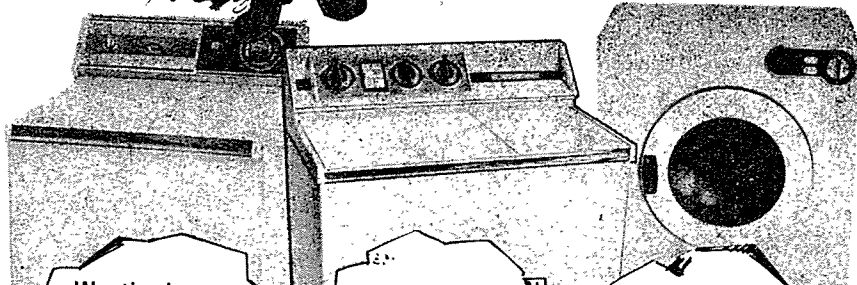

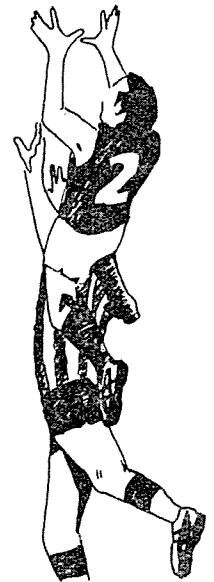

● LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

NORTH "PIPPED" ON POST LAST KICK WIN TO ST. BERNARD'S MARCELLIN DOWN TO COBURG

North Old Boys suffered their first defeat for the season when St. Bernard's beat them by a point in a thrilling finish.

St. Bernard's hit the front with the last kick of the match, which was scored a goal only an instant before the final siren.

Coburg, in a desperate bid to avoid relegation, scored a shock 2-goal win over Marcellin, who had beaten Ormond by a comfortable margin the previous week.

St. Bernard's, winning in the ruck and across the centre, kept with North in the first half, and although the leaders broke away to gain a 20-point lead in the third term, St. Bernard's finished well to kick 5 goals in the last quarter.

Poor shooting for goal by Ormond kept Caulfield Grammarians in the game for three quarters, but Ormond finished too strongly and won decisively. They looked to be in control practically all day.

University Blacks gained a winning lead over Old Trinity in the first half, and although Trinity did much better after the interval, Blacks scored an easy win.

University Blues matched De La Salle in the first half and trailed by only 13 points, but "De La" then forged ahead and went on to score by a big margin.

Old Melburnians kept themselves just in the running, but they had little to spare from Old Haileybury — 5 points, in a high-scoring game. Monash Blues went down by 10 goals to Old Paradians and can say goodbye to their final four chances.

AJAX beat leaders, Fawkner, by 13 points in a high-scoring encounter,

22-12 to 19-17. Hampton Rovers crashed badly against Parkside and their hopes of playing in the finals went with them.

Alphington lost their second in a row, going down by 3 goals to bottom team LaTrobe Blacks, and St. Kevin's were beaten by Old Camberwell, the margin being 3 points. It was also their second successive defeat and they dropped from second to fourth.

Power House crashed State Bank and ended Bank final four hopes as well as lifting their own chances of playing in the finals.

West Brunswick dented Beverley Hills' hopes when they beat them by more than 7 goals, and Footscray Tech were well beaten by Bulleen-Templestowe.

University Blues made their place in the Junior Section four rather more secure with an 8-goal win over North Old Boys, and Old Scotch went down by 28 points to the Blacks.

West Brunswick suffered a setback in Section 2, when they were well beaten by Hampton Rovers.

Two Reserve Section leaders were beaten — Fawkner and Old Brighton — an another, De La Salle, won by only a point.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

I was very close with my North-St. Bernard's guess last week. Well done, St. Bernard's — I think you'll make the Grand Final and what a game it will be.

Coburg won but it probably won't hold them in the Section and Ormond can't afford to slip or the Blacks will snap up fourth place.

There are a lot of key games remaining to be played.

Today Caulfield Grammarians will notch up another win, over Old Trinity. I expect them to come home strongly in the last few games, but I can't see them finishing higher than sixth.

University Blacks are running on nicely but must keep winning to have a finals chance. Allowing for Coburg's improvement, Marcellin put up a dismal performance. I'll stick with winning form — the Blacks comfortably.

St. Bernard's the only team to have conquered North, will have too many guns for University Blues, who dropped back into their old habits and "De La" showed them no mercy.

The improved Coburg will not trouble North Old Boys.

Ormond are in the tight spot — if they lose today they will surrender fourth place, although it may give Blacks only "caretaker custody".

