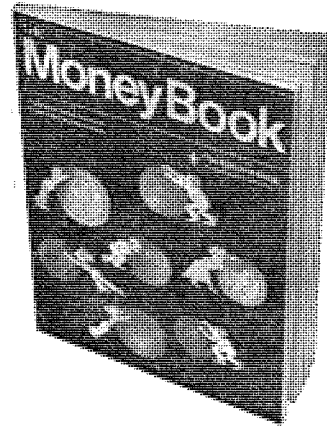

# NORTH OLD BOYS RESUME "A" CHARGE

## LA TROBE TOPPLE "E" LEADER

Last week's round was basically one of percentage-boosting for the winners, with most games providing decisive results. Most advantage was taken by Reserves teams Beverley Hills (E) and Old Melburnians (B) who both managed to keep their opposition scoreless.

The tightest game in A Section was that between Caulfield Grammarians and Ormond. Caulfield emerged victorious by ten points. But the margin might just as well have been ten goals for the effect that the loss had on Ormond's aspirations. And that three goals nine in the last quarter would have done nothing for the confidence of Ormond's forwards. After trailing at half-time, De La Salle came home strongly to win by five goals over Marcellin and so move up to third place again. The team in the "hot spot" currently is Old Scotch after their eight goal defeat at the hands of Ivanhoe last week. Ivanhoe, after a severe mid-season slump, have returned with a vengeance and are now second. North Old Boys resumed their forward thrust with a timely eight goal victory over Section leader University Blues. North led convincingly all day and are now only one game out of the four. St. Bernard's moved off the bottom again and put University Blacks back there when the Saints won their clash by three goals.

In B Section, Old Melburnians returned strongly to defeat Coburg by sixteen goals, after leading by sixty-four points at quarter-time. Old Paradians tighten their grasp on the second spot with yet another good win — this time over Fawkner, who trailed all day. After being fourteen points down at half-time, Old Trinity ran all over Collegians to win by fifty points. Trinity kicked thirteen goals seven to Collegians three-three in the second half of the match. Parkside, again, nearly let the points slip away with an inaccurate last quarter in their game with Monash Blues, who put up a valiant effort in scoring six-one in the last term — but they still failed to bridge the gap.

C Section sees A.J.A.X. now a game clear of the field after their defeat of Kew and St. Kilda's loss to Hampton Rovers. A.J.A.X. led Kew all day to record their nine goal win, whilst St. Kilda trailed by three points at the big interval — having led by eight at the first. Hampton proved too good thereafter and won by fourteen points — undoubtedly assisted by yet another fine display of goal-scoring accuracy. Alphington's twenty-two point win over Old Carey enabled them to retain fourth place but they must keep winning — only percentage separates them from Old Xaverians.

Geelong consolidated in third place — and are now looking at second — with their win over Old Brighton in a low and inaccurate scoring game. Old Xaverians remained in contention and gave their lowly percentage a boost when they defeated Old Ivanhoe by seventy-six points.

St. Kevin's, in D Section, played the game right out last week against Heatherton when they won by twenty-seven points after leading by only three at the last change. Melbourne High proved too strong for West Brunswick after half-time and scored by thirty-nine points. University High were led comfortably by State Bank all day and the Bankers eighty-six point win sees them back in the four — at the expense of M.H.S.O.B. Inaccuracy was the key-note again for Country Colleges in their seven goal win over Elsternwick, though their percentage is in sight of balance now. Power House regained the top spot and a game break when they accounted for a slumping Old Camberwell by sixteen points.

The E Section coup was delivered by La Trobe Blacks when they toppled previous leader St. Bede's by three goals. The Blacks are still fifth on percentage — but in with a definite chance. Bulleen-Templestowe regained the top position when they defeated North Brunswick by fifty points. Old Geelong scraped home by four points to retain fourth spot after a closely fought tussle with Old Mentonians. Beverley Hills' ninety-four point win over Brunswick sees them now firmly ensconced in third place — a game clear. A.M.P. kept their slim finals hopes alive when they defeated A.N.Z. Bank by twenty-seven points.

In F Section, Thornbury retained the top position when they led Clayton all day to score by one hundred and four points, thus ending Clayton's recent run of wins. Bulleen United's seventy point victory over University Reds sees them holding second spot by two points from Commonwealth Bank who, also, scored handsomely over the opposition Bank — National. Therry won well over Monash Whites after a slow start to consolidate their fourth place and it is now difficult to envisage any change in this top four.

