





## ANOTHER DAY OF UPSETS ST. BERNARD'S, BLACKS, ORMOND BEATEN Many still with final four chances

Last Saturday's round caused another batch of upsets, and once again 17 teams in the "fours" were beaten, while another managed only a draw.

Included in the 17 were five leading teams - St. Bernard's, Coburg Juniors, and three in the Reserves, St. Bernard's, Ivanhoe and Old Geelong. with Monash Whites Reserves having to be content with a draw.

St. Bernard's were pipped by two points at Coburg, University Blacks went down by nearly seven goals to Old Trinity and Ormond finished 14 points behind Old Paradians.

With only two rounds of home-and-home matches to be played, there are still many of the "fours" to be decided.

Poor forward work was a big factor in the defeat of Ormond and the Blacks, and St. Bernard's could not hold off Coburg's strong finishing burst.

Ormond were only 2 goals behind Old Paradians at three-quarter-time, and had the wind in the last term, but kicked only one goal from 8 shots, and actually lost ground as Parade added 2-3.

Ormond led by 15 points at the interval, with both sides off the target in the first half, but Parade opened the third quarter with 3 quick goals and finished with 6-1 for the auarter.

Old Trinity got on top of the Blacks from the outset and never allowed them to get into the game. Trinity led by 29 points at half-time and the result was never really in doubt. The Blacks were goalless in the first and last quarters.

Coburg looked a beaten side when they trailed St. Bernard's by 34 points at the final change, even with the wind advantage in the last term, but they added 6-7 to 1-1 and got up to win by 2 points.

St. Bernard's were 4 points in front at half-time then broke away |

with 6 goals in the third term. A winning centreline and a strong half-back line were telling factors in North Old Boys' win over Monash Blues. Monash lost any chance they had when they kicked 4-10 in the second quarter to be 20 points down at the interval.

After that it was all North, who went away to win by more than 10 goals.

An 8-goal burst in the second quarter carried Reservoir Old Boys to a commanding lead over Geelong and they coasted home to an easy win.

Reservoir are now second on percentage from the Blacks and North; with Coburg only a game outside the four. Only St. Bernard's (two games clear) are absolutely safe for the finals.

Marcellin kept their hopes alive with a 12-point win over De La Salle but Collegians' chances were wiped out when they went down to Ivanhoe by 16 points.

Old Scotch made themselves safe from relegation when they scored a decisive win over Old Carey. Caulfield Grammarians overwhelmed Kew but Old Haileybury ran University Blues to 17 points, Blues accurate kicking (19-8) saving the day for them.

Melbourne High ousted Old Ivanhoe from second place when they scored by 27 points and Uni. High droped out of the running when they went down to Alphington by 15 points.

Alphington have just an outside chance, Parkside's win over Old Melburnians virtually clinching their place in the four.

In D Section, the four is practically settled. State Savings Bank having written themselves off when they were easily beaten by Assumption.

The top four, Fawkner, Hampton Rovers, Old Xaverians and Old Geelong, all recorded comfortable wins.

Elsternwick beat LaTrobe Blacks by 6 goals, AJAX beat St. Pat's- Monivate by 26 points and Old Mentonians' 9-point win over North Brunswick knocked North out of the four. their place being taken by AMP Society, who scraped home from bottom team West Brunswick by only a point.

ANZ Bank were surprised by St. Bede's, who won by 3 goals.

Monash Whites were well beaten by Thornbury, the margin being 44 points, but Heatherton, Bulleen United and Beverley Hills all had easy wins. Footscray Tech. moved up a peg when they beat University Reds by 4 points.

Junior leaders, Coburg, were handed out a thrashing by University Blues, who won by 11 goals. Ivanhoe beat Monash University by 20 points

and Ormond had a big win over University Blacks.

In Section 2. Hampton Rovers beat Old Carev by 4 points, and St. Bernard's, downed by Thomastown by 5 goals, lost their place in the four to Bulleen-Templestowe.

In the Reserves, St. Bernard's dropped from top to third after their 16point defeat by Coburg, and Old Trinity, who beat the Blacks by 2 points. are now on top, ahead of Coburg and St. Bernard's on percentage.

Ivanhoe went down to Collegians by more than 6 goals and De La Salle failed by 4 points against Marcellin. Collegians and Marcellin<sup>e</sup> now share the lead with Ivanhoe and De La Salle equal third.

State Bank dropped out of the four when they were well beaten by Assumption, their place going to Old Xaverians, who beat St. Kevin's by 13 points. Old Camberwell surprised leaders, Old Geelong, beating them by 3 points, and Fawkner are now on top.

AMP Society, with a big win over West Brunswick, took their place in the four. Heatherton went down to Glenrov by 14 points and Monash Whites drew with Thornbury.

#### ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals reads:-

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for in-clusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day.

Provided that no player shall be eligible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

JUNIORS A player who has been a member of a

senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.

