

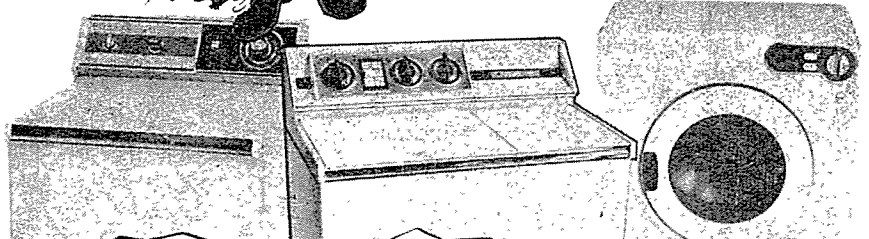

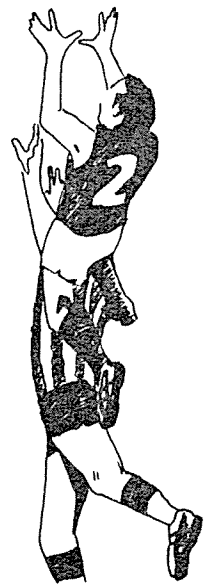

ORMOND HOLD ON TO BEAT "DE LA" BLUES' FINISH STAGGERS ST. BERNARD'S FOUR LEADERS CRASH IN DAY OF UPSETS

There were many upsets in last Saturday's round, no fewer than 21 teams in the various fours being beaten. There was not one section in which the top four teams won — in fact, in B Section the first three suffered defeat. Of the 21, nine of them were beaten by teams outside the fours.

Four leaders — Old Scotch, Ivanhoe Juniors and Hampton Rovers Juniors and Old Brighton Reserves — were beaten, Ivanhoe Juniors for the first time.

Ormond held on just long enough to beat De La Salle by three points and University Blues kicked 10 goals in the last quarter against St. Bernard's.

Ormond opened with the wind and went to an early lead but De La Salle appeared to score goals so effortlessly against it that they looked set for a big win.

It was a different story after the first term, however, as Ormond's desperation football kept "De La" down. Ormond broke away to lead by 22 points at three-quarter-time and De La Salle made no impression until late in the game when a burst of goals took them to within 3 points.

The Blues looked the goods all day against a struggling St. Bernard's, who had no counter for the Student's last quarter burst and were beaten by more than 12 goals.

Caulfield Grammar kicked 11 goals against Old Trinity in the second term and went further ahead after the interval to win easily.

University Blacks and Marcellin staged a close game for three quarters but the Blacks' strong finish took them on to a 3-goal win.

Old Scotch went down by more than 6 goals to Old Haileybury, Old

Melburnians beat Ivanhoe by 14 points and a 7-goal burst in the third quarter enabled St. Kilda CBC to beat Old Paradians by 20 points.

Old Carey beat Parkside by 5 goals and Hampton Rovers beat Old Xaverians by 17 points. State Bank crushed Old Camberwell and St. Kevin's beat Old Brighton by 4 goals.

Poor kicking contributed to Old Mentonians' 2-point defeat by Heatherton, and Commonwealth Bank failed by 6 goals against Bulleen United.

In the Juniors, University Blacks thrashed Ivanhoe and the Blues were well beaten by St. Bernard's. De La Salle pipped Geelong by 2 points, but Hampton crashed badly at Reservoir.

Last week's round, I thought, might finally decide several of the fours, but there were so many upsets, the position is now even more confused. In only two of the 14 sections, can we safely say that the composition of the four cannot be altered.

Will today's matches help to clarify things, or will they further cloud the issue?

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

I am in strife with University Blues again — and "De La" also seem to have difficulty in putting in two consistent games.

St. Bernard's became complacent and undid the good win over North the week before — but full marks to Ormond — the Blacks will find it hard now.

Today, Caulfield Grammarians, with John Butcher in vintage form, will crush Coburg while the unpredictable Blues will be too hot for Marcellin, who were let down badly in front of goal last week.

De La Salle and University Blacks — anybody's guess here — perhaps the home ground advantage will see "De La" through.

Careful St. Bernard's — the Blacks need a win to counteract an Ormond slip, so you can rest assured Ormond will be right on the ball today.

I fancy St. Bernard's if only because the game is at Essendon. But we are really guessing!!

North Old Boys, the only team in either A or B Section without a single problem, will strike another blow to a thoroughly dejected Old Trinity.

B SECTION

Whoever said "Last week a Rooster, this week a feather duster" must surely have had your correspondent in mind. How could the three bottom sides roll the three top bananas in the one round, in good conditions? The results now give five sides a chance for the four with the rest remaining candidates for relegation.

A very important match is the one between Old Paradians and Old Melburnians at Headquarters. With veteran Peter "Wonkey Legs" Roberson in top form with 8 goals from a flank and a winning centreline where novice wingers Brad Burns and Nell Campbell are firing leads one to suggest that the Navy Blues will take the points and keep their final four chances alive.

Monash Blues after failing against the bottom side last week, scarcely appeal against Old Scotch, despite the Cardinals' shock defeat. Chris Moore and the Andersons are putting their best foot forward week after week, but need more support.

Kevin White will lack the inches to give his small men a use of the ball and this could be a very telling factor and give Reservoir the edge.

Geelong have their last chance to extricate themselves from a bad spot when they journey to meet Ivanhoe. The Amateur Magpies are sadly missing the drive of Charlie Stredernick, and this absence should allow Ian Davis to continue his excellent form for Geelong. It will be a close one but I must go for Ivanhoe to pull themselves together with a win.

