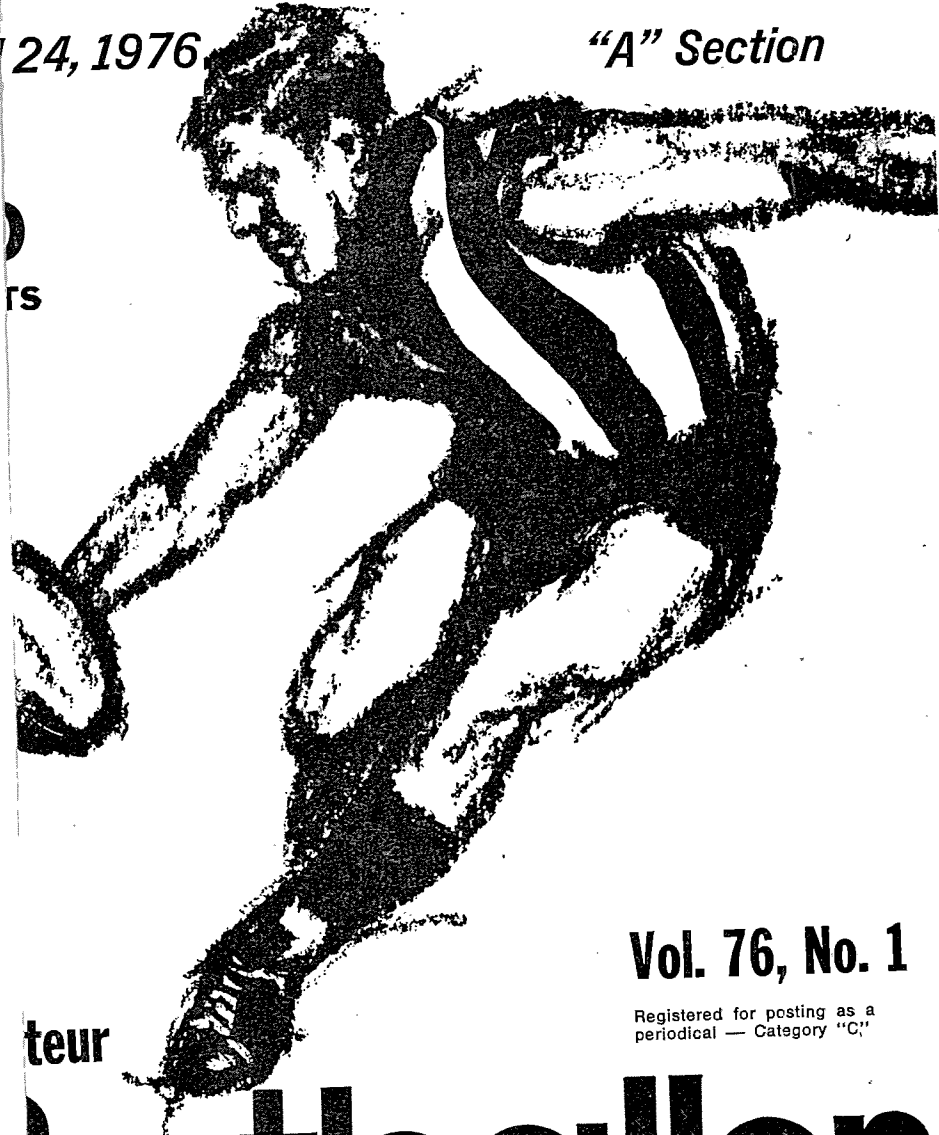

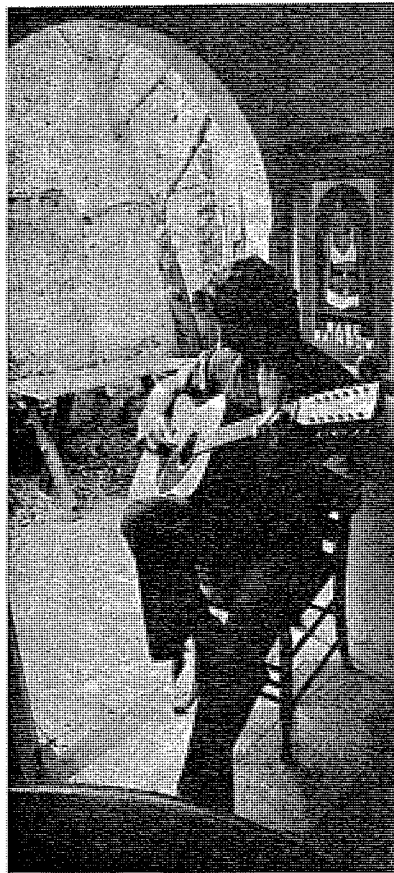

This will be brought about by the self discipline generated from within each and every individual, from within every team and club, and certainly by the insistence of our tried and proven code of ethics.

