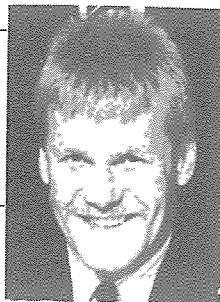

The one hundredth season of Amateur football draws to a close this weekend and in the two senior games any one of the four teams could emerge victorious at the end of either Saturday or Sunday. Readers of my column this year will have noticed that I have refrained from making selections, however, being the final weekend I thought it time to 'break loose' and see if the 'Kiss of Death' is still alive.

In the B Section Grand Final I think Old Brighton will be premiers although the match against Old Trinity will be much closer than people might expect. In previous encounters this season each side had 1 win each and statistically looking at the scores, Old Trinity perhaps look slightly stronger on form – • June 13th Old Trinity 26.9(164) def Old Brighton 14.13(97); • August 15th Old

Brighton 15.18(108) def Old Trinity 14.21(105). However, being a local boy I'd better stick with the Tonners.

On Sunday, form obviously indicates a Collegians victory, although I feel De La Salle could well surprise as their team is blessed with great desire and finals experience and will certainly at least give an excellent account of themselves.

Previous encounters – • May 10 Collegians 16.7(67) were defeated by De La Salle 17.11(113); • De La Salle 10.7(67) were defeated by Collegians 10.11(71) and in the second semi final Collegians 13.15(93) defeated De La Salle 11.13(79), giving Collegians a 2-1 record to this stage. I'll stick with Collegians as I feel the incentive of being premiers in their 100th season will drive them on through every minute of this Grand Final.

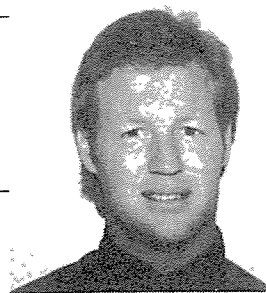

### REVIEW

**De La Salle** got the jump on **St Bernards** and were never headed.

One wonders how **St Bernards** were ever able to keep touch with **De La** as they were.

Accurate kicking was probably the main reason for **St Bernards** being as close as they were – but clearly **De La** were the better side on the day.

The over zealous approach to the game saw **St Bernards** give away many free kicks as **De La** displayed the type of composure needed to firstly win the game and secondly challenge **Collegians** for the title of VAFA A Section Premiers.

**Pat O'Callaghan** led the **De La** forward line and finished with 3 fine goals.

**Craig Wright** across the half back line was impassable and he certainly took over the mantle of Director in charge of defence in the absence of **Peter Rennie**.

**Wayne Carey** battled on all day and probably just won the ruck duel with **Andrew Ronchi**.

With **De La** four goals up at ½ time **St Bernard's** chances were dim and the writing was on the wall.

By ¾ time **De La** were cruising with a 40 pt lead and were home and hosed.

To their credit **St Bernards** kept fighting but **De La** had the game in the bag and were only going at half pace at the end.

**Chris Campbell** and **Pa' Fuime** were in great touch for **De La** and while all the **St Bernard's** players tried gallantly they were simply outclassed by the experienced **De La Salle** combination.

The signs are good for **St Bernards** next year and everyone involved with A Section has been most impressed with their first season back in the top grade.

### PREVIEW

**Collegians** versus **De La Salle**, the battle of the A Section giants.

**Leigh Carlson's Lions** have not put a foot wrong this year and they are deserved favourites to win this year's pennant.

The return of **David Hoyle**, **Stuart Hinchin** and **Mark Hibbins** coupled with the addition of **Christian Davidson** and **Danny Thomson** has seen **Collegians** develop into a most impressive outfit that play an excellent brand of long kicking direct football.

**De La Salle**, the reigning premiers, have had a struggling year.

Injuries and overseas travel has seen their list decimated and it is very much to their credit that they have made it into this year's Grand Final. Their experience and determination could see them cap off the season with back to back premierships.

In recent weeks **De La** have struggled to find a dominant forward. The normal avenues of **Nick Fraser**

and **Pat Mannix** have been well held leaving **Bernie Dunn** searching for new goal kickers.

During the course of the year we have seen **Julian Maloney** and **Sam Hunter** fill the gaps with great efficiency.

Today I feel we will see **De La** line up with all these potential goalkickers in attack.

The man who will direct the forward line will be **Pat O'Callaghan** at centre half forward.

Feeding off him and providing alternatives will be **Mannix**, **Fraser**, **Maloney** and **Hunter** – on paper the forward line is most impressive – on form it is dangerously looming.

