

Editorial

A LOOK AT THE RESERVE FOURS ALL STILL LIABLE TO ALTERATION

At the risk of incurring the displeasure of the Senior and Junior Sections which have provided editorial material for most of the season, this week looks at the six Reserve Sections and their final four contests.

A Reserve is as open as its Senior counterpart. St. Bernard's with a win last week now have a game break over University Blues (who were narrowly beaten by the Blacks) and Ormond who defeated Ivanhoe. Ivanhoe are fortunate indeed to be in the four and have Caulfield to thank. The Grammar boys notched their first win for the season when they bettered North Old Boys, who are fifth — nine per cent behind Ivan-hoe. The issue will be resolved today, however, when North Old Boys play host to Ivanhoe. The loser will be a game behind. Marcellin (equal fourth but sixth on percentage) must win well when they visit Old Scotch, today, to stay in contention and to boost their lowly percentage.

Fawkner, in **B Reserve**, are two games out of the four but still have a bye to be added in. Their defeat of Collegians (fourth) last week was a very handy one. Today they visit Old Haileybury (seventh) and must win — as Collegians are host to Old Paradians (eighth). Monash Blues (third) have the chance to wrest second spot from Parkside when they play Coburg (ninth). Parkside play unbeaten Old Melburnians, who will be very keen to keep their Championship hopes alive now. O.M.'s cannot lose the top spot.

Geelong are showing the way in C Reserve, a game clear of St. Kilda, who. in turn, are a game ahead of Old Brighton. Hampton Rovers are fourth, another game away, with Old Xaverians and Old Carey fifth and sixth respectively. Although only a game outside the four Old Xavs have a very poor percentage. (How they must rue those unregistered players!) Today they play A.J.A.X. (seventh) whilst Old Carey confront Geelong and Hampton Rovers visit Kew (eighth). A loss today could prove disastrous.

West Brunswick, sixth, and two games out, have to visit St. Kevin's, third — behind State Bank on percentage. St. Kevin's need to win to stay in the race for the double chance. Melbourne High need to win against University High (ninth) to stay ahead of Heatherton.

In E Reserve fourth and fifth teams St. Bede's and Old Geelong — equal on points — today meet up with second and first teams Beverley Hills and Bulleen-Templestowe — a game apart. Old Geelong's loss last week to A.M.P. was very costly. St. Bede's only lost by one point to Bulleen-Templestowe and will be eager to take on Beverley Hills who, in turn, must win as North Brunswick, a game away in third, will be looking to today's clash with Old Mentonians (seventh) to "boost" them into second place.

A SECTION

St. Kilda strike Old Ivanhoe, Kew and Old Carey — all down the list — in addition to A.J.A.X.

Geelong meet Old Carey, A.J.A.X., Alphington (fifth) and then Old Xaverians.

As well as the Geelong game, Old Xaverians, after today's clash with A.J.A.X., will be keen to win against Alphington and Hampton Rovers.

Hampton are finishing strongly, having won its last four games. They will provide a problem for A.J.A.X. and Old Xaverians.

UMPIRES' CORNER

Regular readers of Umpires' Corner will recall that last year saw the creation of the Victorian Federation of Australian Rules Football Umpires with the V.A.F.A. Umpires' Association being one of the five foundation members,

One of the principal aims of the Federation being to promote the recruitment, education and training of umpires; it has been working closely with the Junior Football Council in its programs for schoolboy umpires. In May the Federation assisted in providing experienced umpires to attend a holiday course held at Scotch College to help provide practical training and assistance.

The Federation hopes to extend this assistance in the future and to, subsequently, ensure that potential umpires are not lost to the game. A brochure setting out the conditions offered by the member associations has been prepared and is available to any prospective umpire through the Federation Secretary, Philip Rowell (ph. 25-2399).

The first major project undertaken by the Federation is the provision of umpires for the Australian Schoolboys Under 16 Football Carnival in Geelong later this year. The Carnival is to take place between 22nd August and 1st September and it consists of 28 games. Umpires will be provided by each of the Federation members — being the Umpires' Associations of the V.F.L., V.F.L.R., V.F.A., V.A.F.A. and G.F.U.L.

The concept of umpires representing Victoria rather than a particular association is something that will be cherished by each umpire participating.


