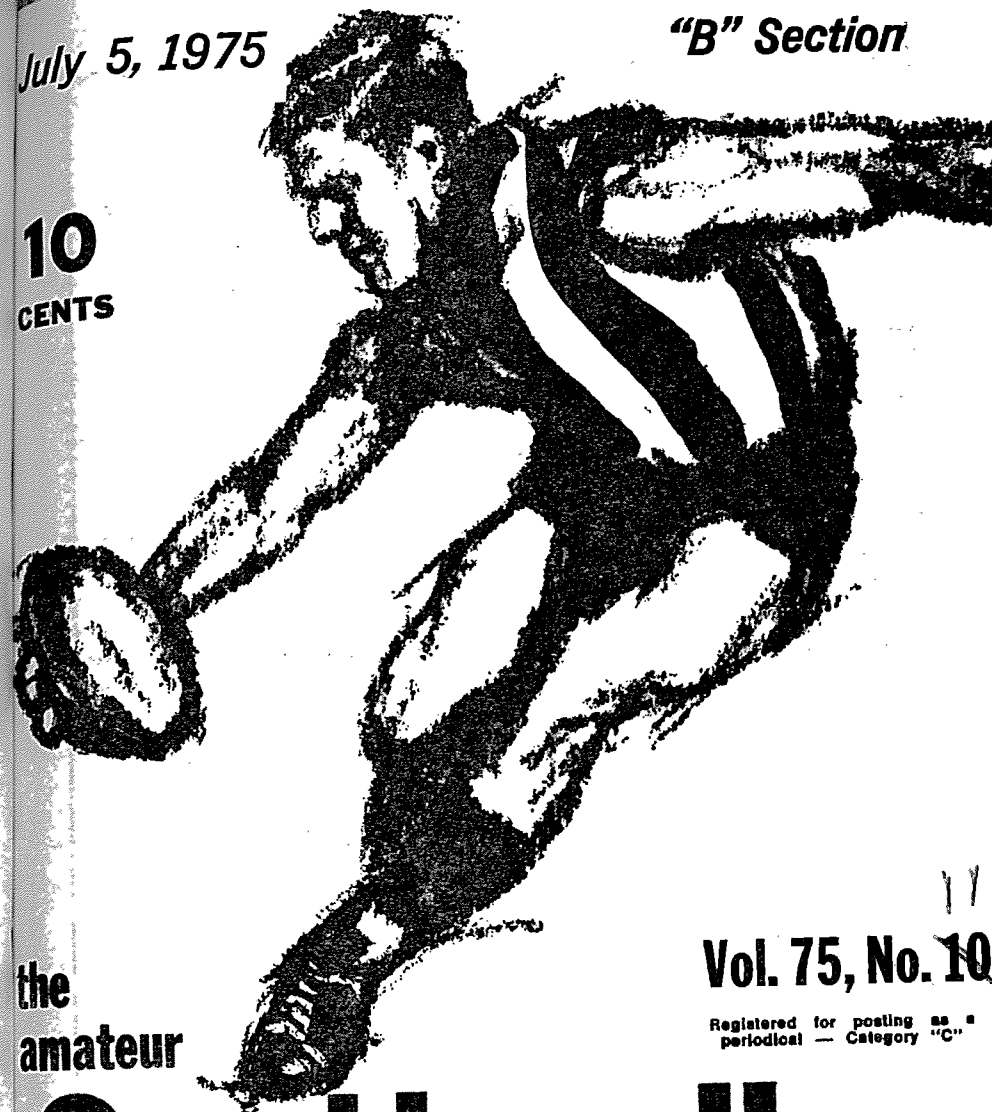

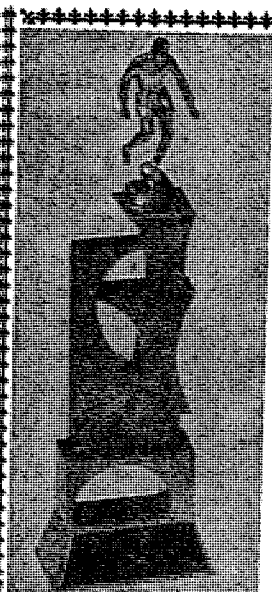

UPSETS AS SECOND ROUND OPENS RESERVOIR THRASH ORMOND ST. BERNARD'S GREAT FINISH OVER NORTH

There were several upsets in last Saturday's round, the first of the return home-and-home matches.

