REVERSAL OF FORM BY "DE LA" Thrash St. Bernard's To Enter Grand Final *Ivanhoe "Pip" Reservoir - Gain Promotion*

De La Salle staged a reversal of form to score a runaway win over St. Bernard's in the Final last Saturday, and meet North Old Boys today to decide the premiership.

Ivanhoe beat Reservoir Old Boys by a point in the B Section Final, to gain promotion to A Section in 1978 with Old Scotch, who will be their opponents in the Grand Final.

Fawkner, Old Brighton, Heatherton and St. Bede's won the premierships in their respective sections, and the Junior titles went to St. Bernard's and Hampton Rovers.

A better attack, superiority in the air and smarted ground play and backing-up were factors which swung the game De La Salle's way, and from halfway through the second quarter they took control.

The scores were level at quarter-time, after St. Bernard's had had the use of the light breeze, and it was goal for goal in the early stages of the second term.

But then De La Salle started to assert their supremacy and they looked to be in a commanding position at the interval with a lead of 29 points.

St. Bernard's did little to raise their supporters' hopes in the third quarter, in fact they slipped further behind, and trailed by 32 points at the final change.

Two quick goals at the start of the last term gave St. Bernard's a chance, as it cut their leeway to 20 points, but their hopes were short-lived, for "De La" took charge again and kicked 6 goals for the quarter.

St. Bernard's added 2 more goals late in the game in a dying effort but they were 50 points down at the finish.

De La Salle's second quarter burst, when they kicked 7-6 to 3-1, was the turning point in the game.

Their half-forwards, Terry Crothers (7 goals) and Chris Loft (4) did a lot of the damage.

Ivanhoe scraped home by a point in a see-saw B Section game, with little between the teams — and the scores — all day.

They led by 13 points at the first change but Reservoir's 6-goal burst in the second quarter gave them a lead of a goal at half-time.

Reservoir were a point in front at three-quarter-time, and in a thrilling finish to a hard fought game, Ivanhoe had the nose in front at the final siren.

Fawkner beat Parkside by 29 points in a high-scoring game, and Old Brighton scored a surprisingly easy win over Alphington, the final margin being more than 10 goals.

Heatherton beat West Brunswick almost as easily, but St. Bede's had only 2 points to spare over Bulleen-Templestowe.

St. Bernard's finished on against Ivanhoe after an even first half to

take the honours in Junior Section 1, and Hampton Rovers won the Section 2 premiership by 11 points from Geelong, in an extremely high-scoring encounter.

Geelong kicked 18-17 (125 points) to the Rovers 20-16 (136).

This is my last Editorial — from the beginning of next season the Editor of The Amateur Footballer will be Mrs. Jan Howard, of Assumption Club. The new Press Correspondent of the V.A.F.A. will be Mr. Arthur Goudie.

I would like to wish Jan and Arthur every success in their respective capacities and hope clubs will give them their fullest co-operation. I hope also that the Victorian Amateur Football Association will continue to flourish — as it has during the past 85 years.

LOOKING BACK

5 YEARS AGO — 1972

In the 'E' Section grand final State Vikings Bank showed that their semi-final win against Marcellin was no fluke when they beat that team by 47 points to take the flag.

Best were Spithill, Allen, Fraser (S.S.B.) and P. Toohey, Delmo, Miller (Marcellin).

Old Camberwell came through as champions when they beat Elsternwick in 'F' Section by 7 points, much closer than their three previous games. Stars were Gretrix, Burt, Tipping (6 gls.) (Old Camberwell) and Freer, Mazur, Cottrell (Elsternwick).

Ormond won the second of their "hat-trick" premierships and Geelong took the honours in B Section to hit the top grade after a long spell "down below".

The Junior Section titles went to St. Bernard's (Sec. 1) and University Blues (Sec. 2).

10 YEARS AGO — 1967

Old Paradians, in their fifth grand final appearance in six years, (premiers 62, 63, 64 and 66) met Caulfield Grammarians who were making their debut in an 'A' Section grand final.

Experience was on the side of Parade as four of their 100 game players, Fred Proctor, John Tudor, Brian Weyman and Bernie O'Brien had played in their four premiership teams. 10.11 to 10.13 at three-quarter-time, Parade kicked 5.4 to 3.2 in the last quarter to win yet another premiership. They were also premiers, in 1968, and John Tudor is still playing — Ed.)

