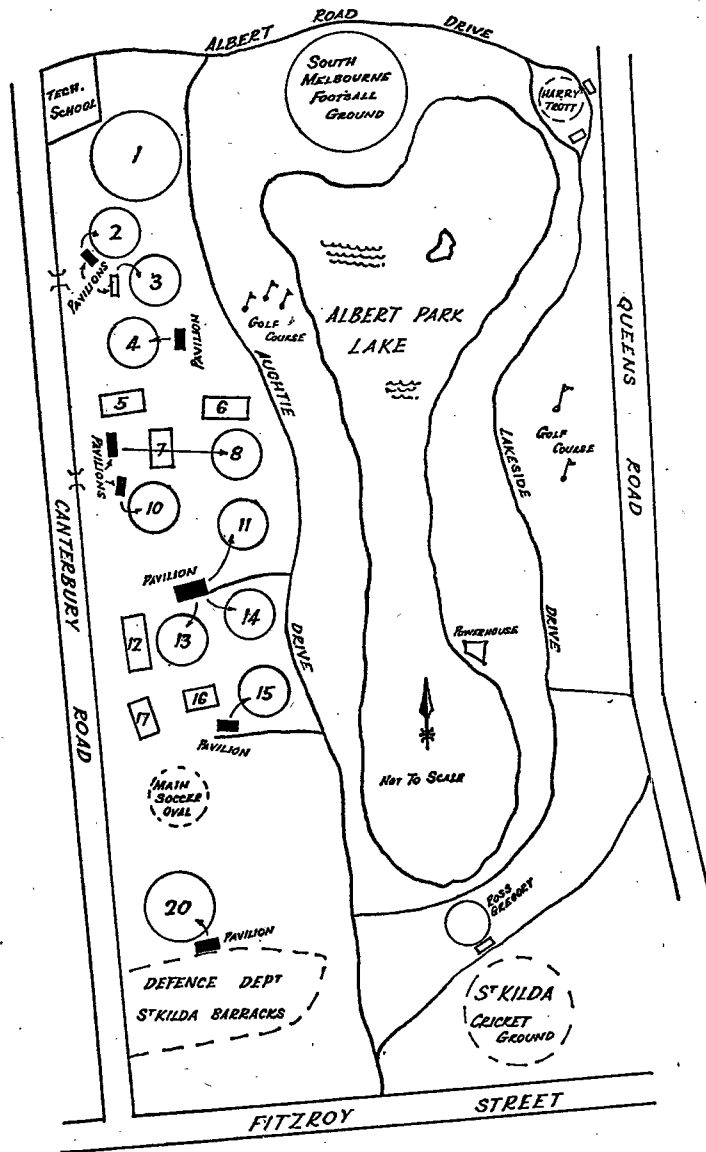

# 139 TEAMS TO START SEASON 1975 THREE NEW CLUBS MAKE V.A.F.A. DEBUT Interstate Games on Queen's Birthday Sunday

One hundred and thirty-nine teams will compete in the 1975 season of the Victorian Amateur Football Association, which opens today.

Last year there were 135 teams taking part.

Three new clubs have been admitted to the Association, one of which is fielding only a Junior Section team, while two other established clubs have entered Junior teams.

An innovation this season is the playing of two Interstate games in Melbourne on the Sunday of the Queen's Birthday week-end.

The new clubs to be admitted to the Association are Bulleen United and Heatherton (who will field teams in F Section and F Reserve Section), and Thomastown, who will compete in Junior Section 2.

Bulleen-Templestowe, who competed in the Junior Section last season, will also field a senior team (but no Reserves) this year. They will also play in F Section.

Old Carey and Reservoir Old Boys have increased their field of activity in the Association with the addition of Junior teams.

At the other end of the scale, Dookie and Longerenong O.C. have withdrawn and A.J.A.X. have had to withdraw their Junior team.

To the new clubs and the new teams, we extend a very hearty welcome and hope that your association with us will be to our mutual benefit.

It is Victoria's turn to play hosts for the 1975 Interstate games and we will be visited by teams from South Australia and Tasmania.

Both matches will be played on the Sunday of the Queen's Birthday week-end, Sunday, June 15th. The games will be at Elsternwick Park, the one against Tasmania commencing at 11.45 a.m., and that against South Australia is scheduled to start at 2 p.m.