Those Ormond forwards find goals hard to get — allow this latitude to De La Salle, and the four points will not be yours.

I expect the game to have all the qualities of a Final — "De La" will win because of their more convincing and consistent performances.

B SECTION

Well patient readers, I've finally gotten B Section form thoroughly under control and come up with five winners. Unfortunately, I do not have the space to inform you just what this unique experience feels like.

It is now apparent to my expert eye that the final four will not change due to the highly favourable draw facing the incumbents. However the pressure is really mounting on the candidates for relegation.

Old Scotch look to be enjoying good form as well as top spot, and should take the points against struggling Old Haileyburians, who haven't experienced the joys of winning for some weeks now.

Reservoir Old Boys also playing well and relishing the ruck drive of Mike Bates meet

up with Geelong who must be very appreciative of the slight advantage that their early season form gives them in the relegation stakes. Young Steve Wells continues his good form but will have trouble holding the pacy Ray Shepherd. Reservoir should win comfortably.

I have seen Old Paradians give their supporters heart failure recently by kicking huge scores of behinds. Ross Duke is getting it forward often enough but the forwards are squandering chances like millionaires. St. Kilda C.B.C. will have a lot of trouble containing ruckman Steve Kohut and the Paradians should pick up four easy points.

Monash Blues with Chris Moore marking everything at centre half forward, but reducing his effectiveness by heeding calls for the ball out on the flanks, are far from a certainty against Collegians who occupy an uncomfortable low spot. However, because we must be due for a dry ground, Monash should have the aerial strength to come out narrow winners.

Although any win is a good sign, Old Melburnians had to struggle hard last week for their narrow win over Haileybury. It would be drawing the long bow to suggest they have more than an outsider's chance against Ivanhoe. I think that captain-coach Bill McWhinnie has no thoughts of letting the double chance slip through his grasp and will drive Ivanhoe hard for a win.

Last Saturday's matches could have decided the 'four' and Hampton could have blown their chances unless they can win the next three comfortably.

AJAX showed fine form to top the leaders — it doesn't leave too much scope for either of the leaders to become too complacent. AJAX is now breathing down the necks of both Fawknor and Old Xavs in an endeavour to get the double chance. AJAX will consolidate today at the expense of MHSOB.

Although playing on the local Hampton ground, the Rovers will find Old Xavs too much of a handful.

Fawknor, smarting at last week's loss won't be able to take things too lightly against Kew. I think they will be trying hard to hang on to top spot and they should take the points.

Parkside — this is your big chance and you must win to be certain of making the 'four'. Old Carey's big ground may prove too much for the visitors. However I'm going for Parkside to make a desperation bid for a win and they should be in front at the siren.

I probably haven't given Old Ivanhoe a great deal of credit this year — may be because of their 1976 let downs. They have improved greatly to gain a place in the upper bracket and will pick up 4 points today against UHSOB.

The main game of the round appears to be that between Bulleen United and Commonwealth Bank. Victory for United could prepare the way for them to sneak into fourth place at the last minute. Surely Mike McArthur-Allen can put this message across to his charges.

The visiting Bankers are still shocked by their debacle at Bulleen two weeks ago. They do not play as well away from the Harry Trott as they do on it. Fiecer determination, harder tackling, finals' incentive, as well as home ground advantage should all be relevant in Bulleen United's approach to this game and they are my selection today.

5 YEARS AGO — 1972

Reservoir O.B., Assumption, and Power House were safe in the 'C' Section four but the fight for the final place was intense with St. Kilda C.B.C. (32), Old Xax. (30), Nat. Bank (28), Fairfield (24) and Old Hailey (24) all in the battle.

Congratulations to John Tudor of Old Paradians for his 200th game against Univ. Blues, one of the best players and clubmen that Paradians has seen.

John started his amateur career in 1961, was a member of the Carnival side in 1962, and had played in six winning grand final sides.

Alphington (fifth) stayed in the fight for the 'D' Section four when they came from behind to defeat Hampton Rovers (ninth) by 17 points. Williams, Shaw, Roberts, and Alsop (5 gls.) were Alphington's best.

Leading goalkickers were 'A' Section — Butcher (Caul. Gram.) 72, 'B' Section — Stephens (Old Trinity) 74, 'C' Section — Tuck (Assump.) 80, 'D' Section — Shannon (St. Pat's.) 68, 'E' Section — Walker (Old Ivan.) 92, 'F' Section — MacCullivar (Old Camb.) 52.

10 YEARS AGO — 1967

Victoria thrashed South Aust. 14.16 to 1.4 in the final match of the Carnival at Launceston.

It was and still is, the lowest score ever recorded in a Carnival match.