Two previously unbeaten teams met their Waterloo — St. Kilda CBC and De La Salle Reserves — leaving Monash Whites the only undefeated side.

Reservoir handed out a thrashing to Ormond and were rewarded with a place in the four, North Old Boys, victims of an 11-goal last quarter burst by St. Bernard's, dropping to fifth.

At the other end of the scale, three teams celebrated their first wins for the season — Old Haileybury, Footscray Tech. and Alphington Reserves.

Reservoir kicked 9 goals against the wind in the second quarter to give them an unbeatable lead of almost 12 goals over Ormond and after that it was only a formality.

Their short-passing and handball left Ormond floundering and although the visitors put up a better showing in the second half they went down by more than 10 goals.

St. Bernard's and North Old Boys were locked together in a close struggle for the first three quarters. North led by 2 points at quarter-time (1-5 to 1-3) and it was 4-8 each at the interval.

St. Bernard's edged away to lead by 15 points at three-quarter-time, but put up a tremendous last quarter effort to kick 11-5 to 2-2, and won by 12 goals.

The previous week they kicked 8 goals in the last term to leave University Blacks standing.

Coburg looked to have Old Trinity's measure when they piled on 4 goals in the first 6 minutes of the second quarter and finished the term with 6 goals for a lead of 17 points at the interval.

The third quarter was even but Trinity fought back in the last, gradu-

ally wearing Coburg down and went on to a 16-point win.

The Blacks had too much overall strength for Old Paradians and with their rucks giving them great drive, the University side scored an easy win.

Geelong caused Monash Blues little trouble and when Monash broke away with 9 goals in the third quarter it was all over.

Poor kicking by De La Salle (7-17) was a big factor in their defeat by 3 goals at the hands of Ivanhoe.

Old Carey stopped Marcellin's run, inflicting a 7-point defeat on them and Collegians surprised Caulfield Grammarians, beating them by 3 goals.

Old Scotch gave leaders University Blues a fright, running them to 9 points, while Old Haileybury scored by nearly 8 goals over Kew to open their account.

Melbourne High toppled St. Kilda CBC by 14 points, to inflict their first defeat.

There were some really close ones in this section, as Parkside beat Uni. High by 2 points, Old Melburnians beat Old Brighton by 3 points and Alphington piped Brunswick by 4 points.

In the other game, Power House proved too strong for Old Ivanhoe, who went down by 37 points.

Old Geelong beat State Savings Bank by 40 points and Assumption got home from National Bank by 4 points.

Fawkner, Hampton Rovers and Old Xaverians had plenty to spare from their respective opponents, Old Camberwell, St. Kevin's and Commonwealth Bank.

Elsternwick were well beaten by AJAX, the margin being 44 points, and AMP Society went down again, this time to LaTrobe Blacks by 29 points. Poor shooting for goal didn't help ANZ Bank who kicked 5-18 against Old Mentonians and were beaten by 26 points.

Straighter kicking by St. Bede's might have given them the chance of beating St. Pat's-Monivae, who scored by 14 points.

Footscray Tech. recorded a shock win over Bulleen United, the margin being 18 points. It was Footscray's first win. Thornbury beat Beverley Hills by 16 points in a high-scoring affair (18-14 to 15-16).

In the Junior Sections, Coburg had an easy win over Ivanhoe and Ormond, University Blacks and Blues won the other games.

In Section 2, Hampton Rovers were pushed to 15 points by Thomastown and it was Rovers' straighter kicking which won it for them. St. Bernard's

surprised Old Carey, who went under by 8 points.

The Reserves were notable for the fact that of the 29 games, only eight were won by the visiting teams. All of the home teams in A and B Reserve Sections were successful. (It was a "home team" affair for the senior teams in A Section too).