**James Bennett** is the linchpin of the **Collegian** defence. He will use every trick in the book to hold out **O'Callaghan**.

**Stuart Hinchin** will take **Mannix** and will make him earn every kick.

**Steve Laussen** will take **Nick Fraser** and **Christian Davidson**, **Julian Maloney** – fairly even contests I believe.

**Andrew Lord** will follow **Sam Hunter** leaving **Andrew 'Roo' Wright** to mind the resting rovers.

The **Collegian** defence is just as good as the **De La** attack and it will be up to the midfielders of **Collegians** to make sure that the ball is delivered under pressure, otherwise **De La** could have a field day.

The **Collegian** attack is worth admiring. Not only is it more than capable of kicking large scores it does not let the ball out easily.

**Rick Schober** is the main man in the **Collegian** forward line. His size belies his marking ability and that awkward left foot is far more dangerous than it looks!

**Stephen Mount** had a day out two weeks ago against **De La** when he booted 7 goals. With **Peter Rennie** out injured **De La** may struggle to hold him today.

**Jason Dansey** sits in the pocket and needs to be watched by a big man as he is most capable over head.

**David Hoyle** and **Tony Parkin** across the flanks are hard at the ball and **Brad Woolhouse** can create havoc in his pocket.

**De La's John Tully** will take **Schober** to task in what should be a great battle.

**Craig Wright** is in great form and will most likely take **Tony Parkin**.

**Andrew Mackintosh** will watch **David Hoyle** and try to run off him wherever possible. Leaving **Damien Toohey** to stop **Mount** – but who will cover the lanky **Dansey**? Your guess is as good as mine. To my mind **Dansey** poses a big threat if the ground is dry.

Across the centre we find great talent. **De La's Chris Campbell** is one of the best wingmen in the competition. **Mark Lowe** is a hard ball centreman and **Chris Belleville** can run all day.

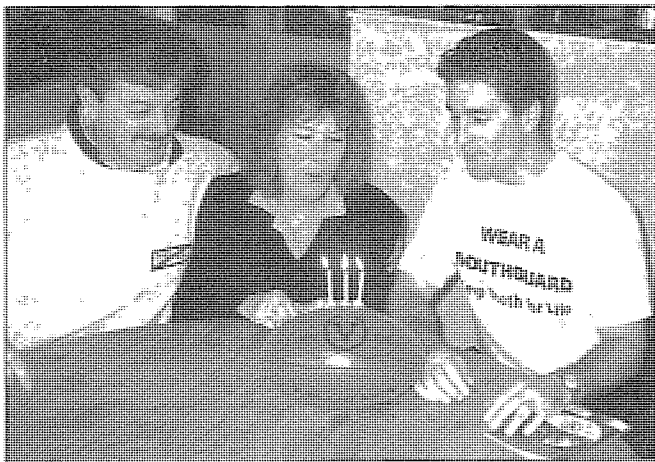
Thanks Bombers – you have leapt up my list of favourite AFL teams.

## B SECTION by John Simpson

### PRELIMINARY FINAL REPORT

It has often been said about our great game that nothing is predictable and once again on Saturday such a statement proved to be true. Who would have thought that the overnight rains, heavy showers and early hail would turn the **Box Hill** oval into a quagmire. We usually expect to witness finals games where the great skills of the teams show through on firm grounds in fine conditions. This did not prove to be the case for the cut throat B Grade Preliminary Final. In sloppy conditions general skill is replaced by total commitment and a fair dose of luck too. Prior to the game both teams had question marks hanging over them. Could **Old Trinity** finally break free of their finals hoodoo and make A Grade? Could **Old Melburnians** recover from their defeat at the hands of **Old Brighton** and steel themselves for a red hot go at A Grade and another shot at **Old Brighton**? In many ways both questions were answered as the commitment and character of both teams in difficult conditions was excellent. Both sides put their bodies on the line making the ball the object all day. Constantly players from both teams threw themselves desperately over the ball or at an opponent to prevent them using it.

