## Editorial

# BLUES THREE GAMES CLEAR OLD MELBURNIANS STILL UNDEFEATED DE LA JUNIORS BACK ON TOP

Last Saturday's round has left Old Melburnians — B Section — as the only undefeated Senior team. In the Reserves Section both Old Melburnians (B) and Old Brighton (C) are still unbeaten, as are North Old Boys in Junior One. Sweep honours went to De La Salle in Junior Two (again) when they won handsomely over West Brunswick and so regained top spot in the Section.

The day's thrills were provided by A Section's University Blacks, who, having an eight point lead over De La Salle at three-quarter time, could only manage one goal six in the last quarter to De La Salle's three goals two. The Blacks had to be content with shared points from a game that they could have won.

University Blues won well over Caulfield and have now established a three game lead over the rest. Old Scotch contributed to the Blues lead when they went down to Ormond by nearly nine goals.

My spies tell me that Ormond put on a magnificent display of team football all day. It certainly appears that they have pulled their game together and are now lying in fifth spot, two points out of the four.

Ivanhoe moved back into third place when they accounted for Marcellin, who must be having those relegation nightmares even more vividly.

The section's other slow-beginning — North Old Boys — seem to be back in step but are still sixth despite their nine goal win over St. Bernard's, who are starting to have **those** dreams too.

In B Section Fawkner looked set to overthrow Old Melburnians at three-quarter time. They had led at each change — the margin being sixteen points at the last. However, they were no match for O.M.'s onslaught in the final term scoring only three goals two to eight goals ten. O.M.'s emerged victorious by twenty-two points to retain their championship hopes.

Collegians will be looking forward to the 'Bye' today to regain some of the form sadly lacking last week against Parksides, when they were held goal-less in two quarters. Parkside missed the chance of boosting their percentage however when they recorded an inaccurate nine goals fifteen behinds.

Old Paradians moved back into second spot when they scored shakily over Old Trinity by thirty-four points. They too were inaccurate though and amassed twenty-two behinds for the day (and sixteen goals).

A scoreless third term probably cost Old Haileybury the points in their match against Monash Blues. O.H.'s led by thirteen points at half-time, trailed by eight at three-quarter time and lost the game by two goals — and, thus, missed an opportunity to move into the four.

Alphington slipped into the C Section four when they proved too strong for Kew — particularly after half-time — and recorded an eleven point win.

Old Brighton's defeat by A.J.A.X. assisted Alphington's move. Scores were level at half-time in this match but A.J.A.X. emerged by twenty-nine points after a total of only one goal five had been recorded in the third term.

Geelong cemented their hold on the third spot with an eleven goal win over Hampton Rovers — who, if nothing else, were accurate, scoring five goals straight.

Old Carey's twenty-seven point win over Old Ivanhoe had a two-fold result. It allowed them to move off the bottom rung at last and virtually ended Ivanhoe's hopes of making the final four—they are now two games out. The Carey-Kew clash today should provide some excitement as the victor will have the better chance of avoiding relegation.

St. Kilda returned to the winning list with a 'bang' — recording an eighty-eight point win over Old Xaverians who could not match them at any stage.

Melbourne High Old Boys (D Section) provided the upset of the day when they held Section leader Old Camberwell goal-less throughout to win by eight goals. The Camberwell forwards will be out to avenge this humiliation today when they travel to Heatherton.

Country Colleges kept their finals chances glimmering when they defeated State Bank by six goals. (The defeat also cost State Bank their place in the four.)

West Brunswick returned to the winning list after a long run of 'outs' when they accounted for University High by thirty-one points.

St. Kevin's strengthened their place in the four when they scored by fourteen points over Elsternwick, who have become isolated in ninth spot.

Power House led comfortably all day over Heatherton and went on to score by five goals, thereby consolidating their hold on the number two position.

E Section's Old Geelong moved into third place when they won by eighty-six points over A.N.Z. Bank, after leading all day.

Late starters La Trobe are now seventh following their nine point win over North Brunswick, who have not regained their earlier form.

St. Bede's retained the top place when they led Old Mentonians for most of the day and won by forty points. They are still closely pressed by Bulleen-Templestowe who kept in touch by scoring over Beverley Hills (then third now fourth).

A.M.P. kept their hopes for the four alive when they defeated Brunswick by ten goals and so moved into fifth spot—out on percentage only.

Bulleen United staged the F Section upset when they bettered previously undefeated Thornbury by two goals. They led all day to do so.

Therry moved two games clear in fourth position when they defeated Footscray (by six goals) and University Reds accounted for National Bank by twelve goals. The Reds have improved recently — but have left their run too late it appears.

Clayton recorded their second win when they defeated Monash Whites again, this time by thirty-four points.

Junior Section One results saw North Old Boys again victorious, this time over Monash University. The margin of defeat cost Monash their place in the four.

Hampton Rovers defeated Old Scotch by two points. The closeness allowed Scotch to move into the four (replacing Monash).

Ivanhoe and University Blues changed places when the Blues went down to Ivanhoe by thirty-seven points.

University Blacks kept their hopes of remaining in Junior One when they accounted for St. Bernard's (eighth) by five goals, thus levelling their respective match points.

Ormond moved into sixth place when they scored handsomely over Geelong — despite a slow beginning.

De La Salle's big win over West Brunswick in Junior Two, together with Coburg's defeat of Old Haileybury, sees De La Salle back on top — a game clear.

Kew stayed with Coburg when they led Fawkner comfortably all day to record a seventeen and a half goal win over Fawkner.

Old Paradians' seven goals in the first quarter kicked them off towards their one hundred point victory over Caulfield, whilst Melbourne High scored seven goals in the second quarter (and none in the last!) on the way to their twenty-seven point win over Therry.

#### A SECTION
