



ST. BERNARD'S TOO STRONG FOR RESERVOIR

UNIV. BLUES BEAT DE LA SALLE AND GET BACK **TO TOP SECTION**

St. Bernard's proved much too strong for a disappointing Reservoir Old Boys in last week's Second Semi-final, and have won their way into the Grand Final next Saturday.

It will be St. Bernard's second Grand Final appearance in three years they were runners-up to Ormond in 1973. Last year they were beaten by the ultimate premiers. University Blacks, in the First Semi-final.

University Blues scored a decisive win over De La Salle in the B Section Second Semi-final, and will return to A Section in 1976, after only one season in the lower grade.

St. Kilda CBC, Fawkner, Elsternwick, Monash White, University Blues Juniors and North Old Boys Juniors, all of whom were beaten in their respective Second Semi-finals a fortnight ago, were successful in the Finals and will contest Grand Finals today, and all except Uni. Blues in Junior Section 1, will be promoted next season.

St. Bernard's and Reservoir played an even first quarter but Reservoir broke down in attack after that and this factor played a big part in their defeat.

They had practically as much of the play as did St. Bernard's, but lack of height on the forward lines and their inability to keep their positions, robbed them of many scoring chances. Perhaps they were suffering from Finals iitters.

On the other hand, St. Bernard's always looked dangerous when the ball went into their attacking zone, and although their forwards were far from accurate in front of goals, they were much more effective than Reservoir.

This was particularly noticeable in the second quarter when St. Bernard's added 4-9 to 2 points and held a commanding 5-goal lead at the interval.

Reservoir were unlucky in that there was virtually no breeze in the

first quarter but it freshened considerably in the second and helped St. Bernard's, but some of this assistance was nullified by the rain.

Reservoir improved after the interval but still lacked cohesion on the forward line. They kicked 4 goals in the third term but their opponents added six, and St. Bernard's were in an almost unbeatable position at the last change.

Reservoir fought the game out to the finish but St. Bernard's were able to coast home and win by 33 points.

The Blues started slowly against De La Salle, who quickly ran to a 3-goal lead. but the University side came back to level the scores at quartertime.

"De La" were held goalless in the second term, when the Blues' small men dominated the game and sent them to a 26-point lead at half-time.

De La Salle added 5 goals in the third quarter to trail by 3 goals but the Blues finished strongly and ran out winners by 38 points.

Seven goals in the first quarter gave St. Kilda CBC a winning break on Old Ivanhoe who were unable to make up their early leeway and were beaten by 34 points.

The Fawkner-Old Geelong game was close for three quarters but then Fawkner gained the upper hand as Old Geelong failed to finish on and went down by 4 goals. Fawkner had a slight edge, leading by a goal at the interval and 13 points at the last change.

After an even first half, Elesternwick ran right away from AMP Society and went on to score by nearly 10 goals, avenging the defeat which A.M.P. inflicted on them in the last home-and-home round.

Monash Whites and Bulleen United also staged a very even first half, but Monash gained a 2-goal break just before three-quarter-time. They kicked another 2 goals early in the last term and were winners by 25 points.

Only points separated Ormond and University Blues in the Junior game with the Blues scraping home by 2 points.

It was a different story in the Section 2 match, where North Old Boys were not troubled to beat Reservoir Old Boys by 11 goals.

In the Reserves, Old Trinity led St. Bernard's throughout and won by 14 points, although St. Bernard's were able to keep close enough to make it interesting.

Collegians were too strong for De La Salle and won by just over 6 goals, but St. Kilda CBC, thanks to their straight kicking, beat Power House by only a point (12-6 to 11-11).

Old Xaverians easily beat Old Geelong, the margin being 6 goals, but Monash Whites beat Bulleen United by only 2 points, also due to more accurate kicking (12-8 to 11-12).

NORTH'S COACH AND LEADER — SHANE MACGUIRE

Eight years of experience, including the donning of a Victorian sweater back in 1969, is taken on to the ground by North Old Boys' Captain and Coach — Shane Maguire.

Shane started with North in 1967 and was a member of the Victorian team which played against Tasmania at Hobart in 1969.



This was the first of four appearances in the Big "V" uniform, but strangely enough, they have been scattered over a period of seven years.

Shane played against South Australia at Elsternwick Park in 1971 and following that match was selected in the Australian Amateurs team to play in the National Championships in Brisbane shortly after.

He had to wait for another three years to represent his State, playing against South Australia at Norwood Oval (Adelaide) last year.

This also led to Shane being included in the Australian Amateurs team which competed in Sydney a couple of weeks later.

He played in the Victorian team against South Australia at Elsternwick Park this season, and was Vice-Captain of the side.

Shane's usual position is centre half-back, but he has also shown out well at full-back and centre half-forward, and can take a turn in the ruck.

He won his club's Best and Fairest trophy in 1973 and was voted the Best Clubman last year. In addition he has won other "minor" awards, as he terms it, such as runner-up and third in the best and fairest voting.

Shane, who is 26, stands at 6' l' and weighs 14 stone, was Captain of North Old Boys in 1972 and 1973, and took over as playing coach last season, when they finished eighth.

He should be quite pleased with their performances and improvement in 1975, as they have hardly been outside the top four all the season.

His club activities are not confined to coaching and playing — he has been a member of the Committee for four years.

Shane includes cricket and squash among his sporting interests, but neither is on a competition basis.

Shane Maguire got his side over the first hurdle in his quest as Captain-Coach of a premiership side a fortnight ago. Today he hopes to go a step further in the Final.
