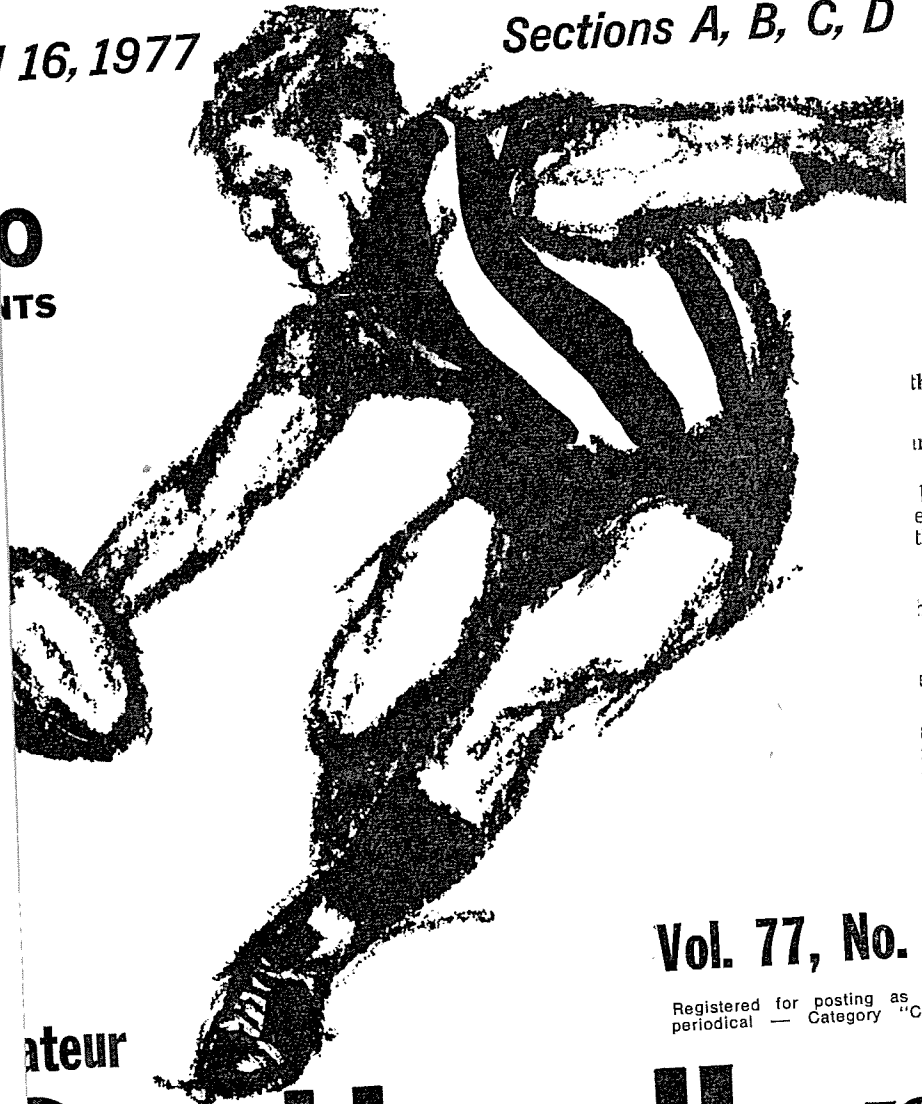

# START OF ANOTHER SEASON

(Our 85th Anniversary)

## LATE WITHDRAWALS CAUSE IRKSOME BYES

### *Free Interchange Trial*

We are all set to start season 1977, and its the 85th Anniversary of the beginning of Amateur Football, which commenced way back in 1892.

Admittedly we have been forced to suspend operations during the two World Wars, from 1916 to 1919 and again from 1940 to 1946, the 1940 season terminating midway through the season, but the Victorian Junior Amateur Football Association (the fore-runner of the Junior Section of the V.A.F.A.) continued to operate during the latter period, under somewhat adverse conditions, and we were able to keep the Amateur Football flag at least fluttering, if not flying.

Unfortunately the number of competing teams has dropped from 140 last season (14 sections of 10 teams each) to 137, with the late withdrawal of St. Pat's-Monivae O.C. from E Section, and Power House from Junior Section 1, thus creating a bye in those sections and of course E Reserve Section.

This year, we have decided to adopt on a trial basis for one season, a system of free interchange of the 20 players in the team.

The South Australian National Football League and the Australian Amateur Football Council have agreed to give the Rule a try-out.

There are some necessary restrictions however —

1. An injured player who is replaced while still on the field

will not be permitted to take any further part in the match.

2. The Umpire must be notified by the **official runner** of the intention to replace a player and the only time the Umpire may be so notified is

(a) when a goal or behind has been scored.

