THE PICTURE BECOMES CLEARER IN MOST SECTIONS

SIX IN DISPUTE

And so to Round 18 and only eight of the final fours are decided — although only two of these are without the possibility of internal change. The most open Section of all is surely "A" University Blues is the unassailable leader and currently enduring a slump. The other three positions could be filled by any of five teams — Ivanhoe, De La Salle, North Old Boys, Old Scotch and outsiders University Blacks. The obvious evenness of the sides in A Section augurs well for a most interesting finals series. (Don't forget: the A Section Grand Final is on SUNDAY, September 17th, this year.)

The "nether" end of A Section is also full of interest, with today's clash between Ormond and Marcellin to decide who will join Caulfield Grammarians in B Section next year. Another pressure game is that between North Old Boys and De La Salle. The loser could well be fifth or sixth come 5.00 p.m. tonight.

In Junior Section 1, North are safely ensconced in the top spot despite their recent lapses. University Blues, Old Scotch and Ormond are all desperately trying to secure the double chance, whilst St. Bernard's and University Blacks are just as desperately striving to avoid relegation. Today they meet North Old Boys and Ormond respectively.

D Section's Old Camberwell will be looking for a return of form to enable them to return to the four. Equally will their opponents University High be looking for the win that could keep them in the Section for next year (particularly after last week's narrow miss). The St. Kevin's-State Bank match will decide who fills second place.

Main interest in **E** Section centres around the La Trobe Blacks-Beverley Hills and Old Geelong-Brunswick games, which will decide the final four's composition.

A Reserve sees University Blues, North Old Boys and Ivanhoe vying for the two spots behind St. Bernard's and Ormond.

The bye and the Therry-Commonwealth Bank game maintain the interest

in **F** Reserve. Therry must win to stay in the four (University Reds, fifth on percentage only, having the bye) whilst Commonwealth Bank need to win if they are to retain hopes of that coveted double-chance position.

There is one other "ladder" which is wide open at the moment and that is the **Tipster's.** Syd Whitfield has recently been assailed by Peter Nathan for the top spot (there is no "double chance" here). Third, fourth, fifth and sixth spots are also still "up for grabs" with only one point separating Brian Lauder from tied Peter Lemon, Norm Nugent and Jim Fidge.

Owing to the importance of so many of today's matches may I stress with all Home Club Press Correspondents the need for **promptness** and **accuracy** when phoning your scores through. Please check with **both** goal umpires first — do not rely on the timekeeper's only.

Finally, to those clubs which finish the year today may I say all the best for the next six months and good recruiting for next year's assault!

To the clubs that have survived through to the finals, Good Luck over the next three-four weeks!

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Despite last week's upsets, or more correctly, because of these, the second, third, fourth and ninth positions (relevant as far as relegation is concerned) are still not finally determined.

Picking today's winners is going to be even more difficult than any other round in the year as every team will be desperate to win. The first game for discussion is North O.B. and De La Salle. Both sides know that they must win if they are to be certain of a place in the final four. Trying to get a line on form at this stage of the season, when grounds have been so wet and muddy for such a long time, is very difficult. Both sides have strong forward lines but with adverse conditions recent games have been a battle of the back lines. I am tipping North Old Boys to take the points in what will be a "do or die" struggle between both teams.

Another "last man standing" affair is sure to be the game between Ormond and Marcellin. The loser of this game will be relegated to "B" Division. Both sides have winning form and both showed great courage and determination in their wins last Saturday. Ormond have a home ground advantage over Marcellin and are a team that will be especially desperate not to leave "A" Grade. Marcellin, on the other hand, have shown very good form over the last few weeks and will not surrender to defeat easily. I am selecting Ormond to defeat Marcellin in a very tight finish.

Ivanhoe meet University Blacks in what is another vital game. Ivanhoe, despite the fact that they are in second position, could fall back to fourth if they lose to the unlucky Blacks. Blacks know that they have the slimmest chances of making the finals and would be foolish to not play this game as tightly as possible. Despite the fact that Uni. Blacks have shown good form over recent weeks I believe that they enjoyed the muddy and wet conditions and I believe that they will beat the Blacks and retain a second position.

University Blues meet St. Bernard's in what would have been another decisive game if St. Bernard's had not been defeated by a point by Ormond. Uni. Blues have dropped form in recent games and obviously are a team that prefer the drier conditions so that they can exploit their fast, open, play-on football. St. Bernard's performance in the second half of the game at Ormond was nothing less than dismal. In view of this and the fact that Uni. Blues will be keen to finish the season on a winning note I'm tipping the Blues.

