● LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

LOW SCORING IN THE MUD "DE LA" KNOCK CAULFIELD OUT OF FOUR ORMOND GET BACK IN

The halfway mark in the home-and-home series for 1977 last Saturday will go down as one of the worst days for football for some considerable time — certainly by far the worst weather we have experienced this season.

The shocking conditions were reflected in the scores — only eight centuries being recorded — and 21 games were won with scores of 50 points or less. LaTrobe Reds Reserves won with a score of 4-6 (30 points).

But Reservoir Old Boys Juniors kicked 26-28 (184) against West Brunswick.

Caulfield Grammarians lost their place in the four when they failed to finish on against De La Salle, and Ormond's win over Coburg put them back in the top bracket.

The "De La"-Caulfield game was rather remarkable in that neither side could manage a goal in the third term, and the scores were level at half-time and again at three-quarter-time.

But De La Salle went away towards the end and won by 14 points.

Ormond forged ahead of Coburg after the interval, and had they kicked straighter, could have won by much more than 33 points.

North Old Boys were too strong for Marcellin, and four goals against the wind in the first quarter enabled St. Bernard's to easily beat University Blacks.

Monash Blues crashed again, this time to Reservoir Old Boys, and Old Melburnians were well beaten by Collegians.

Old Xaverians beat Parkside by more than 5 goals, Kew beat Hampton Rovers by a goal and Old Carey beat Melbourne High by 2 points.

State Bank toppled Alphington and Old Brighton went down badly to Elsternwick.

North Brunswick surprised West Brunswick with a 23-point win and Bulleen United failed by 3 goals

against Monash Whites. St. Bede's easily beat Thornbury and Footscray Tech. were too strong for Commonwealth Bank.

In Junior Section games, University Blues went down to Old Scotch by 2 points and the Blacks finished 28 points short of St. Bernard's.

Hampton Rovers had a close call, beating Kew by only 7 points and West Brunswick were swamped by Reservoir.

In the Reserves, Marcellin beat North Old Boys, Old Melburnians beat Collegians, Parkside overwhelmed Old Xaverians and Melbourne High failed against Old Carey.

St. Kevin's beat Old Geelong by a goal, Commonwealth Bank scraped home by 2 points from Footscray Tech. and LaTrobe Reds beat Glenroy by a goal.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

You live and learn — or perhaps with my experience of St. Bernard's over the years I should have known better!

Today's key match again features St. Bernard's — this time its Marcellin at Elsternwick Park. Marcellin's successful State team mentor in Launceston Ray Walsh and the team's captain Maurie Power are running on the crest of a wave and they know that any chance of cracking the four in that first "A" Section year, depends on success today.

I'm tempted Marcellin — but perhaps next year St. Bernard's will be just that little bit too experienced.

University Blacks disappointed last week (and it still surprises) but if "Harry" Costello, Nick Burne and Ross Booth are all on the job they will amend form today and make a real mess of a lowly "Mereditth weakened" Coburg.

Can Caulfield Grammarians upset the powerful North Old Boys? After going close to "De La" perhaps they are one of the few to rate a chance of disturbing the nearest thing we have seen to an "A" Section champion side for years.

That Caulfield depth of talent continues to impress me as does the overall evenness and consistency of the North boys.

But following the two goal loss to "De La" in conditions not suited to Caulfield, don't be surprised that if North are to be upset it could be today.

Ormond, in the hot seat, cannot afford to slip up against University Blues. Bruce Bourne, who kicked 7 out of 9 goals last week and Simon Trumble are the key players in this clash. Can Trumble nullify Bourne's influence. Perhaps, to a certain extent, but his team mates don't appear to have the same qualities to offset their Ormond counterparts.

As I have said before the Blues boast talent and it amazes me they have only managed two wins — the second half of the season may tell another story.

De La Salle with Richard Halassa and Barry Lyons near impassable defenders will give Old Trinity little opportunity to score let alone hold any chance of winning.

What is going on with Old Melburnians? One week they are premiership material, the next week a pack of no-hopers. On paper, they seem to boast more pace and marking power than St. Kilda and should avenge their first round defeat.

Geelong can look back on the last month and view it as something of a nightmare, after a very promising start.

Their opponents, Collegians, will have been spurred on by last week's big win and should overcome Geelong's home ground advantage and take the points.

Monash Blues and Old Haileyburians look to be evenly matched. I anticipate a great clash between Chris Moore and Dave Code, the result of which could decide the game, I'm leaning slightly towards Old Haileyburians.

Good old Reservoir have done it again. What have they got against me? They play host to Old Paradians who are renowned wet weather players. Although we can count on Ray Shepherd to continue his excellent form overseas in Tasmania, I feel the O.P.'s will scrape in.

The big clash of the week is no doubt Old Scotch against Ivanhoe. Both teams were convincing last round winners and have a depth of talent for their canny coaches to work on. I'm going for a wild throw and suggest that Ivanhoe can squeeze another win out of their current purple patch.

