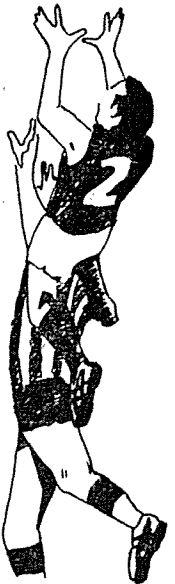

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections.

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day.

Provided that no player shall be eligible

for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON. UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

How can a tipster be expected to select a winner in this topsy turvy season?

Marcellin, battling to avoid relegation, easily accounted for an inaccurate Uni. Blues, who have been riding high for most of the season.

Uni. Blacks, perhaps the unlucky side of the competition, tossed the ebullient North O.B. to give themselves an outside chance for the Final Four.

St. Bernard's kept their finals chance alive with a comfortable win over Old Scotch, who have continued their slump in form.

Ivanhoe were too strong for Caulfield and they know they have to keep winning to hold their position whilst Caulfield are in deep trouble as far as relegation is concerned.

De La Salle consolidated their opportunity for the double chance by defeating Ormond, who are also in the hot seat as far as relegation is involved.

Two games to go and the double chance, the final four and relegation all still wide open. How interesting can a competition be.

With great trepidation and absolutely no confidence I will try to pick a winner this week.

Old Scotch meet Uni. Blues in a match which will be very much do or die for Old Scotch.

They are unfortunate they are meeting Blues who will be smarting from the defeat by Marcellin.

Salter (coach, Uni. Blues) will have his team hungry for a victory and I believe they will be too brilliant for the fast-fading Old Scotch.

St. Bernard's clash with Ormond at home. St. Bernard's still have a hope for a place in the Four, whilst Ormond will be desperate, for another loss leaves them right in the "Relegation Stakes". This match is sure to be a typical dour, hard struggle but I'm tipping St. Bernard's home ground advantage to be the decisive factor in their favour.

De La Salle clash with Ivanhoe in yet another game which will determine the positions of teams in the Four. Both teams know they must win to maintain their respective positions.

De La Salle have a stronger forward line and a more brilliant team overall and should win but this is a game in which an upset would be no surprise. However I'm tipping De La Salle to take the points.

Marcellin meet North O.B. at home and who could say they were not a good chance to defeat the Northerners after their fine defeat of Uni. Blues and North's poor form against Uni. Blacks. Marcellin have shown their best form too late and must be a good chance to win this one. The pressure will be right on North in this game and I believe they will respond accordingly and take the points.

One is tempted to say the only sure winner in this round is Uni. Blacks but turn-ups have been more than common this year than certain results and Caulfield Grammarians need to cause another. Uni. Blacks have been the unlucky side for the year with a controversial

draw and some very close defeats. They still have an outside chance for the Four and I'm certain they won't fritter it away to day.

Fawknor meet Old Trinity at Fawknor. Last week's loss to Parkside has made Fawknor's finals hopes look very slim, but they must keep winning to keep that faint hope alive. Their fate seems to rest with the performances of Haileybury.

Old Trinity put up a great show against Monash Blues last week and will present Fawknor with a real battle. I think the motivation behind the Fawknor camp is stronger and this should give them the win they so desperately need.

Old Melburnians, fresh after last week's rest are poised for the final run home which should take them to "A" Grade.

Today they host Monash Blues at Fawknor Park.

This game could not come at a worse time for the "Blues". They have struggled home for the narrowest of wins in their last two games. Today should see their bubble burst. Monash will be desperate and will give it everything they have but I cannot see them winning in enough positions to topple the leaders. I'll go for O.Ms.

In the final game we see a very confident Parkside journey across to Coburg. The "Red Devils" had a very important win over traditional rivals and friends, Fawknor, last week and their hopes for "A" Grade are sky high.

Coburg were jumped early by Collegians but fought on well and could be a very real danger, if Parkside take this game too lightly. The Coburg ground has brought many a good Parkside team down and if they are not careful they could be in for a nasty shock. I'll stay with the form team Parkside for a win, but I feel a bit edgy about this one.

Old Paradians after a magnificent run of successes finally went down to Old Haileyburians. I thought this was on. O.H. are a side

that never believe they are beaten. Today's bye will give Paradians a chance to recoup for next week's big clash with Parkside.

C SECTION

Highlights of round sixteen were Geelong's impressive 39 point win over A.J.A.X. and Old Xaverians crushing defeat of Alphington.

Geelong, after 7 games in third place, has at last progressed up the ladder — a patient wait for a team that during that period has not lost a game. Geelong's win over A.J.A.X. last week records for it consecutive wins over every team in the section.

But while Geelong are now second, a win for St. Kilda against A.J.A.X. today and a loss for Geelong against Old Xaverians next Saturday could see St. Kilda regain second spot.

Old Xaverians has also shown tremendous consistency. A poor first half was that side's handicap against A.J.A.X. two weeks ago. Form would not indicate Old Xaverians dropping out of the four; however they face danger games at Hampton today and Geelong at home next week. The other contender for fourth place, Old Brighton, could sneak into the four by winning both its games (Old Carey and Kew), should Xaverians drop both their games.

