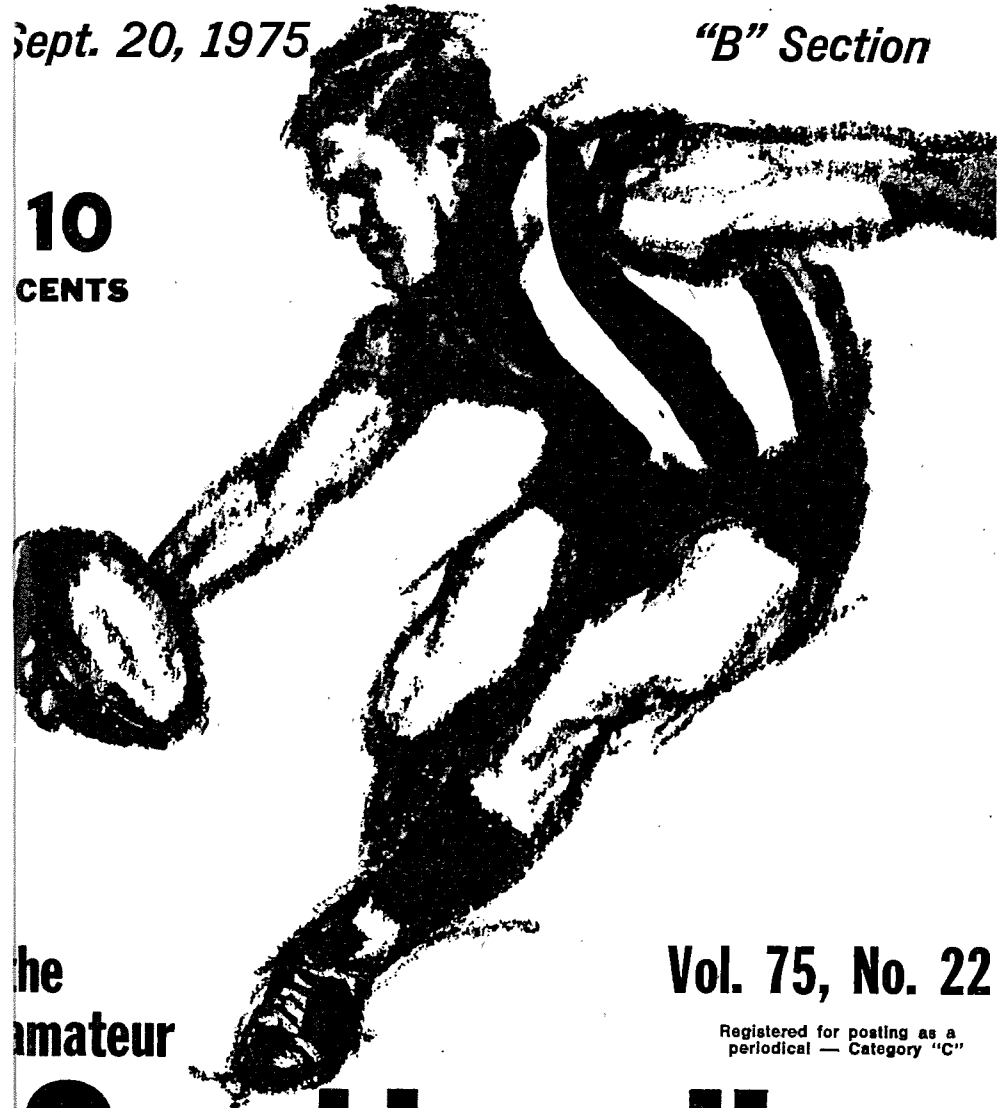

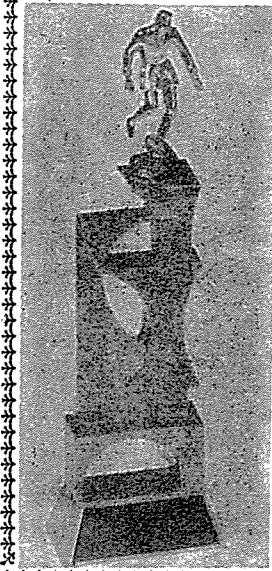

NORTH WEAR RESERVOIR DOWN GREAT LAST QUARTER PUTS THEM IN GRAND FINAL

“DE LA” BEAT CAULFIELD GAIN PROMOTION TO “A” SECTION

A great last quarter by North Old Boys enabled them to wear down Reservoir Old Boys in the Final last Saturday and earned them the right to meet St. Bernard's in the Grand Final today.

Reservoir looked to have it won at three-quarter-time when they led by four goals, but wilted under North's onslaught and went down by eight points.

De La Salle always had the call over Caulfield Grammarians in the B Section game and scored an easy win.

This means promotion to A Section next season for De La Salle, who meet University Blues in the Grand Final, while Caulfield will have to spend 1976 in B Section.

St. Kilda CBC, Fawkner, Monash Whites, University Blues Juniors and North Old Boys Juniors turned the tables on their Second Semi-final conquerors to win their respective premierships, but AJAX repeated their Second Semi-final win to take the E Section flag.