This is the first time Amateur football has been played officially on a Sunday in Melbourne although the Perth Carnivals in 1959 and 1970 in-

cluded Sunday play. We are hopeful that a much larger attendance than usual will support these games, as there are no V.F.L. matches to be played on this day.

### NO PRICE INCREASE

Despite heavily increased printing costs, it has been decided not to increase the price of THE AMATEUR FOOTBALLER this season, either to the clubs or the public, although many other publications of a similar nature have done so.

However the Association cannot go on indefinitely absorbing the rising costs and a price increase may be inevitable in 1976.

### NEW FEATURES, WITH YOUR CO-OPERATION

We have decided to introduce some new features in THE AMATEUR FOOTBALLER this season, but we will need the co-operation of Club Secretaries and Press Correspondents if it is to be successful.

Prominent players, past and present, are to be featured, as well as Coaches, and prominent officials. But as we are not fully aware of the football history of these players and officials, we are asking clubs to provide us with these details.

Please contact the Editor immediately so that your club may be represented in this feature.

And now to season 1975 — may it be a happy and successful one — free of serious injury and free of Tribunal meetings!!

## IMPORTANT NOTES

Club Secretaries are reminded that all applicants for permits who have played with League or Association first or second XVIII's and certain Country Leagues must appear before the Permit Committee.

The Club Secretary should ring the Chairman of the Permit Committee, Mr. F. H. Coldrey, at 92-4797, to ascertain the date and place of Permit Committee meetings.

While on the subject of permits, it might be as well to remind club officials that they should check all permit forms before lodging them with the V.A.F.A., to ensure that they are fully completed and in order.

Any form which is not complete will be returned to the club concerned. Similarly, any form marked X indicating where the player should sign will also be returned.

If an applicant for a permit has not played with any club previously, he should write NIL in the space provided.

All applications for permits must be submitted on forms which provide for the applicant to complete a statutory declaration as to his amateur status.

### CLOSING TIME

Applications for permits must be in the hands of the Records Secretary of the Association, by TUESDAY, otherwise they will not be dealt with until the following week.

Re-registrations close on FRIDAY of each week.

Clubs with Junior teams are advised to register players who are eligible for the Juniors on a Junior permit form. These players will then be automatically registered and eligible to play with the Seniors and Reserves.

The slip at the foot of permit forms and re-registration forms, which is detached and returned to the club Secretary on granting of the permit

(or re-registration) must be completed before the form is lodged.

Permit forms and re-registrations forms must be completed and signed in INK; forms filled out in pencil are not acceptable.

ALL NEW PERMITS AND RE-REGISTRATIONS are to be forwarded to RECORDS SECRETARY, Mr. Bruce DeLacy, 67 Charman Road, Mentone, 3194 (phone 93-3977). All enquiries regarding the granting of permits or re-registrations must be made to Mr. DeLacy. Enquiries on Saturday mornings should be made not later than 10 a.m.

## OLD PLAYERS AND OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION

It is planned to establish an Old Players and Officials Association of the V.A.F.A. Any and all ex-players and officials will be eligible to join.

It is anticipated that the annual membership fee will be ONE DOLLAR per member.

It is not proposed that this body should be excessively active but it will serve two purposes —

1. As a means of renewing and retaining friendships and associations built up over the years.
2. To assist in the establishment and propagation of present-day Amateur football.

In the initial stages it is proposed that only two activities a year would be embarked upon, but of course, the area of assistance of this important adjunct to the V.A.F.A. would depend on the thoughts of members after the "ball is set rolling".

Clubs have been asked to notify the Secretary of the V.A.F.A. as to the numbers of ex-players and officials of their clubs who would be interested in joining, while ex-players and officials not at present actively engaged with any club should contact the Secretary of the V.A.F.A. Clubs are reminded of the Clearance Agreement between the V.A.F.A. and the Victorian Country Football League. Clearances MUST be obtained for any new player with the V.A.F.A. who has played with a club or League affiliated with the V.C.F.L.

### CAREFUL WHERE YOU SEND THEM!!!

Make sure you send ALL APPLICATIONS FOR PERMITS AND RE-REGISTRATIONS to the RECORDS SECRETARY, and NOT to the Secretary of the V.A.F.A.

Any which are sent to the Secretary of the V.A.F.A. will not be sent on to the Records Secretary, BUT WILL BE HELD UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THEY ARE PICKED UP BY THE CLUB CONCERNED.

