● LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

NORTH CRUSH ST. BERNARD'S ORMOND FAIL AGAINST CAULFIELD GRAM. MORE LEADERS SUFFER FIRST DEFEAT

North Old Boys showed their position at the top of the ladder is justified when they inflicted a crushing defeat on St. Bernard's (who were runners-up to them in 1976) in the game at Elsternwick Park last week.

Five goals against the wind in the second term was a big factor in Caulfield Grammarians' 28-point win over Ormond.

Four more leading teams who started the day unbeaten were on the wrong side of the ledger at the final siren — West Brunswick (Seniors and Reserves) Bulleen-Templestowe and Old Brighton Reserves.

St. Bernard's started well with the wind and had 5 goals on the board before North scored, but North's 2 goals shortly before quarter-time nullified Saint's use of the wind to some degree.

North gradually gained control in the second term, when they added 7-9 to 1-2, and were 23 points in front at the interval. They clinched it in the third quarter when they allowed St. Bernard's to reduce their leeway by only 2 points, and it was all North in the last as they went on to win by nearly 10 goals.

Caulfield also sealed Ormond's fate in the third term, when after leading by 27 points at half-time they rattled on 8 goals to gain a commanding lead.

Ormond began the last quarter with 3 quick goals but then Caulfield held them off and won comfortably.

De La Salle were much too strong for University Blues, Marcellin had a big win over Coburg and University broke their "drought" when they overwhelmed Old Trinity.

Old Paradians suffered their second successive defeat, going down to Mon-

ash Blues by 21 points, and losing top place to them as well.

Hampton Rovers beat Parkside by a point and Fawkner had an easy win over AJAX while Melbourne High ran Old Xaverians to 2 goals.

A contrast in kicking gave St. Kevin's an easy win over Old Camberwell (16-9 to 9-16), and State Bank went down to Power House by 17 points.

West Brunswick were well beaten by Beverley Hills, who kicked 18-5, and Bulleen-Templestowe (17-18) went down by 2 points to Footscray Tech. (18-14). Bulleen United beat Thornbury by more than 8 goals.

In the Juniors, University Blues beat North Old Boys by 4 goals and Hampton Rovers had a big win over West Brunswick.

Nine "top four" teams in the Reserves were beaten — St. Bernard's, Old Melburnians (a point by Old Haileybury), St. Kilda CBC, Parkside, Melbourne High, Old Brighton, Old Camberwell, West Brunswick and Glenroy.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

The "Battle for the finals" has created a tipster's nightmare over the past couple of weeks — at that stage I thought the top four was fairly well settled. How wrong I was — St. Bernards are now in the hot seat and Caulfield, Marcellin and perhaps the Blacks have all emerged as competent challengers.

But University Blacks may have their hopes dimmed today. The visit to Marcellin will not be a happy one. The brilliance of Tony King and the steadiness of Simon Costello will not overcome the splendid everness of an all-round Marcellin.

The result will be close and it would not surprise if the Blacks recent form provided an upset.

St. Bernard's will need to account for University Blues in relentless fashion at Elsternwick Park — Mark Tyquin and Mike Sleeman are doing well each week for the Blues but they don't have the numbers.

I don't however expect St. Bernard's to register more than a marginal win but their percentage should still hold their loose grip on fourth place.

Caulfield Grammarians, with all those established names like Greg Tootell, John Butcher, Barry Morphet, John Griffiths and Tony Lester really firing are now shaping themselves for a run to the top. Coburg are improving but not sufficiently to worry Caulfield today.

Same must be said of Old Trinity — I don't envy their task at trying to stop talented North Old Boys. Ould is on target up forward but what's happened to the ever-green Les Murray? North will win this one with ease.

Now for the big one — Ormond and De La Salle. If it was at De La Salle there is little doubt the home team would win. But following a loss, Ormond will be a different proposition when it returns to its big partisan home ground following.

I should pick Ormond — Roger Wood is certainly disappointed at not notching a win for his memorable 200th. There is plenty of talent at Ormond.

But De La Salle's form has been steadier. They will win a really tight contest.

B SECTION

Newly established Section leaders Monash Blues strike a tough nut in Old Scotch and will have to fight hard to maintain their position.

I think they will do it through their more mobile rucks, provided they can counter Old Scotch's Sherwen.

Last round losers Reservoir and Geelong should be evenly matched for their tussle out at Reservoir. The home side have let me down recently so I'll try my luck with Geelong this week.

St. Kilda are at home to keen rivals Old Paradians. Ross Duke is in fine form and providing great drive around the packs. Steve Kohut is getting first use of the ball for Paradians and I think they will take out the points in an interesting match.

Collegians won a close one last week and are not playing all that convincingly of late. I think that they will find Old Halleyburians ruck pack lead by John Houghton a bit much to handle, and the "Berries" should snatch a morale-boosting win.

