



SECOND HALF RECOVERY GIVES ORMOND WIN 6-PT. MARGIN OVER MELB. HIGH Geelong Pips Blacks by a Point

A great second half by Ormond enabled them to beat Melbourne High by a goal in last week's main game.

Ormond looked to be in an almost hopeless position at half-time when they were 28 points behind but they brought themselves back into the game with a burst of eight goals in the third term.

Geelong went into top place on percentage when they beat the previous leaders University Black by a point. A late bid by the Blacks just failed.

Other leading teams to "bite the dust" were La Trobe University, Ormond Juniors and St. Kilda CBC Reserves.

Collegians and Ivanhoe staged a neck-and-neck struggle with Collegians holding on well in the last quarter to win by 11 points. A feature of the game was Ivanhoe's accurate kicking — 11 goals straight at one stage, and they finished with 18-5.

De La Salle gave Caulfield Grammar a lot of trouble until well into the last quarter, but then Caulfield cut loose and slammed on 10 goals in less than 20 minutes to win by a big margin.

Coburg built up a big early lead over Old Paradians and coasted home to an easy win.

Melbourne High put on 8-7 to Ormond's one point in the second quarter and looked to have the game won. Ormond's third quarter burst gave them a 21-point advantage at threequarter time and although High drew level shortly before the finish. Ormond goaled in the last minute for a thrilling win.

In the University Blues-Monash match, played on Wednesday May 20th the Blues failed to take advantage of the wind in the third quarter and went down by 7 goals. They kicked 8-4 to a goal in the first term, but Monash added 9-4 to 2 goals in the second and ran right away with another 8 goals in the last quarter. Geelong led the Blacks by 6 goals at the interval and were 44 points ahead at the last change but the Blacks kicked 8-7 to 2 goals in the final term to go down by only a point

final term to go down by only a point. North Old Boys held on to withstand a last quarter effort by Old Xaverians and won by 5 points and a 7-goal burst in the third term helped Alphington to beat Commonwealth Bank by 20 points.

St. Bernard's easily beat Kew and Old Scotch went way from Footscray Tech in the second half.

Geelong, Old Scotch and the Blacks now share top places four points ahead of St. Bernard's.

Old Haileybury knocked Old Melburnians out of the four when they scored a decisive 34-point win over OM's. They virtually led throughout the match.

Hampton Rovers put up a remarkable effort of accurate kicking against Uni High. They kicked 10 goals without a behind, but were well beaten. Uni. High kicked 10-5 to a goal in the first quarter.

St. Pat's gave Glenhuntly a big start at the half way mark but finished in good style to scrape home by 3 points. They trailed by more than 7 goals at half-time.

Ormond leaders in Junior Section 1 went down to Old Scotch by 3 points in a close struggle. St. Bernard's finished too strongly for Coburg and won by 2 goals. Old Scotch who were second to Ormond on percentage are now clear leaders.

In Section 2, Army Apprentices beat Old Brighton by more than 10 goals and West Brunswick scored from Elsternwick by a similar margin.

In the Reserves Collegians got up to draw with Ivanhoe, De La Salle beat Caulfield Grammar by 5 points and the Blues beat Monash by 23 points (on May 20th).

Footscray Tech downed Old Scotch by 19 points. St. Kilda CBC went down to Assumption by 10 points. St. Kevin's beat Old Trinity by 31 points. Fairfield beat West Brunswick by 21 points and Reservoir overwhelmed La Trobe.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

HOLDING THE BALL: HOLDING THE MAN RULE

A player in possession of the ball, when held firmly by an opponent (firmly enough to stop him or retard his progress), should be given a reasonable chance of disposing of it, by kicking or handballing, otherwise a free kick shall be awarded to his opponent for holding the ball.

A player who lies on or over the ball is deemed to be in possession of it, and if tackled **correctly** will be penalised.

A player held by an opponent when not in possession of the ball shall be awarded a free kick. If a player bounces the ball whil being held — holding the ball.

If the hold and the bounce ar made simultaneously — play on

A player held by one arm while h retains possession of the ball wit the other — holding the ball.

When a player is knocked on arm c elbow causing him to drop the ball play on. When a player has his arm pinned to his sides, causing him t drop the ball — play on.

If an opponent is carried forward i a push-ball movement even thoug he is in possession of the ball – free kick. (This is incorrect tackling SOCIAL NEWS





PERMITS CLOSE SOON

Applications for permits for season 1970 will close with the Records Secretary of the V.A.F.A. Mr. Bruce De Lacy, 67 Charman Road, Mentone. 3194 on July 1st.

The only application considered after that date will be that of a player affiliated with a club in the amateur body of South Australia, Western Australia or Tasmania, who is transferred to Victoria in his employment, or a National Serviceman who returns to Victoria.

A player who has played with a club in the V.A.F.A. this season, and has subsequently played with another club, must stand down for two matches before being eligible to play for his V.A.F.A. club again.


In a case such as this, the date on which he last played with the other club must be shown on his permit application. Re-registration of a player whose permit is still in force, that is, a player who has not played with any other club since he last played with the club with which he is seeking reregis:ration may be made at any time up to the last home and home match.
