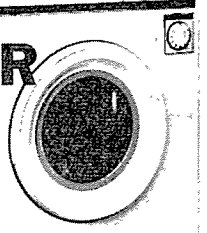

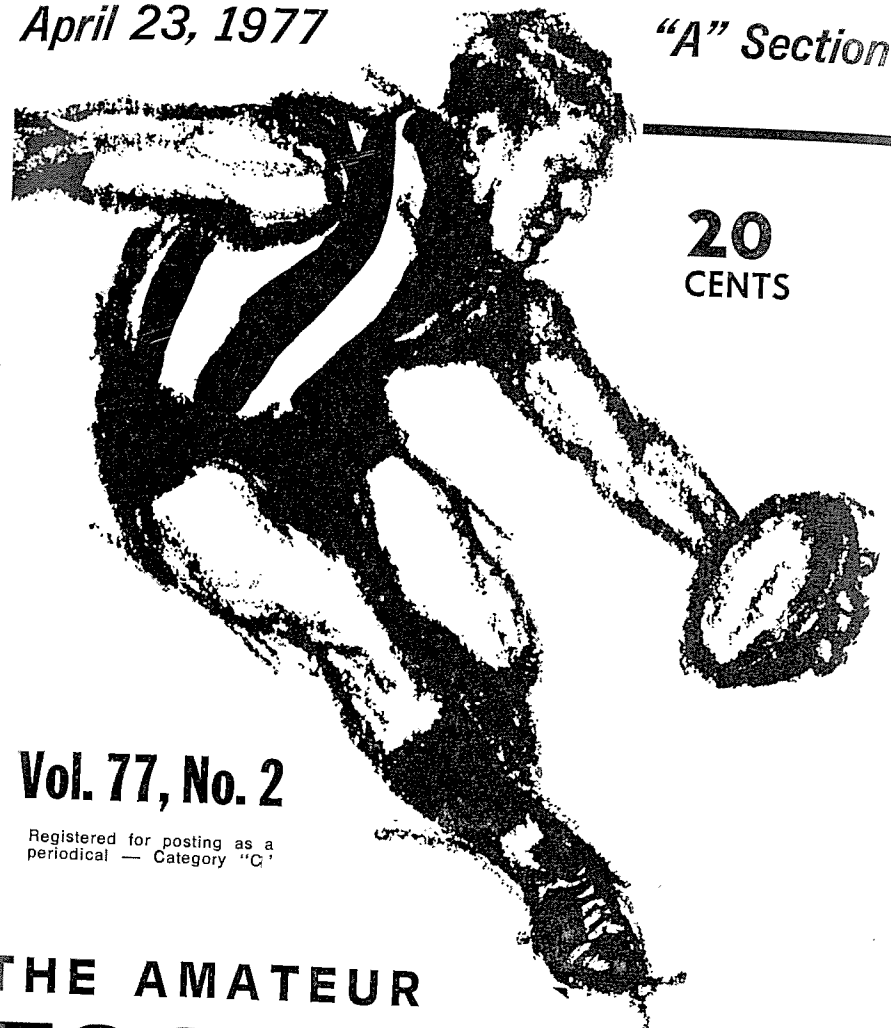

HIGHLIGHTS OF OPENING ROUND MARCELLIN, CAULFIELD, START WELL Ormond just home from St. Bernard's

Marcellin and Caulfield Grammarians, premiers and runners-up respectively in B Section last season, began the 1977 season in good style, Marcellin beating University Blues (fourth last year) and Caulfield scoring easily from Old Trinity, who just missed the four.

Ormond held off a strong finish by St. Bernard's (runners-up) to win by five points, while premiers, North Old Boys scored an overwhelming win over Coburg.

Ormond looked safe when they jumped to a 20-point lead halfway through the last quarter after being 3 points down at three-quarter-time, but St. Bernard's fought back strongly and just failed to make it. The game was of high standard and was even throughout.

Old Trinity started slowly but crept up to within 3 points of Caulfield early in the third term. Then Caulfield unwound a 7-goal burst and ran on to an easy win.

Marcellin beat University Blues by 19 points although the Blues had one more scoring shot. Marcellin opened up an early lead but the Blues came back well in the second term.

De La Salle got away from University Blacks in the second quarter to lead by 6 goals, but faded in the last term as the Blacks got to within 13 points.

Poor kicking by the Blacks in the second half (4-13) might well have cost them the game.