1975 is now behind us, and we look forward to 1976 with renewed vigor and enthusiasm, and a deep knowledge, that what we did in 1975 as an Association (for we do act as an Association, which of course means that we are judged by the poorest, not the best), was not a true reflection of our capabilities nor our ideals.

Great improvements must be achieved in all forms of administration, club management and player participation in 1976, if 1975 is to be used as a measuring “stick”, which of course it must.

I will not go through the trauma of itemizing the serious and unwanted actions as to the behavioural pattern that existed in the V.A.F.A. during the 1975 season beyond saying, that 1976, will be different.

It will be different because the accepted pattern of behaviour, established in this Association in 1892, the year of its “birth” will be insisted upon, and players, officials and clubs who are not prepared to accept these concepts of what Amateur Football is all about, will promptly be removed from the membership of the V.A.F.A.

This should have been quite evident to all members, by what took place

towards the close of the 1975 season, and what has been planned for 1976, of which several clubs have already been directly advised.

As a club member or a club secretary, it is your responsibility to ensure that your club, its players, spectators as well as officials, are all advised that what was accepted, even in part in 1975 will NOT be the standard required in 1976.

Each and every club MUST play its part in maintaining our standards, and 1976, WILL be a year, when players, officials and spectators will once again be proud to be part of an Association, that has since its inception established itself as the “place to play Australian Football,” where the best interests of the player and the welfare of all members, officials and supporters is the accepted standard, and to put it quite plainly, where the “rough neck” is NOT wanted.

You'll notice that none of the gentlemen concerned will be writing about his own club, to alleviate any suggestion of bias, favoritism, prejudice, embarrassment, frustration and so on.

There is however, a slight exception to this set-up in the case of Jim Fidge, who may have a soft spot for State Savings Bank, considering that's where his salary comes from.

As these arrangements were made at very short notice, it was impracticable to obtain the comments of those assigned to B Section and the Junior Sections this week, so these have been done by the Editor.

Here are this week's comments —

A SECTION

First rounds usually produce some strange results and the effects of recruiting and retirements are difficult to gauge, but here goes anyway.

Old Trinity to beat Uni. Blues on the basis that the students usually take a few weeks to settle down, although the old "Salter magic" will make it a close one.

Gus Mitchell pulled off a premiership last season for St. Bernard's and they showed account for State Coach Peter O'Donohue's Uni. Blacks who are known to be missing some champions from 1975.

North Old Boys are always trained to the minute and should account for Monash Blues with the aid of their home ground advantage.

Coburg and Reservoir O.B. should turn on a thriller and the match could go either way with ruck duels being the highlight. I lean to R.O.B.'s who badly want that first A Grade Pennant.

Ormond will be eager for a first up win for their new coach Ian Cameron. De La Salle had a great season last year but could get an early shock. "De La" minus Peter Murnane equals Ormond for me. — Alf Keam.

B SECTION

Melbourne High, runners-up in C Section last season, are at home to Ivanhoe, who were beaten by Caulfield Grammarians in the First Semi-final.

High face a tough hurdle first up and Ivanhoe look the winners to me.

Geelong had a lean season in the top grade in 1975 and will be keen to start with a win. They visit Collegians who I'm selecting to win.

Marcellin and Old Scotch should produce an even game, with Marcellin likely to be just in front at the final siren.

Old Paradians were unlucky to be relegated after winning seven games in A Section. Their opponents, Old Carey, won seven in B Section, and that points to Parade landing the bacon.

St. Kilda CBC, C Section premiers, are at home to Caulfield Grammar, who were third. I'm going for Caulfield on the score of experience. — George McTaggart.

C SECTION

Although **Old Melburnians** have recruited well, **Old Haileybury's** experience in "B" Section should allow them to win by a narrow margin.

Parkside and **Alphington** should be a close contest with **Parkside** making use of the Home Ground advantage.

Hampton Rovers, fresh up from "D" Grade will be out to show their prowess in the higher Section and look too good for **Power House**.

Kew haven't taken relegation too lightly and are very hard to beat on their sloping ground, as **Old Ivanhoe** will surely find.

