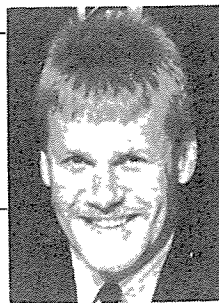

REVIEW

Collegians strode into the A Section Grand Final when they defeated a gallant **De La Salle** by 14 points last Sunday.

Collegians got the jump on **De La** and from that point on they kept **De La** chasing.

De La who trailed by 16 points at quarter time did have the opportunity to be a bit closer but they were under pressure and failed to convert their chances.

Collegian veterans **Stephen Mount** and **Rick Schober** were providing all the options up forward.

Collegians continued to set the pace in the second term but it was their turn to be inaccurate adding 2 goals 7 behinds to go to the long break leading by 21 points.

Pat Mannix seemed to be the only forward looking dangerous but the midfield pressure applied by **Collegians** meant that his chances were not the result of accurate disposal upheld.

Andrew Ronchi was doing well in the ruck for **De La** but his work was being sharked by **Matt Galbraith**, **Mark Hibbins** and **Co**.

In a fairly even third term both teams attacked relentlessly.

Chris Campbell and **Col McClounan** gave it their all for **De La** but **Collegians** certainly stuck to their pressure game plan and extended their lead to 25 points at ¾ time.

Mount really was outstanding and despite the **De La Salle** last term revival he finished with a match winning 7 goals.

Many of the **De La** stars were well down on their game.

Peter Rennie, **Brett Mahoney** and **Julian Maloney** can play far better than Sunday's performance.

Collegians slowed in the final term which has become a dangerous trait and one that could create an upset on Grand Final day if it were to continue.

The strength of **Collegians** all over the ground was basically too much for **De La Salle** to hold. Every time they covered one player another **Collegian** would bob up and create havoc.

It now remains for **De La Salle** to take stock and regroup as they prepare for battle against **St Bernards** who have had a week's break.

PREVIEW

St Bernards play very much on emotion and commitment.

With both teams desperate for a Grand Final berth we can expect to see a bruising encounter today with bodies on the line and the ball being the objective.

St Bernards will look to him again to provide the leadership and experience that they will need to win this one today.

Luke and **Jason Gollant** will be the main targets up forward and either or both of them can be dangerous.

Nick Mitchell seems to be out of touch and with **Greig Wood** suspended the '**Bernards**' may have to rely on their running brigade to score a few goals.

Peter Rennie, **Andrew Mackintosh**, **Danny Smith**, **John Tully** will be the players asked to stop the **St Bernards** forwards and on talent they should be able to but on desire it will be an even match.

At the other end of the field **De La** will be hoping that **Nick Fraser**, **Pat Mannix**, **Sam Hunter** and **Julian Maloney** will kick a winning score.

Apart from **Dunell**, **Paul** and **Anthony Capes** and **Ferdi Comito** will carry the hopes of the **St Bernards** defence.

Across the midfield **Chris Belleville**, **Mark Lowe** and **Chris Campbell** will take on **Simon Walsh**, **Rob Purcell** and perhaps **Corey Mallia**. The **De La** combination are hard to beat in this area and at best I can only see **St Bernards** breaking even with them across the centre.

On the ball **Wayne Carey** should have a great duel with **Andrew Ronchi**.

The ruck roving battle between **Col McClounan** and **Julian Maloney** who will be pitted against **Jack Overman** and **Gavin Keane** could well decide the outcome of this game.

At the fall of the ball **Brett Mahoney** and **Morris Mastriani** will be challenged by the talented and very much in form duo of **Matt Mulkearns** and **Vin Comito**.

On form **St Bernards** will control the roving tussle. So where are we now?

De La has a forward line out of touch. **St Bernards** are relying on two major forwards to kick their goals.

De La have a better centre line but are currently down in the roving department.

All indicators say that this game is bound to be close.

Determination, concentration, discipline and commitment will win this one.