Old Melburnians and Ivanhoe are both playing very impressively and looking very much like final four material to me. This game is very important to both clubs as the loser will drop their momentum.

As I can produce no logical argument in support of my choice, I'll support O.M.'s because of their home ground advantage.

Melbourne High went close last week against Old Xavs but I can't see them producing the goods against AJAX who will be keen to win after their drubbing by Fawkner. AJAX are two from top spot and must win to keep their double chance hopes alive.

Old Ivanhoe had a strong win against Old Carey but will find Old Xavs too much of a handful. Old Xavs half back line has been a driving force all year and will prove a stumbling block for old 1's.

Fawkner look the form side at the moment and will be jealously guarding top spot. Despite Kew's home ground advantage Fawkner should win well.

UHSOB, top scorers last week, meet Hampton Rovers in what should be the closest game of the round. Both sides are on equal points and knocking on the door of the four but Hampton Rovers look the goods.

Parkside's inaccurate kicking cost them the game in a thriller against Hampton Rovers last week. Old Carey let me down, as I thought they had turned the corner but obviously more effort is required against a top four side. It's Parkside for me.

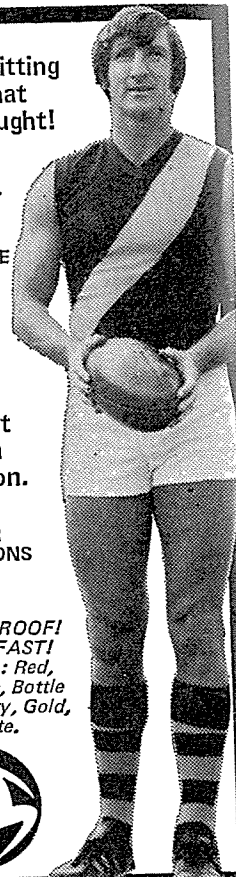

UMPIRE'S CORNER

FREE KICKS

A free kick is a penalty imposed by the field umpire against a player who commits a breach of the "Laws of the Game" and is indicated by the umpire blasting his whistle. Unless indicated otherwise a "free" is award to the nearest opponent and should be awarded against a player who

1. Kicks the ball out of bounds on the full.
2. Kicks the ball out of bounds without it having been touched by another player when kicking off after a behind has been scored.
3. Encroaches within the circle or interferes with an opponent when the ball is being bounced by the field umpire.
4. Deliberately holds back or throws an opponent after the opponent has legitimately disposed of the ball.
5. Wilfully wastes time.
6. Unduly interferes with the bouncing of the ball by the field umpire.
7. Interferes with an opponent from the time the ball goes out of bounds until the ball, after being thrown in by the boundary umpire, makes contact with a player on the ground.
8. Wilfully kicks, handballs or forces the ball out of bounds without it being touched by any other player. In such instances the ball need not cross the boundary line on the full.
9. Trips an opponent.
10. Throws or hands the ball to a teammate whilst the ball is in play. If the ball is thrown or handed to an opponent the field umpire "may" award a free kick to the opponent.
11. Kicks in a manner likely to cause injury to an opponent.
12. Strikes an opponent.
13. Slings an opponent.
14. Holds an opponent below the knee or by the neck, head or top of shoulder.
15. Charges an opponent.
16. Pushes an opponent from behind in any way except when a player is legitimately going for a mark and "unintentionally" interferes with an opponent from behind.
17. Pushes an opponent in the face.
18. Holds an opponent who is not in possession of the ball.
19. Encroaches within the centre square — the field umpire will award the free to be taken from the centre of the ground by an opponent designated by him.
20. Holds the ball after being given a reasonable time to dispose of it when firmly held (legitimately) by an opponent.
21. Runs more than 10 yards with the ball without bouncing or touching the ball to the ground.
22. Shepherds an opponent when the ball

is more than 5 yards away or is out of bounds.

24. Infringes any of the laws between the time the field umpire sound his whistle and bounces the ball to start the second, third, and fourth quarters.

It is wise and in a club's best interest that coaches, officials and all players familiarise themselves fully and become wisely conversant with the "Reasons for free kicks" facet of our game.

Many inexperienced and less skilful players look for helpful guidance from the coach and club officials who with a positive approach can decidedly assist the player who primarily makes the ball his sole and only objective. With an increase in the "positive approach" players our game will be greatly enhanced.

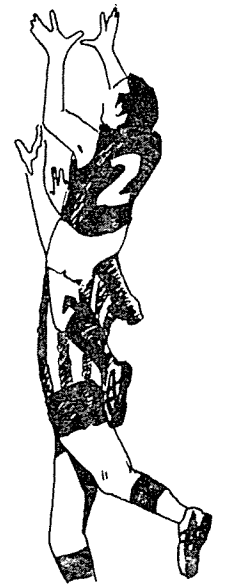