Players affected will of course not be eligible to play in the meantime.

### JEWISH HIGH HOLY DAY

### (JEWISH NEW YEAR)

If either of the AJAX teams (Senior or Reserve Section) are involved in the playing of a Semi-final, Final or Grand Final match on Saturday, September 6th, 1975, then all games in that Section scheduled to be played on that date will be deferred one week and played on Saturday, September 13th.

This only applies in E Section, will only apply on the date stipulated in 1975, and will only apply if either of the AJAX teams is drawn to play on that date.

## UNIVERSITY BLACKS v MONASH BLUES GAMES

The University Blacks-Monash Blues games, drawn for May 17th, will be played on Wednesday, May 7th.

No date, other than May 7th, can be substituted for this day.

### RE-REGISTRATIONS

Attention is drawn to the following Rules of the Association which were amended at the Annual Meeting on Monday, 3rd March, 1975.

Rule 12 now reads — "THE RE-REGISTRATION OF A PLAYER WITH THE ASSOCIATION SHALL BE EFFECTED IN SUCH FORM AS THE PERMIT COMMITTEE SHALL PRESCRIBE FROM TIME TO TIME".

Rule 13 (which follows) HAS BEEN DELETED.

This Rule stated — "The Re-Registration of a player with the Association may be effected singly or with others on a list in duplicate which shall be in alphabetical order of surnames showing the said surname, initials and present address of each player whom it is requested be re-registered".

Rule 71 states — "THE PERMIT COMMITTEE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE TO THE ASSOCIATION TO PRESCRIBE THE FORM IN WHICH APPLICATIONS SHALL BE MADE TO THE ASSOCIATION FOR RE-REGISTRATION WITH THE ASSOCIATION".

ALL APPLICATIONS FOR RE-REGISTRATION MUST NOW BE MADE ON THE RE-REGISTRATION FORMS WHICH WERE DISTRIBUTED TO CLUBS AT THE ANNUAL MEETING. THE FORM MUST BE SIGNED PERSONALLY BY THE PLAYER.

Under no circumstances will lists of players for Re-Registration be accepted.

## Important Notes (cont.)

### INCREASED FINES FOR LATE SCORES

Club Secretaries and Press Correspondents are reminded that increased fines will apply this season for omitting to phone scores or other required information to the appropriate phone number, or for the late phoning of such information.

Failure to phone final scores to the Herald office by publication deadline (4.50 p.m. for Seniors and Juniors, 3 p.m. for Reserves) — THREE DOLLARS.

If you miss the publication deadline, you must still phone final scores to our representative at the Herald office before 5.30 p.m., otherwise the fine is SIX DOLLARS.

If you miss out on phoning final scores to the Herald office before 5.30 p.m., you must phone these scores to the Press Correspondent before 7 p.m., otherwise a FURTHER FINE of SIX DOLLARS will be incurred.

Clubs in A Section are required to phone Goal-kickers and Best Players of BOTH sides to the Press Correspondent before 6 p.m. and those in B Section between 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. otherwise a fine of SIX DOLLARS is imposed.

Make sure you phone the CORRECT scores. The fine for phoning INCORRECT scores is THREE DOLLARS.

**THE HOME CLUB IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ATTENDING TO THE PHONING OF SCORES AND OTHER NECESSARY INFORMATION.**

### AMATEUR DEFINITION

An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize, staked bet or declared wager, or who has not knowingly or without protest competed with or against a professional for a prize of any description or for public exhibition, or who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the practice of any athletic exercise as a means of livelihood or pecuniary gain. (This definition is subject to certain exceptions set out in the rules of the Australian Amateur Football Council.)

Any phone calls not directed to these numbers go astray, and clubs will be regarded as not having phoned the scores, and will be fined accordingly.

When phoning scores, please state firstly the Section, the teams concerned, and then the winners, before giving the actual scores.

Correct scores must be phoned, otherwise a fine will be incurred. Check with Goal Umpires for correct scores.

This is the responsibility of the HOME CLUB.

### INTER-STATE ACTION COMMITTEE

A sub-committee has been appointed by the Executive to plan and organise activities in connection with Inter-state games.

The function of this sub-committee will be to arrange details of these games in conjunction with the Secretary of the V.A.F.A.