St Bernards are displaying more of this at the moment but perhaps lack the experience of **De La Salle**.

The conditions seem likely to favour **St Bernards** and I'm leaning their way in what should be a thriller.

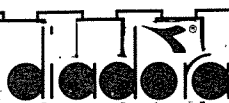

At last Monday's Vote Count Night each section's leading goalkicker was presented with his National Mutual Trustees Medallion for the number of goals kicked during the home and away season. The winners were as follows, with goals in brackets: **A:** Gary Petroff (53) Marcellin; **B:** Adam Acreman (63) Old Mentonians; **C:** Ralph Bergman (107) St Kilda; **D:** Mark Crawford (60) Hampton Rovers; **E:** Dean DeMorton (93) North Brunswick; **F:** Joseph Simundza (99) Old Essendon; **G North:** Andrew Treganowan (76) Marcellin; **G South:** Matthew Dalton (74) Old Xaverians; **U19/1:** Craig Bennie (71) Marcellin; **U19/Central:** John Raywood (82) Ivanhoe; **U19/South:** Wesley Douglass (110) Monash Blues.

A highlight of the Vote Count Night was the conduct of a LUCKY DRAW which saw one of the attendee's name drawn from a barrel which won for the winner a night for two at the Radisson Hotel followed by complimentary breakfast the following morning.

The winner was Mark Wilson from the Bulleen-Templestowe club.

Thanks to the Radisson for its support of the Association with a couple of functions over the past couple of years.

Congratulations to Old Brighton on their first ever promotion to A Section – a wonderful achievement and I'm sure that by their depth of talent they will be in A Section for a long time.

Other teams promoted to this stage are as follows: From C to B – Fawknor and Bulleen-Templestowe; From D to C – Caulfield Grammarians and Mazenod; From E to D – Brunswick and North Brunswick; From F to E – St Leo's Wattle Park and Old Essendon.

Last Thursday night 6 clubs from outside the Association were interviewed with a view to possible inclusion in F section 1993.

The recommendations of the interviewing committee will be put to the Executive on Monday evening who will consider possibly: (a) whether to add 4 clubs only to F section making 2 sections of 10 for 1993; or (b) whether to add more than 4 clubs making perhaps 2 F sections of 12 clubs each.

Another consideration may be to reduce G section to a single section consisting of clubs who are a 3rd eighteen of an existing club, a new club to the association or an existing F section club battling with numbers which may need a year as a single team club to re-group.

Clubs in G section at the moment who are single team clubs who do not fit the above criteria may be asked to adjust to a 2 team F section club.

The above may be the subject of discussion at the Executive Seminar where all club submissions are considered along with the Executive's ideas.



B SECTION by Tom Johnston



The opening of Saturday's B Grade second semi final was predictably intense and highlighted by scrambly patches of football and errors. Played in conditions best described as holding, both teams were committed to the ball and body clashes were numerous. The spectacle, as a result, was not great early, but clearly showed the importance of the game. Significant tactical moves saw **Andrew Pryor** tagged by **McAulay** (A move which would continue for most of the day and in some ways reflected the attitude of **Old Melburnians** – on the back foot from the start). **Mark Parker** opted to use **Nick Perry** on the dangerous **Scott Teal** early. This duel proved to be very interesting.

Old Melburnians kicked against a slight breeze in the first quarter and worked hard to create early chances for their forwards. **Useinov** missed a simple goal in the opening minutes, running into an open goal a lack of concentration saw the ball miss and an easy goal go missing. But for this miss scores should have been virtually levelled at half time. **Old Melburnians** also played the quarter with a four man forward line, preferring to push extra men like **Anastakis** into defence. Such a move would prove to benefit **Old Brighton** more than **OM's**. Constantly **Melburnians** using their mark and kick game bombed the ball into their forward line only to meet a wall of **Old Brighton** defenders across their half forward line. **Brighton** gained possession often and their running in lines shared the ball out of defence. Only poor delivery to the leading **Hayden** combined with the efforts of **Tony Witts** in defence prevented **Brighton** from turning **OM's** unplanned and ill directed attacks into goals. There is little doubt in my mind that to match it with **Old Brighton** who work to create loose running options as a fundamental element of their play you **must** man up. Furthermore **Old Brighton** were working hard to gain and hold front position. **Teal** was forced wide and a long way from goal for his kicks due to the lack of support near him. His long goal during the first term was a great example of his personal talent and ability.

