St. Bernard's strike form at right time

Poor kicking costly to Ormond

Parade out — Fawkner qualify for B Section

St. Bernard's broke their run of "outs" to beat Ormond by 19 points in the First Semi-final last Saturday and will meet the losers of today's game in the Final next week.

Inaccuracy in front of goal proved costly to Ormond, who had beaten St. Bernard's convincingly only a fortnight previously.

A 6-goal burst in the third quarter paved the way for Ivanhoe to beat Old Paradians by 14 points.

Fawkner moved up to B Section when they beat AJAX in a high-scoring C Section Second Semi-final, while Alphington, Heatherton, St. Bede's and Hampton Rovers Juniors also qualified for promotion to a higher section in 1978.

Ormond rushed a goal in the first minute, against the wind, but then St. Bernard's settled down and their steady attack took them to a lead of 4 goals at quarter-time.

It was the second quarter which really cost Ormond their chance of staying in the running for the flag.

They kicked 3-8 with the wind, and although the St. Bernard's defence kept the pressure on Ormond, many of the "misses" were from deliberate shots. And to add insult to injury, St. Bernard's kicked 4 goals against the wind and were 23 points in front at the interval.

Ormond did well in the third quarter, holding their opponents to 2 goals and were 31 points down at three-quarter-time.

Bruce Bourne's 3 goals early in the last term brought Ormond right back into the game but St. Bernard's steadied and the closest Ormond got was 10 points.

Old Paradians led Ivanhoe by 11 points at the half-time break, but Ivanhoe rattled on 6-6 to 2-3 in the third quarter and held on to win by 14 points.

All four teams in C Section topped the century mark, with Old Xaverians going down to Parkside by 5 points and Fawkner beating AJAX by almost 6 goals.

There was little between Parkside and Old Xav's all day and Parkside overhauled their opponents shortly before the finish.

Fawkner took a commanding lead over AJAX in the first half to lead by 8 goals and were more than 12 goals in front at the final change, but AJAX kicked 10 goals straight in the last term.

Old Brighton were not unduly troubled by Old Camberwell, but it was a neck-and-neck struggle between Alphington and St. Kevin's with Alphington's slightly better kicking giving them a 2-point win.

North Brunswick broke away from Old Mentonians in the third term with a 7-goal break but Mentonians kicked 6 in the last quarter to be beaten by 2 goals.

West Brunswick's failure to make use of the wind in the first quarter left them trailing Heatherton by almost 6 goals at the interval, and al-

though they rattled on 8 goals in the third, Heatherton finished well to score by 10 points.

Footscray Tech's kicking was even worse (8-24) and although they had 12 more scoring shots than Thornbury, they were beaten by 3 points.

After an even first half, St. Bede's streaked away from Bulleen-Templestowe, adding 9-11 to nothing in the third term. Then they kicked 7 goals straight to score a runaway win.

In the Junior games, North Old Boys were too strong for University Blacks and St. Bernard's got home by a goal from Ivanhoe in a close encounter.

Geelong beat Reservoir Old Boys by a similar margin, and Hampton Rovers, after trailing De La Salle by 15 points at half-time, kicked 7-7 to nothing in the third term and went on to win by 32 points.

Most of the Reserves games were clear-cut, but Collegians beat Old Melburnians by only four points and Bulleen-Templestowe beat St. Bede's by a similar margin.

The fight for premiership honours has been narrowed down by the elimination of the 14 First Semi-final losers, and in all but the top two sections (and their Reserves), the other 10 losers today will be out of the running.

Congratulations Peter Aughton on topping the A Section poll, but commiserations that injury eliminates the chance of playing for a flag.

Bad luck Ormond but congratulations to you and coach Ian Cameron in lifting the club back into the top bracket.

A couple of weeks ago I thought that today's North Old Boys-De La Salle second semi-final result would be a foregone conclusion. But now I'm not so sure.

After the feast of goals by "De La" against a formidable Caulfield, perhaps there is a chance for a real turn-up.

North have put together a fantastic year of utmost consistency. They are an adaptable band of players.

Winger Mark Hannebery, in brilliant form and the prolific ball-getting ability of centreman Mauro Borcich give them plenty of drive.

Peter Hall is rucking superbly and with clever rover Bob Conti, they have the formula to give North the initiative from the centre square.

Barry O'Connor, Frank Leeack and John Hogan lead a tight defence that has surrendered only 1191 points for the season — an average of 11 goals a game.

De La Salle's defence rates nearly as economical as North's but their attack averages three goals less a game.

But if Terry Crothers continues his last match form, when he kicked 12 goals, this slight difference in assessing both line-ups becomes a hypothetical theory — any team kicking 28 goals against the side finishing sixth is a worthy premiership contender.

De La Salle are a most even side. Mick Nugent will provide opposition to North's ruck and the experienced Rick Sykes will be a damaging player wherever placed.

The poise of "give-nothing-away" Barry Lyons will be a stumbling block and ex-Geelong (V.A.F.A.) star Vince Eddy has the ability to adapt to many positions.

I am prompted to take a punt on the underdogs — De La Salle — I have a strange feeling North may be complacent.

But any team with such an impressive record must start favourites. North will get there but it will be their toughest encounter this season.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

Over the past few years the Executives of the five major umpiring associations, viz. VFL, VFA, VFL Reserves, Geelong Football Umpires League and the VAFA, have met socially after the completion of the season to discuss problems which have affected their members in particular, or umpiring generally.

At the function two years ago, the idea of a body representing all umpires within Victoria was born and in July of this year the Victorian Federation of Australian Rules Football Umpires was created.

President — Peter Fell — who is well-known in amateur football circles as the Secretary to the Umpire Committee and also as a life-member of the VAFA Umpires' Association;

Vice-President — Kevin Mitchell — well-known as the top VFL boundary umpire and President of the VFL Umpires' Association this year;

Secretary — Philip Rowell — who is Vice-President this year of the VAFA Umpires' Association;

Treasurer — Rex Wenn — a top field umpire in the VFA who is President of that Association this year.

Any umpiring association which is interested in obtaining further details concerning the Federation can write to the Secretary at 49 Carlyle Street, Ashwood.

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections.

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day. Provided that no player shall be elig-

ible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.
