

RESERVOIR BEAT ST. BERNARD'S COBURG'S BIG WIN OVER ORMOND

North in four — But pressed by Trinity

Reservoir Old Boys toppled the leaders, St. Bernard's, in last Saturday's main game and Ormond, who were badly beaten by Coburg, lost their place in the four to North Old Boys.

But North didn't have things all their own way with Old Trinity, who went down by 14 points after kicking eight goals in the last term.

Four other leading teams also suffered defeat - Old Ivanhoe, Hampton Rovers, St. Bernard's Reserves and Fawkner Reserves. Altogether 15 teams in the fours were beaten — but apart from Ormond, only Old Geelong and AMP Society dropped out of the top brackets.

Poor shooting for goal played a big part in St. Bernard's defeat, as they had five more scoring shots than Reservoir Old Boys, but were beaten by 20 points.

Reservoir gained an early lead but St. Bernard's came back in the second term to be within 5 points at the interval. Then they added only 5 points in the third term and Reservoir shot to a lead of 35 points and they held on in the last quarter to win

Coburg made good use of the wind in the first quarter to lead by more than 6 goals and held Ormond to 2-6 in the second quarter while manag-

ing a couple of goals themselves.

This gave Coburg a lead of 34 points and when they slammed on 7-7 to 1-1 in the third term it was all over and they won by 45 points.

Old Trinity started promisingly against North Old Boys but North took control in the second quarter and ran to a 15-point lead at half-time.

North, with effective use of handball, broke away in the third term and ran to a lead of 38 points and looked like going to an easy win but Trinity fought back well and went down by only 14 points. They kicked 8 goals to North's 4 in a high-scoring last

Another high-scoring term was the highlight of the University Blacks-Geelong game at Elsternwick Park. when each side hopped out after the interval to kick 7 goals, but the Blacks kicked theirs against the wind.

Geelong didn't make full use of the wind in the first quarter and the Blacks added 7-3 to a goal in the second to lead by 22 points. Geelong fought the game out well but the University side won easily.

Monash Blues kept their final four hopes alive when they beat Old Paradians by 11 points in a close game. Parade led by 9 points at the interval and 6 points at the final change thanks to their accurate kicking, but they were off the target in the last term when they got only one goal from 6 shots while Monash added 4-4.

Old Carey did nothing to enhance their final four prospects when they failed badly against Ivanhoe, whose winning margin was 14 goals.

Neither did Collegians who went down by 9 goals to the leaders, University Blues. Old Scotch surprised Caulfield Grammarians, and won by 17 points, to move out of the relegation zone, at least for the present.

Kew. well beaten by De La Salle, have dropped to ninth, and in the other match. Marcellin were not troubled by Old Haileybury, and moved up to fifth, two points out of the four.

Alphington scored an upset win over Old Ivanhoe by 17 points, and Old Ivanhoe lost top place to St. Kilda CBC, who after two successive defeats, had a big win over Old Brighton.

Uni. High beat Power House by 26 points and Melbourne High finished well to score by 4 goals over Old Melburnians.

There are now four teams level in fourth place — Power House, Uni. High, Alphington and Parkside in that percentage order.

In the cut-throat D Section games, Fawkner beat Hampton Rovers by 11 points and Old Xaverians thrashed Old Geelong. State Savings Bank, with a big win over Commonwealth Bank, displaced Old Geelong from fourth place.

North Brunswick pipped the St. Pat's-Monivae combination by a point and ANZ Bank beat AMP Society by 2 goals. LaTrobe Blacks, with a comfortable win over Old Mentonians, knocked AMP out of the four.

All of the top four teams in F Section won, but Beverley Hills (fifth) ran Bulleen United to 3 points and it was only Bulleen's straight kicking (13-9 to 12-12) that won it for them.

This was the only senior section in which the "four" teams all won. The same thing happened in C Reserve Section and F Reserve Section, and in Junior Section 1 none of the "four" were beaten but two of them had byes.

Old Scotch, University Blues, Hampton Rovers and Thomastown had easy wins in Junior matches and St. Bernard's (fourth in Section 2)

were badly beaten by North Old Boys.
Reserve Section leaders, St. Bernard's, went down to Reservoir Old Boys by 25 points, and Geelong beat University Blacks by 3 points to score their first win for the season.

Old Haileybury sneaked home by a point from Marcellin, University Blues beat Collegians by 3 goals, Hampton Rovers beat Fawkner by 10 points, A.M.P. ran A.N.Z. to 3 points, AJAX had a big win over West Brunswick, St. Pat's-Monivae opened their account at North Brunswick's expense and Glenroy scraped home by 4 points from Thornbury.

With six rounds to be played, the fight for the four is wide open in practically every section and there will be a lot of keen games before the 56 finalists are decided.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

By Kevin McKay

A footballer cannot reach the peak of itness and strength by just playing football it is essential he be 100% fit if he is going to produce his top skills throughout an entire game.