In the second quarter **Old Brighton** built on their lead despite kicking against the breeze. Their ability to win the ball out of the centre was a decisive factor in this term. Running into the wind in numbers they made the play and were continually committed to sharing the ball around. In contrast **OM's** tended to bomb the ball indiscriminately relying on glimpses of **spontaneous individuality** rather than the consistent team play of **Old Brighton**. **Jeremy Nichols'** mark of the day perfectly underlined this but such bursts of individual talent were constantly negated by the continuous tackling and pressure of **Old Brighton**. On a number of occasions **Old Melburnians** were forced to kick hurriedly without purpose – resulting in turnovers.

At the start of play I felt that **Melburnians** held the advantage in the air but it was the marking strength of

Old Brighton that was proving to be significant. **Rickarby** was leading the way in this department. But for a long goal from a near impossible angle by **Salter** after the bell **Old Melburnians** could have been 20 points down at the main break. Instead they still had some hope. The persistence of the **Old Melburnians** coaching staff with a four pronged attack even with the breeze had again proved advantageous to **Old Brighton** who ran in numbers to the midfield before delivering to their leading forwards.

The signs at half time were not good for **OMs** but they came out firing after half time slamming on two quick goals. Any hope of a recovery was short lived however, when the possession game of **Brighton** began to link faultlessly and the accurate passing found **Hayden** or the numerous options provided by the energetic **Brighton** forwards. The intensity, of the game had lifted but **Old Brighton's** tackling was continuing to provide headaches for **Old Melburnians** who compounded their misfortune by failing to man up leaving far too many options for **Old Brighton** to exploit with short chip kicks. **Mark Parker** had obviously decided to go on the attack after half time as he switched **Nick Perry** to centre half forward, a move that merely reflected the positive attitude of **Old Brighton** throughout the day. Games like this need to be won and the team that makes the play, takes the advantage and attacks benefits. **Old Melburnians** may well reflect on their decision to tag **Pryor**, whilst it eliminated him from the contest it took the pressure off both **Andrew Grant** and **Matt Talbot** whose creativity more than covered that of **Pryors** loss – **you can't tag them all**. The other significant factor was the lack of drive from the **OM's** midfield **Webb** and **Maskiel** were both quiet for example.

At the ¾ time break **Mark Parker** reminded his players that 7 months hard work was on the line and that a place in the B Grade Grand Final and A Grade was near at hand. **Paul O'Brien** on the other hand could only plead with his players to try anything.

The last quarter, marred by rain, would see **Old Melburnians** finish as they had played throughout the day – without much system or pattern. **Brighton** continued on their way and their slick ball handling and clever delivery to leading forwards was a feature. They must now be favoured to take out the B Grade flag.

Old Melburnians on the other hand must re-examine their goals. Do they really want another chance at winning the B Grade pennant and thereby gaining promotion? It would seem to many that they may be a little unsure and hesitant. They have 7 days to recover and refocus – re-establishing a system that will suit their structure.

I would not discount them yet as they are capable of anything and their year to date has seen many highs and lows. However, I believe **Old Trinity** having had a

week's break have more incentive and desire to achieve the goal they narrowly missed in 1991. Doubts concerning the fitness of **Nichols** and **A Wilts** plus a belief that **Old Trinity** have better options up forward and a midfield in top form lead me to believe they can win. **Old Melburnians** rely heavily on **Scott Teal** and their midfield too, others must now accept the challenge and take the game up to **Old Trinity**.

