COBURG NOW ALONE ON TOP

CRUSH M.H.S. BY MORE THAN 10 GOALS

Ivanhoe, De La Salle Cause Surprises

Coburg jumped into top place on the premiership list when they crushed Melbourne High by 63 points last Saturday. It was High's first defeat and they previously led Coburg on percentage.

Ivanhoe had their first win for the season when they rattled home strongly to beat Old Paradians by 21 points. De La Salle also finished well in beating University Blues by 29 points. Besides M.H.S., two other leaders were beaten — Fairfield and Ormond Juniors, Ormond losing their first game for the season.

Twelve teams are still undefeated while 13 have still to open their accounts for the season.

Melbourne High's inaccuracy in the second quarter robbed them of the chance to lead Coburg at half-time. High added 3-7 for the term and were trailing by 17 points.

But the third quarter proved their undoing as Coburg slammed on 8 6 to 1-1 and held a practically unbeatable lead at three quarter time.

Parade had 8 goals on the board before Ivanhoe scored their first but they wilted badly as Ivanhoe fought back well. Parade added only 8 behinds in the third term, which didn't improve their chances.

The Blues — De La Salle match was very evenly contested until half way through the last quarter when "De La" raced away to swamp the Blues and go to a comfortable win.

A brilliant first half by Ormond put them in a commanding position against Collegians who were over 10 goals behind at the interval, and Ormond coasted to a very easy win. They kicked 7-7 and held Collegians scoreless in the first term.

Caulfield Grammar kicked 10-2 in the first term against Monash and kicked on again in the third to go

on and win by 52 points. They were too fast for Monash who however fought the game right out.

Kew gave unbeaten University Blacks a shake and ran them to 14 points in a high scoring game. Kew led narrowly at the interval but the Blacks went to a 23-point lead at the last change.

St. Bernard's better kicking for goals saved them from defeat by Old Xaverians, who failed by only a point. Geelong trailed North Old Boys by 9 points at half-time but added 9 goals in third term and won by 11 points.

Footscray Tech ran Commonwealth Bank to 8 points after being 19 points down at the interval but Old Scotch were not troubled unduly by Alphington and won by a big margin.

Old Melburnians and Tooronga-Malvern fought out a high-scoring battle with Melburnians winning by 14 points. Tooronga-Malvern kicked 8-1 in the first quarter and OM's replied with 10-2 in the second.

Old Carey led Old Haileybury by 15 points at half time but Haileybury's 6-goal burst in the third quarter carried them to a 15-point win.

FIRST BALL MADE FOR AUSTRALIAN GAME — Still Leads The Field

Old Brighton's accurate kicking was the big factor in their 2-point win over leaders Fairfield. They had 8 fewer scoring shots. Old Geelong inflicted a crushing defeat on West Brunswick, winning by nearly 12 goals. St. Kevin's although winning by 35 points from A.M.P. Society, lost their place in the four to Old Geelong on percentage.

Old Ivanhoe crashed from fourth to seventh as a result of their overwhelming defeat (104 points) by Brunswick who moved up to third. Reservoir Old Boys beat Old Camberwell by 10 points in an even game.

Melbourne High beat Coburg by 5 points in an exciting tussle in the Junior Section — (16-10 to 15-11). University toppled the undefeated Ormond by 35 points and Monash now head the list.

Old Brighton scored by 6 points from Hampton Scouts and Caulfield Grammar went down to Alphington by 7 points.

In the Reserves Coburg beat Melbourne High by nearly 10 goals to tumble them out of the four, and Parade beat Ivanhoe by 5 points the

same margin by which Commonwealth Bank beat Alphington.

Old Carey beat Old Haileybury by 4 points and Assumption beat Hampton Rovers by 2, knocking the Rovers out of the four. West Brunswick beat Old Geelong by only 10 points, and State Savings Bank beat AJAX by 4 points.

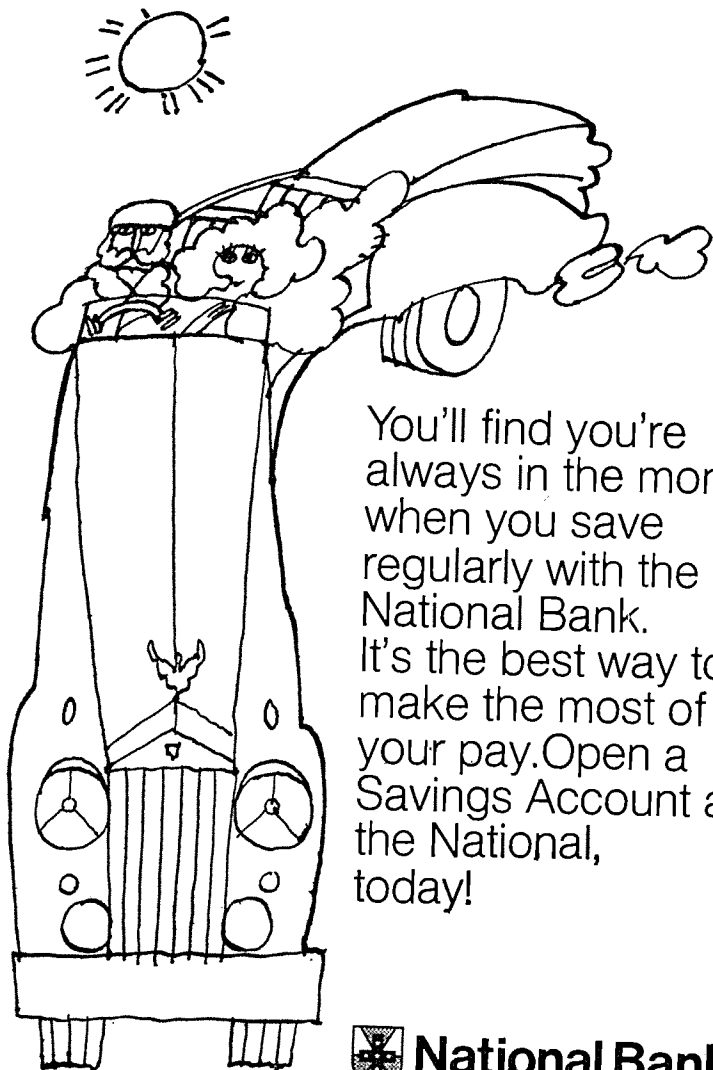

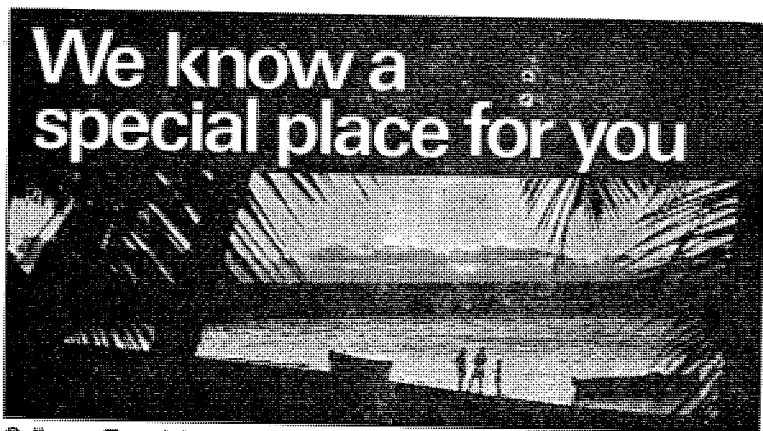
