# OLD TRINITY GIVE ORMOND A FRIGHT POOR KICKING FATAL TO "DE LA" BLUES THRASH BLACKS BY 10 GOALS GROUND CLOSURES STOP EIGHT GAMES

Ormond got a fright from Old Trinity last week, scraping home by a point from the bottom team, yet to "break the ice" this season.

North Old Boys maintained their unbeaten record, poor kicking by De La Salle spoiling any chance they had of topling the leaders.

University Blues shocked their fellow students, University Blacks by running away to a 10-goal win and sending the Blacks final four hopes crumbling.

The shocking weather in recent weeks caused the closure of several grounds and eight matches were not able to be played, much to the annoyance and disappointment of some 300 odd players.

Trinity kicked five goals straight in the first half and led Ormond by 15 points at the interval, but Ormond gradually wore the visitors down and just managed to win.

De La Salle trailed North by only 4 points at half-time, but kicked themselves out of it in the second half when they added a miserable 2-11 and went down by 4 goals, finishing with 7-20.

They did much the same in the first round match, kicking 9-23 to be beaten by 20 points.

A 7-goal burst in the second quarter gave the Blues a 28-point lead over the Blacks at half-time. The Blacks got to within 15 points at the last change, only to see the Blues streak away in the final term and add nine goals.

Marcellin opened smartly against a sluggish Caulfield Grammarians, who were 5 goals behind early in the second quarter.

Caulfield steadily whittled down Marcellin's lead which had dwindled to 4 points at half-time. Marcellin

were 11 points to the good at the last change but Caulfield finished much too strongly, adding 6 goals to win by 25 points.

Old Scotch beat Old Melburnians by 15 points. Paradians beat Collegians by 13 and Reservoir had 2 goals to spare over Old Haileybury.

Equal leaders in C Section, Fawkner and Old Xaverians, are still equal leaders — theirs was one of the games which could not be played.

Old Camberwell went down to Alphington by 16 points, but Power House, looking for a place in the four, did not take advantage of Camberwell's loss, as they were well beaten by St. Kevin's. Assumption eased the threat of relegation with a sound win over Old Geelong.

Poor kicking contributed to Heatherton's defeat by West Brunswick, who scored by a goal and pushed Heatherton out of top place, while Commonwealth Bank had a decisive 4-goal win over St. Bede's.

Monash University upset things in Junior Section 1, beating North Old Boys by nearly 5 goals, and the Blacks beat the Blues by 14 points.

In the Reserves, De La Salle thrashed North Old Boys, Scotch beat Melburnians by 5 points, Reservoir went down to Old Haileybury by 8 points, and Power House surprised St. Kevin's with a 3-point win.

Heatherton crushed West Brunswick, Commonwealth Bank beat St. Bede's by 10 points and Footscray Tech. won with a score of 1-4 (10 points). Their opponents, LaTrobe Reds kicked only 6 behinds. What a battle that must have been!

### UMPIRE'S CORNER

#### AUSTRALIAN RULES

It has often been mentioned of recent years that "Aussie Rules" captures the largest spectator audience per head of population of any field sport in the world.

To the many followers of the sport it is

obvious the game provides for feamwork, skill, speed and physical contact between players. Also it creates excitement, tenseness, partisanship and controversy amongst spectators.

The rules of the Australian game of football have been framed in such a way that they permit players of various physiques to capitalise on their particular attributes. Players of small stature are afforded the opportunity to excel by exploiting their speed and elusiveness whilst the taller and beavier players may utilise their saller and

heavier players may utilise their natural advantages of height and weight.

THERE IS, IT SHOULD BE ALWAYS REMEMBERED, NO SUBSTITUTE FOR

Not many followers of our great game stop to realise that the intention of the "Laws of the Game" is to help, not hinder, "Aussie Rules" and to afford protection to the fair player who is prepared to make the ball his sole, positive objective.

In order to cope with a vigorous fast-moving field game the laws must provide for many eventualities.

The umpire's advisor has a very onerous task in helping and instructing umpires in the interpretation of such laws and how to deal with the many eventualities that umpires are likely to meet during the course of any game in which they umpire.

