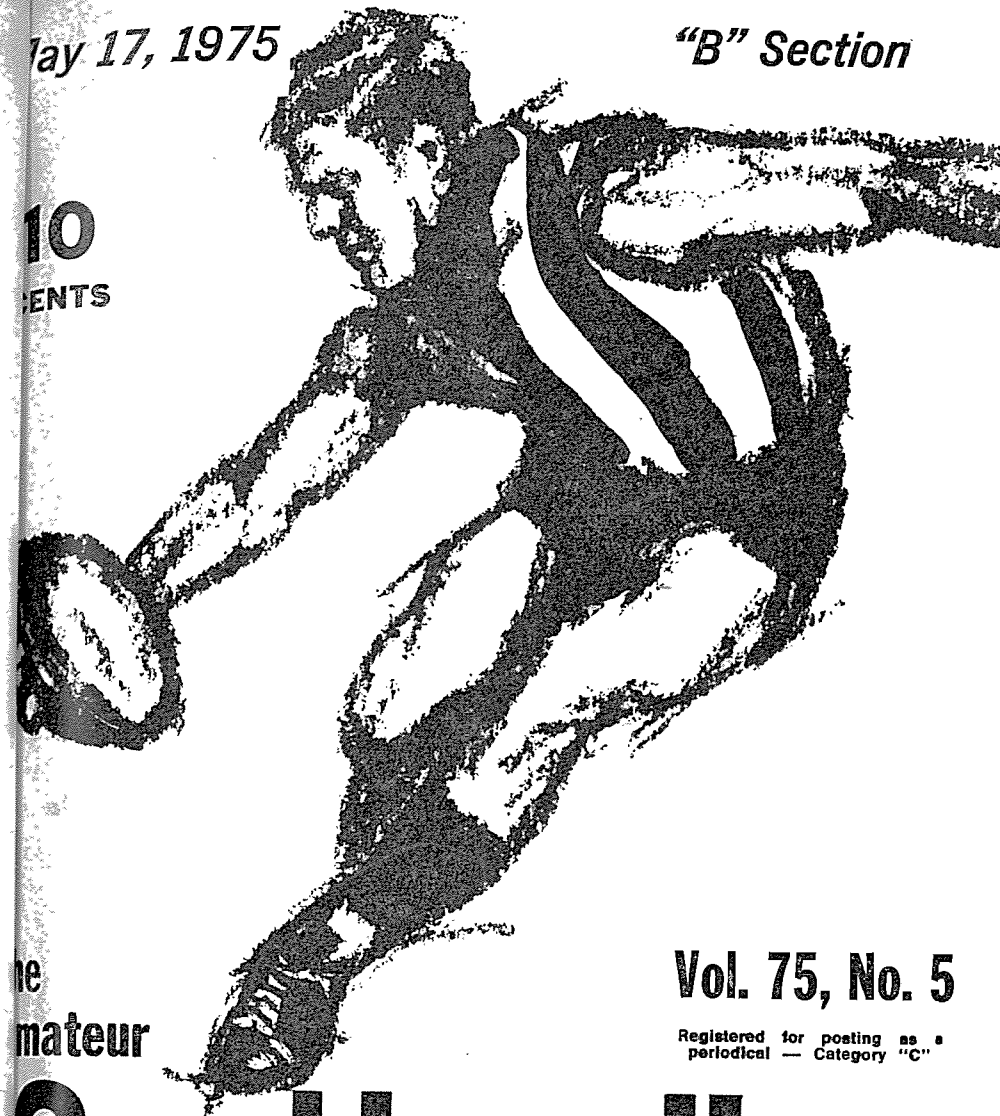

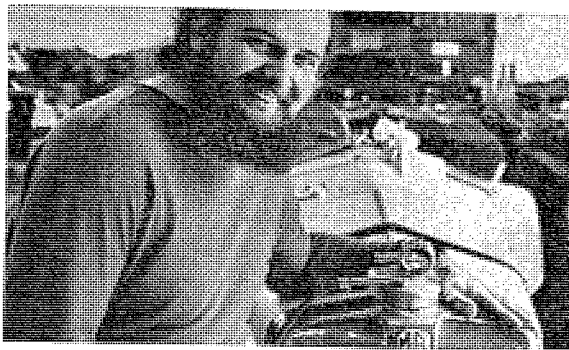

MONASH TUMBLE FROM TOP PLACE Blasted by Blacks — Pipped by Parade Ormond in Big Win Over Coburg

Monash Blues have dropped from the top of the ladder to fourth and there is every likelihood that they will go out of the four after today's round.