Two new names have recently been added. Messrs. Clarrie Middling and Brian Gibbs, and the Sub-committee now comprises Messrs. J. F. X. Dillon (convener), J. P. Byrne, J. E. Fidge, C. Middling and B. Gibbs.

### LATE WITHDRAWAL OF JUNIOR TEAMS

The late withdrawal of Beverley Hills from Junior Section 1, and Old Brighton Grammarians from Junior Section 2, will create a bye in these two sections.

The "Fixtures and Results" for these sections will be amended next week.

## Important Notes (cont.)

### RESERVES — PLEASE NOTE

Team Managers and Timekeepers of Reserve Section teams should note particularly the following points:—

1. Starting time is 11.45 a.m. If started after 11.50 a.m., a fine for late start operates.
2. EACH QUARTER is of 20 minutes' duration, plus Time-on. Instructions regarding TIME-ON are printed on the back of Score Cards.
3. Half-time interval MUST NOT EXCEED 15 MINUTES — that is from the end of the second quarter to the start of the third.

### SENIOR, JUNIORS

Senior and Junior Sections matches consist of quarters of 25 minutes' duration — plus Time-on and commence at 2 p.m.

### LITTLE THINGS ALL SHOULD KNOW ABOUT

1. The lines in front of goal posts are known as the kick-off lines, not the goal square.
2. Time added, is time on, not time off.
3. All clear is the signal, given to the goal umpire — by the field umpire — indicating that the goal umpire is at liberty to decide whether a goal or behind should be recorded.
4. Goal umpires are the sole judges of scores.
5. The ball must be completely over the scoring or boundary line, before a goal or behind is scored, or the ball is out of bounds.
6. When the ball is kicked out of bounds on the full — the player receiving the free kick may bring the ball into play — either by kicking or by hand ball.

### SECTION — PLEASE

Press Correspondents are requested to comply with ALL INSTRUCTIONS in the Notes to Press Correspondents issued to all clubs prior to the Season — including — CLUB NAME and SECTION on every envelope forwarded to The Amateur Footballer.

### TIMEKEEPERS' INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING "TIME-ON"

"Time-on" must be added (1) when signalled by the Field Umpire and (2) when a goal or behind has been scored. In the case of a goal, take the time from the waving of the flags by the Goal Umpire to the bouncing of the ball in the centre by the Field Umpire and, in the case of a behind, take the time from the waving of the flag to the kick off.

### CORRECT SCORES ESSENTIAL

Clubs are reminded, that correct scores must be phoned to the Herald office, otherwise a fine (one dollar) will be incurred.

And remember, too, that scores are incomplete without the points—offending clubs will be fined.

### DUTIES OF RUNNERS

The duty of an Official Runner is to carry messages from the coach to players and NOT to engage in altercations with players.

The runner, in carrying such messages, must take the shortest possible route to the player concerned, and leave the field immediately after delivering the message.

### AT ELSTERNWICK PARK ADMISSION TICKETS

Admission tickets issued to clubs for matches at Elsternwick Park are for the use of players and officials only. Any player who cannot produce a ticket will be required to pay for admittance.

### CAR PARKING

Drivers who are not willing to park cars as directed at Elsternwick Park, will be refused admittance to the ground.

### SCOREBOARD

Clubs are advised that the Scoring Board at Elsternwick Park must be operated by responsible club officials at all times.

Children must not be allowed in the Scoring Board.

### HOW TO CONTACT EMERGENCY UMPIRES

Emergency umpires for all sections will be located at Elsternwick Park, and will be available to proceed to any ground if required.

The telephone number will be 91-6491. Should the appointed umpire fail to appear, it will be necessary to phone Elsternwick Park and ask for an emergency umpire to be sent.

Clubs must make themselves familiar with the system, and ring the correct number: 91-6491.

For teams on Thursday night (as early as possible after 7.30 p.m. please—and certainly before 9 p.m.).

## Important Notes (cont.)

### HERE'S HOW YOU CAN HELP WHEN PHONING SCORES

Club representatives when phoning scores to the Herald can help in three ways.

1. BE PATIENT — There are a large number of calls to handle in a short time. You may find the phone engaged — and when you get through to the number, you may be asked to "Hold the line please". The call before yours on the other line has to be attended to.

