COBURG HOME BY 2 PTS. REPEAT GRAND FINAL WIN OVER ORMOND SEVERAL CLOSE FINISHES

Coburg sneaked home by two points from Ormond in a thrilling finish to a "r-play" of last year's Grand Final when they took the lead shortly before the final siren. Ormond had led for most of the day.

There were several close finishes in last Saturday's round, eight games being decided by a margin of six points or less while Elsternwick and State Savings Bank played the first drawn game of the season.

Ormond looked a slightly better side than Coburg but the premiers' persistence and tenacity eventually paid off as they wore Ormond down in a tense last quarter. Their chances were far from rosy when they trailed Ormond by 3 goals early in the last quarter.

Six goals straight against the wind enabled Caulfield Grammar to gain a firm grip on the game against Old Paradians who were finally beaten by nearly 10 goals. They could not match Caulfield's ruck strength. University Blues carried too much tal timber for Ivanhoe and ran out winners by 15 points. While Melbourne High's teamwork was a big factor in their comfortable win over De La Salle.

Collegians led Monash University by 19 points at half time but faded badly in the second half, adding only 4-1 to Monash's 9-5 and went down by 15 points.

Kew trailed Old Xaverians by 21 points at the interval but finished too strongly for the Xavier boys and won by 28 points.

Bad kicking for goal probably cost Old Old Boys the match against North Old Boys who with 8 fewer scoring shots were winners by 2 goals.

Commonwealth Bank gave Geelong too big a start in the first half and were beaten by 3 goals. St. Bernard's

Old Geelong were 21 points behind Parksides at the interval but then added 14-7 to 4-6 to win comfortably. Old Geelong kicked 9 goals in the last term.

State Savings Bank led Elsternwick by 5 goals at the interval but the Old Ivanhoe beat to make it a draw. Wicks fought back ANZ Bank by 9 points and Reservoir Old Boys put in a sensational second quarter against Dookie and Longerenong in which they added 13-5 to a point and went on to win by 8 goals.

In the Junior Sections Monash scored by 19 points over University, Old Scotch beat Parade by 14 and Ormond beat Coburg by 8. National Bank ran Hampton Scouts to 8 points and Elsternwick beat Parkside by 17 points in a high-scoring game, thanks to a 9 goal burst in the third quarter.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

Many Clubs have inquired about the new method, operative from this season, of umpires gradings.

Umpires have been selected into four groups, namely:

Group 1 8 Umpires — 5 to officiate at "A" Section fixtures, 1 — B Section 1 — C Section and 1 emergency.

Group 2 10 Umpires "B" and "C" Sections.

Group 3 23 Umpires "D", "C", "E" and Junior Sections.

Group 4 31 Umpires — Reserve Sections.

These groupings will be reviewed fortnightly by the Umpire Committee, so umpires cannot afford to be complacent in any group.

Training is conducted at Elsternwick two nights weekly, so we do not anticipate any complaints from clubs about umpires not being physically fit.

Coaching classes, which have been held weekly since early March, should assure consistency in interpretations by all umpires from week to week.

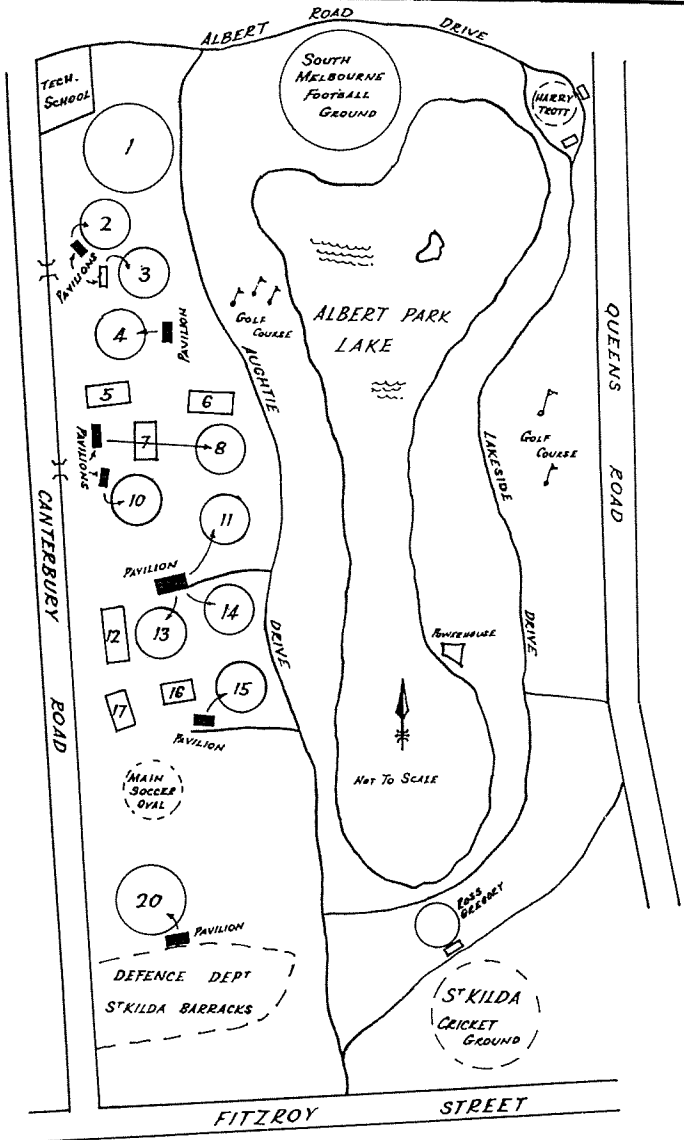