Proctor, Quinlan and Weyman were best for the winners while Ward (5 goals), Barker and Chaffey were strong players all day for Caulfield Grammarians.

Another notable performance was Ormond Reserves appearing in the grand final for the 7th consecutive year.

In the Reserves, De La Salle led North Old Boys by 5 goals at half-time, but North kicked 8 goals in the last quarter to win by 21 points.

Parkside beat Hampton Rovers by a similar margin, but the other games were won very decisively.

University Blues 23.12 (trounced North Old Boys 9.16 to win the 'B' Section pennant. Rovers Rutherford (9 goals) and Church (5 goals) were dominating players while Elliott and Les Murray battled all day for the losers.

25 YEARS AGO — 1952

University Blues and Ormond played the Grand Final at Warringal Park (Heidelberg) in blistering heat. Ormond brought in some players from their Junior team but were no match for the Blues who won 20.10 to 8.16.

Blues had struck form in the last few games with the brilliant half-forward line of Geoff Tunbridge, Mick Eggleston and Geoff Dahlenburg in control and champion Duncan Anderson (6'4") at full-forward kicking 11.1. They went right away in the last quarter scoring 9.1 to 1.2.

Coburg, 2 points in front at three-quarter-time, kicked 3.9 to a goal in the last term, to defeat Elsternwick for the 'C' Section premiership.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

My tipping form has been disastrous! — Well done De La Salle — you have again proved me wrong and have earned your chance to try for your first "A" Section flag.

But fair consideration to a gallant St. Bernard's who overcame injuries and did well to finish a meritorious third.

Anyway St. Bernard's will be now able to enjoy their gala breakfast, journey to the park by taxi and spend a relaxing afternoon watching North and De La Salle scratch themselves apart.

Today's game — North Old Boys, the hottest premiership favourite for years and De La Salle a thoroughly convincing and deserving challenger.

It appears to me that there is an opening to stop either team; mercurial Les Murray proved two weeks back that there is still running in his 34-year-old legs, while De La's half-forward Terry Crothers has been having a series of "birthdays" and collected another seven goals last week.

So there's a challenge — stop Murray, De La, and you are part of the way to winning the game. And your deal North is to curb the effectiveness of Crothers.

De La Salle did it easily last week but I can't see them improving 6 goals on their semi-final clash with North.

Defender Peter McDonald, ruckman Mick Nugent, with Simon Beddoe and Vincent Eddy are continually among their best, but can they get there if they are forced to jump all day?

The North line-up is one of the best equipped teams we have seen for years, and is probably every bit as good as the vintage teams that few remember but of which Noel Rundle and Manson Russel are still nostalgically raving.

Mark Hanneberry, Terry Scanlon and Barry O'Connor are proven performers while Bob Conti and Mauro Borlich can spark the brilliant touch at the right time which is needed to win games.

I will not underestimate De La Salle's desperation to capture an "A" Section flag — and North could slip if they allow confidence or the theme from "Rocky" to become their saviour!

I anticipate a typical Grand Final with loads of atmosphere. But I predict that the North machine will prove too accomplished at the finish and run up its second successive "A" Section pennant.

B SECTION

There can be little doubt about the two hard luck stories of the season in this Section of the competition. One was Geelong dropping to C Section with 7 wins and the other of course would be Reservoir Old Boys falling by only a point to get back to 'A' Section.

Whilst I foresaw the likelihood of a very tight Preliminary Final, never in my wildest thoughts did I expect such a heart-stopper as was witnessed last week.

And now we come up for the big one that has occupied our thoughts for a whole season.

The scores between Old Scotch and Ivanhoe are level at one win apiece but the two clubs have not been tested together since late June when Ivanhoe won quite comfortably in heavy conditions.

Laurie Aghan has brought his Cardinals into the final series in apple-pie condition, and, having done the right thing by him in the second semi-final, the team can hardly claim the leg-weariness that would be Ivanhoe's problem at the moment.

Because it is a big occasion, I can almost certainly guarantee that Old Scotch and Victorian captain John Anderson will turn in a top performance. Backing him up is a tight back line and a bunch of very efficient forwards.

Whilst I'm confident that Bill McWhinnie's boys will give a great account of themselves, the Old Scotchmen appear as likely to hold the lead at the final siren.