Monash were unbeaten and alone in top place but crashed badly against University Blacks in the match which was played last Wednesday week, May 7th, instead of today, to enable players to take part in the Inter-Varsity Carnival at Adelaide.

Then last Saturday they just failed to catch Old Paradians in the last quarter and were beaten by three points, after Parade kicked nine goals in the third term.

Ormond and Coburg, who have staged some terrific struggles in recent years, provided something of a "fizzer", Armond racing right away from the start to win by no less than 105 points.

What a contrast from last year's second semi-final, when Ormond scraped home by a point in one of the finest games I have ever seen.

Reservoir Old Boys' shocking inaccuracy deprived them of a half-time lead over St. Bernard's and instead they trailed by a goal (3-11 to 5-5). It was a tight game with the back lines of both sides on top.

St. Bernard's edged away to a lead of 13 points at three-quarter-time and then rattled on 6 goals in the early part of the last term to make the game safe. They finished with 8 goals for the quarter and ironically, Reservoir kicked 4 goals straight in the same period, but went down by 41 points.

North Old Boys kept the ball low to counteract Old Trinity's tall men and these tactics, coupled with a winning half-back line, gave them a very comfortable win. They finished strongly, adding 7 goals in the last term.

Monash started well with 6 goals in the first quarter and led Parade by 17 points, which Parade reduced to 11 points at the interval.

But Parade's third quarter burst of 9-3 to 3-3 was the turning point, for although they managed only a point in the last quarter, they held Monash out just long enough.

Ormond kicked 8 goals in the first quarter and led Coburg by 10 goals at half-time. They turned on a great display of teamwork which left Coburg floundering.

Geelong kept within reach of University Blacks for the first half, but several missed chances in the third term which made it easy for the Blacks.

In the midweek game, the Blacks outmarked and outpaced Monash and their long-kicking game kept the Blacks on top all day. They won by more than 18 goals.

Old Carey surprised with a 12-goal win over Ivanhoe and De La Salle thrashed Kew. University Blues scored by 34 points against Collegians and Caulfield Grammarians had 3 goals to spare over Old Scotch.

Marcellin finished 44 points ahead of Old Haileybury, whose inaccuracy in front of goal contributed to the size of their losing margin.

Old Ivanhoe scored comfortably from Alphington (39 points) and Melbourne High beat Old Melburnians by 2 points in a high-scoring game.

St. Kilda CBC beat Old Brighton by 5 goals, while Parkside and Power House opened their accounts with wins over Brunswick and Uni. High respectively.

Hampton Rovers beat Fawkner by 3 goals and State Savings Bank scored a big win over Commonwealth Bank. Old Camberwell (first win) Assumption and Old Geelong were the other winners.

Elsternwick continued their unbeaten run, but they only had 8 points to spare from St. Bede's, and LaTrobe Blacks scraped home from Old Mentonians (who have not won a game) by a mere point, while the St. Pat's Monivae combination tumbled North Brunswick out of the four when they inflicted a 20-point defeat on North.

Thornbury caused an upset by beating the previously undefeated Glenroy, the margin being more than 11 goals.

There were a couple of big scores in the Junior games — Ivanhoe kicking the huge total of 39-25 (259 points) against Power House (10-3) and Co-

burg kicked 28-21 (189) to Parkside's 10-10.

University Blues suffered their first defeat — the Blacks beat them by 7 points. Blues' inaccuracy could have cost them the game.

In the Reserves, Old Trinity beat North Old Boys by 19 points, Ormond beat Coburg by 6 goals, Reservoir easily beat St. Bernard's, Collegians beat University Blues by 32 points, and St. Kilda CBC won by 21 points from Old Brighton.