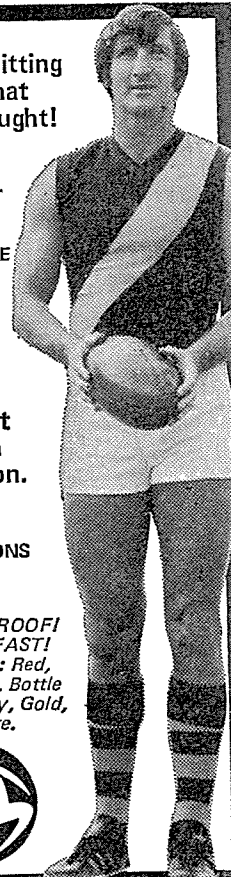

UMPIRE'S CORNER

Most players and supporters are more prone to criticise what they consider to be a poor umpiring performance, than they are to praise a good one. We must concede, however, that just as a player cannot possibly avoid the odd mediocre day, neither can an umpire.

We know from experience that our umpires do not treat their game as a means of filling in time. On the contrary, they generally apply far more time, hard work and thought in preparation for their games than do many of our players.

Members of the V.A.F.A. Umpiring fraternity are fiercely competitive with each other, to have charge of the better standard of game. Like our clubs, they are graded so as to ensure that an umpire's current performances are closely watched with the standard of the game he handles.

In order to facilitate this grading, Umpire's Coach Alan O'Neil (ex. V.F.A.) and his assistant Ian Allpress (ex. V.F.L.) train the umpires twice weekly at Elsternwick Park as well as coaching them at regular lecture sessions.

The two coaches, along with a committee comprising Alf Keam (M.H.S.O.B.), Keith

Sharkie (Nat. Bank), Robert Gay (Bulleen United) and Peter Feil, Linton McLeod, Alan Duckworth and Ian Henderson who are all well known as V.A.F.A. umpires, move around the games each Saturday.

The committee's objective is to critically examine and assess the umpire's performance and furnish a written report to the coach which not only allows the grading system to be up-dated but also may assist the umpire to eradicate any shortcomings of his technique.

Our umpires are very much an integral part of the V.A.F.A. scene, and the best way our clubs can acknowledge this fact is to invite the umpires to participate in the after match refreshments.

In this way, we can all show a mutual respect and friendship towards each other.

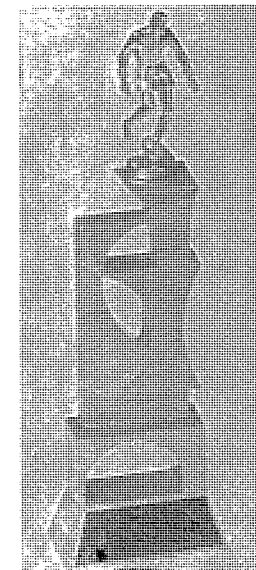

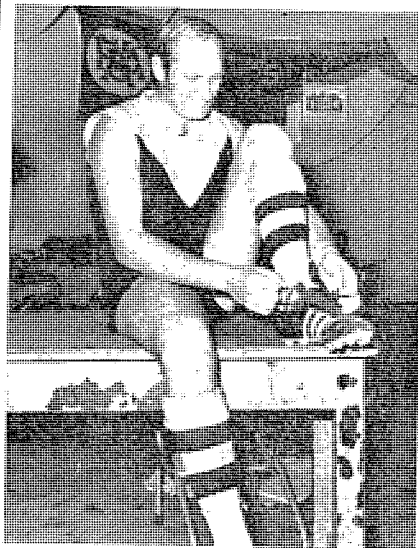

The spearheads had a good day — among the goals, 9 to Butcher (Caulfield Gramm.), De Luca (St. Bernard's), D'Arcy (U.H.S.O.B.) Roche (Latrobe Blacks) and 8 to Von Moger (Monash).

Grace (6 goals) was the star in in Hampton Rovers' 3-goal win over Old Geelong.

200 games to popular and dynamic Melbourne High captain Ian Turnbull. All Australia side in 1970, countless Victorian sides, 'A' Section best and fairest were features of Ian's great career, mainly in the centre and half-forward. Another M.H.S.O.B. veteran, Alan (Chooke) Featherby played his 150th game. Alan had also doubled up as club secretary in 1971.

10 YEARS AGO — 1967

Kew, with Crowe, Briggs and Mullin the best, gave a great display of wet weather football to overwhelm Coburg 12.13 to 8.6;

and moved into second place in 'A' Section with Melbourne High.

25 YEARS AGO — 1925

In the worst 'slush' for many years Ormond Juniors (11.17) defeated Old Scotch (3.8) to continue their unbeaten run — stars were John Byrne (just retired as V.A.F.A. executive member); Brian Walsh (later to play with St. Kilda) and Col Wilson (a member of the Melbourne 1950's premiership teams).

Clubs were reminded that the V.A.F.A. had never cancelled a game while the tops of the goalposts were showing above water. There is no provision for cancelling a full round — (Ed.).

Old Xaverians (16.14) were happy with victory in 'C' Section over Glenhuntingly (9.12) and were looking forward to Jim Ralph's return to the field.

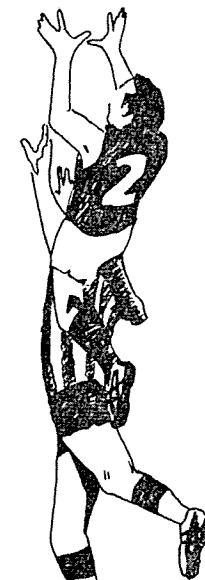