Reservoir broke away midway the second quarter after an even first term and ran to a 5-goal lead at the interval — a good position to be in considering the conditions last week.

They looked a different side altogether from the one that put up a poor exhibition in the Semi-final against St. Bernard's the week before.

North opened the third term determined to wipe off their deficit but the Reservoir defence made them earn every point, and it was more points than goals, as North added 3-7 to double their first half score, while Reservoir kicked 3 goals straight and were still 4 goals in front at the last change.

North, with that never-give-up spirit which got them over the First Semi-final hurdle when they slammed on 8 goals in the last term against Univer-

sity Blacks, repeated the performance with a 7-goal burst and scored by 8 points.

It wasn't so much a “burst” perhaps, just the steady, relentless pressure that gradually whittled down Reservoir's steady lead until it disappeared altogether. Reservoir regained the lead once but lost it again and another goal just before the siren settled the issue North's way.

De La Salle were always in control against Caulfield Grammarians and went further ahead as the game progressed.

They were 3 goals in front at half-time and 4 goals to the good at three-quarter-time. Caulfield folded up completely in the last term when they failed to score and De La Salle, who kicked 3 goals in each quarter, went on to win by more than 7 goals.

Melbourne High started well against St. Kilda CBC, and ran to a lead of 23 points at the first change but St. Kilda hit back in the second term, kicking 5 goals to one, and led by 3 points at the interval.

It was an unusual contrast of kicking in the third quarter — High kicked 3 goals straight and St. Kilda 4 behinds, but St. Kilda put on 5-2 to 1-3 in the last quarter and won by 2 goals.

Fawkner trailed Hampton Rovers by more than 4 goals at half-time but staged a second half recovery which enabled them to scrape home by 3 points in a high-scoring game. Their accurate kicking helped to win it for them (16-8 to 15-11).

AJAX had to hold off a strong challenge from Elsternwick to win by 11 points. They were 23 points in front at half-time and still led by 3 goals at the final change. Elsternwick had the chance to win it but poor kicking for goal (4-8) to AJAX's 4-1 may have cost them the premiership.

Monash Whites raced away to an early lead over Heatherton and went further ahead in the second term to be 6 goals in front at the interval.

Heatherton came back at them in the second half but could not make up their early leeway and were beaten by 15 points after getting to within 9 points shortly before the finish.

In the Junior games, University Blues opened well against Coburg, and

increased their quarter-time lead of 19 points to 28 points at the halfway mark (6-7 to 2-3).

Coburg added 3-1 to 2 goals in the third term but failed to score in the last and were beaten by 29 points.

North Old Boys were much too strong for Hampton Rovers in the Section 2 match, and won by 7 goals. Their accurate kicking (5 goals straight in the first quarter and 7-1 at half-time, which gave them a 26-point lead, didn't do anything to boost the Rovers' morale.

Poor kicking for goal almost cost St. Bernard's the game in the Reserves' Final, in which they snatched victory over Coburg in the last few minutes. They had 18 scoring shots to nine to win by only 4 points.

Ivanhoe won comfortably over De La Salle, the margin being 25 points but Parkside beat St. Kilda CBC by only 4 points.

Fawkner's better kicking gave them a 13-point win over Old Xaverians, AJAX beat West Brunswick by 11 points and Heatherton finished 17 points in front of Monash Whites.

Today will see the close of the 1975 Amateur football season, and the last issue of *The Amateur Footballer* for the season, so I would like to thank all those who have contributed to the success of the publication during the year.

All the best until 1976.

A GREAT DAY FOR THE IRISH!

It's a long time since two Old Boys teams from Catholic Colleges fought out an A Section Grand Final, and neither of today's aspirants for premiership honours has ever won a premiership in the top grade.

We are indebted to John Adams, a former President of North Old Boys, for the following article tracing the fortunes of the two clubs involved since they joined the Association in 1963.

"Today's A Section Grand Final teams St. Bernard's Old Collegians and North Old Boys has been very keen rivals since both were admitted to the Association in 1963.

The teams represent old boys of two Christian Brothers' Colleges — St. Joseph's North Melbourne and St. Bernard's Essendon.

"St. Bernard's won the 1963 E Section premiership and repeated their success in D Section in 1964. They then spent three seasons in both C and B Sections before their promotion to A Section in 1971 where they have remained ever since, being runners-up to Ormond in 1973.

"North remained in E Section in 1963 but won the premiership the following year thereby commencing a remarkable run. They were premiers in D Section in 1965 runners up in C and B Sections in the two years following and were promoted to A Section in 1968.

"North were relegated to B Section in 1970 and 1971 and returned to A Section in 1972, finishing fourth in 1973.

"Both teams have therefore won two previous premierships, in E and D Sections. They have now played each other 15 times, St. Bernard's winning 9 times and North 5 with one match drawn.

"Only one player remains from the original 1963 teams and that is North's Les Murray who today plays his 223rd game.

"The successful team today will win its first A Section premiership."

To carry things a little further, De La Salle Old Collegians are competing in the B Section Grand Final and St. Bernard's in the A Reserve Section Grand Final, so it really could be A GREAT DAY FOR THE IRISH!