Fawkner were much too strong for Hampton Rovers, Old Geelong beat Old Xaverians by nearly 5 goals, AJAX went down to West Brunswick, and Old Mentonians scored a big win over LaTrobe Blacks.

Thornbury beat Glenroy by 5 points, Monash Whites beat University Reds by a similar margin and Heatherton beat LaTrobe Reds by a point.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

By Kevin McKay

BOUNDARY UMPIRES

Boundary umpires cover more "territory" than field umpires, therefore they must be physically equipped for their task.

I am assuming that they all are in training and will always be up with the play.

Boundary umpires must always keep their eyes on the play and players, and the field and goal umpires.

They must keep out of the way of players. When following the play they may "cut the line" by moving along inside the boundary, but when up with the play they must keep "on the line".

The ball is not out of bounds until it has crossed the line. If any portion of the ball is on the line it is still in play.

Do not be influenced by players or spectators. The position for the "throw-in" is on the boundary line, not 4 or 5 metres inside the boundary line.

Balance yourself by placing both feet on the line, and take the ball in either your right or left hand and swing over the opposite shoulder toward the centre of the ground, allowing body swing.

This takes the strain off the stomach muscles, and helps conserve stamina.

The ball must be thrown towards the centre of the ground, and from the boundary line.

Always aim for an even "throw-in". When near the behind posts do not "throw-in" too far as it may give an advantage to a team if the ball lands in front of the goals.

When inexperienced boundary umpires in junior competitions are throwing into a breeze, they tend to stand a metre or so inside the boundary line.

However this is wrong in practice and should not be done.

If the wind is behind you, show judgement with your throw so that you do not leave the players "high and dry" if they are in position.

However immediately you get the ball throw it in.

Don't wait for the rucks to get into position. That's their worry — yours is to put the ball into play.

When a player is kicking for goal, take up a position at the behind post in line with the flight of the ball. You then command a view to give an accurate decision.

If, when moving towards the goal, there is a doubt as to whether a behind has been scored or it is out of bounds, withhold your signal until the goal umpire has made his decision.

In short, have an understanding with your goal umpires and co-operate with each other.

After a goal has been scored get the ball and rush it to the centre, then quickly

make for your position at the centre square. After a behind has been scored run backwards along the boundary line until you reach the spot from where you will watch the ball being kicked-off; then follow the play from there.

If the field umpire fails to note the signal of the boundary umpire, his attention must immediately be called, by the boundary umpire following him on to the playing field.

Once you start, do not weaken. Go on with it.

In conclusion to all our club boundary umpires who each week give their best thank you for your efforts and keep up the good work.

STATE COACH IS A ST. BERNARD "FOUNDATION"

Gerard (Gus) Mitchell, who is Coach of the Victorian teams for the 1975 Inter-state matches at Elsternwick Park on Sunday, June 15th, is a foundation member of St. Bernard's, of whom he has been coach since 1970.

In that time he has brought St. Bernard's up to A Section and of the four years they have competed in the top grade, they have been in the four on three occasions and finished fifth the other year.

Gus left school at the end of 1961 and in 1962 had a season with Essendon.

The following year he returned to become a foundation member of St. Bernard's Old Collegians Football Club, and as a courageous ruck-rover, was a member of the E Section premiership team the same year.

The club met with continued success and won the D Section premiership in 1964.

The following season Gus won the club's Best and Fairest award, and was appointed Captain for the 1966 season.

He relinquished the captaincy at the end of that season and retired from football, with more than 100 games with the club to his credit, after the 1967 season, due to business commitments.

With the formation of the club's Junior team (Under 19) in 1969, Gus was enticed back and was appointed Coach of this side.

He met with immediate success and coached this team to the Junior Section 2 premiership the same year.

His ability as a coach was readily recognised and when the senior coaching position became vacant in 1970, Gus was appointed club coach.

Again success came his way, and St. Bernard's gained promotion to A Section in 1971, being runners-up to Old Scotch in his first year as coach.

