LAST ROUND HIGHLIGHTS

VIC'S GREAT THIRD TERM BRINGS WIN OVER S.A. CLOSER IN TASMANIA, BUT VICTORIA HOME PLENTY OF UPSETS ON LOCAL SCENE

A magnificent third quarter by Victoria, when they added 9-1 to South Australia's 1-2, gave them a 41-point win in the Interstate game at Adelaide last Sunday. The first half was even with South Australia five points in front at the interval.

At Launceston ,it was the second quarter in which the Victorians gained a winning break of five goals and this team went on to beat Tasmania by

The last round in Melbourne a fortnight ago provided some surprises, most notable being the defeat of Monash Blues, Old Paradians, Old Xaverians, Fawkner and Beverlev Hills.

Victoria's win was some consolation for the defeat by South Australia in the Carnival last year, but we still have to prove that we can beat the other three states in turn to win a Carnival — we haven't done that since 1967, in Launceston. South Australia have won the three staged since then — 1970 (Perth), 1973 (Melbourne) and 1976 (Adelaide).

Can we break their run of success at Hobart in 1979?

University Blacks climbed closer to the four when they made better use of the wind to beat Marcellin by 33 points, and De La Salle, with superior handball and kicking and their ability to play a full game of sustained football never allowed Ormond to get into the picture.

"De La" won by just over 8 goals.

University Blues showed their best form for the season in putting up a creditable performance against St. Bernard's, although beaten by 34 points in a high-scoring game. St. Bernard's won it with a burst of 8 goals in the second quarter.

Ormond's defeat knocked them out of the four, their place going to Caul-

field Grammarians, who beat an inaccurate Coburg by 5 goals.

Old Scotch thrashed Monash Blues to the tune of more than 11 goals and St. Kilda CBC's accurate kicking (16-5) gave them an 11-point win over Par-

Ivanhoe proved too strong for Old Melburnians, who went down by more than 5 goals.

Old Ivanhoe beat Old Xav's by 7 points, Kew shocked Fawkner to win by 10 points and Uni. High's poor shooting compared with Hampton Rovers' accuracy accounted for their 2-goal defeat.

Old Geelong beat Elsternwick by 8 points in a high-scoring affair, Assumption ran leaders Alphington to 15 points, and Old Brighton had to be content with a draw against St. Kevin's.

Heatherton beat Old Mentonians by 7 points, ANZ Bank had 23 points to spare over Beverley Hills, and Commonwealth Bank proved they were in business with a big win over Bulleen United.

In Junior games, Ivanhoe won easily from University Blacks, the Blues beat St. Bernard's by 3 goals and Kew beat West Brunswick by 19 points.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

REPORTING OF OFFFENCES

On every occasion when a player (or official) of a club is reported the umpire MUST have actually seen the offence committed and must not guess or suspect what may have occurred when reporting. The may nave occurred when reporting. The umpire therefore must be certain that the particular offence was committed.

If there is any doubt in the umpire's

mind the benefit of the doubt must be

given to the player.
The "LAWS OF THE GAME" also state that umpires shall not take into account any question as to whether the offending

player received provocation or not.
The Rules of Australian Football provide that umpires shall report to the controlling body any player who commits the following offences:

Disputes the decision of the umpire; Assaults another player;

Violently pushes an opponent after

such player has had his kick;
D. Throws an opponent after that player has taken a mark or after the ball is

otherwise out of play.

E. Intentionally trips or kicks of attempts

to kick or trip an opponent.

F. Strikes or attempts to strike a player either with his hand or arm (It is not necessary for the hand to be clenched for the offence to be reportable. The elbow or forearm is regarded as the arm).

G. Remains on the playing ground not wearing the proper uniform afte; being cautioned by the field umpire.

cautioned by the field umpire.

H. Wears any equipment which may cause injury to other players.

I. Uses abusive, threatening or insulting language, or otherwise misconducts himself during the progress of the match or within the oval on the day of the match.

J. Shakes the goal post while another player is preparing to kick for goal or while the ball is in transit

player is preparing to kick for goal or while the ball is in transit.

K. Unduly interferes with, or assults, or uses abusive, insulting or threatening language or behaviour towards an umpire during the progress of the match, or within or without the oval on the day of the match. (It should be noted that a player or official may be reported for any of the abovementioned offences if they occur at any time of the day on which the match is played.

mentioned offences if they occur at any time of the day on which the match is played, irrespective of where the umpire may be at the time of the offence).

L. Unduly interferes with a player whilst such player is kicking for goal; e.g. a player taking a kick for goal, after being awarded a mark or free kick, is interfered with an opponent throwing any material or oban opponent throwing any material or object at the player to interfere with his kick.

M. Is guilty of unduly rough play.

N. Wilfully wastes time.

Charges an opponent.

Coaches, players, and club officials should familiarise themselves with those snould raminarise themselves with those offences which may lead to a report. Also they should be aware of the definition of "charging", "tripping", "throwing", "slinging", "shepherding" etc. so that ignorance is not a weak excuse for "I didn't know".

In reporting players or/and officials umin reporting players or and officials umpires are carrying out a normal requirement of our great game and treat it as part of their umpiring duties. Umpires like players, are only human and are continually being criticised. Any umpire worth his salt would never lodge a report unless he was certain the offence was committed,

Unfortunately some players admit their inability to beat their opponent by superior skill and ability and resort to actions which lead umpires to carry out the in-structions set down in Rules 28 and 29.