(b) when the ball is out of bounds and **time-on** has been signalled.

Any replacement must be made within three minutes of the Umpire being notified of the intention to make such replacement.

A replacement may also be effected at quarter-time, half-time or three-quarter-time, providing the umpire is notified.

(c) The interchange of players must take place at the same spot on the ground.

And now a general word — let's hope this season is a better and happier one than 1976, when the number of players reported (and suspended) was absolutely staggering.

Let's give the Tribunal a break, but if players do the wrong thing, they can expect no mercy from the Tribunal, for there is no place for the "rough neck" in Amateur football, and the Tribunal is determined to stamp out rough play.

## NOEL RUNDLE — TREASURER

Noel Rundle, Treasurer of the V.A.F.A. for the past 14 years, played in 15 Final matches in his playing career with Ormond and Old Geelong, although he played in a total of only 90 games.

And he was in four premierships teams too!

Noel played with Carlton Under 19 team in 1949 then switched to Ormond the following year.

He missed seasons 1951 and 1952 and resumed with Ormond in 1953. He was Captain in 1954 but at the start of the 1956 season, he transferred to Old Geelong, his old school, and was selected in the Victorian team for the Amateur Carnival that year but was forced to withdraw due to a severe hamstring injury which caused him to miss many matches.

In 1958 Noel took over as Captain



and Coach of Old Geelong but in the third match he had the misfortune to break his wrist (which was in plaster for six months) and this forced his retirement as a player.

But he was back as Coach of Old Geelong in 1961 and again in 1971 and 1972. He was also President of Old Geelong in 1961.

He was a member of Old Geelong's premierships teams in 1956 (D Section) and 1957 (C Section) and was adjudged the Best Player in the Final series in the 1957 season.

At school, Noel was renowned for his sprinting ability and held the Under 15 220 yards record at the Combined Public Schools for 14 years (he was more shapely and less bulky in those days).

Noel has been writing "Looking Back" for The Amateur Footballer since the inception of this column and admits that his association with Ormond probably accounts for the number of "mentions" they get.

He is very proud to have been a member of Ormond and to have known and been influenced by such administrators of Amateur football as the late Les and Roy Smith and "Doc" Porter.

### A SECTION

Ormond at home to last year's runners-up St. Bernard's, is a tough one to predict first up. Ormond are never easy at home but I must go for St. Bernard's.

Coburg visit the 1976 Premiers, North Old Boys, but I can't see them upsetting North.

Old Trinity and Caulfield Grammarians do battle at Elsternwick. Trinity just missed the four and Caulfield were runners-up in B Section. Another close one — I'll go for Trinity.

B Section premiers, Marcellin are at home to Alan Salter's boys University Blues. Marcellin have done remarkably well since joining the Association, but I fancy the Blues to land the bacon.

Under Laurie Aghan, Old Scotch looked world beaters early on last year and there is no doubt he'll have them firing from the first bounce. They should have too much experience for Old Haileyburians in their first B Section appearance.

Determined St. Kilda CBC make a trip out north to Reservoir and I do not see them enjoying the day. Ruckman Kevin White will find it harder than usual to control the packs as Reservoir Old Boys with their brilliant rovers should beat St. Kilda's small men for pace. It's Reservoir for me.

Ivanhoe will greatly miss the drive of Bill McWhinnie who has I believe, hung up his boots, and he will leave a gap that will not be easy filled. Geelong, coached by Ian Davis for the first time will really put the Amateur's Magpies to the test, and may scrape in narrowly with their home ground advantage. Ivanhoe's younger players will find the trip down to Geelong, the factor that tips the scales against them.

North Brunswick are home to ANZ Bank; both clubs had mediocre seasons in '76, but the Bank came home the better. Despite this, I think that N.B. at home will be able to pick up the points.

### F SECTION

## UMPIRE'S CORNER

By Alan O'Neill

We welcome new Umpires' Coach, Alan O'Neill, to this column and look forward to some interesting and informative comments from him during the season.

### RULE 18(iii)

If a player, taking his kick from outside the boundary line — after having been awarded a mark or free kick — fails to take the ball into play OR attempts to play on outside the boundary line, the ball MUST BE BROUGHT into play by the BOUNDARY UMPIRE from the spot where the original mark or free kick took place.

Note — The ball shall be deemed to be brought "into" play when any portion of it is on or above the boundary line.

### RULE 18M

Any official, runner or trainer who DELIBERATELY interferes with the ball, or a player of the opposing team, during the course of the game, SHALL cause the FIELD UMPIRE to award a free kick to the nearest player of the team offended against at the spot of the infringement, or where the ball is at the time, whichever would be the greater penalty to the offending club.