Fawkner, "D" Section Premiers, should outplay **U.H.S.O.B.** in their debut in "C" Section, but **Uni.** High's ruck strength will provide good opposition. — **Alec. Johnson.**

D SECTION

AJAX SET FOR WIN

An interesting opening round in "D" Section should take place today with new teams to the section, **AJAX** and **Old Brighton**, likely to provide the main clash in the round.

Ajax, out of "E" Section at last, will be keener than ever today and equally keen will be their opponents who will be anxious to re-establish themselves following relegation.

Scores are expected to be close at the final siren with **Ajax** likely to benefit from the home ground advantage.

State Bank, journey to meet **Old Geelong**. Both teams have been knocking on the door for promotion in recent seasons to today they will be anxious to continue this pursuit by starting with a win.

The **Bank** appears to boast many new faces; Both teams rivalled for a place in last years finals with **Old Geelong** being the successful contender. Today, however, I'll go for the **Bank** to outlast **Old Geelong**.

Assumption were another team to miss out on the 1975 finals but at **Old Camberwell** today should prove too strong.

Brunswick may be down a section this year but I expect them to pick themselves up today by accounting for a semi-finalist of last year **Old Xaverians**. And I suggest this at the risk of earning the wrath of our Association President! This should be a tough contest between two of our longest established clubs.

It's good to see another one of our long standing clubs on the up and up. **Elsternwick** are up from "E" Section and perhaps they too can celebrate their promotion with a win over **National Bank**. Rest assured that **National** won't give it to them all their own way.

However, I believe last year's success will instil in **Elsternwick** the sparkle that is needed for a win.

E SECTION

Pity about losing the "Jackers"* and the "Wickers"* to D section but it's good to see a newer club moving up in **Heatherton**, who should win a close one against **St. Pat's**.

La Trobe Blacks to beat **North Brunswick** and **Monash Whites** for a nice afternoon (unfurl the flag and beat **Old Mentonians**). Home ground advantage only in these games.

Commonwealth Bank had a good game at **Alphington** before **Easter** and went well enough to be able to win against **A.M.P. Society**. (About time the **Bank** began to come good or the lady tellers will be looking for a game).

ANZ Bank to beat **St. Kevin's** on the latters' new ground at **Burnley** (no home ground advantage here. — **Syd Whitfield**).

*AJAX and **Elsternwick** — **Ed.**

F SECTION

Preview of "F" Sections games poses some problems, but word has it that **West Brunswick** is the side to watch this year, having recruited well and in view of this they appear to be too strong for **Glenroy**.

The **Bulleen United/St. Bede's** game should be the match of the day with the points in favour of **St. Bede's**.

Thornbury will have the edge on **Beverley Hills** but in the other two games **Footscray Tech./La Trobe Reds** and **Bulleen-Templestowe/University Reds** the decision could go either way; your scribe has therefor used the "pin" theory and come up with **Footscray** and **Bulleen-Templestowe**. — **Keith Findlay.**

JUNIOR SECTIONS

University Blues, premiers in Section 1 are at home to **North Old Boys**, who took the honours in Section 2.

Could be a close one, but the odds are in favour of the **Blues**.

Power House finished on the bottom and **University Blacks** were fifth. This should give the **Blacks** the edge.

Monash University had a poor season and unless they have improved a lot, are not likely to greatly trouble **Old Scotch**.

Ormond are usually well up amongst the leaders and may prove a shade too strong for **Hampton Rovers**, who have come up from Section 2.

Runners-up Coburg visit **Ivanhoe**, also finalists last season. Another likely close one with **Coburg** getting the nod.

A lot of unknown quantities in Section 2, with three new teams.

I'll go for **West Brunswick** to beat one of the newcomers in **Alphington** and **Reservoir Old Boys** to account for **Kew**, also making their first appearance.

St. Bernard's should be too strong for **Geelong**, and **Thomastown** are favoured against the other new side, **De La Salle**.

Caulfield Grammar and **Old Paradajans** both finished well down last season, but **Caulfield** are my pick. — **George McTaggart.**

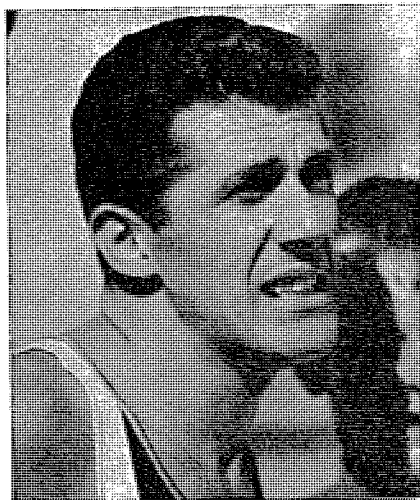
NEW RULES OF THE GAME

When a player who has taken a mark or been awarded a free kick is in the opinion of the field umpire unable to take advantage thereof through accident or the deliberate action of an opponent, the field umpire **MAY** award a free kick to the nearest player of the same team at the time the incident occurred, the kick to be taken from the same spot as where the incapacitated player would have been entitled to kick, or a position in reasonable proximity thereto, as directed by the field umpire.