The game started with **Old Trinity** kicking with a very strong breeze. **Andrew Allibon** ignited his side and played a dominant role during the quarter. Constantly he won the ball in the midfield and used long and penetrating delivery into the front half. **Trevor Norman** was also giving **Old Trinity** great drive with many of his possessions coming across the half back line during the quarter. **Norman** is a great player with plenty of courage and commitment on any day. His ability to work hard and 'get down the back' to give his defence support is a wonderful example of disciplined on ball play. **'Doc' Rogers**, the recently crowned B Grade Best and Fairest winner was covering an enormous amount of ground and winning possessions on both wings as he and **Oldfield** continually swapped places, testing the *patience and stamina* of **Doug Maskiel**, who was trying hard to curb the energetic **Rogers**. **Old Trinity** dominated the 1st quarter. Their forwards, especially **Phillips**, were holding front position well and were proving dangerous. But for poor kicking they should have led by a greater margin at ¼ time.

At the 1st break **Old Melburnians** with only a solitary point on the board had to dig deep, regroup, use the breeze effectively and get back into the game. **Webb** and **Jeremy Nichols** began to win plenty of possessions in the midfield and get the ball forward. **Scott Teal** showed great courage to mark and goal and **Old Melburnians** through sheer effort and hard work began to get back into the game. Late in the quarter **Nichols** missed a set shot whilst at the other end of the ground **Balaszy** (who had earlier in the quarter played a strong role in defence) kicked a freakish goal off the ground to put his side 5 points up at the main break. The game was evenly poised now and after their fine 2nd quarter **OMs** must have felt they would be a real chance if they could limit **Old Trinity's** scoring opportunities. I am sure **Alan Johnson** would have

been urging his players to establish a lead of about 18 points by ¾ time, which would be enough in the conditions to hold out **Old Melburnians**.

**Paul O'Brien** had already set a fine example for his side and was to continue in this vein for the rest of the day. He constantly put himself into the fray to force the ball forward during the quarter. **Old Melburnians** defended well during the quarter but despite seeking out the dangerous **Scott Teal** they failed to convert. **Old Trinity** on the other hand were able to score and build on their lead and their 2 goals 2 points to 1 point would build the very lead they had hoped for at ¾ time.

Three significant highlights of this quarter were decisive factors in determining the result in my opinion.

*Firstly*, **Johnson's** use of **O'Shaughnessy** in defence was a great move. **David O'Shaughnessy** constantly threw himself at the ball and either limited his opponents opportunities or tapped the ball out to his team mates. Although a 'veteran' his ability to find and hold good body position and do the hard things was outstanding.

*Secondly*, the use from defence of **Hudson** proved significant (as it would all day). His length would often put **Old Trinity** into attack and his kicking of the heavy ball proved both penetrating and more importantly accurate – finding targets on the far wing often.

*Finally*, a classic shepherd by **Richard Beardsley** on the grandstand wing that allowed his brother **Nick** the opportunity to find space and penetrate the **Old Melburnians** defence and find **Phillips** who then shared the ball well to find **Heath** for a goal was telling. Along with **Balaszy's** earlier goal this effort would seal the issue in many ways.

Significantly it was also the fact that **Old Trinity** had numerous options up forward in **Phillips**, **Heath**, **Makris** whilst **Old Melburnians** could only hope **Scott Teal** would mark the heavy ball – he was their lone key forward option. Furthermore the **Beardsley** shepherd highlighted the importance of protecting the ball carrier; something that **Old Melburnians** had rarely done all day. Also **Old Melburnians'** players often fell into the trap of turning back into play; a ploy which in heavy conditions would prove fruitless and cause turnovers.

At ¾ time **Old Melburnians** were still a real chance and they came out firing again – refusing to give in. An early goal gave them renewed enthusiasm and found the ball in their front half for much of the quarter. Again, **Johnson** pulled a great move and put the tireless working **O'Shaughnessy** on the ball. A freakish snap by this player just missed the mark during the quarter but he was great value to his side providing a steadying influence at the point of play – often controlling the play and giving directions that enabled his side to eventually win the game. A perfect example of such direction came when a clearing kick by **Old Trinity** changed play from the grandstand half forward flank (in **Trinity's** defensive one) to the far wing and eventually out of bounds – changing the pattern of play, clearing the ball and wasting valuable time in the process. **Old Melburnians** had persisted all day and their lack of forward options; failure to convert opportunities up forward and lack of

bulk were all telling. Both sides deserve full credit for an enormous effort that saw the game in the balance for most of the day. **Old Trinity** live on and **Old Melburnians** whilst remaining in B Section can look to 93 with a positive outlook. Many of their younger brigade will benefit from their experiences of the past two weeks and I would expect them to be one of the power sides of B Grade next year.

