevin's were too strong for Old Brighton and Old Geelong were not troubled by St. Pat's.

Brunswick trailed ANZ Bank by 14 points at half time but ran right away in the second half to win by 41 points. Old Camberwell easily beat Old Ivanhoe and Reservoir Old Boys, thanks to a burst of eight goals in the third quarter, scored a big win over State Savings Bank.

La Trobe University were far too strong for Old Essendon and Dookie and Longerenong went down to Elsternwick by a big margin. AJAX beat Old Mentonians by four goals in the other E Section match.

In the Junior sections University swamped Melbourne High, Ormond easily beat Parades, Old Scotch scored by 33 points from St. Bernard's, with Coburg and Monash having plenty to spare from St. Kilda CBC and Ivanhoe respectively.

Elsternwick trailed Alphington by nine points at half time but kicked nine goals in the last term to win by 43 points. Other games in Section 2 were also decided by substantial margins.

In the Reserves Melbourne High beat Collegians by 11 points, Blues beat Coburg by 14, De La Salle beat Parades by 15, the Blacks had only 4 points to spare from St. Bernard's, Glenhuntly beat Fairfield by two points, AMP Society beat Old Trinity by a point, and Old Vaverians beat Elsternwick by three points.

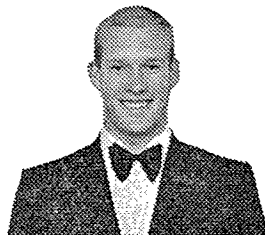

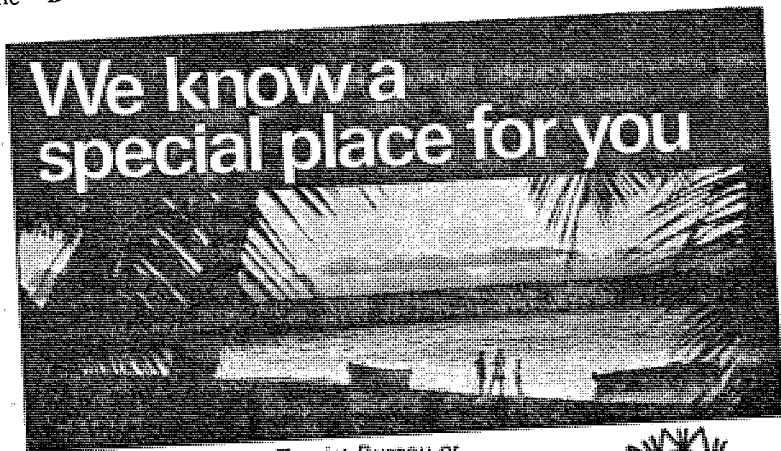

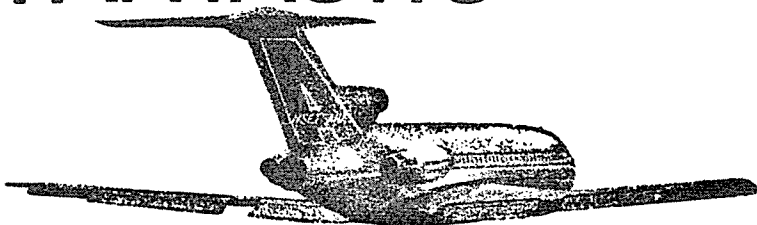