NOTE:— The word in this law is "may" all other rules state the field umpire shall award a free kick — this is not so in this law.

With this first edition of the **Amateur Footballer for 1976**, we welcome back to the **V.A.F.A.** former top umpire **JOHN POSETTI** who has accepted

the position of assistant umpires' coach.



John, who umpired in our Association until late 1973, is well known and respected by officials and players as always being a very fit and strong umpire, and will be of great assistance to the umpires' coach, has his knowledge of the game and his athletic ability are first class.

With his appointment we re-print from the Amateur Footballer of June 7th, 1969 the following: "John has been good enough to umpire many finals and of course has been an automatic selection for the job of boundary umpire in interstate and grand finals when not doing the field job.

"John's running style is surely poetry in motion and he makes sprinting look so easy.

AMATEUR DEFINITION

An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize, staked bet or declared wager, or who has not knowingly or without protest competed with or against a professional for a prize of any description or for public exhibition, or who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the practice of any athletic exercise as a means of livelihood or pecuniary gain. (This definition is subject to certain exceptions set out in the rules of the Australian Amateur Football Council.)

"He can be classed as one of Victoria's top professional sprinters when you consider just a few achievements:

- "• 5 yards inside even time over 130 yards;
- "• Has run off 3¼ yards back mark at Stawell;
- "• Gift wins include — Northcote, Keilor and Epping.
- "• A member of the winning 4 record breaking team for 440 yards at Stawell in 1966;
- "• Was favorite for the Bendigo \$2,000 but unluckily broke down with a torn achilles after winning the fastest heat".

As a field umpire John umpired every Section grand final including A and B; also the 1973 Carnival on the M.C.G.

With this vast experience of umpiring and athletics his appointment will surely be an asset to umpires and to the Association.

A man very loyal to the V.A.F.A. — and a Life Member of the Umpire's Association John is married with two children — "Michael" and "Alicia".

We wish him well in his new appointment.

LOOKING BACK

5 Years Ago — 1971

Lou Zachariah succeeded Ernest F. Atkins as President while Mr. Atkins, together with two former Secretaries, Jack McCann and Geoff Moore, were elected Patrons of the Association.

Jack Fullerton, in his 20th season as Secretary of V.A.F.A., had been honoured by being elected President of the Australian Amateur Football Council.

Marcellin Old Collegians and North Brunswick joined the Association.

Well known names among the new coaches were Roger Head (Old Hail-eyburians), Kevin McLean (Old Ivanhoe), Paddy Walsh (St. Kevin's) and John Bennetti (Ivanhoe).

'A' Section umpires for the opening round were Darryl George, Don Dodds, Graeme Simpson, Norm Sharpe, and Brian Hagarty.

1970 'A' Section premiers, Caulfield Grammarians, trailed Collegians by 2 goals at ¾ time but put on 9.7 to 4 behinds in the last quarter to win easily.

Best were Atchison (5 goals), Clark and Lester for Caulfield Grammarians and Crow, Opie, and Roach (5 goals for Collegians).

After setting a club record by winning three successive best and fairest awards Mick Quinlan deserved the honour of the appointment as captain of Old Paradians.

The only team to make its debut was Army Apprentices School (based at Balcombe) who scored a big win over Tooroonga-Malvern in Junior Section 2.

President of the Umpires' Association was Pat Loy who had been a top line umpire for a number of years.

Byron Hill of State Savings Bank lined up for his nineteenth season.

10 Years Ago — 1966

For the second time in four years the Association had been forced to vacate its central ground, the latest blow being the loss of St. Kilda Cricket Ground.

The Association had used Olympic Park for five years after the 1956 Olympic Games but the introduction of a dog racing track decreased the size of the ground that it was unsuitable for Australian Football.

25 Years ago — 1951

Old Melburnians welcomed their new coach, John Mitchell. (John is 1976 President of Melbourne Football Club — Ed.).

Big news at Kew — Alf Perrin had got married and had handed over the job of captain-coach to Miles McGrail; however Alf still found time to act as secretary.

Other coaches of note were Harry Heathersaw (Commonwealth Bank) and Sam Loxton who had returned to coach Collegians after a break of a year.