St. Bernard's scraped home by 2 points from North Old Boys, Old Trinity beat Coburg by 8 goals, De La Salle crashed against Ivanhoe, who beat them by over 7 goals. It was De La Salle's first defeat.

Collegians beat Caulfield Grammar by only 6 points, Old Scotch won easily from University Blues, Melbourne High ran St. Kilda CBC to 5 points and Old Melburnians beat Old Brighton by 15 points.

State Bank went down to Old Geelong by 10 points, Elsternwick beat AJAX by 22, West Brunswick beat North Brunswick by 5 and St. Bede's beat the St. Pat's-Monivae combination by 8 points.

The wintry conditions were reflected in the scoring, reducing the number of centuries recorded to 25 — only one Reserve team kicked over 100 points.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

Law 18D — No free kick shall be given against a player who, in legitimately going for a mark, interferes with an opponent from behind.

Notice the words "legitimately trying to mark".

If a player is not "legitimately trying to mark" he is open to penalty if he interferes with the player trying to mark the ball.

Therefore the opponent flying into the air with a clenched fist takes the risk of penalty. He surely can't be "legitimately trying to mark" with a clenched fist.

The spoiler takes all the chances of being free kicked.

FREE KICK WITHOUT BOUNCING THE BALL

Should the field umpire after blowing his whistle, and before bouncing the ball in the centre to commence the game notice an infringement of the laws he shall immediately award the penalty without bouncing the ball as covered in Law 17 sub clause (P).

While provision is made for the umpire to bounce the ball in the centre circle after a goal has been scored this does not necessarily have to be done.

If a breach of the laws has been noticed anywhere in the field where the penalty will be to the advantage of the side offended against he must immediately award the free kick and not bounce the ball — Law 17 sub clause (Q).

GOAL UMPIRES

The goal umpire is not in a position to make any decision regarding a goal or behind until he has received the "all clear" signal from the field umpire which, in brief, signifies that the field umpire does not wish to award any penalties.

Holding the man — A player shall not be held within the meaning of the law

unless he is held firmly enough to stop or retard his progress.

Retarding does not mean completely stopping, to check or ease down a man's progress is sufficient. Take the instance of a 10-stone man trying to stop a man of some 15 stone. He could retard him but the odds are he would not stop him.

LONG KICK WINNER — GLEN FLETCHER

Most of the personalities we have featured in this series of articles have given many years of service to their respective clubs or to Amateur football generally. Today, however, we feature a 19-year-old player who has only recently joined the ranks of the professionals.

Today, however, we feature a 19-year-old player who is in only his third season of Amateur football, in fact his third year of football since leaving school. But he deserves recognition because he won the first

But he deserves recognition because he won the final of the LONG KICKING CONTEST held in conjunction with the recent Interstate matches — Caulfield Grammarians' GLEN FLETCHER.

Glen went into Caulfield Grammarians' senior team immediately he joined the club at the beginning of season 1973, straight from school.

He was first used at full-forward, the position he filled in the school team, where he was coached by a famous Amateur football personality in "Jocka" Nelson, winner of no less than five V.A.F.A. "best and fairests" in A and B Sections.

Glen played 10 games in this position in his first season and then played in the ruck, but he is now regularly stationed at centre half-back, where his long clearing kicks are seen to advantage.

Although he has played only about 40 games with his club, Glen has already made a name for himself as he was runner-up in the voting for the club's best and fairest award last season.

Which only goes to show this 19-year-old, boy, who stands 6 ft. 1 in. and weighs a little over 13 stone, may not be eligible to compete in any long-kicking contest at the next Interstate matches — he could be playing for Victoria.

Incidentally Glen's winning kick in the final, which covered 68 yards, was not the best for the contest — Peter Ferguson, of North Old Boys, put in a kick of 69 yards and 1 foot in the qualifying heat, but could not reproduce that effort in the final, in

which his best kick was 64 yards 2 feet, to gain him third place.

Glen's elder brother, Ross, also played with Caulfield Grammarians, but a severe arm injury has forced him out of football, and he is now coaching the club's Junior team.