Since then his record as a coach has been most consistent, although his ambition for a premiership in A Section has so far eluded him.

In 1971 the team finished third, the following year they were fifth and in 1973 were runners-up to Ormond. Last year, St. Bernard's were fourth, being beaten by the ultimate premiers, University Blacks, in the First Semi-final.

This performance must have been instrumental in his being appointed State coach for this season. We wish him every success.

In private life, Gus has his own accountancy practice in Moonee Ponds. He is married with three young children.

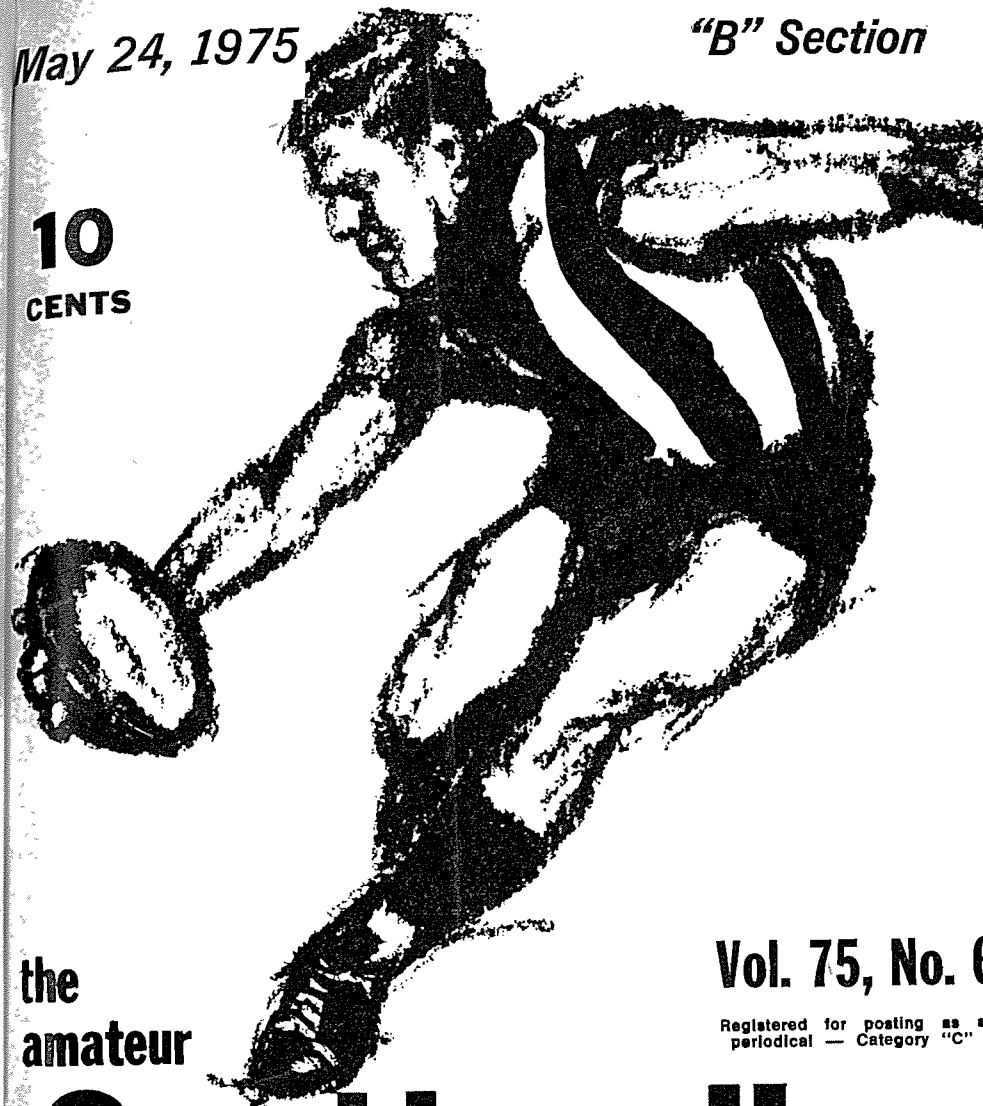