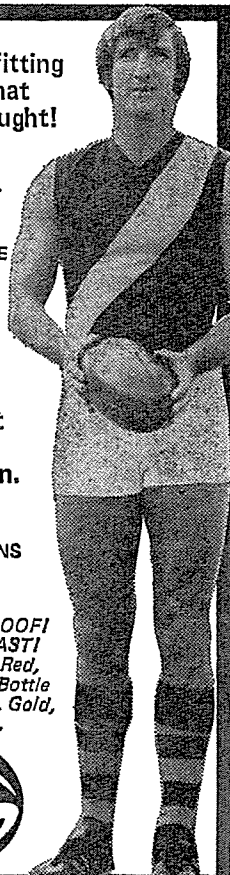

UMPIRE'S CORNER

This week we look at two Field Umpires, Bill Mason and Philip Rowell, who have gained many honours during their respective careers with the V.A.F.A.

Bill is a Past President of the Umpires' Association and Philip Rowell, elected Vice-President this year, automatically becomes the President in 1978, which illustrates the high regard the members of the Umpires Association have for both men.

Bill Mason is one of the best Umpires seen in the V.A.F.A. over the last ten years, as many Clubs, particularly those in "A" Grade, will bear testimony. He has umpired over 300 games since joining the panel in 1960 after many years as a player, firstly with Ivanhoe Amateurs (Bill's parents are still keen supporters at Ivanhoe each week) and then for three years with North Melbourne from 1955-1957, but persistent leg injuries forced him to leave North and stand out of football for a year.

After a Season with local Club, Doncaster in 1959, Bill decided to take up umpiring, but three years later he once again got the "playing bug" and returned to football in 1963, travelling from Melbourne to Nagambie each week for a game (we're not sure why!).

However, the old leg injuries flared up again so it was back to umpiring to stay in 1964 and after six years in various sections Bill was in charge of his first "A" Grade game. He then completely dedicated himself to reaching the top, training every day (except Saturday) and was twice rewarded in 1973 when, at the peak of his umpiring career, he was appointed to handle a Carnival Game at the M.C.G. and then at the end of the season his greatest thrill, the "A" Section Grand Final, which Bill recalls as the best game of V.A.F.A. football he has umpired, when Ormond played St. Bernard's for the flag at Elsterwick Park.

The honour was repeated when he umpired the 1974 "A" Section Grand Final, after which he decided to step down from the senior panel and run in the lower grades.

Bill recalls his time in "A" Grade as particularly rewarding and said the Club spirit was tremendous, the Umpire was accepted by all for good or bad and once the game was over mistakes (if any) were forgotten as he shared a drink with players and officials. Indeed, he feels that this attitude is typical throughout the V.A.F.A.

His popularity was recognised and his service to the V.A.F.A. rewarded when he became the first Umpire to be named "Amateur Football Personality of the Year" at a presentation during St. Bernard's Grand Final Breakfast in 1975. A morning he says he will never forget!

Bill is a fine example of the comradeship that exists in the Umpires' Association and is particularly adept at making new Umpires feel at home. He was awarded Life

Membership on the vote of his fellow Umpires in 1970, a most deserved honour and he served on the Executive for five years between 1970-74 during which time he was President in 1971.

Bill says that he is now a year-to-year proposition and so we hope that we can persuade him to return in 1978.

A night for Schoolboy Umpires held during 1968 by the V.A.F.A. Umpires Association, was attended by a young lad from Scotch College by the name of Philip Rowell, who was so impressed by the evening that upon leaving school in 1970 he decided to join the V.A.F.A. in preference to other bodies.

It was fortunate for us that he did, for Philip has proven himself to be both an excellent Umpire and Administrator and is one of our most valued and esteemed members today.

Philip graduated quickly through the ranks, umpiring his first "A" Section game late in the 1972 season and was appointed to a Carnival match on the M.C.G. in 1973. To date he has been in charge of no less than 16 Finals matches. Philip is lucky that he is such a good Umpire, because he runs so fast that he would be a natural selection for the Boundary during the Finals if he wasn't "in the middle!"

Philip enjoyed a most successful season in 1976 and was the Umpire selected to represent Victoria at the Amateur Carnival in South Australia where he was in charge of the South Australia v Tasmania match and represented the V.A.F.A. with distinction.

But, he said his greatest thrill last year was being appointed to umpire the "A" Section Grand Final, having also umpired the "C" Grade Grand Final the previous week.

Philip has been a keen and dedicated member of the Umpires' Association since he joined, and acted as Assistant Secretary from 1971-74, Secretary in 1975-76 and is currently Vice-President. He is also a co-founder of the Victorian Federation of Australian Rules Football Umpires and was elected Secretary of that body at its inaugural meeting.

Recalling his own experience he recently organised a special training night for schoolboy umpires at Elsterwick Park which was thoroughly enjoyed by all those in attendance and will hopefully prove to be a source of much needed recruits to the Umpires Association.

Like Bill Mason, Philip illustrates and enjoys the strong atmosphere of mateship in the Umpires Association, particularly at Finals time when your colleagues are running the Boundary and standing in the Goals. This is the team spirit which Philip says is the outstanding feature of V.A.F.A. Clubs, who want to get to know the Umpires and Opposition Players and expect them to join in the refreshments and discussions after the game.

We congratulate "Bill and Phil" on being two outstanding members of the V.A.F.A. and look forward to having them us for many more years.

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections.

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day. Provided that no player shall be elig-

ible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.