2. ALWAYS INCLUDE THE POINTS — For example 5.6-36 points. Remember the scores are not complete without the points —and you will be fined for not having phoned the complete scores — and make sure they are correct — or you will also be fined.

3. DON'T ASK FOR SCORES IN OTHER MATCHES — or ring especially to ask for scores. This takes time and may prevent another club from meeting the "publication deadline".

Your assistance and co-operation in these matters will be appreciated.

### PRESS CORRESPONDENTS

POST REPORT EACH SUNDAY. — It is absolutely essential that copy be received by the Editor BY FIRST POST ON MONDAY EACH WEEK. Copy received after this time will not be considered.

The only way to ensure delivery on Monday is to post SUNDAY — EARLY.

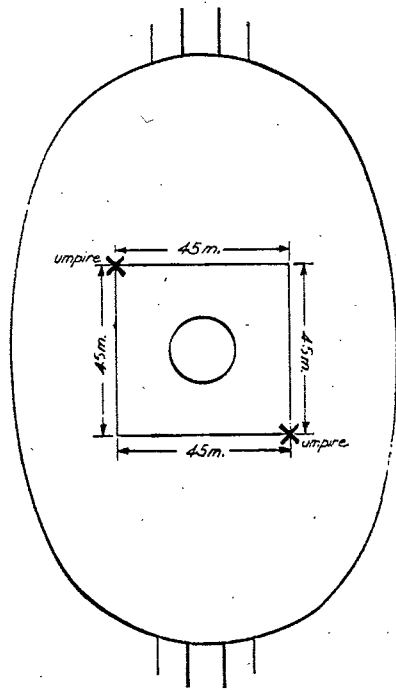

## THE CENTRE SQUARE



Boundary umpires will stand on diagonally opposite corners at the points of the square (as illustrated) so they can see both ways for any infringement.

Boundary umpires will take up positions on diagonally opposite corners at the points of the square.

Field umpires must wait until the boundary umpires are in position before proceeding to bounce the ball.

When a player has infringed by being on or over the line of the "square" the boundary umpire shall sound his whistle and call to the field umpire "against No. \_\_\_" and name the club, and then run in the direction of the intended kick.

If the boundary umpire is unable to see the number of the player offending, he will simply call the name of the club.

The field umpire shall award a free kick to the player of the opposing team, nearest to him in the centre of the ground, such free kick to be taken at the centre circle.

The field umpire is the sole judge as to who takes the free kick.

In the event of both boundary umpires sounding their whistles simultaneously — if the offenders are from the same team, the free kick shall be given to an opponent.

If however, the offenders are from opposing teams the field umpire shall then proceed to bounce the ball after allowing players time to take up their position out of the square, in accordance with the provision of the centre square.

In the event of a scrimmage which requires the field umpire to once again bounce the ball, then the centre square law does not apply.

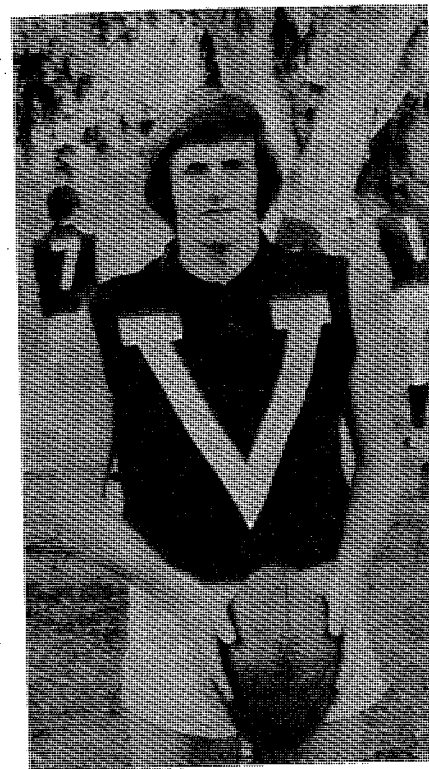
In the event of a breach of the laws being detected by the field umpire prior to, or during his moving in to bounce the ball, he shall award a free kick, to the player offended against, but at the spot where the incident occurred, provided such free kick does not penalise the side offended against.

If a boundary umpire should observe an incident where a player was forced over the line, he would not sound his whistle but at the first opportunity censure the offender and advise him it is a reportable offence, also he must inform the field umpire of any action he has taken.

