



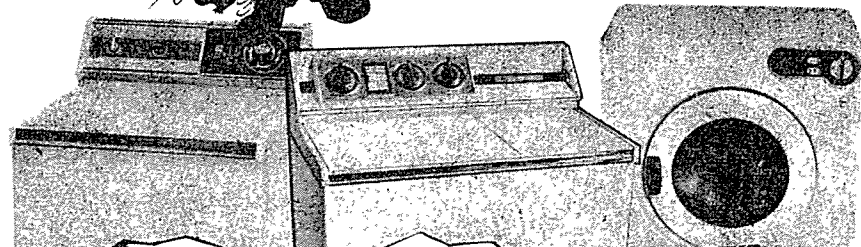

# BLACKS HOLD ON FOR 3-PT WIN ORMOND'S LATE BID JUST FAILS ST. BERNARD'S FINISH SWAMPS CAULFIELD

University Blacks kept themselves in the fight for the four with a win over Ormond last week, but they just held on long enough to score by three points.

Caulfield Grammarians also looked as if they could keep their final four hopes alive when they led St. Bernard's for three quarters, but they had no counter for St. Bernard's last quarter effort which brought nine goals and an easy win.

Old Scotch trounced Reservoir Old Boys and Collegians scored a surprise win over Ivanhoe in a topsy-turvy B Section.

The Blacks were much more impressive than Ormond for three quarters and looked to be set for a good win when they led by 5 goals at three-quarter-time.

They had outpaced and out-thought Ormond, handled the very heavy conditions well and they were able to pick up the ball and keep it moving far better than the home side.

But Ormond threw everything into a supreme last quarter effort and it very nearly succeeded. However the Blacks managed to hold them out and scored narrowly in a thrilling finish.

Caulfield just shaded St. Bernard's in a very even game — they were 10 points in front at the first change, one point to the good at the interval and 6 points in front at three-quarter-time, but St. Bernard's raced right away in the final term and won by 38 points.

North Old Boys gained a break on University Blues in the second quarter and were not troubled to score by 27 points.

Marcellin "jumped" Old Trinity in the first quarter and although Trinity shaped better in the second half, they were never in the game.

De La Salle looked to be coasting to an easy win over Coburg, but Coburg hit back in the last quarter and went down by only 15 points.

Old Scotch gained a firm grip on top place when they beat Reservoir by more than 9 goals, but their play was patchy. They were helped by Collegians who beat an inaccurate Ivanhoe by 7 points. It was Ivanhoe's second successive defeat.

Geelong crashed against Old Melburnians, going down by 32 points in a low-scoring game and Monash Blues crept closer to the four with a 19-point win over St. Kilda CBC.

AJAX were too good for Old Xaverians, their accurate kicking (18-7) giving them a 23-point win. Fawkner thrashed Hampton Rovers, Old Ivanhoe surprised Parkside, and Melbourne High had their first win.

Old Camberwell beat Power House by 5 points, and Alphington were too strong for Old Brighton.

Bulleen-Templestowe crashed against St. Bede's and unbeaten Hampton Rovers Juniors had a close call against Geelong.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

I guess I'm not academic enough to work out the form of the University teams — first the Blues' and now the Blacks' quick revival has upset my tipping skill, which puts me under considerable pressure today. The Blacks can establish themselves as a premiership threat if they pull off the biggest turn-up of the season to date — a win at home against North Old Boys.

And if they lose, it's goodbye to any final four hopes.

Ross Perrett, Nick Burne and "Harry" Costello are providing the backbone to a more successful University Blacks side. The North machine, led by many stars including Mauro Borlich, Gil Ould and Mark Hannebery, are still grinding their opponents into the mud.

I will be surprised if North don't slip up somewhere between now and September 17th. I haven't a clue when this slip will occur (if it does), but today could be the day. I'll take a punt — University Blacks to win — by how much (?) — say seven points.

Ormond will find Marcellin difficult at Marcellin, particularly with John Gartner playing at his top. Bruce Bourne's goal-kicking potential has been contained in recent weeks, but I still think the importance of the win will give Ormond the points.

Coburg and Old Trinity — much as I'd like to see Trinity break the ice, Coburg will be too good.

