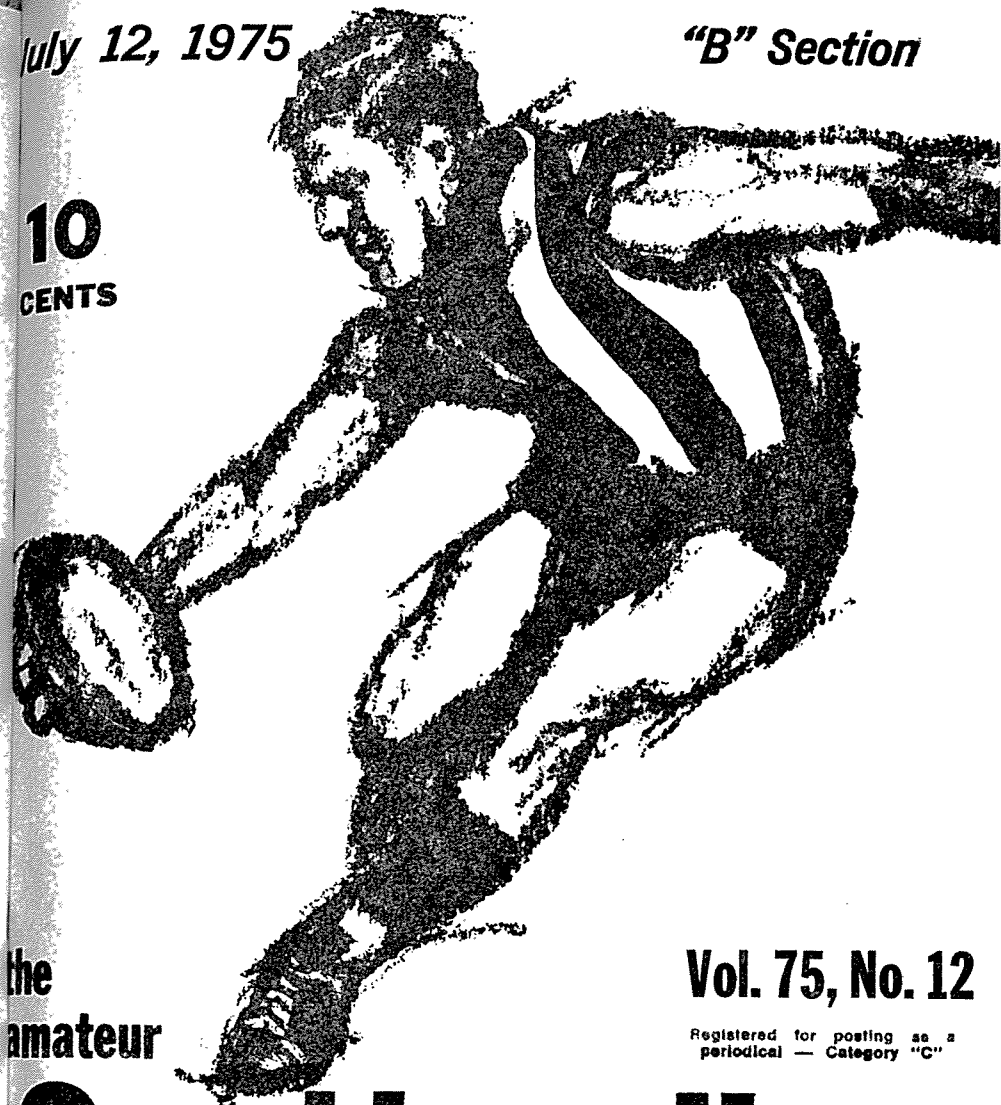

GEELONG GIVE ST. BERNARD’S A FRIGHT ORMOND DOWN TO OLD TRINITY — 1 PT.

Blacks hold off North’s challenge

Bottom team Geelong, who have not won a match, veery nearly caused an upset last week when they ran the leaders, St. Bernard’s, to a goal. It was easily Geelong’s best performance for the season.

Ormond suffered their third successive defeat when they went down by a point to Old Trinity in a real thriller. Trinity are now just outside the four on percentage.

North Old Boys made a strong last quarter bid for victory against University Blacks but failed to get there by four points. Of North’s five defeats this season, three have been by less than a goal.

AND THEN THERE WERE NONE — After 11 rounds, there is not one undefeated team in the competition. The last to go were Monash Whites who were beaten by Bulleen United, the margin being 25 points.

St. Bernard’s put on 7 goals in the second quarter to lead Geelong by 17 points at the interval and looked to be in for at least a comfortable win.

But Geelong held the leaders to one goal in the third term and got on level terms at the last change. The last quarter was a thriller but St. Bernard’s greater experience and extra touch of class enabled them to hold off the tenacious Geelong and win by 6 points.