Old Haileybury (C Section runners-up) had a 4-goal win over Old Scotch, but premiers Old Melburni-

ans didn't do so well against Old Paradians, going down by 17 points. Geelong were much too strong for Ivanhoe and Monash Blues won well from Collegians, while Reservoir Old Boys doubled St. Kilda CBC's score.

Old Xaverians also celebrated their promotion with a sound win over Hampton Rovers but AJAX were well beaten by Parkside. The two teams relegated from B Section, Melbourne High and Old Carey, fared badly at the hands of Kew and Fawknor respectively.

Old Geelong beat LaTrobe Blacks by 7 points and Old Camberwell's poor kicking contributed to their 9-point defeat by Assumption.

Beverly Hills (F Section runners-up) opened with a good win over Old Mentonians (fourth last year).

St. Bernard's (promoted from Junior Section 2), had a big win over Coburg and Monash University (runners-up in 1975) crushed Ormond while Ivanhoe turned the tables on University Blues who beat them in the First Semi-final last year.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Picking first round winners is never an easy chore but what a disastrous start. I have a "red face" for overlooking the best sides in B Section last year!

Today's match of the day — Caulfield Grammarians and North Old Boys — the only teams clashing today that enjoyed opening round success. Current title holder North will win but I expect the strong Caulfield home ground following to push their team to a tight finish.

Ormond look to have a new lease of life — Ian Cameron has certainly got them bouncing. They will be too strong for University Blues who disappointed last week.

Whatever has happened to the might of Coburg? The veteran of the grade with a sequence of 13 successive years must take stock if it is to survive this year and make next year its fifteenth. University Blacks, narrowly beaten last week should not be troubled at Coburg today.

I'll toss the coin with St. Bernard's and Marcellin. It was close last week for Bernards but on their home ground today I can't see them slipping.

De La Salle and Old Trinity is another poser. Trinity appear to have come back to the field while De La Salle have again an even line up and obviously have recruited well. I expect De La Salle to win and establish itself as one of the competition's early leaders.

B SECTION

Well the first round saw some surprise results. Surprises to me that is.

St. Kilda C.B.C. play host to Old Melburnians in what should be an interesting contest. The Navy Blues disappointed me last week and suffered a three-goal defeat. I intend to play safe and call St. Kilda the winners, pending further proof of O.M.'s reputed strength.

Colleagues were disappointing out Monash way. They looked to have many new faces and to be lacking in height. Geelong on the other hand, should build on last week's comfortable win and take out the points on this one.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

Explanation and Interpretation of the Rules of the Game.

KICKING OFF AFTER A BEHIND HAS BEEN SCORED

This can only be done after the flag has been waved by the goal umpire. If the player does not wait for this, the ball will, on the request of the field umpire be returned to the goal area.

1. Any player of the defending side may kick the ball in from within the kick-off lines.

2. Should a defending player hand-ball over the kick-off line the field umpire would stop play and instruct the player that the ball be kicked in.

3. No player of the opposing side shall be permitted to remain within 10 metres of the kick off line whilst the ball is being kicked in.

4. The ball must be kicked clear of hand and foot, not necessarily over the line, and once kicked is deemed to be in play.

5. The player kicking off must enter the kick-off area before kicking. If he doesn't, the umpire shall stop play and instruct the player accordingly.

6. If the player kicking off encroaches over the kick-off line the umpire shall instruct the ball be brought back to the spot on the kick-off line where the breach took place and bounce the ball.

7. If the ball is not kicked clear of hand and foot the umpire shall instruct the ball be brought back and he will bounce the ball at the spot on the line nearest where the breach took place.

HANDBALL (Rule 11)

"A player may handball by holding the ball in one hand and hitting it with the clenched fist of the other hand. If the ball is not handballed correctly, a free kick shall be given to the nearest opponent".

So handball is clearly holding the ball with one hand and striking it with the clenched fist of the other hand.

AMATEUR DEFINITION

An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize, staked bet or declared wager, or who has not knowingly or without protest competed with or against a professional for a prize of any description or for public exhibition, or who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the practice of any athletic exercise as a means of livelihood or pecuniary gain. (This definition is subject to certain exceptions set out in the rules of the Australian Amateur Football Council.)

The hand holding the ball must not deliver or propel the ball. The ball must be despatched by the force of the clenched fist.

It is not compulsory for the hand holding the ball to be still — it may move in any direction. The ball must be held on one hand. It must not be juggled or thrown, nor should the hand holding the ball be pulled away before the ball is propelled with the clenched fist of the other hand.

A player may not hand or throw the ball to a team mate. A free kick would be awarded to the nearest opponent. However, if a player deliberately grabs or pulls the ball from another player the umpire should call "play on".