2nd Qtr - The breeze came up, the rain came down and the **Bankers** lit up. 5 YEARS AGO – 1987

Old Paradians to defeat **Ormond** and go on to play **Old Xavs** in the Grand Final – a replay of 1986's 'B' Section Grand Final. Would it be the first time it had been done for the 'B' Section grand finalists to make it next year to the 'A' Section grand final? Tipsters **Ross Booth** and **Peter French** thought **Paradians** would be there and so continued on their shocking record of finals tipplings.

At half time it looked as if the boys may be right. After an even first quarter, two goals apiece, **Parade** played a magnificent second quarter, kicking 6 goals in 17 minutes, with 5 coming from the boot of forward, **Michael Skeritt**, and led by 28 points at half time. Centre half back **Dale McCann**, rover **Frank Gleeson** and forward **Ted Flynn** had all been prominent for **Parade** while **Ormond** had struggled.

It was a magnificent third quarter by **Ormond**. Coach **McArthur-Allen** made some significant changes – **Paul Sutherland** to the forward line, **Brad Nash** on the ball – they each kicked 3 in the 2nd half, and full forward **Paul Schuhkraft** got 6 to make it 87 for the season.

Parade were magnificent in defeat. They came back strongly for 6 goals in the final term, only to be matched by **Ormond** with the same number.

First gamer **Lindsay McMahon** was magnificent in the ruck for **Ormond** and other best players were **Nash**, **Schuhkraft**, **Cox**, **Sutherland** and **Tobin**. It was hard to see how they left out **Phil Mehrten** and **Phil Kingston**.

Mehrtten was reported in the final term and, it would be a long time to Tribunal night for the **Monds** supporters. **Gleeson**, **Broad**, **Woods**, **Skeritt**, **Grills** and **Canavan** were **Parade's** best.

In 'B' Section the Executive were very worried at the last change that it would be another draw. A prodigious goal by **John Pearson** and then one of the biggest goals ever at Elsternwick Park by **Greg Wood** made the game a certainty for **St Bernard's**. **Sullivan**, **Nathan**, **O'Dea**, **Hogan**, **Comito**, **Federico** (St B's) and **Flaherty**, **Reddick**, **Quinn**, **Ratcliffe**, **Gibson**, **Matton** (**Therry**) were best.

After 29 years as a player and official, 240 games and President from 1972 to 1987, Elsternwick's president **Graham Holmes** had decided to step down. A special presentation was made to **Graham** at the club's Trophy Night.

10 YEARS AGO – 1982

Goal umpire **Ralph Bridges** waved the flags for his 350th VAFA game. **De La Salle's** strong second half dominated by their small brigade, saw **North Old Boys** defeated 15.13 to 10.17.

Best were **Maher** (4 goals), **Williams**, **McDonnell**, **Bourke**, **Frenetic**, **Greene** (**De La Salle**) and **Walsh**, **Griffin**, **O'Rourke**, **Clark**, **Conti**, **Ryan** (**North Old Boys**).

North Old Boys went on to annihilate **Marcellin** in the preliminary final, leading 14.9 to 1.6 at half time, with final scores 19.16 to 8.12. Stars were **Griffin**, **S. Weir**, **Borchich**, **O'Rourke** (**North Old Boys**) and **Cain**, **Ebert**, **Howard** (**Marcellin**).

In 'C' **Old Camberwell** took out the flag when they repeated their semi-final win against **Coburg** to win just as convincingly 17.20 to 11.7 with the best players **Rogers**, **Hackett**, **D. Steven** (**Old Camberwell**) and **Purcell**, **N. McAuliffe**, **Peck** (**Coburg**).

Parkside beat **St Pius** for the third time to win 'D' premiership. **B. Clark**, **Arnold**, **Heaver**, **Bastow** (8 goals) would go down in **Parkside's** history as the grand final stars.

