## WHAT CONSTITUTES AN AMATEUR? **DO YOU KNOW?**

This article appeared in the Tasmanian Amateur Football League Programme a few weeks back and is published here as a matter of general interest, as it applies just as much in Victoria as in the Apple Isle.

This Editorial was published in the issue of July 27th, 1968. It is re-printed as a matter of general interest as the same position applies today.

#### WHAT CONSTITUTES AN AMATEUR?

Do you know? In this changing world of values, does anyone know? The definition of interpretation in the various languages of the world seems to be as far apart as the poles.

Amateur in England seems to have one meaning; in Russia another interpretation; U.S.A., Australia, and so on, vary in some manner.

Would an amateur tennis player who has competed on the annual circuit overseas, be registered as an amateur footballer?

If not, how would he be reinstated? According to the rules of the A.A.F.C., tennis would have to reinstate him before a member could consider an application. Tennis could not do so, as according to them he is an amateur

Technically, is any person an amateur, or are there degrees of professionalism?

Rule 19 (2) (d) of the A.A.F.C.— Loss of Status—reads: "Wagering or being in any way interested in a staked bet or wager made in connection with any amateur athletic competition."

Now how many players have not at some time or another bet on the result of a game or a kick, perhaps only five cents, more likely 20 cents? When in the mood \$1 would be put up. Does such a bet violate this rule?

AMATEUR STATUS is defined as: "No player shall be permitted to take part in any match played under the

control of the Council or of any Member or affiliated Association unless he is an amateur according to the Council's definition. be

All amateur football registrations carry the following definition: "An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize, staked bet or declared wager, or who has not knowingly or without protest competed with or against a professional for a prize of any description or for public exhibition, or who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the practice of any athletic exercise as a means of livelihood or pecuniary gain."

And players applying for registration make a statutory declaration to the effect that they are amateurs in accordance with this definition. A false declaration renders a person liable to prosecution for wilful and corrupt perjury.

Now, it is a well-known fact that players with senior clubs, for instance, V.F.L., T.F.L., N.T.F.A., etc. may be paid. The T.F.L. rules state this fact, also included is "Particulars of traveling and incidental expenses for players in each club shall be submitted to the League (T.F.L.) for approval."

Players applying for registration with the Southern Division have to state with whom they have played previously. Should a League club or club of similar standing be named, a financial clearance from such club or clubs is required.

Now these financial clearances either state that the player has not

received any money or has been paid travelling expenses.

The Amateur Rules state — Loss of Status — "Accepting or receiving any money or pecuniary gain through taking part in any athletic event other than for travelling, hotel and medical expenses, actually incurred through the event in question."

The whole crux of this rule is "actually incurred".

In view of the fact that a player has taken a Statutory Declaration and a financial clearance has been given by the Secretary of a League Club, the Registration Committee seem to be within their rights in approving such registrations.

But are they?

Take three hypothetical cases: — A player lives 25 miles from Hobart and works in the country. He attends training two nights a week and plays on Saturdays. To appear at the ground in each case he uses his own car.

Does he claim expenses each week or, say, accept \$80 at the end of the season, having played 20 games?

Everyone knows you cannot run a car on nothing and even allowing 10 cents a mile, he is out of pocket by some \$20, or are actual expenses only petrol and oil, in which case he would be \$20 in pocket.

Player B lives within the city area, which is fed by regular bus services. He also has a car, but under no stretch of imagination can his car usage or bus fares be any appreciable amount. He collects the same amount as player A and has made a profit, outwardly anyway.

Player C, a city resident, same position as player B, accepts a trophy in lieu of cash.

It will be said that other expenses have to be met—equipment to permit him to play, boots, etc., but such expenses cannot be considered. They are normal, which are paid by anyone equipping himself to play a sport.

Is player A eligible for registration as an amateur footballer? Obviously player B is not, and player C is in the clear.

What constitutes an amateur? Do you know? Doubt it very much.

Recently a Melbourne newspaper quoted a case of a registered amateur player who subsequently played cricket in Victoria, and more or less said the player had been crucified by the V.A.F.A., as a number of applications for reinstatement had been turned down.

The player concerned discussed the position with the officials of the V.A.F.A. BEFORE going on the Interstate cricket tour, which allowed \$6 per day expenses over and above accommodation and travelling, which were met by the V.C.A.

He was told actual expenses could be accepted, which should be listed; anything more and he would NOT be eligible to play in the V.A.F.A.

This player, therefore, went away knowing the position, but the V.A.F.A. cannot be blamed for him accepting the flat rate of \$6 per day.

He stated he could not afford not to accept the full amount. Don't we all in life think we would like this or that and have to go without because we cannot afford it? A personal decision and the consequences have to be accepted.

Is sport any different? It is a well-known fact that Tasmanian players selected for interstate teams have to make themselves unavailable because they cannot afford the cost involved.

There are very few State amateur teams which compete on the mainland, where the participants have not contributed 50 per cent. of the cost, perhaps more.

The last two paragraphs apply equally to Victorian amateur players and their participation in Interstate matches.—Ed,

#### IMPORTANT NOTES

#### CONCERNING PERMITS AND RE-REGISTRATIONS

Club Secretaries are reminded that all applicants for permits who have played with League or Association first or second XVIIIs and certain Country Leagues must appear before the Permit Committee.