I tip this unlikely to occur. Today Old Brighton at home will allow Old Carey little latitude and run out winners while Old Xaverians will be too accomplished for Hampton Rovers.

The main one today is between certain finalists St. Kilda Old Collegians and A.J.A.X. If the game was at Albert Park there is little doubt A.J.A.X. would win. However, the contest must be considered differently as it is to be played out at North Road.

The Geelong-A.J.A.X. clash last week was one of the finest games of Amateur football I've seen in years — particularly the first half when both teams played superbly, each trying in turn to take control of the game.

I cannot see A.J.A.X. being beaten twice in succession. (The same could almost be said of St. Kilda.) The game will be loaded with pressure and astute coaches, Sid Myers (A.J.A.X.) and Maurie Bilston (St. Kilda) will have their sides at "finals fever" pitch.

The A.J.A.X. boys will win and I recommend the game to followers — the contest shows promise of being a classic.

Geelong, running along nicely, must now beware of complacency, over-confidence or anything similar. Just because Alphington performed dismally last week does not mean they will slump again today. I know for one reason that Alphington has been keenly looking forward to its first visit to Queen's Park since 1970 — the club has geared itself up for the occasion. And Geelong's coach Laurie Degoldi is aware of the pitfalls of a casual approach; Geelong cannot relax. Alphington's determination will test Geelong but the Geelong machine, with an improved percentage and the additional stakes to hold second place, will run out winners.

Kew have improved in recent weeks and will be far too strong for a struggling Old Ivanhoe at Ivanhoe today.

Congratulations to University High School Old-Boys, Elsternwick and the State Bankers whose victories last week have assured an Alfred Hitchcock suspense ending to the D Section season. Only Powerhouse is assured of a final's game. At the other end of the ladder the relegation question still has to be answered.

Heatherton, whose form has been inconsistent, visit Melbourne High School Old Boys. The home side will be anxious to regain its lost horizon of the top four. Now that State Bank has regained a top spot I believe they will succeed today against a disappointing West Brunswick. Big name players such as The Brennan's, Eacott, Wynd and Webster will provide drive to the Bankers. For the "Moulting Magpies" Brockwell appears to be playing a lonely, consistent game. I predict the Bankers will consolidate their percentage assets today and end the game with a credit balance on the score board.

The valiant University High School Old Boys efforts to avoid relegation should be thwarted today against second placed St. Kevin's. Old Timer Les. Radford continues to give St. Kevin's great drive. Hannan, like his namesake, has found gold, in the form of goals, which he scores consistently. Allan Oile will fire his charges with the message that a big victory today will consolidate the double final chance St. Kevin's are my selection to win.

On June 17, Powerhouse overwhelmed Country Colleges. Since then Powerhouse has continued on its successful path while the Colleges, after showing a flicker of light, have seen their light completely extinguished. Ken Vipond has given the Colleges his best season yet (Ken is now in the mature years of his footballing life). However constant pressure from Bredyk and Perry today should see the modest Vipond

will. Around the packs Evans should pick up kicks against Dewan who does his best work away from the pack. Despite my prejudices, (having been a member of both clubs) I must commit myself to a decision. Powerhouse will appreciate the room to move the ball around the Western Oval. North Brunswick are playing well and are not easy to beat at home. Unless there's a big improvement in a dozen different departments, I can't see Old Geelong taking the points.

UMPIRES' CORNER

TRAINING

One question which is often asked by players during after-game discussions with umpires is: What type of training do you do? Often the question is asked by men who are nearing the end of their playing careers and are thinking of taking up umpiring as a means of keeping fit and of maintaining their association with Amateur football.

Here is the answer:—

Training is held each Tuesday and Thursday night at Elsternwick Park and at the Collingwood Harriers track. The format varies but a typical night's work would involve:

- An 8 lap warm up
- 10 50-metre sprints, jog back to start and repeat
- 4 laps Indian file — last man sprints to front
- 30 15-metres wind sprints
- 2 laps warm down
- ball bouncing

It is a different type of training from that which players do because it is designed for a different purpose — ensuring that an umpire has the stamina to run for over 120 minutes. Ex-players generally do not find it too hard to adapt.

JUNIOR UMPIRES NIGHT

An announcement that this event was to take place was made in the Amateur Footballer on 15 July. Thirteen young umpires attended at Elsternwick Park the following Tuesday and trained with the senior umpires. Afterwards they joined in a pie-night and were addressed by Umpires' Adviser, Alan A'Neill and Umpire Committee Secretary, Peter Feil. Most expressed an interest in joining the Amateur panel on leaving school. We will be keeping in contact with them and they will be guests of the Association at the 'A' Grade Grand Final in September.

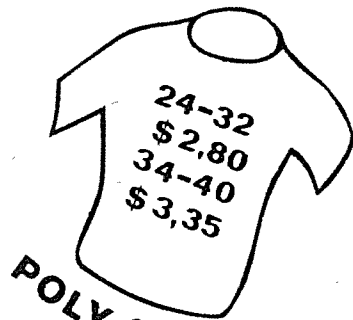
