# ANOTHER CLOSE CALL FOR U.H.S. CAULFIELD'S LATE BID JUST FAILS Monash Too Strong For De La Salle

Melbourne High had another close call against Caulfield Grammarians in the main game last Saturday, when they held off a strong finish by Caulfield to win by two points.

The previous week they beat Monash University by a similar margin.

Monash drew away from De La Salle after an even first half and ran out winners by four goals.

Melbourne High Juniors caused an upset when they beat the leaders Monash by 28 points. All other leading teams recorded wins.

High started well and led by 17 points at the interval and loked safe with a 16 point lead at three-quartertime. Caulfield fought back to within 5 points but Melbourne went away to lead by 3 goals.

Caulfield came again but their effort just failed. They added 7-5 to High's 5-3 in the last quarter.

Ivanhoe had no counter to Coburg's play-on game and the leaders won as they liked.

Ormond were much too strong for a tired University Blues side and were also untroubled to win by a big margin, while Collegians' better teamwork and greater accuracy enabled them to score easily from Old Paradians.

Old Scotch beat St. Bernard's by 2 goals in an even game and Geelong had to battle to beat Old Xaverians by 13 points. Commonwealth Bank led Kew by nearly 4 goals at half-time but Kew added 8-4 to 3-2 in the second half and won by 9 points.

North Old Boys gave University Blacks little trouble and Alphington opened their winning account at the expense of Footscray Tech.

Old Melburnians scraped home by 2 | Boys ran right away from AJAX in points from Old Carey in a thriller at | the second half to score an easy win.

Elsternwick Park, their more accurate kicking (9-8 to 8-12) being the deciding factor. Uni High can also thank better kicking for a 1-point victory over National Bank (9-8 to 8-13).

Old Haileybury Assumption and St. Kilda CBC scored easily in the other games.

Old Trinity beat Fairfield by 7 points in a match where the scores were close all day and St. Kevin's beat West Brunswick by 8 points. Old Geelong, Old Brighton and Parkside had little trouble against their respective opponents, although Glenhuntly kept with Old Geelong for three quarters.

Old Ivanhoe were almost 5 goals behind State Savings Bank at half time, but finished too strongly for the Bankers and won a high-scoring game by 10 points.

There was little between Brunswick and Old Camberwell for three quarters but Brunswick went away in the last quarter to win by 28 points.

ANZ Bank and Elsternwick battled out a low-scoring struggle with Bank's better kicking (6-2 to 4-11) giving them a 3-point win. Reservoir Old Boys ran right away from AJAX in the second half to score an easy win.

A third quarter burst of 5 goals by Old Scotch Juniors enabled them to draw away from Coburg and win by 27 points, and Ormond finished too

strongly for Ivanhoe.

In Section 2, Power House suffered their first defeat when they went down to Hampton Scouts by 9 points in an even game. Elsternwick led Caulfield Grammar by 19 points at the interval but failed to finish on and went down by 3 goals. There were some close results in the Reserves - Commonwealth Bank beat Kew by 5 points. Old Scotch went down to St. Bernard's by 9, Tooronga-Malvern beat Assumption by 4, Old Carey's poor kicking cost them a 6-point defeat by Old Melburnians and Old Xaverians pipped LaTrobe University by a point.

### **UMPIRE'S CORNER**

Rule 21:--

(a) When the ball is signalled by the boundary umpire as out of bounds and the signal is not seen by the field umpire and play goes on -

The boundary umpire must run after the field umpire and notify

him at once.

(b) The field umpire shall stop the play and order any intervening score to be annulled, (unless in the meantime a free kick has been given for a breach of the laws) and the ball shall be taken back to the spot where it went out of bounds and thrown in.

Re the new rule of kicking out on

the full - if the ball is kicked and hits the behind post on the full, it is deemed to be out and a free kick given — if the ball hits the ground and then hits the behind post the throw-in rule is observed.

Rule 28 states:-

If the ball is in transit towards goal, from a free kick - mark or field kick and an opponent shakes the

goal post.

If in the opinion of the field umpire such action could have affected the result of the kick, the umpire shall give the player kicking for goal the option of another kick, but if a teammate shakes the goal post, the field umpire shall blow his whistle and award a free kick to the nearest opponent at the spot where the ball was kicked

It is a reportable offence to shake

the goal or behind post.
