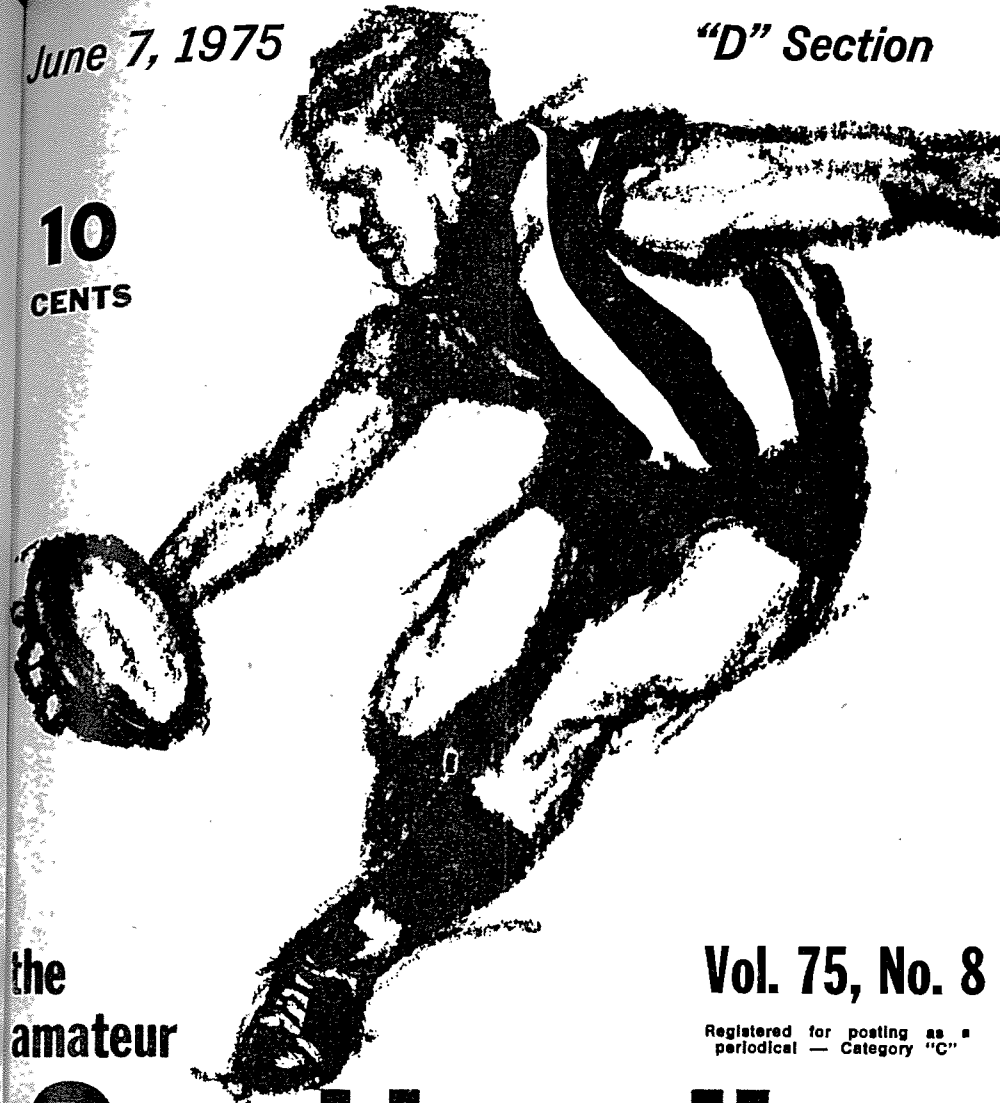

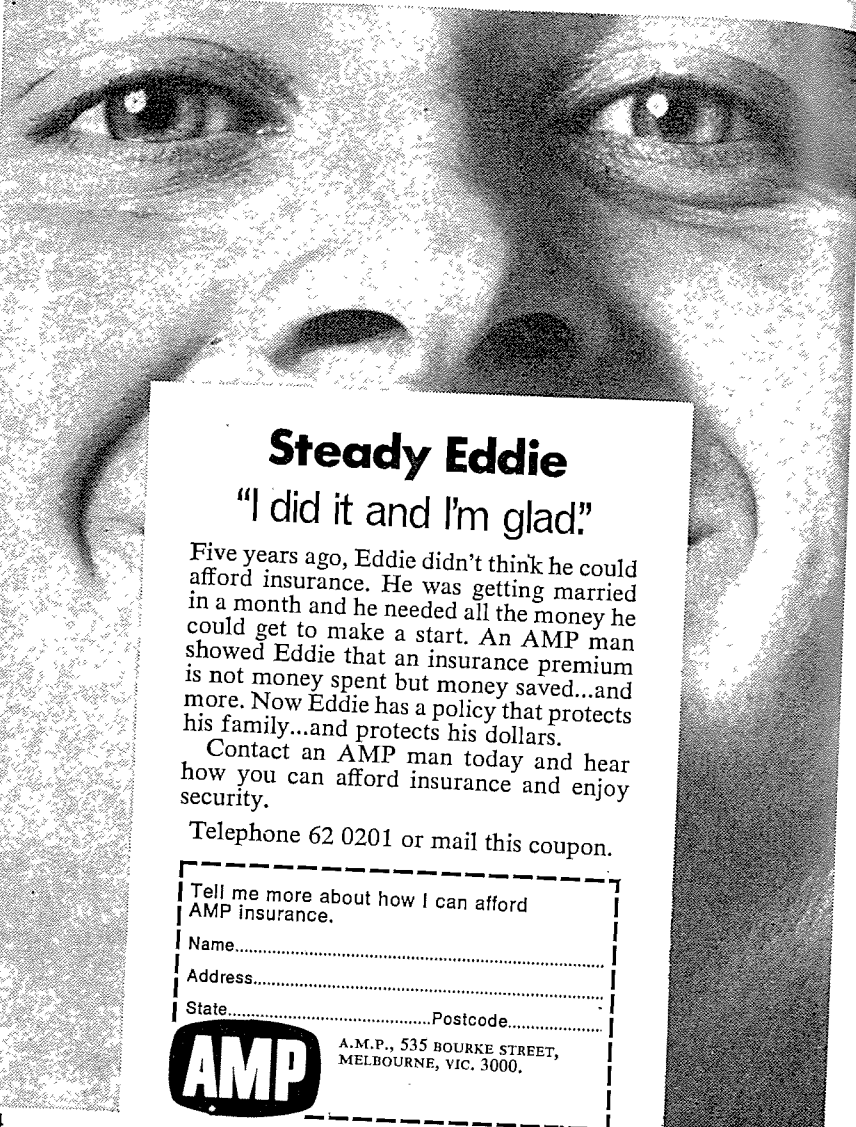

PARADE TOSS ST. BERNARD'S

ANOTHER BAD DAY FOR LEADERS — 5 LOSE

Big Re-shuffle in E Section

Old Paradians continued their upward trend when they caused an upset and scored a 21-point win over the leaders, St. Bernard's, who still hold top place on percentage.

Four other leading teams were defeated — University Blues (first defeat), A.M.P. Society, North Old Boys Juniors, and Monash Blues Reserves, who also suffered their first defeat, but lost the points the previous week through playing an unregistered player.

Another leader, ANZ Bank Reserves, could manage only a draw.

There was a big re-shuffle in E Section, where not one of the 10 teams is in the same position on the ladder as it was last week.

Parade's small men dominated the game against St. Bernard's and with Parade winning around the packs, the leaders were in trouble.

The first half was fairly even with Parade leading by 4 points at the Interval, but the third quarter was the turning point, when Parade held their opponents to one goal with the wind and kicked three themselves.

St. Bernard's came back in the last term but Parade finished well and their accurate kicking (17-7) was another winning factor.

Old Trinity, using their height to advantage, took an early lead over Monash Blues, who hit back with a burst of 7 goals in the second quarter to be within 10 points at half-time.

But Trinity went away again in the second half and won by 4 goals.

University Blacks led Coburg by only 2 points at the interval, but started to take control in the third term and went on to a comfortable win.

North Old Boys got a big lead on Reservoir Old Boys in the first term, kicking 7-4 to 1-1, and were still 3 goals in front at half-time.

North looked set for an easy win when they started the last quarter more than 6 goals in front but Reservoir finished strongly and were beaten by only 2 goals.