Old Scotch meet lack-lustre Caulfield Grammarians in a game which Old Scotch know must put them back into the final four if they win. Old Scotch are very fortunate to find themselves in this spot, if it had not been for the upset win over University Blues last Saturday they would not be in a position to make the four. Caulfield Grammarians have shown nothing over the last few weeks to suggest that they will defeat Old Scotch and I have to go for Old Scotch to win this match.

My selections therefore are: North O.B., Ormond, Ivanhoe, Uni. Blues and Old Scotch — MICHAEL ARNOLD.

B SECTION

Today it's "mothballs" for some and high hopes for others.

The Four is settled and today's games will have no bearing on the final positions of teams.

It's been a hard season with most sides having their moment of glory, but I believe the four finalists have thoroughly deserved the right to fight out the premiership.

The big game today is the clash between Parkside and Old Paradians at Pitcher Park. This should be a ripper!

Parkside have not been defeated since the last time these two teams met. That day, Parade handled the conditions much better than Parkside and gave them their biggest hiding of the year. The ground today will be in a similar condition and should suit Old Paradians. To offset this the Parkside team has not lost a game at home this season and will be keen to keep this record intact. I know they are determined to avenge that previous thrashing, so I will go for Parkside to win a very tough game.

The Blues play well at home and this could be the deciding factor. Collegians started the season so well and looked set to play off in the Finals, but fell away disappointingly. I believe Monash Blues will lift and win this one.

Fawkner have the bye. They have had a strange season after a very slow start. I'm sure they are disappointed, but they have had a magnificent run over the years. It's now time to take stock and build up for next year.

C SECTION

What a Finals series it is going to be this year in C Section. With today's games to be played, only one thing is certain — the teams in the final four will stay there! Their placings, however, are completely up in the air.

A.J.A.X. (130.8%), with its second successive loss are now level with Geelong (126.1%); St. Kilda are close behind on 48 points (127.3%).

Percentages could well decide second place. If Geelong fails against Old Xaverians today, it could find itself in the precarious position of facing Old Xavs again next week — in the first semi-final.

While talking about "Ifs", here's another one. Presuming Geelong win and St. Kilda account for Old Carey, a third successive loss for A.J.A.X. could see them drop to third, with percentage margins the deciding factor.

So much for the "supposing" --- what will happen today? Perhaps anybody's guess!

Geelong go to Yarra Park with its magnificent winning sequence (10) still intact but having not made the most of its opportunities to improve its percentage. Had Geelong capitalized on two of these chances (the Old Carey and Alphington games) it would be unassailable in first or second place — firmly assured of the double chance. This double chance is important; I wouldn't fancy Geelong's confidence if forced to face its conqueror today, again in the first semi-final next week even down at Geelong West.

Geelong will welcome the return of champion Ian Davis and, hopefully, Russell Coad will have regained fitness.

Old Xaverians, with 8 wins in 10, compare favourably with Geelong in consistency. The Yarra Park oval is well known to both sides and the game promises to be a thriller. Curtain, Old Xaverians' full-forward, is a danger player and must be played closely by top Geelong defenders Tim Hardiman and David Ross.

I don't expect Geelong to win by the ninety-odd points it did last time, however, I predict it will win and prove its right to be premiership favourite.

The order of the ladder will remain unchanged.

A.J.A.X. will not slip at home against Hampton Rovers, who have done well in the past few weeks. Hampton were unlucky not to beat Old Xaverians and they appear better suited when at home.

Old Carey will be keen to surprise St. Kilda out at Bulleen. I know "Reg" Elliott will be keyed up for this one and so will the Carey boys after last week's near miss against Old Brighton.

St. Kilda, with so much at stake, will keep alive any hope of sneaking the double chance.

Kew flopped badly against Old Ivanhoe and may be troubled today against a varied Old Brighton. I favour Old Brighton, but for no good reason.

Alphington battled determinedly down at Geelong and will threaten Old Ivanhoe's newfound lease-of-life. Home ground advantage will swing the game to Alphington and this should cheer up Peter Harris, whose only happiness befell him after the game last week.

D SECTION

A real final atmosphere will pervade the Burnley Oval where State Bank players will be endeavouring to take their side into a Final Series for the first time since 1973. St. Kevin's, their hosts today, will be all out to secure the double chance and try to do better during the Finals than they did in 1977. Home ground advantage, a stronger side and my long held suspicion about the Bankers away from Albert Park, are the three factors which lead me to select St. Kevin's.

After being in the vanguard all season the Old Camberwell Grammarians now find themselves out of the Four at the eleventh hour. They must win today for their percentage to carry them back into the Four. University High School Old Boys will be looking for victory to keep them in D Section. The visitors' recent form, although better than that of the Camberwell lads, still may not be sufficient to enable a University High School Old Boys victory. Today is the Camberwell day of reckoning, Peter! Your players must be positive and do rather than debate what might have been. Without any real confidence I select Old Camberwell.