Only four players of either side are permitted to be inside the centre square, if there are more than that number who do not move when instructed by the field umpire a free kick will immediately be given to the opposing team at the centre circle.

The spirit of this law is to enable the game to be free of congestion at the centre bounces thus allowing for the skills of Australian football to be further exemplified.

## BRUCE BOURNE — PLAYER OF THE YEAR, 1974



Probably no one has more richly deserved the title of "THE AMATEUR FOOTBALLER OF THE YEAR", than Bruce Bourne, who was adjudged the winner of this honour in 1974.

Bruce won the A Section Best and Fairest award, and was also selected as THE AMATEUR FOOTBALLER PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR at St. Bernard's Grand Final Breakfast.

Bruce, who has been Vice-Captain of Ormond since 1971, has played six years with the seniors after two seasons with the Juniors, and played his 100th game for the club early last season.

Bruce has represented Victoria in Interstate games since 1971 and was Captain of the Carnival side at Melbourne in 1973.

He was also Captain of the team which beat South Australia in Adelaide last June, and was Vice-Captain of the Australian Amateurs team which competed in the Australian Football Council Section 2 Championships in Sydney. He was not available for the match against Tasmania at Hobart later in the season.

In addition to his Best and Fairest win, Bruce also won his club award, after being runner-up on several occasions.

He also won Victoria's best player award in the Carnival match against South Australia in 1973.

Bruce is 25, is 6.2 tall and weighs 14 stone.

He played most of his football career at centre half-back until the final match of the 1973 Carnival, when he was used with a good deal of success at a ruck-rover. He continued to play in this position with Ormond last year, but with the ability he has, he could play almost anywhere on the ground.

## UMPIRE'S CORNER

In almost any sport at all, the old adage "experience is the best teacher" applies not only to those who participate, but also to those controlling games, in the form of umpires or referees.

The same can be applied to Amateur Football. If a player who has served his apprenticeship in junior ranks and the reserve grade fails to show out during his first 20 or 30 games his performance is noted by all as "all he needs is experience".

The same situation can be applied to Amateur Football Umpires.

The majority of my umpires are very young and inexperienced, but all have performed well and they do the job of keeping pace with, and controlling the frustrations, brought about by trying conditions, of 36 players, making courageous split-second decisions and still "copping the abuse" of all and sundry.

They train very hard, but have no chance of a rest period during the course of a game — so must be fitter than the men they control during a match.

If the field umpire allows play to "go on" and he loses control — he is criticised

— if he pulls the game up for "trivial incidents" he gets "a blast" from either the coaches, supporters, the umpires' board or the umpires' advisor, so he must be able to strike the happy medium.

All I ask as 1975 season opens is for followers of our great game "to give my young umpires a fair go" as they are the hardest men to replace.

This season the Umpire Association will be led by one of our most popular men.

Peter Feil, Mine Host of the Park Royal Motor Inn will be President and will have Ken Jorgensen as his Vice President.

Philip Rowell is Secretary, John Field, Treasurer and Graham Simpson, Assist. Secretary.

### 5 Years Ago

The V.A.F.A. welcomed three new clubs for season 1970 — Old Essendon Grammarians, La Trobe University, and Dookie and Longerenong Old Coll.

A highlight of the season was the A.A.F.C. carnival to be staged in Perth. Previous Perth carnivals had been in 1948 (won by South Australia) and 1959 (won by Victoria).

Umpires in A Section for opening day were Gavin Marshall, Graeme Simpson, Geoff Thomas, Darryl George and Bill Mason. Ivanhoe and De La Salle made reappearances in 'A' section.

Coburg, 'A' section premiers for 1969, unfurled their flag in the presence of Caulfield Grammarians. They had many anxious moments and it was only in the last 10 minutes that they gained control and won by 16 points.

'B' section grand finalists in 1969, Ivanhoe and De La Salle provided a real upset with De La Salle, after kicking 10.3 to 2.2 in the first quarter, defeating Ivanhoe by 53 points to reverse the 1969 Grand Final result.

M.H.S.O.B. congratulated their 1970 coaches, Keith Marshall and George Inkster, on their appointments.

### 10 Years Ago

1965 opened up with the acquisition of St. Kilda Cricket Ground as the Association's headquarters, with the match of the day being played there.

Feature game for the opening day was the meeting of 1964 premiers, (Old Paradians) and Collegians, with Collegians leading all day to win convincingly, 10.12 (72) to 5.5 (35).

