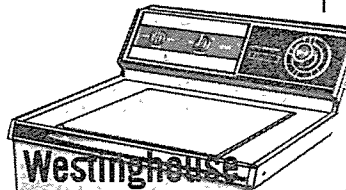

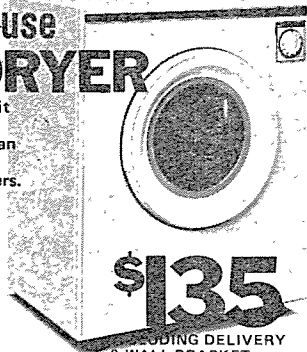

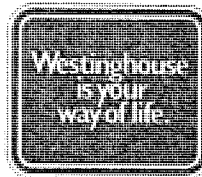

NORTH NOW ALONE ON TOP

ORMOND DOWN BY FIVE GOALS

NARROW WINS TO CAULFIELD, DE LA SALLE

North Old Boys are now alone on top of the A Section ladder, following their 5-goal win over Ormond last week.

Caulfield Grammarians staged a remarkable recovery in the last term to get up and "pip" University Blacks by four points and De La Salle held off a strong challenge by Marcellin to win by five points.

Old Paradians, Old Xaverians, Alphington and Bulleen-Templestowe are also clear leaders of their respective sections and Hampton Rovers are clear in Junior Section 2.

West Brunswick are the only unbeaten side in E Section and Monash University and Ivanhoe are unbeaten in Junior Section 1 but all three clubs have had a bye and are not ahead on points.

The Ormond-North match was not a high standard game — it was marred by bad kicking and both sides were well off the target (8-17 to 12-23), but North made better use of handball.

They opened up a break of 27 points in the first half and Ormond were unable to make any impression on their early leeway.

The Blacks were much more impressive than Caulfield for three quarters, Caulfield's poor forward work leaving them trailing by 25 points at half-time and 27 points at the last change. They had at least as much of the play as the Blacks but continually broke down in attack, or scored mainly points.

But as the wind swung round their way in the last quarter, they seemed to find new life and the Blacks started to make the mistakes. Caulfield added 6-4 to 1-3 and scraped home by four points.

St. Bernard's struggled against Old Trinity for three quarters, but were

too strong in the last when they put on 9-5 to 3-1 and won by 5 goals.

De La Salle led Marcellin by 19 points at the interval but Marcellin finished well and were a little unlucky not to win — they went down by 5 points.

Coburg were no match for University Blues, who kicked 12-13 to 1-2 in the second half.

Geelong scraped home from Old Haileybury by 4 points and Old Paradians kicked clear of Old Scotch late in the game to win by 5 goals, after Scotch made a bold bid for victory.

Old Melburnians opened their account at the expense of Monash Blues, who suffered their second successive defeat, and Ivanhoe beat Reservoir by 20 points in a high-scoring encounter.

Parkside crashed badly at Fawkner, the home side winning by nearly 25 goals, and Hampton Rovers were well beaten by AJAX, while Kew troubled the leaders, Old Xaverians, before going down by 14 points.

Old Camberwell and Elsternwick staged a high-scoring thriller, with Camberwell winning by a point (20-16 to 20-15), and LaTrobe Blacks had their first win at the expense of State Bank.

One point was also the margin in the battle for first win between National Bank and Brunswick, with Bank missing out. Heatherton had a big win over North Brunswick and West Brunswick beat Old Mentonians by 9 points.

The "Bulleen battle" went Templestowe's way — they beat United by 10 goals, and are clear leaders as Thornbury beat Footscray Tech. by 20 points.

In the Juniors, Coburg ran Monash University to 23 points, Ivanhoe beat North Old Boys by 34 points and University Blues thrashed Ormond. In Section 2, Geelong suffered their first defeat, going down to West Brunswick by 25 points in a "kicking" contrast (13-20 to 19-9).

PREVIEWING
TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

The ladder is beginning to sort itself out with Caulfield Grammarians emerging as the most likely side to unseat one of the top four.

Their chance is today when they visit St. Bernard's, never a happy hunting ground for most clubs. Caulfield have Tony Lester in fine touch and John Butcher is getting goals again.

However St. Bernard's with Peter Rackham, Greg Wade and Mick Drennan consistently among the stars, will be too strong at home.

Bruce Bourne after celebrating 150 games with 8 goals two weeks ago is showing his best form for a couple of seasons — and so are Ormond, University Blacks are obviously team building so I can't see them troubling Ormond on what is nearly its "home ground" (Elsternwick Park).

North Old Boys deserve to be on top and have produced a lot of talented new names. University Blues will pace it with them for most of the day but North's unbeaten record will remain intact.

This is good for our game and here's hoping our selectors can recognize some of this "new blood" before it's too late. I don't envy them their always difficult task.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

Following on last week's article on Umpires at Training, here are details of a physical fitness test — "The Harvard Step Test", which coaches may like to try out on their players.

The "Harvard Step Test" is the test which is used to measure the ability of the body to adapt itself to recover from hard physical activity.

The "testee" a performer steps up and down on a bench (approx. 20" high) for as long as possible up to five minutes at a rate of 30 steps per minute. The testee should lead off with the same foot each time and must straighten legs and back at each step.

The time taken from "start" until the performer is exhausted, at the end of five minutes or when he fails to keep the rhythm, which ever is sooner, is recorded in seconds.

The number of heart beats is recorded in the 30 seconds from one minute to one minute 30 seconds following the cessation of stepping. The base of the neck (carotid artery) is an easier place to find the pulse after exercise than the pulse in the wrist.

The scoring formula is as follows:
PHYSICAL FITNESS INDEX =
 Duration of stepping (in seconds) x 100

$$5.5 \times \text{Pulse Rate}$$

e.g. For a person who stepped the full five minutes and had a pulse count for the 30 seconds from the one minute to 1½ minute after cessation of stepping of 50 the score would be

$$\text{P.F.I.} = 5 \times 60 \times 100 = 30,000 = 109$$

$$5.5 \times 50 = 275$$

P.F.I. below 55 — POOR

P.F.I. 55-64 — LOW AVERAGE

P.F.I. 65-79 — AVERAGE

P.F.I. 80-89 — GOOD
 P.F.I. 90+ — VERY GOOD
 P.F.I. 140+ — FANTASTIC

One wonders how footballers would rate if this test was carried out on the members of an Amateur Football team. I suspect that perhaps there may be members of a junior team who would rate higher than their contemporaries in the seniors.

It may be interesting also to note that the "average untrained individual" would have a testing pulse rate of 60 to 70 beats per minute. The trained athlete may bring this down to below the 50 beats per minute.

Perhaps one training night early in the season the test could be given and later on when the finals are on it may be repeated.

It would make interesting conversation comparing each individual's results.

A greater attainment of physical fitness allows the performer to execute the skills of his sport more economically and efficiently.