Each year new situations occur which require an umpire to make an instant "reflex action" decision. Such an honest decision may lead to controversy but a decision must be made. After all that is what umpiring is all about - decision making,

Every umpire has the right to discuss "situations for decision making" with the Umpires' Advisor. It could result in the umpire deciding that the decision he made was perhaps an incorrect one (this does happen) but once an interpretation is given he can confidently be correct in the future,

The "Laws of the Game" come under close scrutiny every year and additions, alterations and modifications are made by the "administration executive". Because of this it would do well for players, coaches, and officials to frequently peruse, like umpires, the rule book and become conversant with the laws under which their club plays.

Umpires are continually updating their knowledge of the rules, improving their mental and physical fitness and becoming aware of the vital and unique role they have to play in Australian Football.

### **SECOND LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS**

### Blacks down Caulfield — Still in running North troubled by Ormond

There were several reversals of form in last Saturday's round, played under the best weather and ground conditions for some weeks.

Ormond, who scraped home from Old Trinity by a mere point the week before, gave leaders North Old Boys a lot of trouble, but were finally beaten by 10 points.

University Blacks, beaten to the tune of 10 goals in the previous match by University Blues, turned round and beat Caulfield Grammarians by 32 points, moving up to fifth ahead of Caulfield on percentage.

They are both two games outside the four, but both have a better per-

centage than Ormond (fourth).

Coburg, who had managed only a total of three goals in the two previous games, finished 15 points ahead of the Blues, who had the chance to make themselves safe from relegation.

North started well but Ormond pegged them back and went to a narrow lead just before half-time.

North added 5-2 to 2-5 in the third term and did most of the attacking early in the last but their inaccuracy in front of goal prevented them from scoring a more decisive win.

After a slow start, the Blacks kicked 9-1 to Caulfield's 6 goals straight in the second quarter to be within 7 points at the interval.

The Blacks went on with the job and 7 goals in the last quarter took them on to a sound victory, and kept them in the running for the finals.

De La Salle were only 2 points in front of Marcellin at half-time, but Marcellin faded right out of it after that and were badly beaten.

Straighter shooting for goal played a big part in Monash Blues' 6-point win over Old Melburnians, and shocking kicking by Old Paradians (5-17) cost them the game against Old Scotch, who won by 8 points.

Ivanhoe's long string of successes was finally broken, as they went down by 10 points to Reservoir Old Boys.

AJAX crashed against Hampton Rovers and Parkside met a similar fate against Fawkner. Kew made Old Xaverians battle for a 14-point win and Old Carey scored by a comfortable margin over Uni. High.

Old Camberwell beat Elsternwick by 2 goals, Old Brighton won comfortably from Power House and LaTrobe Blacks beat State Bank.

West Brunswick were too strong for Old Mentonians, AMP Society beat Beverley Hills, and North Brunswick despite their 7-25, beat Heatherton by 9 points. Thornbury surprised Footscray Tech, who went down by 28 points.

In the main Junior games, St. Bernard's beat Old Scotch by 4 points and De La Salle had 3 goals to spare over Reservoir.

Fawkner Reserves suffered their first defeat, going down to Parkside by 3 goals, and another leading Reserves team, Old Brighton, failed by 11 points against Power House.

In only three Sections (D, B Reserve and F Reserve) did the top four teams win — but only Old Scotch Juniors and Ormond Reserves lost their places in the top brackets.

Contrary to popular opinion "the man in white" DOES know his rules and he uses them appropriately at any of the 68 Victorian Amateur Football Association matches played every Saturday.

The 70 field umpires and 20 goal umpires who officiate at V.A.F.A. matches all belong to the V.A.F.A. Umpires Association.

The objects of the Association are to foster The objects of the Association are to toster goodwill amongst members, protect and safe-guard their interests, encourage and promote umpiring as in integral part of Australian rules football and work with the V.A.F.A. to ensure that it is an efficient Amateur football body.

Membership of the V.A.F.A.U.A. is open to people who officiate in at least three

to people who officiate in at least three home-and-away games, people appointed to the umpires' list and Life Members.

But being an umpire is not just running around a ground or standing between goal posts at a football match every weekend.

Umpires attend two training sessions a week — on Tuesday and Thursday nights. These are held at either Elsternwick Park or Royal Park or Royal Park.
