

Good afternoon football followers.

In the frantic lead up to the start of the season a couple of occurrences really highlighted and made me feel what a nice environment sports administration is to work in.

REVIEW

The performance of **Dermot Dann** and **Geoff Clare** on their respective **Xaverian** wings was heartening but they lacked a cohesive forward line.

PREVIEW

Ormond are at home to St Bernards and both teams will be brimming with confidence after 1st round victories. St Bernards are very much an unknown quantity but they do have a great deal of experience on the field in the form of Frank Dunell, Wayne Carey and Gavin Keane. The on-ball duels between Ormond's Andrew Jobling and Matt McConville and St Bernards' Wayne Carey and Jack Overman should prove to be the highlight of this game. Somehow it is difficult to imagine that St Bernards would have enough good players all over the ground to stop Ormand today. The Ormand runners such as Brett Connell and Darren Wood may open any faults that the St Bernards' defence possesses but be aware that the **Saints** will not be handing this game over on a plate - Ormond by 20 points.

Old Scotch will have their hands full as they take on Collegians at Flinders Park. After being murdered last week by St Bernards I have no doubt that the Cardinals will come out with all guns blazing today. Collegians have a potent forward line with the likes of Mount, Schober, Hoyle and Lake all capable of kicking a bag. Bob Fuller and Steve Reddish will be leading the Old Scotch defence which was torn to shreds last week – I don't think Scotch will play that badly again! Gary Irvine and Ed Allen should have a fine duel on the wing but with Mark Hibbins and Matt Galbraith constantly getting the ball I would expect Collegians, who are very much on a high, to win this game. Russell Greene will have to do his homework if he expects his team to get up this week – Collegians by 2 goals.

A confident Therry welcome Old Xaverians to Oak Park. Therry at home are as tough as any team in the competition – and they know it! Tim Taylor and Paul Matton are in fine touch and no doubt will be worn closely by Justin Cardillo and Michael Logan. The first use of the ball should go to Therry as one would expect big David Wrigglesworth to dominate this game. The forward play of Gilmour and Eastmuire may prove to be a major headache for Xav's coach Grant Thomas and it is difficult to see him having enough good options to prevent Therry from kicking a winning score. If Xavs decide to play this game man on man perhaps they may hold Therry down but I can't see them getting on top – Therry to win by 6 goals.

North Old Boys coming off a fine 1st round victory over De La Salle play Marcellin at Elsternwick Park. Marcellin who have been devastated by the losses of Rob Gross and Chris Slattery will be in for a most unpleasant outing at VAFA Headquarters. The Old Boys looked great last week and with opportunities such as Gerard Phyland, Luke Boyle and Brian Hanlon seemingly at the fall of every ball, I would expect



DENTAL HEALTH SERVICES -WHO ARE THEY?

Vic Health has, for the past season, been the major sponsor of the Victorian Amateur Football Association, and in conjunction with its agency, Dental Health Services, has promoted the health message,

"KEEP TEETH FOR LIFE - WEAR A MOUTHGUARD" Once again, Vic Health and Dental Health Services

are pleased to be associated with the VAFA in 1992. Many of you may not be familiar with what Dental Health Services is and what we do. Therefore, we have

taken this opportunity to give you some insight into what Dental Health Services is all about.

In essence, Dental Health Services is the "school dental service" and you may recall visits from the service when you or your children were attending primary school.

Dental Health Services is a branch of the Statewide Operations Division of the Health Department.

Our mission is "to ensure, through the provision of regular dental services and dental health promotion that Victorian children have the basis to maintain healthy natural teeth for life". Basically, we offer dental services to every primary school in the State on a two year basis for children in grades prep, one, two, three and four and to children in grades five and six whose parents are health care card holders. We place special emphasis on children with high dental needs who tend to be from lower socioeconomic areas. We aim to see children in this category on 12 month recall.

In 1991, over 130,000 primary school children in this State were seen, and treated if necessary, by Dental

Health Services.

Dental Health Services has about 360 staff of which 80% are clinical staff. The main operators are dental therapists who we train at the Dental Therapy School at our Headquarters in St. Kilda Road. We are organised into 14 Area Dental Teams throughout the State.

As you may know, the prevalence of dental disease in the permanent teeth of children has fallen dramatically in recent years; however, the extent to which individual children experience dental disease varies considerably. Our goal is to virtually eliminate dental cavities in the permanent teeth of most Victorian primary school children within 5 years. To do so, we will be placing more emphasis on preventive measures and dental health promotion.

Being associated with the VAFA will help us with our dental health promotion, especially in the area of dental safety and the use of professionally fitted mouthguards.