What are the odds against a team being a point in front at half-time three-quarter-time and at the final siren? Well that’s what happened in the Ormond-Old Trinity game, with Trinity being in the fortunate position.

It was one of the most remarkably even matches imaginable with little between the scores all day. Even at the first break, the difference was only 4 points — in Trinity’s favour.

Two goals in the first minute of the second quarter enabled University Blacks to wipe off their 11-point deficit at quarter-time and they were never headed after that.

They lead by 8 points at the interval and looked in a strong position with a 3-goal advantage at three-quarter-time. North put in a strong last quarter, kicking 5 goals, but the Blacks were able to hold off the challenge and score by 4 points.

Reservoir Old Boys’ effective handball and the brilliance of their small men were too much for Monash Blues, who were beaten by more than 7 goals, while Old Paradians failed miserably against Coburg, kicking only 4 points in the second half.

Caulfield Grammarians wilted against De La Salle in the second half after being only a point down at the interval, and were beaten by just over 10 goals. It was their second successive defeat and they have dropped to fourth.

Marcellin’s hopes of making the finals received a setback when they crashed against University Blues who won by more than 12 goals.

Collegians beat Old Carey by a goal, Old Scotch were too strong for Old Haileybury and Ivanhoe were not troubled to beat Kew by 9 goals.

St. Kilda CBC, who won the first nine games, were beaten again, this time by Parkside who scored by 15 points. They have lost top place to Old Ivanhoe, who won easily from Brunswick.

Melbourne High beat Alphington by 29 points and Uni. High kept in the running with a 20-point win over Old Brighton.

Fawkner pipped Old Xaverians by 3 points in a high-scoring affair (20-13 to 20-10). Assumption beat Old Camberwell by 16 points, while State Savings Bank, Hampton Rovers and Old Geelong all won comfortably.

AJAX held top place after a close struggle with AMP Society, winning by 9 points, and LaTrobe Blacks beat St. Bede's by 19 points.

St. Pat's-Monivae had the same winning margin over Old Mentonians and Elsternwick beat West Brunswick by 27 points.

Heatherton beat Thornbury by nearly 10 goals and edged Monash Whites (beaten by Bullen United) out of top place. Footscray Tech. scrapped home by a point from Glenroy.

Ivanhoe thrashed Ormond in the main Junior Section game and Coburg were not really troubled by Old Scotch.

In Section 2, North Old Boys beat Reservoir Old Boys by 10 points, and the other winners were Bulleen-Templestowe, Hampton Rovers, Thomastown and Old Carey.

There were some interesting results in the Reserves — Old Paradians ran Coburg to 11 points, North Old Boys easily beat a weakened

Blacks, De La Salle failed by 13 points against Caulfield Grammar, University Blues were well beaten by Marcellin, St. Kilda CBC had another close call, beating Parkside by 10 points (Parkside's kicking — 6.17 — losing it for them).

Fawkner trounced Old Xaverians, State Bank crashed against St. Kevin's, Elsternwick beat West Brunswick by 14 points, AJAX went down to A.M.P. by 7 goals, Monash Whites beat Bulleen United by 13 points and Glenroy beat Footscray Tech. by 4 points.

WARNING

He also played against Tasmania at Elsternwick Park last month, when he was 20, 5'10" and 12-5, so he really has just attained his majority.

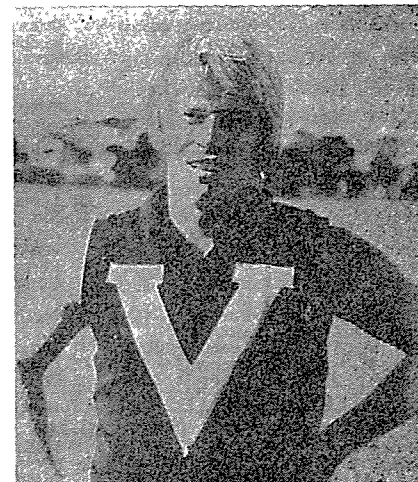
Bill plays as a ruck-rover or in the centre and it's not uncommon for him to be listed among the goal-kickers.