### GRAND FINAL PREVIEW

**Old Trinity** now face **Old Brighton** in the Grand Final having finally achieved their aim of A Grade. In many ways the game will be a battle of the forward lines. Whether **Hudson** or **Richard Beardsley** can contain the exciting **Tom Hayden** will be of interest as **Hayden** in many ways is the key to this game. On the other hand **Old Brighton** must work to contain **Heath, Phillips** and **Makris**, all capable forwards and goal kickers. The battle between **Andrew Pryor** and **Trevor Norman** will be another highlight (I hope they are allowed to play their natural games!). Both are wonderfully skilled players who create and provide plenty of opportunities for their team mates. The battle between the two 'strongmen' of each side **Turner** and **Richarby** will be of interest too. **Richarby's** marking around the ground has been a real feature of his play lately and **Turner** is a real work horse.

I believe **Old Brighton** will win this game because of three factors:

1. Their tackling and the pressure they will apply will limit **Old Trinity's** ability to feed their forwards effectively.

2. They are a team that share the ball and run in numbers. On the wide expanses of Elsternwick Park this will prove telling against **Old Trinity** who after a tough campaign in hard conditions will probably tire.

3. **Old Brighton** have a better marking team with the dangerous **Nick Perry** being just one example.

Well done to both teams on making the big one - I'm sure they will give their all to win the Premiership. Congratulations to both coaches who have done a fine job. **Alan Johnson**, who has been able to re-focus his team after last year's disappointment and **Mark Parker** who has built a team from midfield performers in B Grade in 91 to the power team of B Grade in 92. I wish all concerned good luck

## COACHES CLIPBOARD

In this, the final edition of Coaches Clipboard for 1992 it seems appropriate to make a report on the VAFA Sub-group of the Australian Football Coaches Association, which was formed in March of last season for the first time. VAFA Coaches at that March Coaches night supported the proposal that we should establish our own sub-group of the AFCA and elected Craig Jackson (Commonwealth Bank) as Secretary and the following committee members: Gary Connolly (St Marys), Ken Bremner (Comm. Bank), John Simpson (Banyule), John Keenan (Thomastown) and Simon Meehan (Old Haileybury). I was elected President in the inaugural year.

Throughout the year the group promoted the concept that all VAFA coaches should become members of the AFCA as a way to provide general support for amateur coaches and to 'share the

knowledge' about this great game that we love and participate in. By offering nights such as having Allan Jeans as a Guest Speaker we believe it would be possible to further develop coaches' knowledge about coaching and at the same time help to promote a good working relationship between VAFA coaches at all levels.

Furthermore, the committee decided that this regular column in the Amateur Footballer should be contributed to by members of the committee as well as any other articles that were relevant. I would like to thank all the committee members and the other contributors for their efforts in providing some thought-provoking articles throughout the season. It is not easy to attend to the multitude of coaching responsibilities and still find time to compose a lucid article that may have some general appeal to readers of the Amateur Footballer. ## COMPULSORY LEVEL 1 FOR ALL SENIOR COACHES

From 1993 **ALL** Senior Coaches in the VAFA must have at least LEVEL 1 ACCREDITATION and from 1994 the same situation will extend to Assistant and Reserve Coaches. Also, **ALL** Under 19 Coaches must continue to have Level 1 Accreditation as has been the case for the past 3 years.

This decision was made at the VAFA Executive Seminar last November and this directive was sent to ALL VAFA Club Secretaries in December in the Christmas memo.

Therefore there will be a big demand for Level 1 Courses before next season. A course is available on Sat/Sun 17th-18th October, 1992 at the Royal Melbourne Showgrounds. Application forms are available from VAFA Headquarters by ringing 531 8333. GET IN EARLY.

## VAFA COACH OF THE YEAR

At a recent Committee Meeting of the VAFA Coaches Association it was decided to make available an award to the VAFA Coach of the Year.

This will become an annual presentation to the VAFA's most outstanding coach. The VAFA/AFCA Committee will select the winner from the 188 current Coaches from 73 Amateur Clubs.

The recipient will also be entered into the 'Australian Football Coaches Association' Coach of the Year Award presented in November.

The presentation of the 1992 VAFA Coach of the Year is to be made at the VAFA Gala Grand Final Breakfast. The breakfast is being held on Sunday 20th September between 8am and 11am at the Prahran Town Hall.

The Coaches Association encourages all Amateur Coaches to attend the Gala Breakfast. The normal inclusive cost is \$50 (includes entry to the VAFA A Section Grand Final). To reward Amateur Coaches the Coaches Association will subsidise all VAFA/AFCA members \$10.

the response to these articles has been positive and a few readers have taken the time to convey a written comment to the sub-group.