Traditional rivals **Therry** and **Banyule** staged a typical encounter for the E Section flag – a close game all day, the lead changing frequently, and **Therry** proving too strong in the final term kicking 5.4 to 2.1 to triumph 16.6 to 14.10. Best were **White**, **Whyley**, **McMahon**, **Weir**, **Biddlestone**, **Chetecuti** (**Therry**) and **Ladd**, **Taylor**, **Power**, **Fraumano**, **Foster**, **McKenzie** (**Banyule**).

The match was obviously very fiery – 5 **Banyule** players were reported and suspended for a total of 24 weeks while two **Therry** players were reported for one week's suspension.

The closest grand final **Bulleen United** beat **Peninsula Old Boys** by 7 points, 14.8(102) to 13.17(95). **Morley**, **Viney**, **Anderson** (**Bulleen United**) and **Wiltshire**, **Doyle**, **Horne** (**Peninsula Old Boys**) starred. Junior premiers were **Bulleen Templestowe**, **Ivanhoe** and **Fawkner**.

15 YEARS AGO – 1977

De La Salle staged a real form reversal to annihilate **St Bernard's O.C.** and go into the grand final against **North Old Boys**.

In 'B' Section, **Ivanhoe** scraped home by one point from **Reservoir Old Boys** in a see-saw game in which the teams were never more than 10 points apart. **Fawkner** proved their supremacy for the season in 'C' with a 29 point win over **Parkside** in a high scoring game, 20.21 to 17.10. Best were **Richardson**, **Quinnell**, **Foley** (**Fawkner**) and **Howell**, **Felle**, **Wilson** (**Parkside**).

Other grand final winners were 'D' **Old Brighton** 24.13 to **Alphington** 14.11, 'E' **Heatherton** 17.13 to **West Brunswick** 8.16, 'F' **St Bedes' O.C.** 12.16 to **Bulleen Templestowe** 12.14, Junior 1 **St Bernard's** 20.13 to **Ivanhoe** 12.16 and Junior 2 **Hampton Rovers** 20.16 to **Geelong** 18.17.

The Association bid farewell to **George McTaggart**, editor of the Amateur Footballer for close on 30 years, who was retiring from the Titles Office in October to go overseas with his family for two years. (He came back better and bigger than ever, **N.R.**).

20 YEARS AGO – 1972

Parade's shocking inaccuracy, 3.14 to half time against **Caulfield Grammarians** 6.7 almost cost them the game which really went their way when they kicked four goals in as many minutes in the third term to go on to an easy victory.

A great performance by **Parade** who had won the 'B' Section premiership in 1971 and would now meet 1971 'A' Section premiers, **Ormond** in the grand final. In 'B' Section **University Blacks** contributed to their defeat with poor shooting 11.22 while **Ivanhoe** kicked 18.10 to earn the right to meet **Geelong** in the 'B' Section grand final.

Ireland, Hughes, Dickson (Ivanhoe) and **Balter, MacCallum, A. Costello (Blacks)** were best.

Reservoir shocked **Assumption** with 10.4 to 1.1 in the second quarter to go on a win the 'C' Section premiership and retain their unbeaten record.

Devlin, Bates, R. Shepherd (Reservoir) and **Lewis, Duro, Phillips (Assumption)** were best.

Parkside with a 1 point win over **Old Brighton** gained the 'D' Section premiership, **Ridd, Sammut, Graham, Dryden (Parkside)** and **Watkins, Mullett, Templeton (Old Brighton)** were best.

25 YEARS AGO – 1967

Caulfield Grammarians (14.12) defeated **Melbourne High** (12.14) to enter the grand Final against **Old Paradians**. Best for **Caulfield Grammarians** were **Ward, P. Hore, Pyman, Baker, Vorrath, Williams** and for **M.H.S. Fairbank, Nelson, Turnbull, Needham, Harley, Gilbert**.

North Old Boys (11.7) kicked 6.4 to 0.1 in the last quarter against **Ormond** (7.10) to play **University Blues** in the 'B' Section Grand Final and enter 'A' Section in 1968.