AJAX's first club captain, Lionel Rosenberg, had been appointed senior coach for 1965.

### 25 Years Ago

Thirty-nine senior and eight junior teams lined up for start of the season on April 22, 1950. Only 25 of the senior teams are still here in 1975.

Ormond turned the tables on their 1949 grand final conquerors, University Blacks when they held on at University to beat the home side by 15 points. John Backhouse, state full-forward, who transferred from M.H.S.O.B. starred for Blacks with 7 out of their 10 goals.

University Blues, runners up to Geelong in 'B' section in 1949, also reversed the result when they defeated the home side, 15.12 to 12.8. Geelong's ground was Corio Oval.

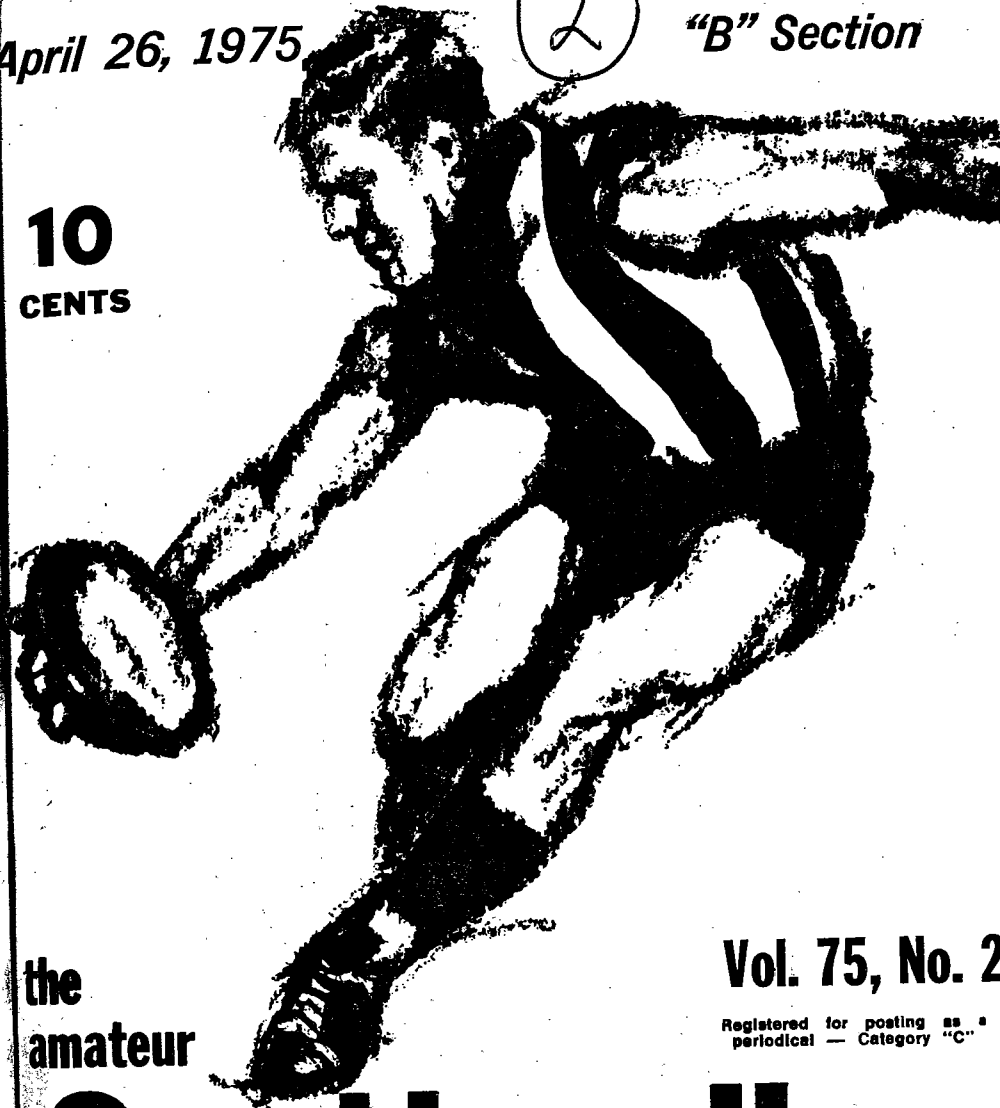