The committee met at the end of last year and discussed a number of rules concerning both the game itself and the external procedures that impact upon the game and coaching within the VAFA. Recommendations from this meeting were forwarded to the VAFA Executive for consideration at their Annual Seminar.

From this initiative came the reduction of the 50 metre penalty to 25 metres and the removal of the line across the centre circle. Both these moves have been generally applauded by VAFA Coaches and players.

The VAFA Executive decided at the 1991 Executive Seminar that considering the success of the VAFA-AFCA sub-group it would be a forward move to have all VAFA Senior, Reserve and Under 19 Coaches become financial members of the Australian Football Coaches Association for the 1992 season onwards. Therefore all clubs were debited at \$12 per coach and this Membership forwarded to the sub-group who in turn, would arrange for payment and details of each coach to be supplied to the AFCA central body at AFL House.

Benefits include:

- Four 'Coaching Update' magazines per year.
- One Fosters game admission (not finals).
- One AFL game admission of choice (first 6 rounds).
- Access to all coach education courses.
- Free admission to Seminars.

Craig Jackson had the unenviable task of collecting from each VAFA Club the name, address, phone number and team for each of the coaches. This was to enable each coach's name to be placed on the central computer at the AFCA for the mailing out of the 'Coaching Update' Magazine. Forms were distributed to each club that would have required no more than 5 minutes to complete the appropriate details. Despite this, Craig was forced to have to make a number of phone calls and to fax out numerous sets of duplicate forms as many were mislaid by coaches or secretaries. The task itself for Craig developed into an ongoing struggle with a small number of clubs being far less than co-operative.

By the end of the season 12 Clubs still remain to provide this basic information on their coaches.

It is interesting to note that only one team of those still to provide the information finished higher than 8th position on the ladder in their respective Section.

It is arrant nonsense that any coach is so knowledgeable about the game that he would not derive significant benefit from reading articles on such relevant topics as Team Building Principles; Tactics for an Open Forward Line; Discipline - the Key to Success; Umpiring Makes Progress; Learning to Read the Play; Psyching-up; Stretching - What does it mean? These are just some of the articles that are included in the August 'Coaches Update'. The four Magazines per year alone are surely worth the \$12 Membership fee in terms of being excellent coaching resources. Yet, at least one official objected to the decision of the VAFA Executive regarding compulsory membership as he suggest it was a form of compulsory 'unionism???'.

The AFCA is now a fully recognised body throughout Australia devoted to improving the level of expertise of coaches at all levels in this game. Its President is Allan Jeans and its Executive Officer is Rod Austin, both of whom have coached senior football at the AFL level. To have men of this calibre committed to assisting other coaches from all levels to improve their knowledge and understanding of coaching and the game itself clearly shows the value of this organisation, its publications and the various coaching courses that it has been able to organise for coaches to gain National Accreditation.

As President of the VAFA-AFCA I can only commend this move by the VAFA Executive as a very positive step towards enhancing the level of coaching that we have in Amateur football and if you are a coach of any VAFA team for the 1993 season and fail to see the value of a \$12 Membership then I guess I can only envy you for being confident enough to know all there is to know.

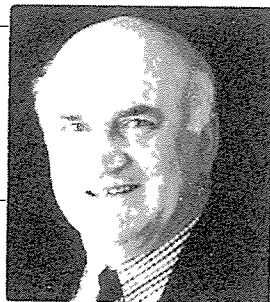

## Looking Back by Noel Rundle



### 5 YEARS AGO – 1987

**Ormond** were happy when the Tribunal found the charge against champion utility player **Phil Mehrtén** not sustained.

'A' Section reporter **Ross Booth** and VAFA General Manager **Peter French** were at it yet again. **Ross** took two lines and picked **Old Xaverians**, **Peter French** equivocated for two pages and then summed up 'their aerial strength, pace, memories of losing last year's Grand Final, confidence and efforts against **Ormond** during the season entitled them to favouritism in what promised to be a most memorable A Section Grand Final – **Old Xaverians** for me'.

A very big crowd, sun, little breeze, jazz, children's rides – it was a magnificent day.

**Old Xaverians** through **Martin Beattie** and **Peter Curtin** were in control and led 4.4 to 2.2. From then on **Ormond** through the dominance of rovers **Cox** and **Young**, the very aggressive centre play of **Phil Mehrtén**, the great defence of **Scott Taylor**, and with **Paul Nankervis** showing maturity on the wing, took control and in the final three terms kicked 13.9 to 8.8 to win 15.11 to 12.12. **Xavs**, fought back to within 11 points before **Steve McCooke** settled the issue 'Maradonna style' with an angle kick off the ground.