To reach this standard of fitness he should start with a solid three months preparation of pre-season training - weight-lifting, running and agility exercises with special emphasis on his own particular weaknesses.

In contrast to footballers, umpires' training is mainly running, as this is what they must do right throughout a game.

During summer months an umpire should analyse and check his weaknesses.

He may find he is lacking in speed, strength, agility or stamina and in my opinion the main sources for these needs are as

Speed - running, mainly interval running over distances varying from 50 yards to 220 yards plus "quick- snap" sprints of 20-

Stamina — running non-stop over long distances using the "surge" method, varied with 440 yards.

Lungs and blood circulation are the limiting factors on the ability to sustain muscle efficiency and provide quicker heart recovery.

This of course, gives you an added advantage over your opponent.

Many umpires and athletes believe that a hot sauna is an aid to fitness, but many experts in this field have found that this is not so.

On a recent test on 14 footballers who were examined and tested, "pre- and post sauna", it was found that although the sauna does cause weight loss, is has no benefit at all in raising fitness levels.

The players on an average had a weight loss of 1.29 kg immediately after taking the sauna, and .46 kg weight loss 24 hours after the sauna.

In brief about the only good thing that really comes from a sauna is that it has a most pleasant tranquilising effect and that the greatest benefits are obtained by those most in need of tranquilising.

Umpire training and also players training can be planned mainly for two groups:

- 1. The slim athlete who requires muscular size, strength and explosive power.
- 2. The heavier-built type who usually needs a reduction in excess fat, more speed, fitness and agility.

The old story you umpire or play the way you train, still applies.

The only way to 100% fitness is hard

work on the track.

"ON PARADE" FOR FIFTEEN YEARS

Many footballers play a whole career without achieving the ultimate aim of playing in a premiership side. Not so John Tudor, who has the distinction of having played in six premier teams for Old Paradians in a career spanning fifteen years and nearly 250 games.


John, the son of a farmer from Gordon (near Ballarat), was educated at St. Patrick's College, Ballarat, having been taught by the Famous Brother O'Malley, whose remarkable success in school football is legendary.

John played junior football with East Ballarat before coming to Melbourne where he played with North Brunswick Y.C.W.

In 1961 he joined Old Paradians as a centre half-forward, a position he held for most of his first 10 years with the club, but was switched to defence in 1971.

Parade were fortunate in 1961 in gaining several other good players who served them well for many seasons. These included Brian Weyman, Tony Pickett and Spence Williams.

- Very few of the 1961 line-up are still playing — notable exceptions being Spence Williams (now with University Blues) while Brian Weyman occasionally turns out for Parade Reserves.



John is pleased that Spence is playing so well with the Blues, and is quick to point out that he is 'not nearly as old as Spence''— a whole six months his junior in fact— (Ed.).

John was a member of the famous Old Paradians side which dominated A Section in the 1960's. He played in the premiership teams in 1962, 1963, 1964, 1966 and 1967, but missed the 1968 premiership through injury.

But he was in the B Section premiership side in 1970, and has appeared in 20 finals matches with Parade.

John played at full-forward for Victoria in the Amateur Carnival at Melbourne in 1962 and was centre half-forward in the Interstate game at Adelaide the following year.

In 1962, he headed the A Section goal-kicking list from centre half-forward.

His four brothers were all keen footballers, his three younger ones playing for Parade, while his father was still playing for Gordon, in the Ballarat District League at 38. But John doubts whether he can beat his father's "age" record.

One of John's problems is poor eyesight. He wears contact lenses and on one occasion had to borrow one of Brian Weyman's lenses to "see out" the game.

In amassing his huge tally of games, John has seen many champions in Amateur ranks. He is not prepared to name the best Parade players during his career, but he rates Don Mullin (Kew), Brian Finlayson (Ormond) and Tony Anderson (University Blacks) as the best centre half-backs he has had to contend with.

Since being switched to defence he has found Bruce Bourne and Glen Swan (both of Ormond) his most difficult opponents.

He is 33 years of age and is an accountant at the Taxation Office. Married with three children, he considers he must be nearing the end of the road when his 6-year-old son greets him after a game with such comments as "Is it hard to get the ball now dad?" !!!

John Tudor has certainly served Old Paradlans well — the club recognised his services by electing him a Life Member in 1974.

All at Heatherton join in congratulating David (Rusty) Hopkins on playing his 50th game today. Rusty joined the club in 1973, was coach of the seconds last year (premiership) and is President of the Football Committee this year. He is an inspiration within the club both in his application to working around the club and his football ability. He rarely misses training and is renowned for his "never say die" attitude on the field. "Rusty" has played most of his football on the backline and many forwards have had a very quiet day on him. All the best Rusty for your next 50. We all hope that they are as fine as your first 50.