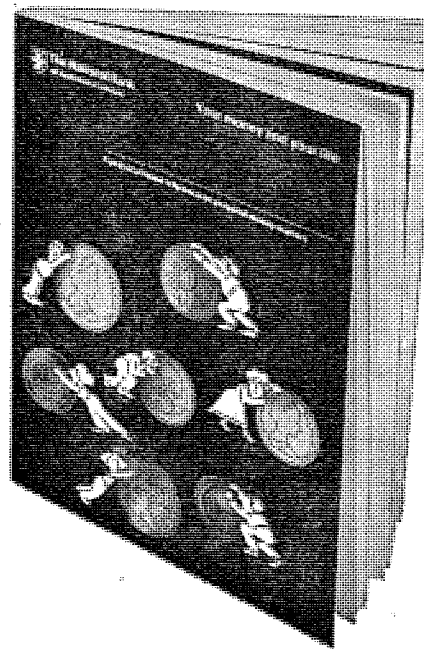

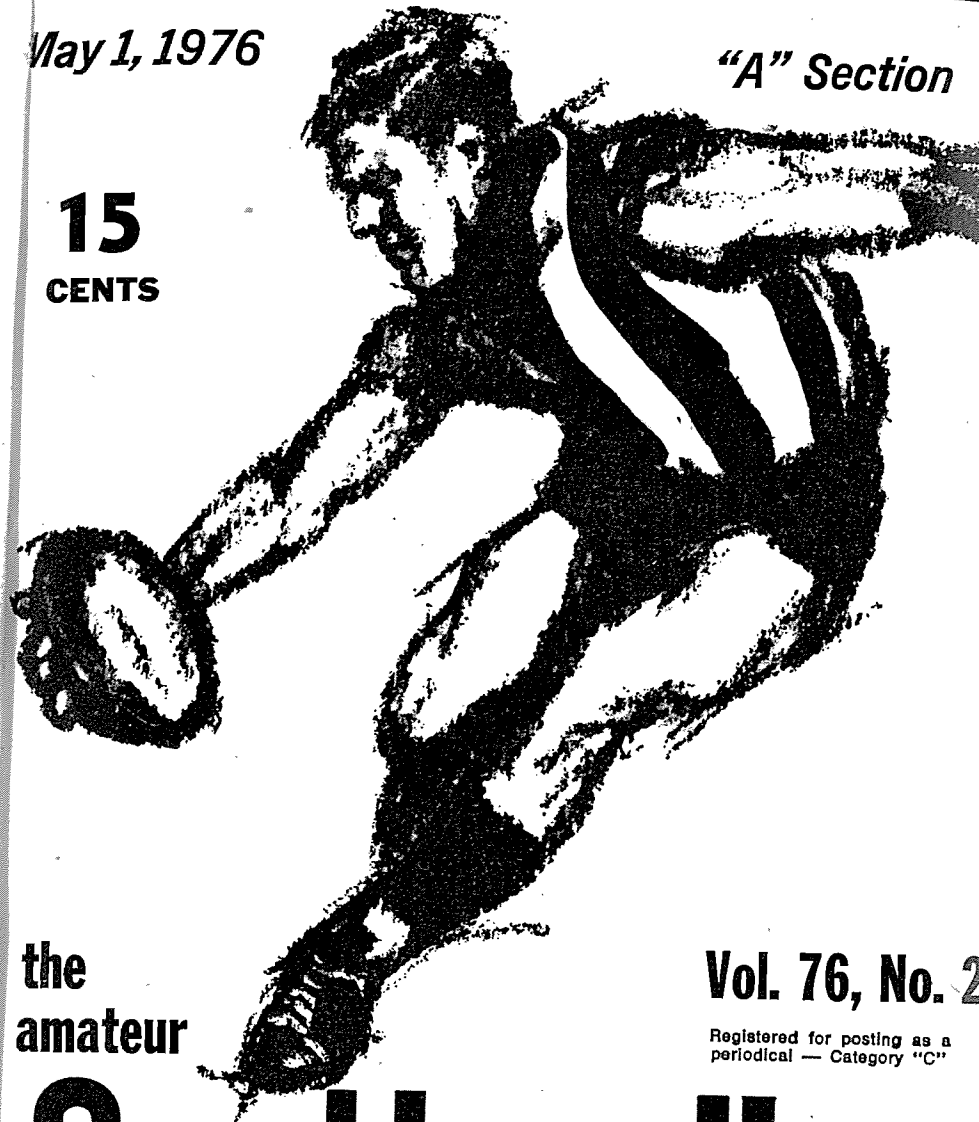
