ORMOND'S STRONG FINISH SWAMPS MARCELLIN NARROW WINS TO DE LA SALLE, COBURG FIRST DEFEAT FOR FOUR LEADERS

After trailing badly for three quarters, Ormond unleashed a strong finishing burst to score an exciting 9-point win over Marcellin in last week's round.

The other main game was even closer — De La Salle scraped home by a point from St. Bernard's. In another close finish Coburg opened their account with a 3-point victory over Old Trinity.

It was Disaster-Day for four leading teams — Old Paradians, Old Xaverians, Alphington and Ormond Reserves, all of whom tasted defeat for the first time this season.

Ormond had no counter for Marcellin's pace, excellent backing-up and clever anticipation and were 5 goals down at half-time.

Their play improved a lot in the third quarter but Marcellin still looked to be in control with a 21-point lead at the last change. Then Ormond came with a burst of 7 goals in the final term to hit the front shortly before the siren.

Poor shooting for goal proved costly for St. Bernard's who had four more scoring shots than De La Salle. "De La's" determination earned them four goals in each of the second and third quarters and they held St. Bernard's off in a tight last term.

Apart from a scrambly first quarter, it was a good game to watch, with little between the scores all day.

North Old Boys finished well to beat University Blacks by 2 goals and a burst of 8 goals in the third quarter was mainly responsible for Caulfield Grammarians' 27-point win over University Blues.

Ivanhoe shocked Old Paradians, winning by more than 7 goals, Old Melburnians continued their run of success by easily accounting for Res-

ervoir Old Boys and Geelong suffered another heavy defeat, this time by Monash Blues.

Lowly Old Carey toppled Old Xaverians by 16 points (with 16 more scoring shots), Alphington crashed badly against bottom team Power House, and State Bank went down to St. Kevin's by 29 points.

Old Mentonians beat North Brunswick by 10 points and Heatherton beat Beverley Hills by 13. Bulleen-Templestowe "pipped" Commonwealth Bank by 4 points and Footscray Techlost their third in a row, going down to St. Bede's by 20 points.

In Junior games, University Blacks won comfortably over Monash, North Old Boys were too strong for St. Bernard's, Hampton Rovers beat De La Salle and Kew had their first win since entering the competition, at the expense of Melbourne High.

Several top four teams in the Reserves were beaten — Ormond, St. Bernard's, the Blacks, Collegians, Melbourne High, State Bank, Old Geelong, Beverley Hills, North Brunswick, Commonwealth Bank and Footscray Tech., many of them by teams outside the fours,





UMPIRE'S CORNER

HOW TO TACKLE

Tackling, an important and vital part of a competent Aussie Rules footballer, is a learned and consistently practised art. Much incorrect tackling takes place during the course of four quarters.

Coaches and many officials should keep well in mind how a player may be tackled, bumped, checked, held or pushed and con-centrate on improving the skills technique of this facet of our national body contact

game.

PLAYER WITHOUT THE BALL — He may be fairly checked, shepherded, bumped, pushed, but not held by an opponent, by the use of the hip, shoulder, chest, arms or open hands provided that the ball is within five yards. The player must not be held or pushed on top of the shoulder, neck, face, head or below the knee or pushed in the head or below the knee or pushed in the

back.

PLAYER WITH THE BALL — He may be fairly checked, bumped, held, tackled or pushed by an opponent by the use of chest, arms, hip, shoulder or open hands provided he is not held or pushed on top of the shoulder, neck, head, face or below the knees or pushed in the back.

If a player with the ball is tackled for the behind and at the same time pushed in the

behind and at the same time pushed in the back or ridden into the ground, a free kick

should be awarded for "in the back". Even if a player fails to dispose of the ball the decision should be "in the back" not "holding the ball".

The use of the elbow, forearm, or fist to intercept an opponent is not punishable irrespective of whether contact is made or

If, in the opinion of the umpire, the action is deliberate such a breach of the "laws of the game" is a reportable of-

A player in possession of the ball may be held by an opponent by any part of his uniform or body above the knee and below the top of the shoulder including the hand and any part of the arm.