Caulfield Grammarians were on target last week but will have too much talent and experience for University Blues — (tongue in cheek!)

That leaves me the other main one at Elsternwick Park — St. Bernard's and De La Salle. "De La" may just have slipped a little, while St. Bernard's coach "Gus" Mitchell has his team developing towards the business end of the season.

It may seem cranky to tip against the two top teams, (North and De La Salle), but I fancy St. Bernard's.

## B SECTION

Another round of upsets has transpired, at least as far as I am concerned. All I can be sure of is that Laurie Aghan is all smiles whilst Ian Davis would be far from happy at this point in time.

Old Melburnians and Reservoir meet in a key game that could well decide fourth place. Rover Ray Shepherd has had a magnificent season for Reservoir whilst ruckman Rohan Brown has done likewise for O.M.'s.

Last week "Turk" Urquhart obviously con-

tributed heavily to the Navy Blues' huge score of behinds. I must lean towards Melburnians, who have the greater depth of ability, to score the points.

Geelong, now firmly ensconced in the hot seat meet Monash Blues, who have a chance for the four. There is a strong suggestion that the brothers Anderson, Moore, Bickford and Olding acknowledged to be their strength are all in current good form whilst Geelong do not have their stars firing at the moment.

The battle of the light blues could well go Monash's way.

Despite their excellent win over Ivanhoe, Collegians have the job ahead of them against Old Scotch. Led by ruckman Chris Roach and Ian Rice, the young Collegians will surely test the Cardinals.

However the experience of John Morgan, John Anderson and Bruce Kefford should ensure four valuable points and the double chance for Old Scotch.

Old Haileybury won the first round game against St. Kilda C.B.C. by dint of accurate kicking and nine weeks later, there still does not appear to be much between the sides. Haileybury impress me as having a leaning towards finer conditions, and, as they play at home where these conditions prevail I favour them as narrow winners.

Ivanhoe have had their boots on the wrong foot of late to compound the problem of their star players being out of form.

This does not argue well for their clash with Old Paradlans whose top players are all putting in good performances of late. The ever reliable Kohut, should give Paradlans enough use of the ball to notch a win.

Bulleen United journey to the big La Trobe Reds ground. The ground size will test United's fitness especially as their recent form has not shown evidence of a four quarter effort. However their strength and skill should ensure they take the points and kindle their final four ambitions.

**UMPIRE'S CORNER**

**GOAL UMPIRES**

After being given the "all clear" or "touched all clear" by the field umpire the goal umpire is the sole judge of a score. (In some competitions where independent goal umpires are not available, the controlling body empowers the field umpire to over rule a goal umpire.)

The goal umpire cannot register a score until he has received "all clear" from the field umpire. Although the goal umpire is the sole judge of a score he should not register a goal if the field umpire has called "touched — all clear".

If the ball makes contact with a player below the knee is can be regarded as having been kicked.

**GOALS** — subject to the field umpire signalling "all clear" a goal is scored when the ball is kicked over the goal line by a player of the attacking side without the ball touching a player or goal post.

A goal can be scored when a ball kicked high in the air completely crosses the goal line, without having been touched, and is blown back by the wind and strikes the goal post or is blown back into the playing arena.

**BEHINDS** — subject to the field umpire's signal a behind is scored when the ball

1. Completely crosses the behind line without touching the behind post.
2. Strikes a goal post including the back of the goal post.
3. Passes over a goal post.
4. Is touched by a player of either side before it completely crosses over the goal or behind lines.
5. Is carried over the goal or behind line by a player of either side.
6. Is handballed over the goal or behind line by a player of either side.

To register a score the ball must be completely over the goal or behind line no matter whether it is in the air or on the ground.

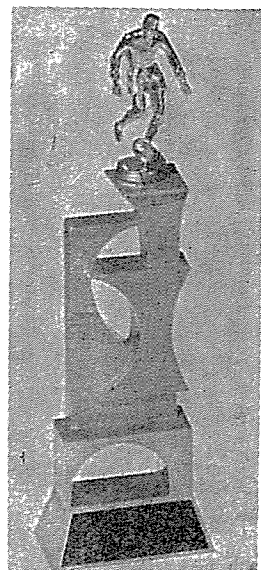