Geelong gained an early break on Ormond when they kicked 7-2 to 3-3 in the opening quarter and still led by a goal at the halfway mark, but Ormond gradually wore them down and were winners by over 7 goals.

Calufield Grammarians finished too strongly for Marcellin and won an interesting game by 32 points, but the result was in doubt until more than half of the last term had elapsed.

Caulfield led by 13 points at the interval after a good second quarter and Marcellin were only 7 points in front at three-quarter-time with Caulfield to have the wind advantage in the final term.

Marcellin fought the game out well but Caulfield were too tall and too strong for them. Caulfield should have had the game sewn up much earlier, but unnecessarily hurried kicking produced only a series of points, whereas a bit more steadiness might well have given them goals.

Kew surprised unbeaten University Blues, who put in a poor performance and were beaten by 19 points.

Poor shooting for goal didn't help Collegians, who went down to De La Salle by 19 points also. Old Haileybury were off target against Old Carey, who won by 27 points with three fewer scoring shots, while Ivanhoe scored a big win over Old Scotch.

Brunswick opened their account at the expense of Old Melburnians who were beaten by 31 points and Old Brighton ran Old Ivanhoe to 2 goals. Bad kicking affected the chances of both losers.

St. Kilda CBC were much too strong for Alphington but the other games were close — Parkside beating Power House by 2 points and Melbourne High beating Uni. High by 3 points (14-21 to 13-24).

Undefeated Hampton Rovers had a close call against Old Geelong, the margin being 4 points, and National Bank surprised State Savings Bank, beating them by 17 points.

St. Pat's-Monivae crushed AMP Society and Elsternwick were well beaten by ANZ Bank.

Thornbury beat Bulleen United by 22 points and LaTrobe Reds opened

their account with an easy win over Footscray Tech.

In the Junior Sections, University Blues had more than 10 goals to spare over Ivanhoe and Power House won their first game, beating University Blacks by 9 points.

Section 2 leaders, North Old Boys failed by 3 goals against Thomastown, while Hampton Rovers had only 2 points to spare from Bulleen-Templestowe.

Poor kicking ruined Reservoir Old Boys' chance of beating Old Carey as they kicked 10-22 to Carey's 15-7 and went down by 15 points.

Among the Reserves, Old Trinity beat Monash Blues by 5 points, St. Bernard's beat Parade by 5 goals and Reservoir had a big win over North Old Boys.

De La Salle beat Collegians by 10 goals, Parkside beat Power House by 2 goals, Old Brighton had an easy win against Old Ivanhoe, and Old Geelong beat Hampton Rovers by 8 points.

ANZ Bank drew with Elsternwick, West Brunswick beat Old Mentonians by 9 points (4-19 to 4-10), Bulleen United beat Thornbury by 25 points and LaTrobe Reds drew with Footscray Tech.

He has also won his club's Best and Fairest award three times.

In addition to his appearances with Victorian teams, Norm was also a member of the Australian Amateurs team in 1970, which



competed in the Australian Football Council Section 2 Championships in Brisbane.

He gets his fair share of goals and is considered by Graham Warfe to be the best player for his size that he has been associated with. It's just as well they both played for Coburg otherwise Graham must have also given Norm a mention as one of the hardest men to mind.

Norm is now 27, and there is still a lot of football in him — plenty I'm sure to carry him beyond that coveted 200 games mark.

PERMITS CLOSE SOON

Applications for permits for season 1975 will close with the Records Secretary of the V.A.F.A. Mr. Bruce De Lacy, 67 Charman Road, Mentone, 3194 on July 1st.

The only application considered after that date will be that of a player affiliated with a club in the amateur body of South Australia, Western Australia or Tasmania, who is transferred to Victoria in his employment.

A player who has played with a club in the V.A.F.A. this season, and has subsequently played with another club, must stand down for two matches before being eligible to play for his V.A.F.A. club again.

In a case such as this, the date on which he last played with the other club must be shown in his permit application.

Re-registration of a player whose permit is still in force, that is, a player who has not played with any other club since he last played with the club with which he is seeking re-registration may be made at any time up to the last home and home match.

While on the subject of Permits it may be as well to draw the attention of Club Secretaries (and any other club official who may be involved in signing up a player) to the fact that it has been brought to our notice that a number of minor Leagues are now making payments to players.