North Old Boys in Junior One continued their winning sequence — at the expense of University Blacks last week. Old Scotch and

Ivanhoe changed places when Scotch won their "see-sawing" struggle by six points; whilst Ormond kept their hopes alive when they defeated University Blues by four points. Monash also still have a slim chance of making it following their forty-five point win over Hampton Rovers. St. Bernard's forty point defeat of Geelong now sees them a game clear of the relegation zone.

## A MANAGER REFLECTS

It was the morning after the Interstate games at Elsternwick Park on June 4th. I knew by the size of my headache it had been a great day and night.

My first thought was "thank goodness that's over". It had been many months of planning and hard work but the two great wins by our Victorian teams had made it all worth while.

As I reflected back to the number of people and clubs who had contributed, I realised what a truly V.A.F.A. day it had been.

It started for me two years ago at the 1976 A.A.F.C. Carnival in Adelaide. As manager of the Victorian team I had to stand by and watch our State side being defeated by the South Australians. The loss filled me with a sense of anger.

This must not happen again — but what could we do about it?

Where could we improve ourselves?

I sat through several unofficial meetings with coach Peter O'Donohue and selector Don McQueen. From these discussions a plan was formed that we hoped would enable us to win next year's Carnival series in Hobart.

Our thoughts were presented to the Executive Committee and they endorsed most of them.

The first step was the appointment of a permanent State coach. The thought was that a State coach without club ties would have a far better chance of viewing players on the field each week and knowing exactly what type of footballers were available.

Peter O'Donohue sacrificed his position as Coach of the University Blacks, to accept the appointment as State coach.

The next step was the appointment of a Selection Committee that could actively support the Victorian coach. These men would be required to view at least two games each week, which meant that between them the selection panel would see over 400 players in action every Saturday. The men chosen to fill this demanding role this season were Don McQueen (Chairman) from Old Haileybury, "Jack" Clancy (North Old Boys), "Jocka" Nelson (M.H.S.O.B.) and "Bill" Brown (Coburg). Bernie Sheehy, who is Coach of the De La Salle club, was chosen as Assistant to Peter O'Donohue. This appointment proved a stroke of genius. He captured our imagination with his knowledge and enthusiasm.

In Junior Two, De La Salle slipped from first to third when they were overrun by Coburg in the last quarter. The win puts Coburg on top — three percent ahead of Kew who won well over Caulfield — by eighteen goals. Old Haileybury's five goal win over Old Paradians now gives them a three game break over that team in fourth place. In the other games Fawker scored by thirty-four points over Therry and M.H.S.O.B. led West Brunswick all day to record a sixty-three point victory.

Here we had a group who not only knew football, but also understood footballers.

I sat through their first major selection meeting which started one Friday evening at 6.45 p.m. and concluded at midnight. I was amazed at the depth of their thinking and knowledge of individual players. I understand that each selector sat through over 40 hours of discussions before the final teams were chosen.

The South Australian Amateur Football League had impressed me with the way they utilised the facilities and resources of their member clubs when they played host. This policy was adopted by us and it proved a winner.

The next important step was the appointment of the V.A.F.A. Social Committee as the main back-up group to the selectors.

Members of the Social Committee were present at all training nights, Sunday workouts and practice matches of the Victorian squad. Their role was to provide food, refreshments, barbecues etc. The thought being this would enable players to meet socially, get to know each other better and promote the thought of Victorian selection.

The Caulfield Grammarians ground was chosen as our mid-week training venue. The Caulfield club responded magnificently. They ensured food and refreshments were available each night. I know some of these nights became quite lengthy.

On the odd night the Caulfield ground was unavailable the State Bank club allowed us to use their excellent ground and clubrooms — complete with refreshments.

At this stage the Social Committee was holding 7 a.m. breakfast meetings at the R.A.C.V. club. It was decided to ask the Power House club to act as hosts and caterers to the four teams and their supporters after things ended at Elsternwick Park.

The Power House club was delighted to accept. This meant five meetings with Steve Mason (Power House Secretary) working out details for the night.

The Executive had appointed a committee headed by John Adams (North Old Boys) and John Miles (Ivanhoe) to manage arrangements for the big day.

They invited the Ivanhoe Club to act as caterers at Elsternwick Park.

I have never seen two functions handled so well. The two clubs were quite incredible.