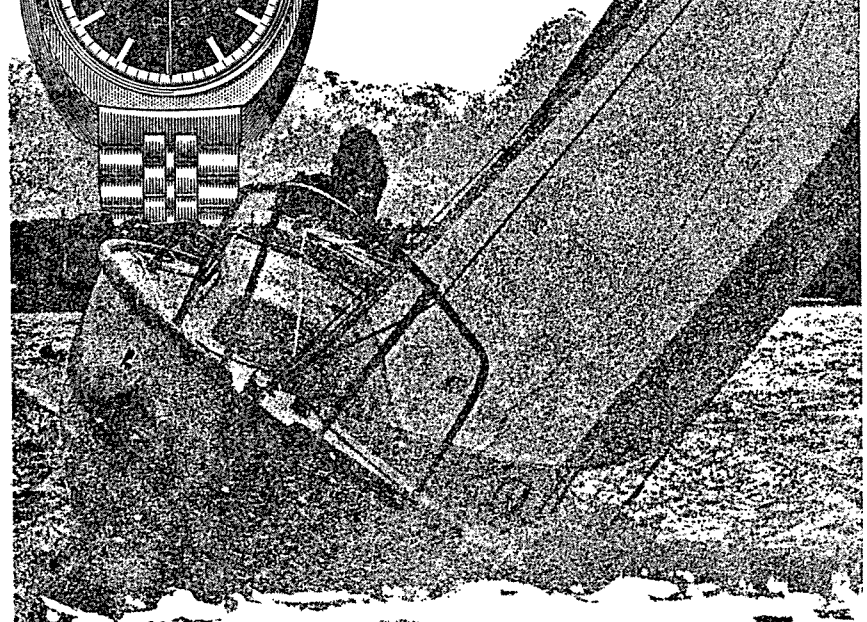

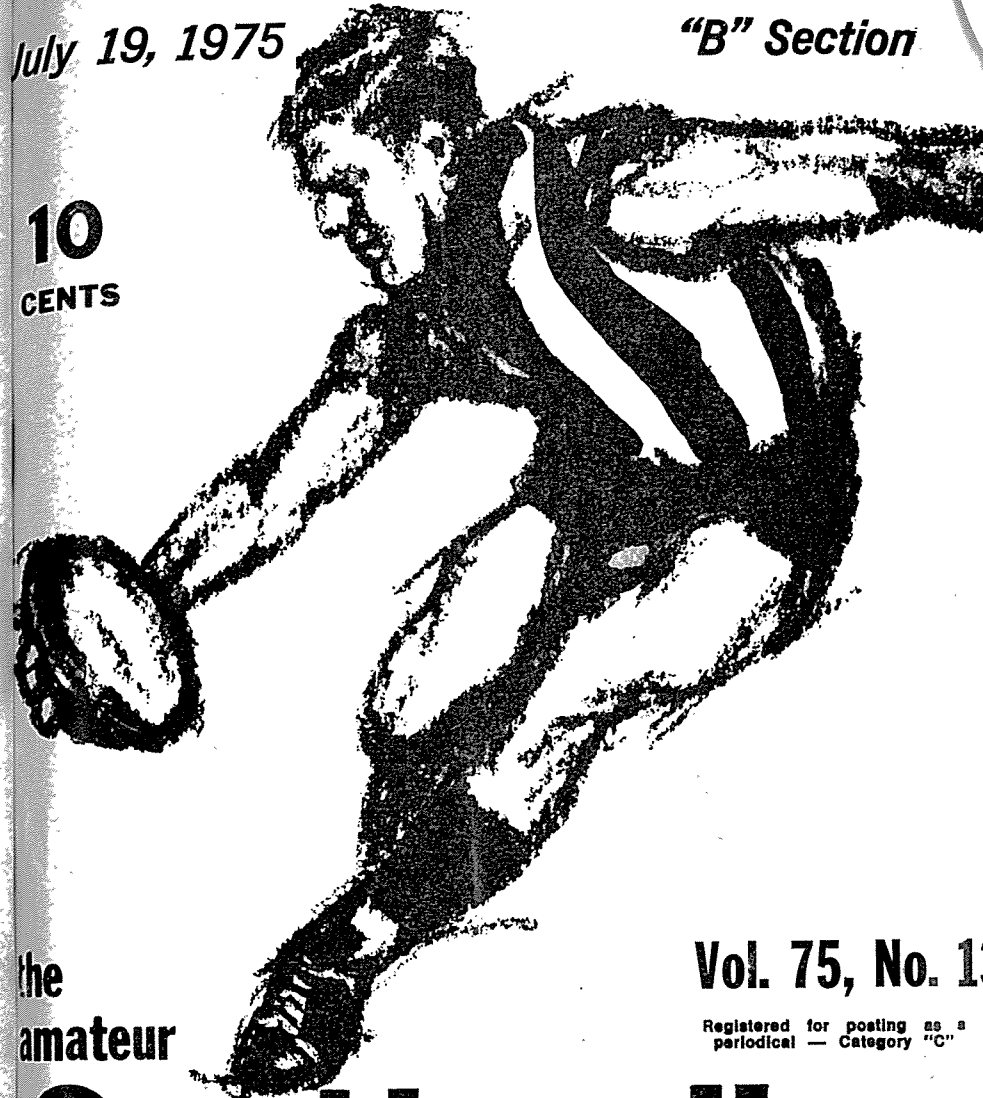