It was the second A Section flag for coach **Mike McArthur-Allen** in three years.

**Marcellin** took all the sting out of **Therry** in the 'B' Section preliminary final when they kicked 8.8 to 1.2 in the first term and won 21.1 to 7.12. Best were **Petroff**, **L. Getson**, **J. Amad**, **Ebert**, **P. Sheehan**, **M. Day**.

And so on the Sunday after the VFL Grand Final in blistering heat **Marcellin** faced up to **St Bernards**, the final scores being **St Bernards** 19.10(124), **Marcellin** 12.20(92).

Life Member of the VAFAUA and former president, **Don Hillier**, retired as a goal umpire with 520 games behind him, 14 A Section Grand Finals, interstate and intra state matches. Well done, **Don**, a man universally respected and admired.

### 10 YEARS AGO – 1982

#### **60 YEARS AGO – 1932**

**Old Scotch Collegians** won its second successive 'A' Section premiership when it defeated **State Savings Bank** by 28 points in a brilliant game at Elsternwick Park before a crowd of 2500.

**Old Scotch** played a brilliant second term to lead 6.12 to 3.5 at half time. **Bank** were not done with as they kicked 5 goals straight in the third term to trail 8.5 to 7.16. They were unlucky at that stage to lose their centreman, **Robertson**, 'A' Section best and fairest for the season, and centre half back, **Coutts**, with an injured shoulder. **Davidson (Old Scotch)** went into the ruck at this stage and dominated the last quarter. **Pearson (Old Scotch)** kicked 4 goals to take his tally to 126 and **Chandler (S.S. Bank)** kicked 3 to make the century.

The Lieutenant-Governor, **Sir William Irvine**, presided at the Association's dinner in the Melbourne Town Hall to honour **Mr L.A. Adamson's** presidency over the last 40 years as he was retiring from the position. (Our historian, **Joseph Johnson**, has shown this was a misconception as **Adamson** did not become president until 1896 – **N.R.**.)

They liked speeches in those days. The toast was proposed by **Mr W.A. Watt** and supported by **Mr R.R. Sholl**. **Mr L.A. Adamson** replied. **Mr E.W. O'Fee** (Vice-President) proposed the toast to 'Kindred Associations'. There were four replies: **Mr C.M. Hickey** (Australian Football Council), **Mr R.P. Franklin** (Associated Public

Schools), **Dr Alex Robertson** (Aust. Cricket Board of Control) and **Mr H.R. Weir** (Victorian Amateur Athletic Association).

**Sir William Irvine** presented premiership cups and pennants for the season, and cups for the best and fairest player in each section as follows:

The **L.A. Adamson Cup** (perpetual) and **Baron Marks Cup** (to be won three times), the A Section premiership, **Old Scotch Collegians**; the **Bartley Challenge Shield** to the B Section premiers, **Brunswick**; the C Section pennant to the premiers, **Canterbury-United**; and the D Section pennant to the premiers, **West Brunswick**. The best and fairest cups were presented to: A Section **D. Robertson (State Savings Bank)**; B Section, **T. du Bourg (Teacher's College)**; C Section, **N. Honey (Kingsville)**; D Section, **D. Paroissien (Old Brighton)**.

#### **100 YEARS AGO – 1892**

During the 18 game season, **Collegians** lost two games. Their scribe stated 'on each of the occasions mentioned the foreign ground and the weather were against the team'. He slammed **St Jude's** 'their ground and arrangements are of such a nature that it will be next to a miracle if they are ever defeated on it'.

The struggle for the premiership was essentially between **Collegians**, **Alberton** and **St Jude's**. The return match with **St Jude's** on the Warehousemen's Ground (now the Albert Ground) was drawn because only goals counted. The scores were 3.13 to 3.1, and **Collegians** claimed a moral victory with 16 to 4 scoring shots.

The final between **Collegians** and **Alberton** took place on the Toorak-Grosvenor Ground, attracting a large crowd. 'Really good football' by both sides resulted in a premiership to **Collegians**, 12.7 to 5.7.

The captain of the team was **H.D. 'Grip Johson'**, a wonderful rover. Other stars were **Catford**, **Waugh**, **Boileau**, **Ochiltree**, **O'Donnel** and **Morrow**.