Ivanhoe left no stone unturned to make this day a success. A refrigerated van to keep refreshments cold and three large spits with sides of beef roasting were just a couple of the highlights. The layout and presentation of the luncheon in the rooms was perfect. After the game they catered for a crowd which packed the rooms.

Then it was back to the huge Power House complex on Albert Park Lake. The night just had to be the finest night we have ever presented our visitors after an interstate match.

As I walked into the upstairs dining room for our evening meal and presentations, I could not help but feel proud to be part of the scene. The room looked magnificent. Afterwards we journeyed downstairs to a Disco Night which just topped off a wonderful day. I am sure our visitors were delighted with our Victorian hospitality.

The two clubs must have put hours of hard work into these functions.

That last week had been quite hectic. Our Social Secretary, Mr. Clarrie Middling (Coburg), had arranged a night at the Masonic Club for all players to enjoy a dinner and refreshments.

At this dinner the jumpers were presented to the lucky players who made the final teams.

The Executive Committee, by this stage, were totally involved. Apart from attending training sessions, they were at the airport to greet our visitors. Courtesy cars were made available to the visiting team managers. On the Friday night a dinner was held at the Kooyong Club to welcome our visiting officials.

Saturday morning involved a meeting of all States participating in the games. This was followed by a meeting of A.A.F.C. officials and delegates present. This was held at the N.M.F.C.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

What a round of upsets! Last week's results were the most topsy-turvy of the entire season and have thrown the whole competition into a state of flux. The top side, Uni. Blues, was decisively beaten by North Old Boys and Old Scotch dropped from second to fourth after a hiding by Ivanhoe.

To further confuse your Tipster, Caulfield Grammarians accounted for Ormond, who, up to a couple of weeks ago, looked certain to get into the Four.

St. Bernard's O.C. climbed off the bottom of the ladder with a three goal win over Uni. Blues whilst De La Salle consolidated their position in the Four by containing Marcellin.

It just serves to illustrate what was said last week — that no team in the Four can afford to rest on their laurels.

It was interesting to note that four out of the five winning teams were playing on their home grounds, which would indicate that the home ground advantages are vital at this stage of the year.

The team that seems to be on the skids at the present time amongst the leaders is Old Scotch, who have only won one game in the last four. Their position in the Four is very tenuous and they have North O.B. breathing down their necks.

The big improvers in the competition at the moment are Caulfield Grammarians, who, only a few weeks ago, were in dire danger of relegation but who are now well within striking distance of the Four on present form indications.

This round produces the game between Uni. Blues and Ivanhoe, the two top teams at present. Ivanhoe were in great form against Old Scotch with fine contributions from Simpson, Sheppard, Jones and Robertson. Ivanhoe, who have a relatively poor percentage, realise that if they lose this game their position in second spot is likely to be taken over. Uni. Blues, after a very humiliating defeat by North Melbourne O.B., will be anxious to regain some lost prestige and prevent themselves from falling into a slide. They will have the advantage of the home ground on this occasion and I fancy that Coach Salter will have read the riot act to his players during the week.

I am tipping Uni. Blues to defeat Ivanhoe in what should be a close and exciting game.

St. Bernard's O.C. meet De La Salle O.C. at the Saints home ground. Last time these two teams met, St. Bernard's scored a surprise victory over their rivals. The Saints have been heartened by Mick Mahoney who kicked six goals last week and are hoping that he can maintain some consistent form. De La Salle, on the other hand, have Groves and Beddoe in good form and know that they must keep winning to secure their position near the top of the ladder. I believe that De La Salle will be too experienced and will defeat St. Bernard's.

Old Scotch Collegians meet Uni. Blacks at Old Scotch. Old Scotch, if not desperate

before, would have to be doubly so at this stage. They realise that they cannot afford another loss and they meet Uni. Blacks who know they must keep winning to avoid relegation. I am relying on Old Scotch's strength, particularly in the ruck and marking divisions, to give them the points over Uni. Blacks in this match.

Another good game is that between Ormond and North O.B. North has struck great form and their forwards, if not put under great pressure, consistently win games for them. O'Connor is equal leading goalkicker for the year and will have to be contained by Ormond if the home side hope to win. Ormond has suffered a slight slump in form and must win this game to keep in touch with the contenders for the Final Four. However, despite their home ground advantage, I cannot see them defeating North O.B. who have staged a great second half revival.