It is therefore absolutely essential that every new player or applicant for a Permit be thoroughly questioned as to his Amateur status, and as to whether he has received payment of any kind, or any trophies or presents etc.

If you are in any doubt whatsoever, contact the Chairman of the Permit Committee, Mr. F. H. Coldrey (Phone 92-4797).

Remember the club will suffer loss of points and incur a fine, if you play a player who is subsequently found to be ineligible.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

By Kevin McKay

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FIELD UMPIRES

1. Field Umpires must wear boots with stops on wet days, instead of rubber soles, to prevent slipping.
2. Umpires must be prompt in their decisions. The field umpire should not put the whistle to his mouth unless he intends to blow it.
3. Field Umpires must attend to training.
4. Field Umpires are instructed that "baulking" when bouncing the ball has the effect of "tricking" players into trouble and must not be practised.
5. When the Field Umpire calls "Play on" it should be a clear-cut case and the call should be given immediately.

"UNDULY ROUGH PLAY"

A free kick shall be awarded against a player for unduly rough play.

Included in this category is the act of kicking or attempting to kick the ball whilst another is making an attempt to pick it up. Dribbling the ball away from an opponent is permissible.

The reasoning behind this interpretation is to give protection to ball players.

We all know that a free kick is awarded to a player where the ball lands (or is marked) when a player is interfered with after kicking the ball.

The same penalty applies if a player has punched the ball and is then fouled.

Umpires' Association Treasurer John Field last week celebrated his 21st birthday with a party at his parents' home in Malvern.

Many of the guests were former school-mates and university friends together with a number of his fellow umpires.

Two of the later were last seen trying to take home the same young lady, I haven't heard who succeeded although I do know that only one of them had a car.

We congratulate John on attaining his majority and wish him well in his future career.

In the past two weeks President Peter Fell has again shown his great interest in our members when he gave invaluable assistance to Brian Goodman who was injured at training and last Thursday week again provided us with a most "comfortable" night, many thanks Peter.

It may be of interest to clubs to know that we have a total list of 85 Field Umpires — 16 of these are in their second year, whilst 29 are in their first year with us.

In other words over 50% of our field umpires have had less than 2 years experience.

In season 1965 the list of field umpires in the V.A.F.A. totalled 71.

Later he was reported on a charge of striking M. Selth (University Reds). On this second charge he was ordered from the field, and as he was ordered off he was reported on a charge of using abusive language to the field umpire.

In all, 11 players were reported last Saturday and details of the Tribunal findings will be published in the June 21st issue of The Amateur Footballer, together with the result of any charges arising out of today's round.

50TH ANNIVERSARY OF INTERSTATE GAMES

Next Sunday's Interstate games heralds the 50th Anniversary of the First Interstate Amateur Football match between Victoria and South Australia.

This match was played at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on Queen's Birthday week-end in 1925.

The Manager of the South Australian side on that occasion was Mr. Hugh Millard, Hon. Secretary of the South Australian Amateur Football League, and the youngest member of the South Australian party.

Hugh was Secretary of that body for more than 30 years, and was later appointed Secretary of the South Australian Cricket Association. He retired from the latter position some few years ago.

In honour of Golden Jubilee of Interstate Amateur Football, Hugh and his wife have been invited to be guests of the South Australian Amateur League for this year's visit.

Although this is the 50th Anniversary of the first Interstate match, it is not the 50th game between the two States.

There were no matches between 1939 and 1946, owing to the Second World War, and in the 1951 Carnival at Melbourne, Victoria did not meet South Australia.

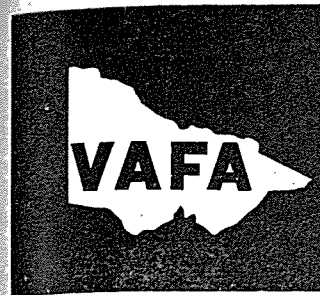

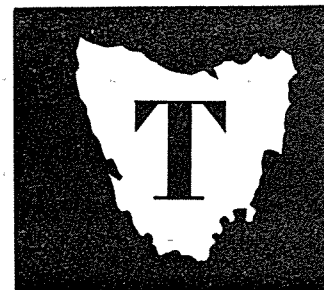