A player is permitted to hit the ball with the open hand provided he is not holding the ball with the other hand at the time. Should the ball be on the ground or in the air a player can legitimately hit the ball with the open hand ("palm"). Players may legitimately tap the ball out in front of them to assist them in gaining possession.

Scooping the ball is a form of throwing and as such, using one hand or two hands, is a breach of the rules. Whilst the ball is in play, no player is permitted to throw the ball in any circumstances.

On Thursday April 14th Old Haileyburians lost a great clubman in Gary "Banjo" Patterson, as a result of a car accident.

Although small in stature Banjo's personality spread throughout the Club and many of our newer recruits are a direct result from his efforts. A stalwart of the Reserve and Third Eighteen his cheerful attitude and determined play were a great boom for team spirit.

We feel Banjo typified all the finest aspects of Amateur football and our club and the community is much the poorer for his premature death. Deepest sympathy is extended to all his family and close mates at the "Bloods".

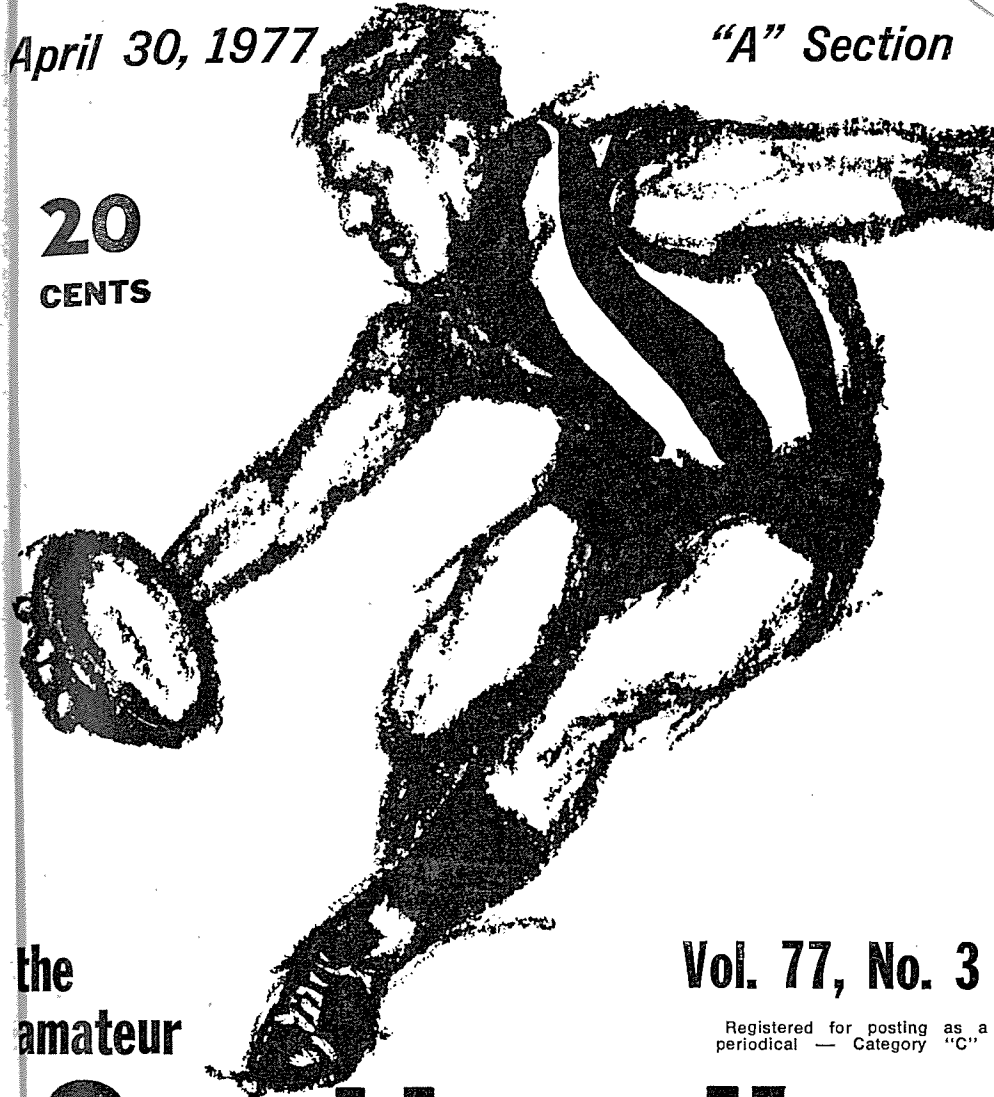