### RULE 17D

If a player unduly interferes with the bouncing of the ball by the field umpire or deliberately interferes with an umpire during the progress of the match a free kick shall be awarded to the nearest opponent.

### "WHEN DOES THE FIELD UMPIRE CALL PLAY-ON?"

The field umpire shall call "play-on" and the ball shall immediately be or remain in play in any of the following circumstances.

- A. When an umpire is struck by the ball while it is in play. This would also apply to a trainer on his way to attend or attending an injured player, or to the official runner.
- B. When the ball, having been kicked, is touched while still in transit.
- C. When the ball is caught directly from a kick of another player less than 10 metres distant.
- D. When a player who has taken a mark or been given a free kick attempts to run, handball, or kick otherwise than over his mark.

## AMATEUR DEFINITION

An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize, staked bet or declared wager, or who has not knowingly or without protest competed with or against a professional for a prize of any description or for public exhibition, or who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the practice of any athletic exercise as a means of livelihood or pecuniary gain. (This definition is subject to certain exceptions set out in the rules of the Australian Amateur Football Council.)

E. When the field umpire cancels a free kick.

The call "play-on" by the field umpire must be loud and clear and given instantly.

If a free kick has been awarded to a player the ball must be returned to that player quickly and thrown back on the full otherwise a penalty of 15 metres shall be incurred.

It is worth noting that a 15-metre penalty can be applied after the siren or bell has gone to signify the end of a quarter.

If a player is taking a kick after the bell has gone, he must kick over his mark, if he attempts to do otherwise the field umpire shall sound his whistle and the quarter is over.

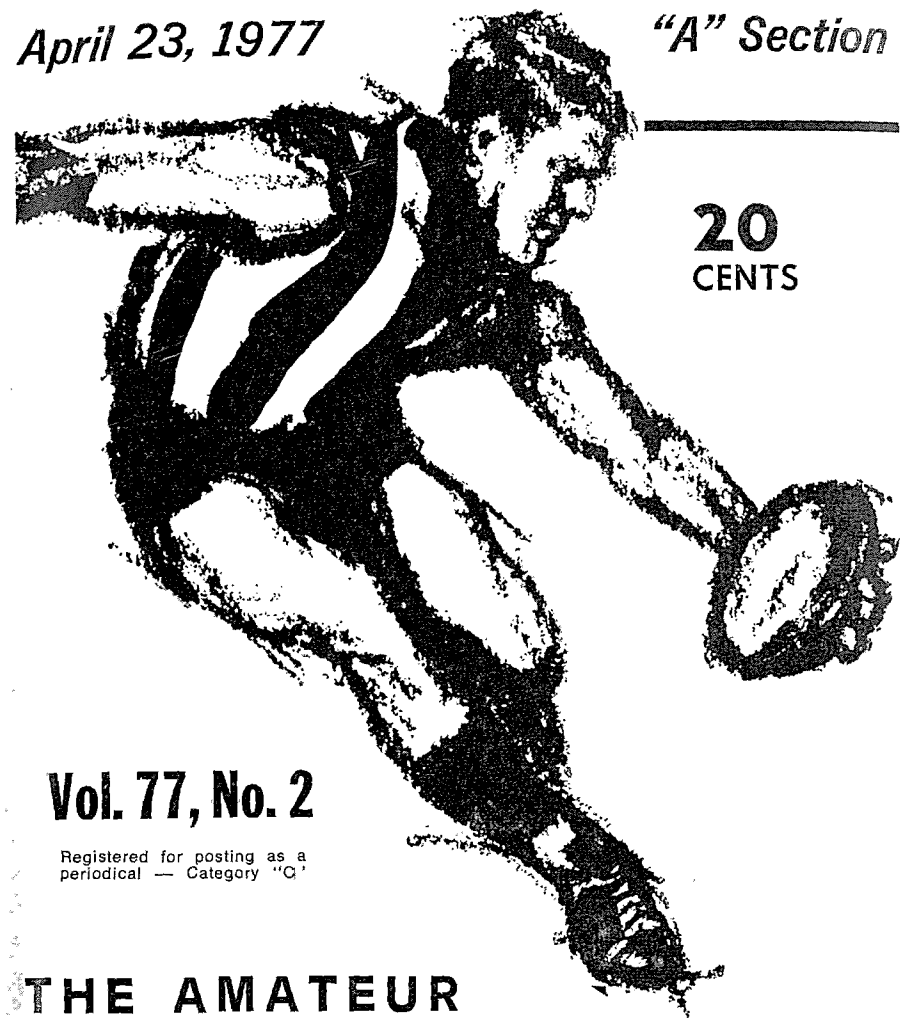