In a game which could assume more than academic or nostalgic interest (to quote Peter Nathan) Country Colleges, for the second time, will play West Brunswick on the Ransford Oval. Both sides can only reflect on what might have been their lot in 1978. The Colleges playon game will be thwarted on the narrow Ransford Oval. West Brunswick will be all out to dismiss any chance of relegation. For them the game could be a "must". I have a reasoned opinion "The Magpies" can win. Veterans of the two clubs will remember the West performance against Assumption O.C. on August 16, 1969. Memories of that West Brunswick performance linger with me still. To be more realistic, neither side has won a match since July 8 (Country Colleges beat Elsternwick), Bearing in mind the Colleges' victory over the "Magpies" on June 10, as well as my own prejudice, I select the Country Colleges to end the season with a victory.

Elsternwick, on their recent form, must be firm favourites to take the points over Heatherton today. The home side (Heatherton) has not lived up to early promises. Their last victory was against Country Colleges on July 22. Elsternwick have proven giant killers as well as Final Four formers with their latest victories. Today, Elsternwick is my selection.

In another vital game Power House, a top berth assured, meet Melbourne High School Old Boys, who must do well to feature in a Final. The power of Power House, namely Sykes, Perry and Bredyk, should win the ball enough to deprive Melbourne High forwards, Adams and Martin, of scoring a winning total. Around the ground Peatling and Flegeltaub should deprive Power House of much of Evans' drive. I can't see the Melbourne High School Old Boys holding Power House to a losing total. After my selections, I can only hope my form of last week holds, and I can see percentage deciding third, fourth and fifth placing. The State Bank and Melbourne High sides must beware that every score will be vital in deciding fourth place.

To conclude, I thank each side for the assistance given to me when I have sought scores and details during the season. May those who finish today do better in 1979, and to those four sides who win through, may fortune favour you over the next three weeks — NORM NUGENT.

E SECTION

The main interest in the Section today is still the outcome of the struggle for fourth place. La Trobe lead in the race, with a one game advantage over Old Geelong, but also with a danger game today against third team, Beverley Hills. Should La Trobe beat Beverley Hills, they'll secure fourth spot, but if they lose, Old Geelong, with a likely win over Brunswick, will edge them out on percentage. La Trobe's game against Beverley Hills is

on the big University oval where the home side has lost only two games for the season, and they'll go close to taking the points. Beverley Hills impressed me greatly a couple of weeks ago - on their ground - but that might not mean much today, firstly because they're now in no danger of missing the Four, and secondly, because their performances away from home have been very weak on a number of occasions. On the other hand, a loss for Beverley Hills would be a demoralizing prelude to the Finals, particularly as the loss would be against the team they'd then have to meet next week. So who knows, they might really turn it on. And in addition, there's another unknown factor: the number of players who'll be absent from the Uni. team due to the vacation. On thinking it over, and admittedly with an element of wishful thinking, I'm going for Beverley Hills to win

narrowly. Old Geelong today complete twenty-five home-and-away seasons with the V.A.F.A., and although that's some incentive to perform well, the bigger incentive will be to get back into the Four. Although almost everything hinges on the result of the game at La Trobe, I can't see Geelong chucking this one away by losing to Brunswick. It's been a disappointing year for Brunswick, and though they might push Geelong for a while, the home team will go on to win comfortably.

Old Mentonians finish the season at home to A.N.Z. Bank, and they'll do it on a bright note with a good win. Mentone struggled badly last week, but today will find goals easier to come by. As for A.N.Z., I'm afraid the only thing to look forward to today will be that beer after the game — but don't despair fellas, they serve a pretty good drop.

A.M.P. will be at home to Bulleen-Templestowe, not far from where the visitors will be playing in the Second Semi-Final next week. I can't see A.M.P. throwing out any serious sort of a challenge, and Bulleen-Templestowe will

win their third easy game in a row. Whether three easy wins in a row is a good thing for a club going into the Finals is another matter — but more of that next week.

North Brunswick again proved last week that they are a good team, and today they'll be looking for a win against top side, St. Bede's. North's coach is confident of knocking off the leaders, and I too, rate them a good chance, especially when it's remembered that St. Bede's only "fell in" by a point with much straighter kicking earlier this year. For all that, however, I'm going to play safe and pick St. Bede's, mainly because of their home ground advantage.

F SECTION

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections. The Rule relating to eligibility of play-ers in Reserve Section Finals reads:— A player who has been a member of

a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home natches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day. Provided that no player shall be eligible

for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be in-eligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grandfinal match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season