Marcellin O.C. meet Caulfield Grammarians at Marcellin in what must be a do or die game for Marcellin in order for them to avoid relegation. Cummings, Gregory and Gartner showed great form for Marcellin last week against De La Salle. On the other hand, Caulfield Grammarians are the improvers at this stage of the season and will be equally determined to keep up their winning run. Good form is being shown by Fletcher, Tootell and Long for Caulfield and I feel their goal-kicking power will give them sufficient drive to defeat Marcellin.

pressure to the fast improving Old Trinity. I watched Haileybury two weeks back and they played the game right out. Good rucks, a strong centre line and some big grabs in front of goal make them hard to beat.

Old Trinity have hit their straps at the right time and are poised for a big climb up the ladder.

I have to make a choice so I'll go for the home side, Haileybury, to run out winners in what should be a great game.

Old Paradians continued on their winning way with a good win over Fawknor last Saturday.

Today they play host to Monash Blues at Bundoora. Paradians will be trying for their sixth win in a row and will be hard to beat. Monash lost to Parkside at the Uni. last week. They would have to show a complete reversal of form to win this one.

Paradians' confidence must be sky high and rightly so. I don't believe they will let this one slip away from them. It should be a good win for Old Paradians.

Parkside chalked up their first win away from home last week and today have the bye. They are taking the opportunity to have a re-match with Bulleen United. The last time these teams met "F" troopers Bulleen proved too strong for Parkside. The "Bulls" have done everything right since then so it should be a good work-out for both clubs.

## C SECTION

Those upsets are still occurring in C Section — this time it was Hampton Rovers toppling St. Kilda. That is the second time Hampton have "surprised" and they are determined to avoid relegation and keep alive any Final Four chances.

St. Kilda have now lost three games in quick succession and may be having a slump. Today they strike Alphington, who will be easier for St. Kilda on its home ground than I envisage would be the case if it were at Alphington.

Alphington struggled to eclipse Old Carey last week — they appear to rely too much on proven stars Bromley and Candy.

St. Kilda's all-round strength should enable it to halt its slide and retain its grip on second place.

Geelong slithered it way to an inaccurate, but handy, twenty-five point win over Old Brighton last week. It is the most determined Geelong side I can recall and must continue to improve that percentage if it is to stay in the race for the coveted double chance. I expect that Geelong's form will enable them to win well over Old Ivanhoe today — my bias naturally expects that the win will boost its percentage past the rating of St. Kilda.

N. Brimacombe and the Old Xaverians have already lifted and Curtain got a bag of goals the other week to give Xavs a tight grip on fifth place. But that wobbly percentage of 67.8 still locks them out of the Four. Even at Kew, the home team will not beat the rejuvenated Old Xaverians. However, Kew showed

last week that it was able to test A.J.A.X. and it may be in similar mood today.

Old Brighton and Hampton Rovers — this is a puzzle! Every week I select against Hampton, they make me eat my words. I have seen both teams play during the past three weeks — I consider Old Brighton the better combination. Perhaps they are a "dry-day" outfit. But, I believe their biggest trouble at the moment is that they have forgotten the winning formula.

I predict that formula will return today. I cannot see Hampton holding Brighton stars Warnock, Priestley and Jones for the entire game at Brighton Beach.

This is the closest A.J.A.X. have ever been to B Section — one game clear on top of C Section. They are definitely the team deserving of "ladder leader", but there are a few "ifs" before I back them all the way for the Grand Final. However, I can't see them slipping against Old Carey at Bulleen today.

The winner of this game could really ensure a Finals berth. 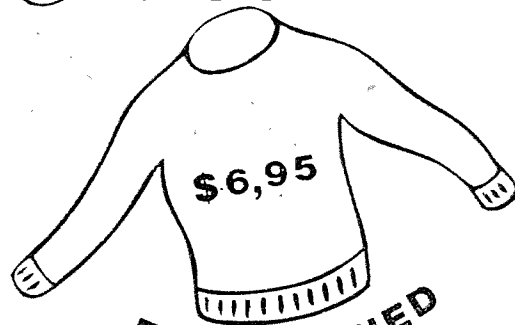

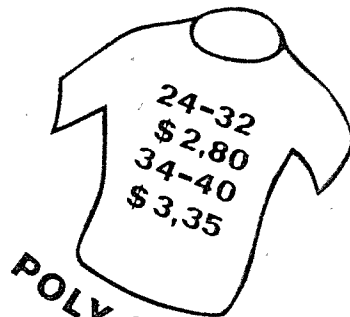