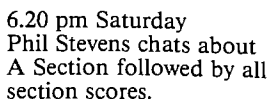

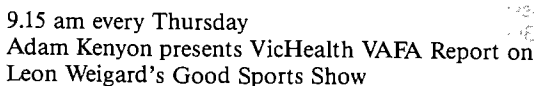

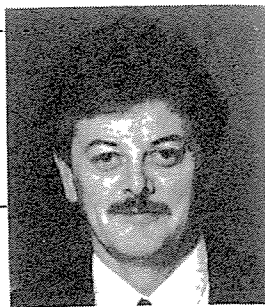

THE AUSSIE COACH

by **Simon Meehan – Senior Coach, Old Haileybury**

Australian Rules Football was devised in 1858 by two cricketers, Thomas Wills and Henry Harrison. It was devised with the aim of inventing a form of football which would provide cricketers with healthy exercise during the off-season. Wills and Harrison developed this form of football dismissing Rugby and Soccer with their emphasis being on running and ball-handling. The game proved an immediate success and as we know today is a 'religion' among the southern states.

As a coach, I make the rules and set the strategies for my side. All coaches do this and hence we can look at Wills and Harrison as the first coaches of our code. From the time these two men initiated our game, coaches have been manipulating people and devising moves to succeed in our game. We read articles and listen to the 'gurus' words of wisdom, hoping that what

we may hear will be the direction all require for automatic success.

Below is some notes I wrote for myself in 1986 when applying for the coaching job at St Kilda C.B.C. they may be of some interest to my fellow VAFA Coaches and aspiring coaches of the future. Just as a matter of fact, I missed out on the job.

- The club must be together with a definite aim.
- The coach must be buddy and teacher to all players.
- The coach must give players faith in himself, the club and themselves. Make sure enthusiasm is at its utmost.
- Bring mature and past players back to the club to give support to teams, committee and club members.

From 1993 **ALL** Senior Coaches in the VAFA must have at least LEVEL 1 ACCREDITATION and from 1994 the same situation will extend to Assistant and Reserve Coaches. Also, **ALL** Under 19 Coaches must continue to have Level 1 Accreditation as has been the case for the past 3 years.

This decision was made at the VAFA Executive Seminar last November and this directive was sent to ALL VAFA Club Secretaries in December in the Christmas memo.

Therefore there will be a big demand for Level 1 Courses before next season. A course is available on Sat/Sun 17th-18th October, 1992 at the Royal Melbourne Showgrounds. Application forms are available from VAFA Headquarters by ringing 531 8333. GET IN EARLY.

VAFA COACH OF THE YEAR

At a recent Committee Meeting of the VAFA Coaches Association it was decided to make available an award to the VAFA Coach of the Year.

This will become an annual presentation to the VAFA's most outstanding coach. The VAFA/AFCA Committee will select the winner from the 188 current Coaches from 73 Amateur Clubs.

The recipient will also be entered into the 'Australian Football Coaches Association' Coach of the Year Award presented in November.

The presentation of the 1992 VAFA Coach of the Year is to be made at the VAFA Gala Grand Final Breakfast. The breakfast is being held on Sunday 20th September between 8am and 11am at the Prahran Town Hall.

The Coaches Association encourages all Amateur Coaches to attend the Gala Breakfast. The normal inclusive cost is \$50 (includes entry to the VAFA A Section Grand Final). To reward Amateur Coaches the Coaches Association will subsidise all VAFA/AFCA members \$10.

- Want outsiders.
- Develop the junior base, so as they want to play football for the club.
- All players must be able to come and talk to the coach at any time with questions relating to their position in the team and the club.
- Also the coach must be able to talk to his players

when guidance is needed or confidence needs to be re-assured.

- A coach must never coach a team all the same.
- Each person has a different personality with different weaknesses and strengths.
- A good coach is one who knows all these and can react to help – not damage.