Best were Murphy, Hughes, Ward, McLean, Parkes, Wood.

David Hughes was runner up to Tasmania's captain, Bob Newton, for the Grosvenor Medal for best and fairest player (David had won the trophy at the Adelaide Carnival in 1964).

Life member and committeeman Colln 'Polly' McDonald played his 200th game for Ormond.

100 games to Charles Edelsten and Bill Mumford (Nat. Bank), Tony Blazey and Tony Fenton (O.G.G.), Fred Proctor (Old Paradians) and Mick Donegan (Power House).

Leaders were Old Paradians ('A' section — 3 games clear), Ormond ('B' section), Alphington ('C' section — 3 games clear), Parkside ('D' section), Old Trinity ('E' section).

25 YEARS AGO — 1952

Two top teams in 'B' section met with victory to Ivanhoe by 3 points over Melbourne High — 9.7 to 9.4 — a real battle, only 3 scoring shots in the last quarter, 1 goal to Ivanhoe and 2 goals to M.H.S.

Best were Bob Murray, Bill Clarke and 'Bluey' Clarke (for Ivanhoe) while for the losers Graham Beck, Max Smyth and John Heathcote stood out.

Pearse of St. Kevin's ('D' section) was the Association's leading goalkicker with 79 goals after 15 games.

State Savings Bank (3rd in 'B' section) kept Parkside (bottom) goalless.

Collegians cracked it for a win with a convincing victory over Alphington by 26 points.

300 UP TO VETERAN

One of the "Grand Old Men" of Amateur Football, Don McQueen, takes the field today for his 300th game. Don's illustrious career commenced in 1960, when he first played with Commonwealth Bank Juniors. Although he was captain of the Juniors, he played only three games with them before he was promoted to Senior ranks. From then until 1966 he played 132 games with the Bank. In 1964, 1965 and 1966 he gained selection in the Victorian State team; on the last occasion he was vice-captain. In 1965 he also earned selection in the All-Australian Amateur team which played in the ANFC Carnival. In 1967 Don transferred to Waverley, where he played a further 60 games.



In 1968, after many years of trying, Old Haileybury eventually persuaded Don to join us. Since then he has played 103 games with us. He has been the sort of fellow every club dreams of having play for them: Club Captain and Vice-President in 1973 and 1974, and President in 1975 and 1976. This season he has mainly played with the Reserves, but has still produced the class and desire to earn a few games in the firsts.

Possibly we at Old Haileybury have not seen Don at the peak of his prowess, but he has given (and is still giving) great support to the team with his knowledge and experience. Age may have dulled the edge a little, but his keenness knows no bounds. When Don read a few weeks ago that "Hutchy" played his 300th game with Power House 5 years ago, his immediate reaction was that he would have no trouble catching up to him! His experience an enthusiasm were rewarded in 1973 when he was voted V.A.F.A. personality of the year, while last year he was appointed assistant coach of the

V.A.F.A. Carnival side, and this year was a State selector. Congratulations Don, on a tremendous effort both to us at Old Haileybury, and Amateur Football generally.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.

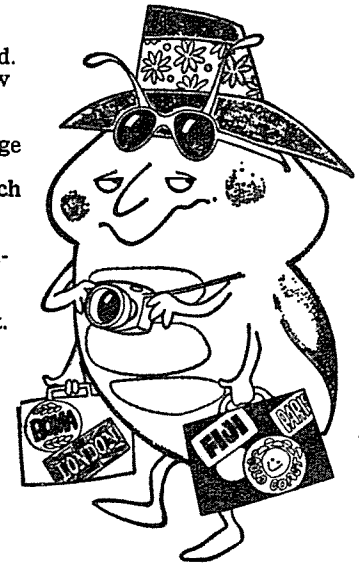

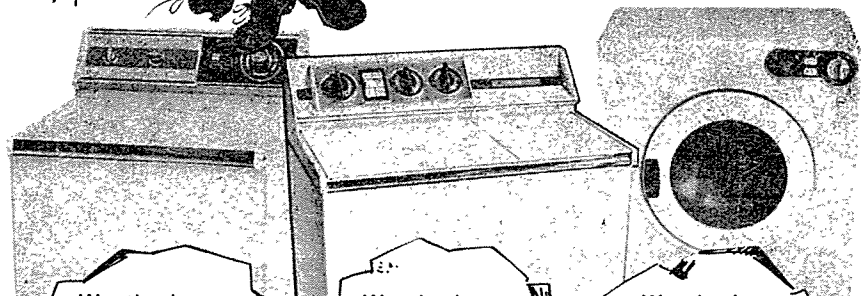