### UMPIRE'S CORNER By Kevin McKav

#### "HOLDING THE BALL - HOLDING THE MAN LAW"

Although this law was amended to it's present form in 1939 it still causes a lot of

controversy — yet it should not If this law is fully understood by coaches, players and supporters, it will be seen just how easy it is to apply. The spirit of this rule is to keep the ball

in motion.

Study the following simple definition and you will see the umpires do apply this law correctly.

A. A player is in the act of kicking or handballing and he is swung off balance and his foot or hand does not connect with the ball — play on — B. A player is bumped and the ball falls

from his hands — play on C. A player his knocked on the arm or

elbow causing him to drop the ball -play on.

D. A player has his arms pinned to his sides, causing him to drop the ball — play on — (This is the most common form of tackling).

E. A player has the ball held to his body

by another player — Ball up. F. A player not in possession of the ball and held by an opponent — FREE KICK — HOLDING THE MAN.

G. A player with the ball is tackled correctly by an opponent and deliberately drops the ball — free kick — to player doing the tackle. H. It should be noted, the player with

the ball only has to make a deliberate attempt to get rid of the ball when correctly grabbed by an opponent.

As you can see the rule is quite simple and is made for the player who is willing to go in and get the ball. Austrelian Rules Football in 1975 is far

removed from its beginning. The fast moving, sensation packed spec-

dock mob fight, in which brute strength counted far more than skill.

Forty a side, they wrestled and shoved and fought fiercely, with the ball an excuse for, rather than the object of, the contest. The respective captains umpired the play,

giving free kicks only for breaches that really had to be penalised.

To start the game the sides lined up on either side of a centre line, the side with the ball kicked off and they went to it without let or hindrance.

Out of chaos came order - modifications were made, but nothing substantial came of it all, till club delegates met at Nissen's Cafe, in Exhibition Street, Melbourne on May 12th, 1874 and wrote out a code of laws

There were only 13 laws - a marked constrast to the law book of today.

The first code of laws embraced what today would be termed the major offences of football and referred only to tripping. pushing in the back etc.

A former South Melbourne player writing of his experiences in the early days of foot-ball, told how the umpire threw the ball along the ground after it had crossed the boundary line.

It was in 1908 that the game became truly national with the formation of the Australian National Football Council.

(Now called the NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE.)

The introduction by the A.N.F.C. of the clever, non-stop game in which the emphasis no-dropping rule has resulted in a fast. clever, non-stop game in which the emphasis is on pace all the time.

This type of play is seen at it's best in Amateur Football where players willing to go in and get the ball are given the full protection they deserve.

The information is required not later than MONDAY, AUGUST 18th. Clubs with Senior and Reserve teams both

in the finals are requested to furnish separate lists, showing in the Reserve team list ONLY those eligible to play with the Reserves, and omitting from the Senior list those players who have no chance of being selected in the senior team.

There may be a few players on both lists. Lists must be in NUMERCIAL (NOT ALPHABETICAL) ORDER, and must be in

## THIS ROLLING STONE HAS MADE GOOD

A change is as good as a holiday? Well, Michael Ritterman, of AJAX seems to think so, for he has changed clubs four times in his football career, but is now back with his original club.

"Ritter", as he is generally known in football circles, made the State side this year - a most unusual achievement for a player from E Section.

Michael started with AJAX Juniors back in 1967 and graduated to the seniors the following year. After two seasons with them he transferred to Melbourne High School Old Boys, then in A Section, to gain some experience in a higher grade.

In 1971, "Ritter" tried his luck in the V.F.L. and played some 14 or so games with Melbourne Reserves, but couldn't manage to make the senior side.

The next year he transferred to Prahran (V.F.A.) club where he unfortunately sufferered a bad knee lnjury which kept him out of action for the greater part of the season.

He was able to play towards the end of the season, however, and qualified to play in the Reserves Grand Final against Port Melbourne.

He had a break from football in 1973 when he visited Israel to compete in the Maccabi games (Jewish Olympics) in which he represented Australia in Athletics. "Ritter" rejoined Prahran for the pre-

season practice games last year but was persuaded to return to AJAX, and was elected captain this season.

Michael has played nearly 100 games of Amateur football but his biggest thrill undoubtedly was being selected in the Victorian side to play Tasmania last June. "Ritter" is 23, 5-9 and 11-12 and has played most of his football on the centreline

or roving.

He considers Norm Beattle, of Coburg and Rob Roulston of AMP Society among the hardest opponents he has played against and classes Old Carey's Mike Birrell as the best ruckman he has seen in Amateur football.

In the summer, Mike is a keen athlete, competing with Hakoah-AJAX in the Vic-torian Athletic Association competition. His most successful event is the 400 metres hurdles.

"Ritter" has had a varied sporting career, but certainly a successful one, and we wish him well in his future activities.