The Club Secretary should ring the Chairman of the Permit Committee, Mr. F. H. Coldrey, at 92-4797, to ascertain the date and place of Permit

Committee meetings.

While on the subject of permits, it might be as well to remind club officials that they should check all permit forms before lodging them with the V.A.F.A., to ensure that they are fully completed and in order.

Any form which is not complete will be returned to the club concerned. Similarly, any form marked X indicating where the player should sign will

also be returned.

If an applicant for a permit has not played with any club previously, he should write NIL in the space provided.

All applications for permits must be submitted on forms which provide for the applicant to complete a statutory declaration as to his amateur status.

Applications for permits must be in the hands of the Records Secretary of the Association, by WEDNESDAY, otherwise they will not be dealt with

until the following week.

Clubs with Junior teams are advised to register players who are eligible for the Juniors on a Junior permit form. These players will then be automatically registered and eligible to play with the Seniors and Reserves.

CAPTAINS, VICE-CAPTAINS Clubs whose Team Lists do not show the Captain and Vice-Captain should furnish this information, so that the next issue will be complete.

#### RE-REGISTRATIONS

Re-registration of players should be made on the appropriate form duly completed and signed by the player, or alternatively, lists of players to be re-registered may be submitted in DUPLICATE and in alphabetical order players' names. Addresses players must also be included, together with telephone numbers if available.

Lists must be on club letterheads and signed by the Club Secretary.

Any list not complying with this requirement will be returned for correction or completion.

Re-registration of players in the Junior Section must be on the appropriate form, duly completed and

signed by the player.

The slip at the foot of permit forms and re-registration forms, which is detached and returned to the club Secretary on granting of the permit (or re-registration) must be completed before the form is lodged.

Permit forms and re-registration forms must be completed and signed in INK: forms filled out in pencil are

not acceptable.

ALL NEW PERMITS AND RE-REGISTRATIONS are to be forwarded to the RECORDS SECRETARY, Mr. Bruce DeLacy, 67 Charman Road, Mentone, 3194 (phone 93-3977). All enquiries regarding the granting of permits or re-registrations must be made to Mr. DeLacy. Enquiries on Saturday mornings should be made not later than 10 a.m.

#### AT ELSTERNWICK PARK ADMISSION TICKETS

Admission tickets issued to clubs for matches at Elsternwick Park are for the use of players and officials only. Any player who cannot produce a ticket will be required to pay for admittance.

#### CAR PARKING

Drivers who are not willing to park cars as directed at Elsternwick Park, will be refused admittance to the ground.

#### **SCOREBOARD**

Clubs are advised that the Scoring Board at Elsternwick Park must be operated by responsible club officials at all times.

Children must not be allowed in the Scoring Board.

#### CORRECT SCORES ESSENTIAL

Clubs are reminded that correct scores must be phoned to the Herald office, otherwise a fine (one dollar) will be incurred.

And remember, too, that scores are incomplete without the points — offending clubs will be fined.

#### RESULTS OF MATCHES

Results of amateur matches are broadcast in the Sporting Sessions of Radio Stations 3LO, (commencing at 6.20 p.m.) 3DB and 3KZ (included in 7 p.m. News) each Saturday evening and from Television Channels ABV-2 and HSV-7. Repeat on 3KZ 9.30 a.m. Sunday.

Channel 2 also provides quarter-byquarter scores of A Section matches each Saturday afternoon.

#### SECTION - PLEASE

Press Correspondents are requested to comply with ALL INSTRUCTIONS in the Notes to Press Correspondents issued to all clubs prior to the Season—including—CLUB NAME and SECTION on every envelope forwarded to The Amateur Footballer.

## TIMEKEEPERS' INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING "TIME-ON"

"Time-on" must be added (1) when signalled by the Field Umpire and (2) when a goal or behind has been scored. In the case of a goal, take the time from the waving of the flags by the Goal Umpire to the bouncing of the ball in the centre by the Field Umpire and, in the case of a behind, take the time from the waving of the flag to the kick-off.

#### TRIBUNAL MEETINGS

Meetings of the Independent Tribunal will again be held at the offices of the St. Kilda Cricket Club (First Floor of Cricket Club Stand), St. Kilda Cricket Ground, on the Tuesday following the report, commencing at 7.30 n.m. sharp.

Club officials are especially reminded that the only notification they will receive concerning players reported or witnesses required in connection with a report, will be from the umpire

on the day of the match.

Any player or witness who fails to appear before the Tribunal at the appointed time is liable to be suspended during the pleasure of the Tribunal.

#### **DUTIES OF RUNNERS**

The duty of an Official Runner is to carry messages from the coach to players and NOT to engage in altercations with players. The runner, in carrying such messages, must take the shortest possible route to the player concerned, and leave the field immediately after delivering the message.

#### LITTLE THINGS ALL SHOULD KNOW

1. The lines in front of goal posts are known as the kick-off lines, not the goal square.

2. Time added, is time on, not time off.

3. All clear is the signal, given to the goal umpire — by the field umpire — indicating that the goal umpire is at liberty to decide whether a goal or behind should be recorded.

4. Goal umpires are the sole judges

of scores.

5. The ball must be completely over the scoring or boundary line, before a goal or behind is scored, or the ball is out of bounds.

6. When the ball is kicked out of bounds on the full — the player receiving the free kick may bring the ball into play — either by kicking or by hand ball.