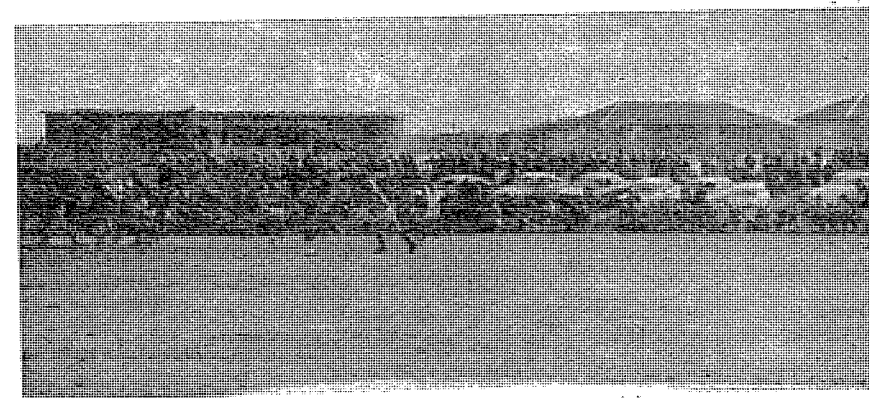

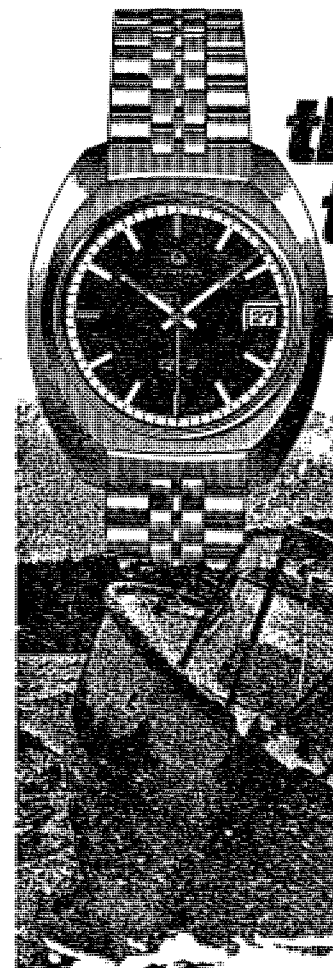

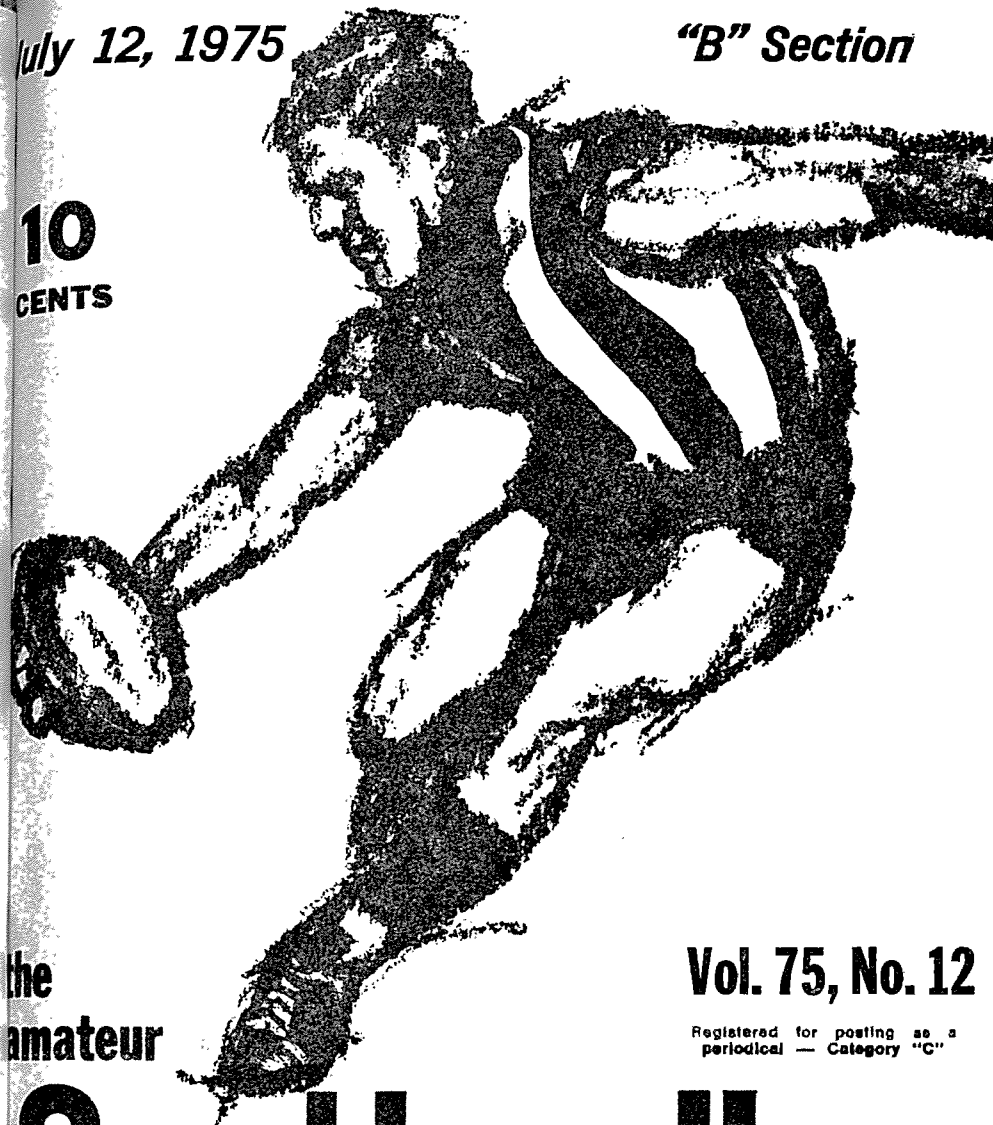

GEELONG GIVE ST. BERNARD'S A FRIGHT ORMOND DOWN TO OLD TRINITY — 1 PT.

Blacks hold off North's challenge

Bottom team Geelong, who have not won a match, veary nearly caused an upset last week when they ran the leaders, St. Bernard's, to a goal. It was easily Geelong's best performance for the season.

Ormond suffered their third successive defeat when they went down by a point to Old Trinity in a real thriller. Trinity are now just outside the four on percentage.

North Old Boys made a strong last quarter bid for victory against University Blacks but failed to get there by four points. Of North's five defeats this season, three have been by less than a goal.

AND THEN THERE WERE NONE — After 11 rounds, there is not one undefeated team in the competition. The last to go were Monash Whites who were beaten by Bulleen United, the margin being 25 points.

St. Bernard's put on 7 goals in the second quarter to lead Geelong by 17 points at the interval and looked to be in for at least a comfortable win.

But Geelong held the leaders to one goal in the third term and got on level terms at the last change. The last quarter was a thriller but St. Bernard's greater experience and extra touch of class enabled them to hold off the tenacious Geelong and win by 6 points.

What are the odds against a team being a point in front at half-time three-quarter-time and at the final siren? Well that's what happened in the Ormond-Old Trinity game, with Trinity being in the fortunate position.

It was one of the most remarkably even matches imaginable with little between the scores all day. Even at the first break, the difference was only 4 points — in Trinity's favour.

Two goals in the first minute of the second quarter enabled University Blacks to wipe off their 11-point deficit at quarter-time and they were never headed after that.

They lead by 8 points at the interval and looked in a strong position with a 3-goal advantage at three-quarter-time. North put in a strong last quarter, kicking 5 goals, but the Blacks were able to hold off the challenge and score by 4 points.

Reservoir Old Boys' effective handball and the brilliance of their small men were too much for Monash Blues, who were beaten by more than 7 goals, while Old Paradians failed miserably against Coburg, kicking only 4 points in the second half.

Caulfield Grammarians wilted against De La Salle in the second half after being only a point down at the interval, and were beaten by just over 10 goals. It was their second successive defeat and they have dropped to fourth.

Marcellin's hopes of making the finals received a setback when they crashed against University Blues who won by more than 12 goals.

Collegians beat Old Carey by a goal, Old Scotch were too strong for Old Haileybury and Ivanhoe were not troubled to beat Kew by 9 goals.