Dental Health Services is dedicated to improving and maintaining the dental health of our young children starting them on the road to having good teeth for life.


The VAFA – and the emphasis it places on ''family'' involvement in the game - assists us to get our dental message across to junior players through the Elsternwick VicKick Clinic, senior players and spectators, many of whom are parents today or will be parents in the future.

We are particularly keen to see individual teams in the VAFA contributing in their way to promoting good dental messages such as mouthguard usage.

Dental Health Services is different to the usual commercial sponsor in that we are not so much interested in promoting our name as good dental health.



COACHES CLIPBOARD edited by Mike McArthur-Allen



A different writer each week will contribute an article. This week Simon Meehan from Old Haileybury has contributed the following:

As the Senior coach of a football club, making it through the pre-season schedule is a wonderful feeling. There tends to be a huge relief once the season starts and the normality of each week becomes a much simpler task. In Amateur football the coach throughout pre-season takes on many roles due to the fact that helpers can be

hard to find and most of the planning has come from his head.

By the time the actual season gets underway, the faces have re-appeared and the demands on the coach have focussed towards teaching the players his team structure and reinforcing the "fundamentals" of the game. The fundamentals of football are the basic skills and team work which must be executed and adhered to in every game. If we step up a level and wish to succeed, it means we must be able to do the basic fundamentals at a faster rate of speed under a greater level of opposition pressure.

"The Football Fundamentals"

1. Disposal Skills

The more you turn over the ball the less chance you have of winning. Players must practise correctly to reach a level of skill which **minimises** errors and gives confidence to team mates.

2. Fitness

This includes physical and mental fitness. One must have properly designed training programmes. Correct food and drink intake and plenty of sleep and rest are essential. To obtain a level of fitness it requires a great deal of self sacrifice and discipline.

3. Teamwork

The coach must teach and advise ensuring all are working together. Teamwork is made up with communication, co-operation and co-ordination. Lazy, selfish and individual players cannot be good team players and never understand the necessity of teamwork.

4. Play On Football

Knowing how, when and why we play on is something the coach must teach. This basic fundamental is something that "slows" when players become tired or lack confidence in others around them.

5. Adapting to Conditions

A good player will adapt to the conditions of each game and thus create the maximum advantage for his team. The differeing conditions can include climatic and umpiring – each being of vital importance.

6. Attitude

This is the player's state of mind made up of many components – Courage, Performance, Effort, Motivation, Pressure, Concentration and Confidence. Without the correct attitude, success is not obtainable.

The coach who can teach and have his side perform these fundamentals the best will be the one who stands victorious at the end of the season. The objective of each game is to outscore the opposition. There is no magic formulae. However, the side that wins in most positions and makes the least number of errors will usually win. In Amateur football the most skilled side usually wins and performs the football fundamentals the best.



VAFA RULE CHANGES FOR 1992


The VAFA for the 1992 Season has made a few rule changes that players, coaches, umpires and officials have been duly advised about through written and verbal communications. However, the VAFA supporter who trots along to barrack for his or her beloved Club may also like to know of these important rule changes to avoid any confusion arising and hopefully to also give them a feeling of being involved.

The most significant change is that the 50 metre penalty that has been so damaging given the dimensions of most VAFA grounds has now been reduced to 25 metres. When applied this is still punitive and no coach will accept undisciplined players causing this penalty to disadvantage his team but at least it is a penalty that is an appropriate distance and will cut down on the extremes of seeing a penalty taking a player further downfield than the average player can kick the ball. The other rule change sees the abolition of the line across the centre circle so that now both ruckmen can run into contest the bounce from the same side of the circle if they so desire. This overcomes the disadvantage at the centre bounce of a team that does not have a very tall ruckman and, after all, it was the only ball-up on the ground where this artificial situation existed.

Some messages regarding dress requirements:

- Umpires and members of the Executive will report breaches of dress requirements and clubs will be automatically fined for these breaches.
- Interchange steward white coat, VAFA armband.
- Runners orange shisrt, tracksuit pants or shorts (not to be the colour of other participating team).
- Medical Staff white top, VAFA armband.
- Trainers and drink carriers white tops, VAFA armbands, tracksuit pants or short (not to be the colour of other participating team).
- Playing jumper must have V logo, numbered correctly, home or away shorts, club socks.
- Bike shorts flesh coloured or identical to shorts' colur being worn.
- Field/Boundary umpires (club supplied) VAFA shirt, white shorts, navy socks. Other league's umpiring gear is not acceptable.
- Goal Umpires white coat, 2 flags (45 x 45 cm)




